Vesting Management of Waiuku Wharf in Waiuku Road

#### GLASGOW, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fifteenth day of June, 1896.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section fourteen of "The Harbours Act, 1878," it is enacted that the Governor in Council

VV 1878," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may vest the management of any wharf the property of Her Majesty in any local governing body or person upon such terms and conditions as the Governor in Council thinks fit:

And whereas it is provided by the seventeenth section of the said Act that in and by such Order in Council it may be prescribed what dues and rates shall be taken by the body or person in whom any such wharf shall be vested as aforesaid:

said:

And whereas it is thought desirable to vest the management of the wharf at Waiuku in the Waiuku Road Board, on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, and to prescribe that the dues and rates specified in the Schedule hereto shall be charged and taken, on and after the date of this Order in Council, for the use of the said wharf:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in

pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said fourteenth and seventeenth sections of "The Harbours Act, 1878," and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby vest the management of the Waiuku Wharf, which is nereby vest the management of the Waiuku Wharf, which is shown on plan marked M.D. 1497, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington, in the Waiuku Road Board, subject to the following conditions; and doth hereby prescribe that the dues and rates specified in the Schedule hereto shall be charged and taken on and after the date of this Order in Council for the use of the said

#### Conditions.

1. That all Her Majesty's subjects shall, at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf, and of ingress

times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf, and of ingress and egress thereon.

2. That Her Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the wharf without payment.

3. That the said Road Board shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf, and all erections on the wharf, in good order and repair; and shall at all times permit to be erected and exhibited therefrom any lights for the guidance of vessels, and shall maintain at its own cost any such lights: Provided that no new light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Marine Department.

4. That any person authorised by the Minister having Charge of the Marine Department, or any officer acting with his approval, may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf, and any buildings erected thereon, and view the state of repair thereof; and that, upon his leaving at or posting to the last known address of the said Board a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings, requiring the Board, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the said Board shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

5. That the said Board shall not erect, or suffer to be erected, on the said Board shall not erect, or suffer to be erected, on the said Board shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharf, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the thirty-first day of March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account when balanced to the Marine Department, and shall

shall cause such account to be balanced to the thirty-first day of March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account when balanced to the Marine Department, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the Marine Department.

7. That nothing herein contained shall authorise the said Board to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations thereunder.

8. That the rights, powers and privileges conferred by this

8. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in

computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime altered, modified, or revoked.

9. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor on giving to the said Board six calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Governor or the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, or any person acting under his or their instructions, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the said Board, their successors or assigns. No compensation or allowance shall be payable in such case.

10. The Board shall be liable for any injury which the

10. The Board shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on its part.

11. In case the Board shall—

11. In case the Board shall—

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or

(2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf,
then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council,
and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and
determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to
the Board or other proceeding whatsoever, and publication
in the New Zealand Gazette of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Board ing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Board and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined.

(3.) Whether, in the event of no one machine or process being entitled to the whole bonus they deem any

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 334, against 377 in April, a decrease of 43. The deaths in May were 150, a decrease of 22 on the number in April. Of the total deaths, males contributed 72; females, 78. Forty-two of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 28 per cent. of the whole number; 33 of these were under 1 year of age. There were 31 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: six men, 65 (two), 74, 78, 86 (two), and four women, 75, 80 (two), 81, died at Auckland; one man, 75, and four women, 68, 73, 76, 78, at Wellington; five men, 70, 75, 76 (two), and two women, 65, 82, at Christchurch; and four men, 71, 77, 81, 82, and six women, 65, 66 (two), 69, 74 (two), at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the death-rate for last month at Auckland, Wellington, and Christchurch. The rates for May are,—

Specific Febrile and Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths from these diseases fell from 42 in April to 18 in May. From miasmatic diseases there were only 7 deaths, against 19 in the previous month. Influenza caused 4 deaths, diphtheria 1, and typhoid fever only 2. From diarrhocal diseases the decline in the mortality is from 21 deaths in April to 9 in May, 8 of which are found at Auckland. There was 1 death from syphilis, and 1 from stricture of the urethra.

Constitutional Diseases.—The total deaths increased from 31 in April to 36 in May. There were 16 deaths from phthisis. Cancer caused 13 deaths, the disease being found in the stomach, uterus, rectum, mamura, omentum, back, bowel, tongue, and lungs.

Local Diseases.—Of 78 deaths in May, 16 were from diseases of the nervous system, including 3 cases of apoplexy, 3 of paralysis, and 6 of convulsions. There were also 16 deaths from diseases of the circulatory system, 14 being from heart-disease and syncope, 1 from aneurism, and 1 from embolism. Diseases of the respiratory system, including croup, bronchitis, pneumonia, and pleurisy, numbered 21. Diseases of the digestive and urinary systems contributed 19 deaths, which, with 5 deaths from diseases of the reproductive system and 1 of the organs of locomotion, complete the class.

Violent Deaths.—These comprised 3 accidents. A child was killed by a cart-wheel going over his body, a carpenter by concussion of brain, the result of a scaffold giving way, and a male of 45 years was found drowned.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
