Regulations for the Examination of Surveyors under "The Land Act, 1892."

GLASGOW, Governor.

I N pursuance and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the fourth section of "The Land Act, 1892," I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations for the examination of and for the issue of certificates to surveyors :-

REGULATIONS.

Board of Examiners.

1. There is hereby constituted a Board of Examiners, consisting of the persons for the time being holding the respective offices of—

The Surveyor-General, the Under-Secretary for Lands, the Assistant Surveyor-General, the Inspector of Mines, the Chief Surveyor for the Land District of Napier, the Chief Surveyor for the Land District of Capterbury Canterbury.
2. The Surveyor-General shall be Chairman of the Board,

but in case of his absence from any meeting the members present shall appoint one of their number to act as Chairman.

3. The Board may appoint a Secretary, who shall hold office during the Board's pleasure, and be paid such salary as the Minister of Lands thinks fit. The office of Secretary may be held conjointly with any other post or office in the

4. A meeting of the Board shall be convened by the Secretary whenever the Chairman or any two members so desire.
5. At all meetings of the Board the quorum shall be four. The Chairman shall have a deliberative vote, and, in case of

equality of voting, a casting-vote.
6. Subject to these regulations, the Board may regulate its own procedure.

Time and Place of Examination.

7. Examinations will be held in the months of March and September of each year, on dates to be fixed by the Board and notified in the New Zealand Gazette: Provided that the first examination after the coming into force of these regulations may be held later than March if the Board thinks fit.

8. Examinations will be held at the principal Survey Office

of each Land District in which there are candidates for examination. The Chief Surveyor of each Land District, or some officer appointed by the Board, shall conduct the examination and act as Supervisor.

Conditions preliminary to Examination.

9. (1.) No candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he satisfies the Board-

(a.) That he has passed the matriculation examination of some recognised university, or the Junior Civil Service Examination of New Zealand (in which Service Examination of New Zealand (in which must be included English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, plane trigonometry, and algebra), or such other examination as in the opinion of the Board is equivalent thereto, and also has served an indentureship with an authorised surveyor in New Zealand for not less than three years, two of which have been in the field; or het has served an indentureship for not less than the plane of the served an indenture of the plane of t

(b.) That he has served an indentureship for not less than four years with an authorised surveyor in New Zealand, two years at least of which have

New Zealand, two years at least of which have been in the field, and also has received such education as will, in the opinion of the Board, qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession; or (c.) That he has completed not less than a two-years course in engineering and surveying at some recognised university, together with eighteen months' service with an authorised surveyor in New Zealand, of which not less than one year has been in the field been in the field.

(2.) Service in the field comprehends minor triangula-(2.) Service in the next comprehends inflor triangulation, topographical survey, survey and subdivision of land, road-surveying and -grading, and the preparation of plans in accordance with the regulations and instructions, for the time being in force, of the Survey Department of New Zealand (hereinafter called "the Survey Regulations").

10. At least thirty days before the date of examination, every intending candidate shall give notice to the Secretary of the Board, Wellington, of his desire to be examined. Such notice shall be written on forms to be obtained at the office of any Chief Surveyor; and must be accompanied by the evidence, certificate, plans, &c., referred to in the next following clause of these regulations.

11. (1.) Every candidate shall forward with the notice referred to in the last-preceding clause of these regulations—

(a.) Satisfactory evidence of compliance with the requirements of clause 9 of these regulations, including a certificate from the surveyor with whom he served as to length of service, character, knowledge of surveying, and general ability;
(b.) A plan of at least three triangles;
(c.) Particulars of the measurement of a base-line not

less than 80 chains in length;

- (d.) A plan of topographical survey; (e.) A plan of at least 100 acres of land, contained within
- not less than ten irregular sides;

 (f.) A plan of a town section which is built on, to illustrate an application under the Land Transfer Act;

 (g.) The original field- and level-books, and all calculations.

tions connected with the above surveys.

