A PROCLAMATION.

A PROCLAMATION.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Mining Act, 1891" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby revoke the Proclamation constituting the Otago Mining District, published in the New Zealand Gazette, No. 42, of the thirteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the colony particularly described in the Schedule hereto shall be the Mining District of Otago under the said Act, with the boundaries in the said Schedule under the said Act, with the boundaries in the said Schedule mentioned; and I do hereby further proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect as from the twentyfirst day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

Station D to a point due north of the north-eastern corner of Section No. 2, Block VI., Kauroo Survey District aforesaid; again towards the east by a straight line to the said corner; again towards the south and east by Section No. 2 aforesaid to Section No. 7 of the said Block VI.; thence again towards the south and west, and again towards the south and east, by the said Section No. 7 to Section No. 5, Block XV., Otepopo Survey District; thence again towards the east, north-east, north-west, and south-west, by the said Section No. 7 aforesaid; thence again towards the north by Section No. 7 aforesaid; thence again towards the north by Section No. 7 said; thence again towards the north by Section No. 7 aforesaid to Section No. 9, Block XV., Otepopo Survey District; thence again towards the east and north by the said Section No. 9 to Section No. 2 of the said Block XV.; thence again towards the east and north by the said Section No. 2

Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's

THREE scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for the years, are offered for competition. One of these scholarships, to be called the senior scholarship, is open to all Maoris under sixteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination; the other

two scholarships are junior scholarships, and are open to all Maoris under fifteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination who have not been pupils at Te Aute or St. Stephen's, and whose attendance preceding the date of the examination who have act pupils at Te Aute or St. Stephen's, and whose attendance at school during the previous year is considered by the Inspector of Native Schools to have been satisfactory. The senior scholarship is offered for competition among Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Native Schools Code, 1893, and in the supplementary regulations that have been sent out to all teachers. Candidates for the junior scholarships will be examined in the subjects specified for Standard IV. in the Native Schools Code, 1893. The questions will, however, be more difficult than those set for the standard examinations. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 21st and 22nd December, 1896. 22nd December, 1896.

Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present themselves for examination. Such notice must be posted not later than the 31st October next.

Deaths occurring at hospitals have been omitted, except where deceased had previously resided in one or other of the above boroughs, in which case the death is counted against the borough of residence.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 350, against 309 in February, an increase of 41. The deaths in March were 165, a decrease of 38 on the number in February. Of the total deaths, males contributed 87; females, 78. Sixty-seven of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 40 61 per cent. of the whole number; 63 of these were under 1 year of age. There were 18 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: three men, 70, 76, 81, and three women, 66, 76, 89, died at Auckland; two men, 70, 76, at Wellington; five men, 65, 73, 75, 76, 77, and one woman, 68, at Christ-church; three men, 67, 70, 77, and one woman, 85, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the death-rate for last month at all four centres. The rates for March are,-

Specific Febrile and Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths at the four centres and suburbs from this class of diseases fell from 67 in February to 40 in March, the mortality from diarrhœal complaints being only 29 deaths, against 49 in the previous month. Of these 29 deaths from cholera, diarrhœa, and dysentery, 13 were at Auckland, 1 at Wellington, 10 at Christchurch, and 5 at Dunedin.

Miasmatic diseases caused 9 deaths, against 15 in February. Diphtheria is found at Auckland, and influenza at Christchurch and Dunedin (one death in each case), and there were 3 deaths from typhoid fever at Auckland, 2 at Christchurch and Dunedin (one death in each case), and there were 3 deaths from typhoid fever at Auckland, 2 at Christ-

church, and 1 at Dunedin.

The above, with 2 deaths from septicæmia, complete the total of the class.

Constitutional Diseases.—There were 33 deaths in March, being the same number as in February. Cancer caused 12 deaths, the seat of the disease being the breast, uterus, stomach, larynx, liver, and lungs. There were 15 deaths from phthisis.

Local Diseases.—The total deaths was 66: 19 were from diseases of the nervous system, 12 from diseases of the circulatory system, 8 from diseases of the respiratory system, 15 from diseases of the digestive system, 1 from disease of lymphatic system, 6 from disease of the urinary system, 3 from disease of the reproductive system, and 1 from disease of integuments

Violent Deaths.—Two were accidental, and 4 suicidal. A labourer was killed by a marble slab falling on him, and a girl of thirteen years by a tram-car. A miner shot himself, and a labourer died from the effects of hæmorrhage from a self-inflicted stab. A woman, sixty-four years of age, poisoned herself with "Rough on Rats," and a labourer hanged himself.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
