ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this nineteenth day of October, 1895.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, Elizabeth Drake, of Purakanui (hereinafter called "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor in Council for a license under "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore of Purakanui Bay, in order to erect and maintain thereon a dwelling-house, and, in accordance with the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 2028), showing the place where it is intended to erect such dwelling-house, the area of foreshore to be occupied for such purpose, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the house: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council, without modification or addition: And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, should be granted and issued to the licensee on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid, and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore coloured pink on the plan marked M.D. 2028, for the erection of a dwelling-house in accordance with the plan marked M.D. 2028, and which said license shall be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore coloured pink on plan marked M.D. 2028, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensee shall, on demand, pay to the Minister the annual sum of one shilling.

4. Her Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said foreshore without payment.

5. The licensee shall complete the erection of the said dwelling-house, in accordance with the approved plan marked M.D. 2028, within twelve calendar months from the date of this Order in Council.

6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned house in good order and repair.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

9. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee.

10. In case the licensee shall—

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or

(2.) Cease to use or occupy the said house;

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

11. The erection of the dwelling-house shall be sufficient proof of the acceptance by the licensee of the conditions of this Order in Council.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Education Act, 1877," His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, doth hereby make the regulation hereto annexed regarding certain payments of capitation allowance to Education Boards; and, with the like advice and consent, doth hereby prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATION.

NOTWITHSTANDING anything to the contrary contained in an Order in Council made on the 5th day of January, 1888, under the provisions of "The Education Act, 1877," relating (*inter alia*) to attendance registers and returns, the payment of capitation allowance to Education Boards for the quarter ending on the 31st day of December, 1895, shall be according to the working-average attendance of the quarter ending on the 30th day of September, 1895, as working average is defined by Order in Council dated the 5th day of July, 1887, and made under the provisions of the before-mentioned Act.

And whereas it is expedient to make the rule set out in the Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make and prescribe the additional rule set forth in the Schedule hereto, to take effect as from the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.

SCHEDULE.

The fees prescribed in Appendix D of the rules made under "The Magistrates' Courts Act, 1893," by the Governor in Council on the 4th day of June, 1894, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 11th day of June, 1894, in respect of "judgment on confession, by consent, or by default (when no witness is sworn)," shall be held to include the filing or lodging of the written confession with the Clerk of the Court; and no fee shall be payable for lodging with the Clerk of the Court the written order referred to in Rule No. 53 of the said rules.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and sixty-ninth section of "The Land Act, 1892," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands in any village settlement shall be disposed of, subject as in the said section is provided: And whereas by a Proclamation made under the said Act on the thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the third day of October, one thousand eight hundred and

ninety-five, the lands described in the First Schedule hereto have been set apart under the said Act and declared open for lease as village settlements, and it is expedient to fix the terms and conditions upon which the said lands shall be disposed of:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Public Domains Act, 1881," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke a certain Order in Council, dated the eighteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, making delegation of certain powers in manner as therein appears; and doth, with the like advice and consent, by this present Order, delegate, but only with respect to the pieces or parcels of land described in the Schedule hereto, all the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Hunterville Domain Board, namely,—

JOHN JOHNSTON,
ALBERT EDWARD ASHCROFT,
DUNCAN MCKAY, Sen.,
JAMES ARTHUR PAWSON,
CHARLES DUDDING,
JOHN H. NORRIS,
WILLIAM MELDRUM,
ALEXANDER HOWIE WILSON, and
HENRY VALDER

(hereinafter referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the second Wednesday in each month, at eight o'clock p.m., at Hunterville, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Wednesday, the eleventh day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the second Wednesday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the mem-

bers may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

Amending Regulations for Colonial Pilots' Licenses.

GLASGOW, Governor.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 31 of "The Shipping and Seamen's Act Amendment Act, 1894," that the Governor may from time to time license pilots, to be called "colonial pilots," within the colony, subject to such regulations as he may prescribe, and to the payment into the Consolidated Fund of an annual fee not exceeding five pounds, and may suspend or cancel any such license:

And whereas the Governor did, by warrant under his hand, dated the second day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 10, of the seventh day of the same month, prescribe regulations for the licensing of colonial pilots:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke clause one of such regulations, and to prescribe other regulation in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the hereinbefore-recited Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby revoke the regulation numbered one prescribed by the said warrant of the second day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and in exercise of the like power and authority doth hereby prescribe the following regulation, and doth order that it shall take the place of the regulation number one, which is revoked:—

REGULATION.

Licenses without Examination.

1. Any person who, prior to the 1st January, 1895, has either commanded a vessel of not less than 300 tons register trading on the coasts of New Zealand, or been engaged in piloting similar vessels on the coasts of New Zealand, may, subject to the approval of the Marine Department, receive a license as colonial pilot without undergoing examination: provided that he held prior to the above date a certificate of competency or service of a grade not lower than that of master, home-trade, and satisfies the Marine Department as to his sobriety and general trustworthiness.

THE Napier Harbour Board has notified that the position and description of the leading lights, beacons, and buoys for approaching the Steamer and Breakwater Wharves at Napier Breakwater Harbour are as follow:—

On and after the night of the 1st November, 1895, a red light showing all round as far as the land will allow will be exhibited from a standard, 25ft. above high-water mark, erected on the Breakwater Wharf at 146ft. from its eastern extremity. A red beacon will be exhibited from the same position during daylight. On and after the same date a green light showing from S.E. by S. round to E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. will be exhibited from the end of the Steamer Wharf at the Breakwater. A green beacon will be exhibited from the same position during daylight. The light and the beacon will be both 25ft. above high-water mark. Vessels entering the Breakwater Harbour should keep the green and red lights or beacons in line. The line of these leading lights and beacons bears S.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E., and covers the extreme point of the mainland at Cape Kidnappers. All bearings are magnetic and from seaward.

A black conical buoy is placed on the Auckland Rock, $4\frac{3}{4}$ cables north of Ahuriri Bluff; vessels should keep well to the northward of this buoy. A black cask buoy is placed clear of the north-western extremity of the Auckland Rock patch. Vessels entering the Breakwater Harbour should keep this buoy on the port side.

Two cask buoys painted black are placed within the Breakwater to mark the east and west extremities of a small patch with a minimum depth of 20ft. 6in. at low-water ordinary spring-tides.

Vessels entering by the leading-lights or beacons must keep both these buoys on the port side.

Three iron mooring-buoys painted with luminous paint, which shows white in daylight, are placed as follows: (a) 400ft. westward from end of Steamer Wharf; (b) 300ft. northward from end of Steamer Wharf; (c) 450ft. north-eastward from the end of Steamer Wharf.

The Breakwater is now extended about two cables' length beyond the red light on the Breakwater Wharf, and the surrounding rubble foundation is extended to about three cables beyond the same light.

Vessels making for Napier Harbour in daylight should keep well outside of the buoys at the Breakwater works and the Auckland Rock. At night vessels should open the white sector of the Eastern Pier light, bearing S.W., before losing sight of the Ahuriri Bluff light, bearing S. by W.

The southern limit of the green light, bearing E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., is immediately outside of the three-fathoms line of soundings between the Breakwater Harbour and the entrance to the Inner Harbour or Spit.