(2.) All plans must be drawn and plotted from surveys actually made by the candidate himself, and must be in accordance with the Survey Regulations. The plan must be signed and dated, and bear the following certificate: "I hereby certify that this plan was plotted and drawn by myself, from surveys made by myself, and that the accom-

panying field-books and computations are my own work."

12. If the requirements of the last-preceding clause of these regulations are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the Secretary shall forward to the candidate at least fourteen days before the date of the examination a least fourteen days before the date of the examination a notice in writing authorising him to present himself for examination at a time and place to be specified in the notice. A fee of one guinea shall be payable by the candidate in respect of such notice, and unless the fee is paid to the Secretary at least seven days before the day appointed for the examination the candidate will not be permitted to sit. Upon payment of such fee the Secretary shall forward the candidate's name to the Supervisor.

Examination.

13. The subjects for examination shall be as follows: (1.) Construction, manipulation, adjustment, and use of

instruments, including the following:

(a.) Theodolite, plane and transit;

(b.) Levelling instruments;

Prismatic compass;

Sextant;

Measuring-bands, and their use in base-(e.) Measuring-bands, and their use in clines and ordinary measurement.

(2.) Principles and practice of land-surveying:—

(a.) Methods of field practice;

(b.) The keeping of field-books;

(c.) Laying out country for settlement;

(d.) Laying-out of roads, including curves;

(e.) Pegging and marking.

(3.) Trigonometrical surveys:-

(a.) Methods of calculating triangles;
(b.) Polygonal and ray-trace triangulation;
(c.) Trigonometrical heights;

(d.) Barometric heights;
(d.) Barometric heights;
(e.) Marking of trig. stations;
(f.) Topographical surveys.
(4.) Computations connected with surveying:—

(a.) Reductions of traverses; (b.) Elimination of discrepancies in measure-

ments and angles;

(c.) Computations of road-angles and -sides; (d.) Computations of areas, regular and irregular.

(5.) Levelling and measurement of earthwork.
(6.) Determination of latitude, true meridian and convergence of meridians.

(7.) Construction of maps and plans:—

(a.) Projection of maps;

(b.) Compilation of maps from detached plans;

(c.) Plotting from co-ordinates, and by protractor and scale.

(8.) Drawing:

(a.) Mechanical work of map and plan drawing;
(b.) Hill drawing and shading;
(c.) Writing.

(9.) The Survey Regulations, the sections of Acts referring to surveys, and the form and contents of certificates required on plans by law.

14. The examination in each subject shall be vivâ voce or in writing, as the Board from time to time determines.

15. (1.) Instruments required by the Survey Regulations

in writing, as the Board from time to time determines.

15. (1.) Instruments required by the Survey Regulations must be produced to the Supervisor at the time of the examination; and, where practicable, an examination of the candidates' work shall be made in the field.

(2.) At the time of examination each candidate must provide himself with a book of logarithms, scales, parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances except paper.

16. On conclusion of the examination, all papers connected therewith, and the data on which they are based, shall be forthwith sealed up by the Supervisor and transmitted to the Secretary of the Board of Examiners at Wellington. The Board shall then meet to consider each case. The Supervisor shall forward a separate report in each case on Supervisor shall forward a separate report in each case on

17. The Board shall fix a value to each subject of the examination, and determine the percentage of the marks required to obtain a pass in each subject.

18. In the event of a candidate failing to pass at the first

examination, the Board may, at its discretion, allow him to come up at the next examination, and may determine the special subjects in which he must pass on the second occasion.

19. Upon passing the examination to the satisfaction of the Board, and upon payment of a fee of £2 2s. (in addition to the fee of £1 1s. payable under clause 12 of these regulations), the candidate shall be entitled to a certificate to be issued by the Board under the hands of the Chairman and one other member thereof in the form following, that is to say: is to say :-

(b.) That, being the holder of a license or certificate as surveyor granted by any institute or authority outside New Zealand recognised by the Board as sufficient, he has practised as a surveyor or a surveyor's assistant in New Zealand for at least six months, and is familiar with the Survey Regulations; or

(c.) That he has practised as a surveyor or a surveyor's

(c.) That he has practised as a surveyor or a surveyor's assistant in New Zealand for not less than eight years, possesses adequate practical professional knowledge and skill, and is familiar with the

Survey Regulations:

Provided that no application under this sub-clause (c) shall be granted after the 1st day of March, 1898.

