N pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities rested in me by "The Mining Act, 1891" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby revoke the Proclamation constituting the Otago Mining District, published in the New Zealand Gazette, No. 64, of the nineteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and

ninety-six, and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the colony particularly described in the Schedule hereto shall be the Mining District of Otago under the said Act, with the boundaries in the said Schedule mentioned; and I do hereby further proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect as from the ninth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-

OTAGO MINING DISTRICT.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by section two of "The Mining Act 1891 Amendment Act, 1894," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, did on the twenty-ninth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, make certain regulations for granting assistance towards prospecting at regulations for granting assistance towards prospecting at deep levels and otherwise, and such regulations were gazetted on the same day: And whereas it is expedient to make

deep levels and otherwise, and such regulations were gazetted on the same day: And whereas it is expedient to make further regulations in the same behalf:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council aforesaid, doth hereby make the following additional regulations for granting assistance towards prospecting at deep levels and otherwise, as mentioned in the aforesaid section two, and doth hereby declare that they shall form part of, and be read together with, the regulations made as aforesaid on the twenty-ninth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

REGULATIONS.

1. The terms and conditions subject to which assistance may be given for any of the purposes referred to in section 2 of "The Mining Act 1891 Amendment Act, 1894," shall be such as the Minister thinks fit to prescribe, not being inconsistent with that Act or the regulations for the time being in

2. The Minister may require such terms and conditions as aforesaid to be embodied in a written instrument of contract, which shall be executed by the applicant or his assignee of the one part and the Minister, on behalf of Her Majesty, of

the other part.

3. Such instrument shall in every case expressly state that all moneys payable by Her Majesty thereunder shall be subject to the appropriation of Parliament.

4. Such terms and conditions as aforesaid may, in the

case of assistance toward prospecting deep levels, include,

case of assistance toward prospecting deep levels, include, inter alia, the following:—

(a.) That the shaft shall be of such size and shape, and shall be sunk to such depth (not exceeding a depth of 2,000ft.), as the Minister prescribes.

(b.) That due provision shall be made to the satisfaction of the Minister whereby all persons may at all reasonable times have free access to the shaft and workings for the nurnose of constructing drainage. workings for the purpose of constructing drainage-levels, and otherwise availing themselves of such

shaft and workings for the purposes of drainage.

(c.) That the plant and machinery shall be manufactured and erected subject to the approval, supervision, and inspection of such person (whether an Inspector of Mines or not) as the Minister appoints in that behalf, and when erected shall have such minimum pumping-capacity (not exceeding 2,000 gallons of water per minute) from such depth (not exceeding 2,000ft.) as the Minister prescribes.

prescribes.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 404, against 367 in August, an increase of 37. The deaths in September were 155, a decrease of 5 on the number in August. Of the total deaths, males contributed 93, females 62. Forty-three of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 27.74 per cent. of the whole number; 29 of these were under 1 year of age. There were 36 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: eight men, 68 (two), 73, 76, 78 (two), 82, and two women, 65, 67, died at Auckland; six men, 65, 67, 75, 76, 80 (two), and five women, 65 (two), 70 (two), 97, at Wellington; two men, 72, 78, and three women, 67, 76, 80, at Christchurch; and nine men, 66, 69, 71 (three), 72 (two), 73, 81, and one woman, 72, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the death-rate for last month at Dunedin, but raises it at Auckland and Christchurch; Wellington remains the same. The rates for September are,—

Specific Febrile and Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths at the four cities, with suburbs, fell from 15 in August to 13 in September. Influenza caused most deaths (4); these were all at Dunedin. Whooping cough was fatal at Wellington, and also at Christchurch—one death at both places. Diphtheria is found at Auckland and Wellington—one death each. The mortality from diarrhœal diseases was very low, being confined to one death at Christchurch and another at Dunedin. The above, with two deaths from syphilis and one from erysipelas, make up the total.

Constitutional Diseases.—The deaths numbered 33, against 37 in August. There were 14 deaths from phthisis, and 10 from cancer last month.

Local Diseases.—These numbered 86, against 80 in the previous month. Deaths from diseases of the nervous system were 22, of the circulatory system 14, of the respiratory system 23, of the digestive system 16, of the urinary system 8, of the reproductive system 2, and of the integumentary system 1.

Violent Deaths.—These were 7 accidental and 1 suicidal. A gardener fell from a cliff and broke his neck; a commission agent jumped from a tram in motion and was killed; a woman died from accidental burning; a child was poisoned by eating heads of phosphorus matches; 2 mariners were accidentally drowned; a barman died from exposure; and a commission agent poisoned himself while temporarily insane.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
