# ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-eighth day of October, 1895.

In pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," His Excelency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations for all that part of the colony known as "The Auckland Acclimatisation District," as the same is defined in the said regulations, and the waters thereof, except as hereinafter mentioned; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall, as from the date of the publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette, supersede all regulations at variance therewith. therewith.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. LICENSES to fish for trout and perch in all waters within that district or part of the North Island known as "The

Auckland Acclimatisation District," which includes the Provincial District of Auckland, with the exception of the Counties of Tauranga, Whakatane, Waiapu, and Cook, may be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Auckland Acclimatisation Society (hereinafter termed "the said society"), or any one authorised by the said Secretary in that behalf: Provided, however, that all fishing is prohibited in that portion of the Waimakariri River, near Oxford, extending from the bridge over the said river on the Oxford-Rotorua Road for a distance of half a mile below the said bridge.

the bridge over the said river on the Oxford-Rotorua Road for a distance of half a mile below the said bridge.

2. For every license to fish for trout and perch in the waters in the Auckland Acclimatisation District, issued to men under the hand of the Secretary of the Auckland Acclimatisation Society, or any one authorised by the said Secretary in that behalf, a fee of one pound will be charged.

3. The Secretary of the said society or his deputy may issue licenses for the whole season to ladies for the sum of five shillings each; and to boys under the age of sixteen years for the whole season for the sum of ten shillings each; and to men, on and after the fifteenth day of January in any year, and until the thirty-first day of March in the same year, for the sum of twelve shillings and sixpence each.

4. Any holder of a license may fish with one rod and line for trout and perch, and may use a landing-net or gaff to secure any trout or perch caught with such rod and line, in all waters (except in that portion of the Waimakariri River mentioned in regulation one) within "The Auckland Acclimatisation District," from the fifteenth day of November in any one year to the thirty-first day of March in the year following, both inclusive.

5. No license shall authorise any person other than the

following, both inclusive.

5. No license shall authorise any person other than the person named therein to fish, and that with natural or artificial fly, insect, worm, or fish only.

6. No person shall have in his possession any of the salmonidæ or trout between the third day of April and the fourteenth day of November, which period is hereby appointed a close season for all such fish: Provided always that this regulation shall not apply to fish caught by the officers of the said society for purposes of acclimatisation.

7. No person shall put, throw, or place, or allow to be put, thrown, or placed, into any river or stream, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream, any dynamite or other explosive substance, or any sawdust or sawmill refuse, or anything of any kind or description whatever poisonous, deleterious, or noxious to fish.

deleterious, or noxious to fish.

8. No person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill, in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon-parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named

salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned to the water from whence it was taken.

9. No person shall fish for trout or perch without a license, and every person fishing shall, on demand of any ranger, constable, member of the said society, or person producing a license, produce and show to such ranger, member, constable, or person his license, and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing such trout or perch.

10. Every trout not exceeding nine inches in length from

10. Every trout not exceeding nine inches in length from nose to tip of tail, taken or caught by any person, shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which

the same is taken.

11. No person shall take, catch, or kill any perch under six inches in length, nor shall perch be taken, caught, or killed at all, or had in possession of any person, between the third day of April and the fourteenth day of November in

any year.

12. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other unsportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout or perch; nor shall any of the above-mentioned baits be used with any medicated or harminal preparation whatever.

the above-mentioned batts be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.

13. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish with or use any net or other engine, instrument, or device for taking fish in any river or stream within the district aforesaid, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream.

14. For the purposes of these regulations the mouth of every such river or stream shall be deemed to include every outlet of the same and the sea-shore between such outlets,

and shall extend over a radius of one-quarter of a mile from the point or line where the waters of such river or stream meet those of the sea or of any harbour at low-water.

15. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale, or shall fish for the purpose of obtaining for sale, any salmon, trout, or perch, or any part thereof.

16. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be less than forty shillings or more than fifty

pounds.

17. If any person shall be convicted of any offence against these regulations the license (if any) held by the offender shall thereupon become void.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-eighth day of October, 1895.