(2.) In order to satisfy itself that the applicant under sub-clauses (b) or (c) of this clause is familiar with the Survey Regulations, or, as the case may be, that the applicant under subclause (c) possesses adequate practical professional knowledge and skill, the Board may require him to undergo such examination as it thinks fit.

(3.) Such certificate shall be signed on behalf of the Board by the Chairman and one other member thereof, and shall

23. (1.) If at any time the Board has reason to believe that any person, whilst the holder of a certificate of competency, has been guilty of unprofessional conduct, or of conduct calculated to bring discredit on the profession, it may call on such person for an explanation; and, if no satisfactory explanation is given, it may report the matter to the Minister of Lands, who, on the recommendation of the Board, and after holding such inquiry as he thinks fit, may, by notice in the Gazette, revoke the certificate.

(2.) The Board shall make entry of every such revocation in the aforesaid register.

24. The names of all surveyors who receive certificates in accordance with these regulations shall be published in the New Zealand Gazette from time to time by the Board.

25. All fees received under these regulations shall be paid into the Public Account, and form part of the Consoli-

dated Fund.

26. The Secretary's salary and all other expenses incurred by the Board shall be paid out of moneys appropriated by Parliament for that purpose.

2. Each applicant on expiry of the period named shall submit a detailed and accurate statement of the actual cost incurred in testing his scheme.

On the expiry of the period named the committee shall as soon as convenient thereafter (should they deem it necessary) make a personal inspection of each applicant's allot-ment, and shall take into consideration—

1. The actual cost incurred by each applicant in testing his scheme for the period above mentioned.

2. The result of the work done on each allotment.

On completion of the tests the committee shall furnish a report to the Minister on all the schemes which they have examined or tested, and shall state-

1. The scheme which they consider on the whole the most practical, efficient, and economic; and if they consider such scheme worthy of the bonus.

2. Whether, in the event of no one scheme being entitled to the whole bonus, they deem any one worthy of a part, and, if so, how much.

The committee has power to withhold all awards if they think none of the schemes submitted of sufficient importance to merit a bonus.

If any machine sent from beyond the colony is awarded the bonus or part thereof, then the cost of bringing such machine shall be borne by the Government.

The committee shall supply a sufficient and equal quantity of green hemp to each machine or process as a test.
The committee shall take into consideration—

baling; The percentage of dressed fibre and tow produced by each machine or process;

The cost of producing the same; The cost of the machine, and the simplicity and dura-

bility of the working parts.

On completion of the tests the committee shall furnish a report to the Minister on all the machines or processes which

they have examined or tested, and shall state,—

(1.) The machine or process which they consider on the whole the most efficient and economic.

(2.) Whether they consider that any machine or process tested so materially reduces the cost of production, or improves the product, as to be worthy of the whole bonus or of a part only.

By-laws of Hawera County Council regulating Traffic on Roads.

Py-LAWS of the County of Hawera, made in pursuance of the power conferred in that behalf by "The Counties Act, 1886," and "The Public Works Act, 1894," and "The Public Works and Government Railways Acts Amendment Act, 1895"; to come into force upon the 1st day of January, 1896.

