WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and revoke regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, which said regulations shall have force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein: And whereas by Order in Council dated the nineteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, certain regulations were made in exercise and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, giving control and management to the North Canterbury Acclimatisation Society of all salmon and trout therein or thereafter to be placed in the lakes in the district to which such regulations relate, and for such purpose to divide the lakes in the said district, with the exception of Lake Ellesmere, into suitable areas, with power to let the right of fishing such areas as in such regulations mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to extend such regulations so as to include the right of fishing Lake Ellesmere in the area which may be let by this Society in the same manner as the areas mentioned in the said regulations:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said Act, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulation, in lieu of and in substitution for Regulation No. 15 in the said Order in Council—namely,—

REGULATION. WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884"

REGULATION.

The regulations contained in Order in Council of the nineteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety (hereinafter called "the said regulations"), shall not prevent fishing, with nets of the regulation size or sizes, for flounders, or mullet, or other indigenous fish, in Lake Ellesmere, outside a radius of one mile from the middle of the Rivers Selwyn and Irwell, Hall's Creek, and Halswell and Kaituna Streams, at the places where those rivers, streams, and creek flow into the said lake at low water ordinary spring-tides. And for the purpose of the said regulations the mouth of the River Heathcote shall be deemed to be at the Heathcote Swing-bridge, situate on the main road between Heathcote Swing-bridge, situate on the main road between Christchurch and Sumner; and the mouth of the River Avon shall be deemed to be at the southern end of the island in that river lying opposite section numbered 11212 in the Christchurch Survey District. Nor shall they apply to that portion of the River Waimakariri east of a straight line drawn at right angles to the course of the said river and across the said river from the coston correct production. said river from the eastern corner of rural section numbered 1393 in the Mandeville Survey District, the said corner of rural section numbered 1993 being two miles or thereabouts in an easterly direction from the main bridge over the River Waimakariri and the Town of Kaiapoi.

REGULATIONS.

1. No scrim or whitebait net shall be used as a set-net, or be set or placed in openings made in the banks of rivers or streams, or in dams constructed therein; and no scrim hand-net having an opening of more than five square feet shall be used for the purpose of catching whitebait: Provided that nothing in this regulation shall render it unlawful to take whitebait by means of set-nets having an opening of not more than seven square feet during the period from the fifteenth day of September to the twenty-fourth day of October in each year.

2. Any person committing a breach of the above regulation shall be liable to a penalty of not less than one pound and not exceeding twenty pounds.

3. Nothing in these regulations contained shall be deemed or construed to affect or interfere with the operation of any or construed to affect or interfere with the operation of any regulations for the time being in force under "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," in relation to the taking or fishing for salmon or trout in the said waters.