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section six of "The Unclaimed Lands Act, 1894," it is, among other things, enacted that the Public Trustee may lease such lands as become vested in him pursuant to the said Act under and subvested in him pursuant to the said Act under and subject to the same terms and conditions as reserves under "The West Coast Settlement Reserves Act, 1892," may be leased, and that the provisions relating to such leasing shall, mutatis mutandis, apply thereto and be deemed to be incorporated therein; and "The West Coast Settlement Reserves Act, 1892," so far as is necessary to give effect to such provisions, should extend and apply and be deemed to be incorporated therein: Provided that the Governor in Council may from time to time declare which of the provisions of that Act should or should not extend and apply to the powers of leasing thereby given, and may so modify the same as to enable the Public Trustee to carry into effect the provisions of subsection five of the said section into effect the provisions of subsection five of the said section

six: And whereas by section twenty-four of "The Unclaimed Lands Act, 1894," the power to make regulations conferred by the Public Trust Office Acts is extended and applied to the said "Unclaimed Lands Act, 1894," as if the t-named Act had been incorporated in the Public Trust Office Acts:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Acts before named, or any of them, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby declare that the provisions of "The West Coast Settlement Reserves Act, 1892," mentioned or referred to in the First Schedule hereto, shall extend and apply to leases to be granted by the Public Trustee under the provisions of "The Unclaimed Lands Act, 1894," with the modifications therein appearing: And doth further declare that the provisions of "The West Coast Settlement Reserves Act, 1892," mentioned or referred to in the Second Schedule hereto, shall not extend and apply to the powers of the Public Trustee under the provisions of "The Unclaimed Lands Act, 1894": And, lastly, doth further, under the powers given in and by section twenty-Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony further, under the powers given in and by section twenty-four of "The Unclaimed Lands Act, 1894," make the regulations contained in the Third Schedule hereto.

The form of lease to be granted under "The Unclaimed Lands Act, 1894," by the Public Trustee shall be as provided by "The Land Transfer Act, 1885," and shall contain express or implied covenants, conditions, and provisoes on the part of the lessee to pay all rates and taxes, other than the landlord's land-tax; to insure in the name of the lessor; to fence; to paint the outside of all premises requiring painting every fourth year; to paint and paper all inside woodwork, and paper such walls as require papering at least twice during the demise, at intervals not exceeding eight years; in the case of farm lands, to cultivate; in the case of all lands, to keep the same clear and free from all gorse, bramble, briar, and sedge, except such as shall the case of all lands, to keep the same clear and free from all gorse, bramble, briar, and sedge, except such as shall be planted for hedges; and to keep all live hedges properly trimmed and prevent their spreading by seed; not to assign or sublet without consent; with a proviso for re-entry on non-payment of rent or a breach of covenant for 21 days; and such other and usual covenants and conditions as the nature of any particular parcel of land, or the circumstances relating the order may preder expedient. relating thereto, may render expedient.

Be it resolved that the United Farmers' Alliance (Limited) be wound up voluntarily, and that Charles Walter Mullins, at present the Secretary and General Manager of the United Farmers' Alliance (Limited), or such other person or persons as the shareholders shall elect, shall be appointed liquidator or liquidators for the purposes of such winding-up, and with full power, subject to the provisions of sections 222 and 223 of "The Companies Act, 1882," to sell, dispose of, and make over the assets, effects, debts, claims, and demands, including all lands, buildings, premises, and leases thereof, of and belonging to the said United Farmers' Aliiance (Limited), to the Manawatu Farmers' Co-operative Association (Limited). belonging to the said United Farmers' Altiance (Limited), to the Manawatu Farmers' Co-operative Association (Limited), on the terms and conditions expressed in a certain conditional memorandum of agreement, dated the 26th day of August, 1895, entered into between the Directors of the United Farmers' Alliance (Limited), (hereinafter described as the selling company), of the one part, and the Directors of the Manawatu Farmers' Co-operative Association (Limited), (hereinafter described as the purchasing company), of the other part, wherein it is stipulated, inter alia, and in substance, and upon the special conditions provided in the said agreements. agreements.

(a.) That the purchasing company shall assume and discharge all the engagements and liabilities of the selling company;
(b.) That the purchasing company shall allot to the liquidator of the selling company, for distribution among the shareholders of the selling company, in satisfaction of their interests a number of shares satisfaction of their interests, a number of shares in the purchasing company, of the nominal value of £5 each, equal to the number of shares in the selling company now held by the shareholders therein;

(c.) That each such allotted share shall be credited as capital paid up thereupon, with a value proportioned to the net capital of the selling company, ascertained by valuation in manner provided by the agreement, and after deduction of all liabilities;

(d.) That each company shall pay one-half of the total expenses incidental to amalgamation and liquida-