In these by-laws, if not inconsistent with or repugnant to

"The county" means the Hawera County as constituted under "The Counties Act, 1886":

"The Council" means the Hawera County Council:
"County Clerk" or "Clerk" means the Clerk of the
Hawera County Council:
"Road" or "public road" means any road, street,

thoroughfare, or way of a public nature, or used by the public as of right:
"Public place" means and includes every road, street, footpath, court, alley, or thoroughfare of a public nature, or open or used by the public as of right, and every receive and place of recreation or very and every reserve and place of recreation or resort so open or used: "Footpath" or "footway" means a space formed or set apart on the side of any road or street or else-

where for the use of the foot-passengers:

"Chairman" or "County Chairman" means the Chairman of the Hawera County:

"Vehicle" means and includes all classes of structures and machines on wheels drawn by any animal or animals, or drawn or propelled by locomotive or other nower: other power

"Tires" means those portions of the wheels of vehicles

which when used on an ordinary road come into contact with and bear uniformly upon the ground: "Cattle" shall mean and include any horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, and foal, and any bull, cow, ox, steer, heifer, and calf, and any ram, ewe, wether, and lamb, and any mule, ass, goat, boar, sow, or other nig.

other pig: "Junker" shall include a vehicle whereon logs or unsawn timber are commonly carried.

-Offences on Roads and Public Places.

Any person guilty of any of the following offences, nuisances, or neglects within the County of Hawera shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds sterling (£5) for each separate offence.

1. No person shall drive or ride across any bridge upon any public road with any horse or with any vehicle faster

than a walking pace.

2. No person shall drive, lead, or take any cattle or horses across or upon any bridge upon any public road at a pace faster than a walking pace.

No person shall use any road by the traction thereon of a junker unless the tire of each wheel thereof shall be at

least twelve (12) inches in width.

4. No person in charge of or driving any junker on a road shall allow or permit any portion of such junker when in motion other than the wheels, or any portion of the load thereon, to touch or come in contact with such road.

II. - Width of Tires of Wheels.

1. The width of the tires of all vehicles using any road in the Hawers County shall be regulated in proportion to the load on such vehicle, not including the weight of such

vehicle, according to the scale set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and every owner or driver or other person in charge of any vehicle on any such road the whole weight on which shall exceed that specified and provided for in the said First Schedule shall be liable to a penalty not exceed-

ing five pounds sterling (£5).

2. It shall be lawful for any person acting under the authority of the Council, or for any policeman or constable, to stop any vehicle affected by By-law No. II., 1, when on any such road, and to examine and measure the width of the tires of the wheels of such vehicle, and to measure and compute the weight of the load on such vehicle on the scale set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or otherwise; and every owner or driver or person in charge of such vehicle, after such measuring and examination shall have been lawfully required, refusing to permit such measuring or examination, or in any way hindering or obstructing the same, shall for any such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds sterling (£5).

3. Every owner, driver, or other person in charge of any vehicle conveying a greater weight than allowed by the scale set forth in the Second Schedule hereto shall prima facie be deemed guilty of an offence under By-law No. II., 1, hereof.

III .- Heavy Traffic on Roads.

"Heavy traffic" means,—

(a.) The transportation of any vehicle, engine, or machine which shall itself, or together with any thing or things being transported thereon, weigh more than one and a half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ tons avoirdupois to

each pair of wheels.
(b.) The traction of any vehicle or thing by means of bullocks, notwithstanding that such vehicle or thing may separately or together with any load thereon weigh less than one and a half (1½) tons

avoirdupois.

Heavy traffic of all kinds shall cease during the months

of May, June, July, August, and September.

2. Before any vehicle which shall itself or together with thing or things being transported thereon weigh more than three (3) tons avoirdupois to each pair of wheels shall go upon or pass over any bridge at or near the approaches to which the notice in the terms set forth at the foot hereof or in similar terms shall be posted, the driver or other person in charge of such vehicle shall first lay down on such bridge planks or ways of sufficient length and width, and not less than three (3) inches in thickness, for the purpose of dis-tributing as equally as possible the weight of such vehicle over the whole surface of such bridge; and no such vehicle shall be taken upon or across such bridge save on ways or planks; and immediately after the passage of such vehicle over such bridge the driver or other person in charge of such vehicle shall remove such planks or ways.

This bridge must not be used by any vehicle which shall itself, or together with any thing or things being transported thereon, weigh more than three (3) tons avoirdupois to each pair of wheels, save under By-law No. III., 2, of the Council's by-laws.
