Bonus for Production of Mineral Manure.—Notice No. 454.

Department of Agriculture, Wellington, 25th July, 1896.

BONUS of £200 is hereby offered for the discovery and working within the colony of a deposit or deposits of marketable mineral manure.

The following are the conditions under which the bonus is offered and will be paid:—

1. That the raw material be easily accessible, and within reasonable distance of a road or railway.

2. That the person appointed by the Minister for Agriculture.

2. That the person appointed by the Minister for Agriculture to examine the deposit is satisfied that there is sufficient to meet all ordinary demands for five years.

3. That at least 200 tons of such manure have been disposed of at a price which will allow of its being remuneratively used for agricultural purposes, and that a further supply can be placed on the market at the same price.

4. That, if the deposit be mineral coprolites, it shall contain by analysis at least 20 per cent. of phosphoric acid.

5. That, if the deposit be mineral apatites, it shall contain by analysis at least 25 per cent. of phosphoric acid.

Bonuses for Encouragement of New Zealand Hemp (Phormium tenax) Industry.—Notice No. 430.

Department of Agriculture, Wellington, 1st November, 1895. Bonus No. 1.

BONUS of £1,750 is offered for a machine or process A for dressing New Zealand hemp (Phormium tenax) which shall be an improvement on the machines or processes now in use, and which shall, after trial, be found to materially reduce the cost of production, improve the product, or increase the quantity of dressed fibre.

The following are the conditions:-

1. All applications for the bonus must be sent addressed to the Hon. the Minister for Agriculture, Wellington, and must reach him not later than the 31st March, 1897. Each application must be accompanied by a description of the machine or process, particularly stating improvements on present machines or processes, and also the cost at which the machine or process can be supplied.

present machines or processes, and also the cost at the machine or process can be supplied.

2. The applicants must be prepared to submit their machines or processes to examination at such time and place as the Government may direct.

3. The Government shall appoint a committee of three or more experts, to whom all applications shall be submitted.

Such committee shall after perusal, state what machines or more experts, to whom all applications shall be submitted. Such committee shall, after perusal, state what machines or processes they deem worthy of consideration, and may inspect the same at any place within the colony; and, having so inspected the whole or any of them, may direct that the whole or any of them be brought for further trial to such place as they may think fit.

The cost of bringing the machines or appliances on to the ground, from within the colony, supplying the necessary shafting, motive-power, and buildings, to be defrayed by the Government. If any machine sent from beyond the colony is awarded the bonus or part thereof, then the cost of bringing such machine shall be borne by the Government.

The following shall be the basis of the test:—

The following shall be the basis of the test:—
The committee shall supply a sufficient and equal quantity of green hemp to each machine or process as a test.
The committee shall take into consideration—
The time occupied by each machine or process in the

operation

The cost of labour and time required after the fibre has left the machine or process before it is ready for baling:

The percentage of dressed fibre and tow produced by each machine or process;
The cost of producing the same;
The cost of the machine, and the simplicity and dura-

bility of the working parts.

On completion of the tests the committee shall furnish a report to the Minister on all the machines or processes which they have examined or tested, and shall state,

(1.) The machine or process which they consider on the

whole the most efficient and economic.

(2.) Whether they consider that any machine or process

(2.) Whether they consider that any machine or process tested so materially reduces the cost of production, or improves the product, as to be worthy of the whole bonus or of a part only.
(3.) Whether, in the event of no one machine or process being entitled to the whole bonus, they deem any machine or process worthy of a part of the bonus, and if so how much and, if so, how much.

A bonus of £250 is offered for a process of utilising the waste products of the hemp.

Bonus for the Manufacture of Potassium Cyanide.

OTICE is hereby given that a bonus of £1,000 will be
paid for the erection of a plant and the manufacture
in New Zealand of the first 200 tons of crude cyanide of potassium from colonial produce.

1. The plant must be capable of producing at least 70 tons of crude cyanide of potassium annually.

2. The crude cyanide of potassium so manufactured shall contain at least 70 per cent. of potassium cyanide.

3. The bonus will be paid in two equal instalments, the

3. The bonus will be paid in two equal instalments, the first instalment being payable on the production of the first 100 tons, and the second instalment on the production of the second 100 tons, of crude cyanide of potassium containing the required percentage of potassium cyanide.

4. On the completion of the plant, notice in writing must be sent to the Minister of Industries and Commerce, Wellington, who will appoint an officer to inspect the same, together with the raw material then available from which the cyanide of potassium is proposed to be manufactured.

5. The officer so appointed shall from time to time inspect the process of manufacture, in order that he may satisfy himself that the whole of the cyanide of potassium is being manufactured from material of New Zealand production; and before any bonus is paid such officer will be required to certify that he is satisfied the crude cyanide of potassium and before any bonus is paid such officer will be required to certify that he is satisfied the crude cyanide of potassium is the product of New Zealand material only, and that it contains the required percentage of potassium cyanide.

6. The bonus must be claimed for the first 100 tons on or before the 31st March, 1897, and for the second 100 tons on or before the 30th September, 1898.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 363, against 320 in November, an increase of 43. The deaths in December were 146, an increase of 30 on the number in November. Of the total deaths, males contributed 88, females 58. Thirty-one of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 21.23 per cent. of the whole number; 24 of these were under 1 year of age. There were 26 deaths of person of 65 years and upwards: four men, 66, 67, 77, 79, and two women, 70, 72, died at Auckland; seven men, 65 (two), 67, 72, 77, 85, 86, and two women, 69, 77, at Wellington; three men, 66, 68, 75, at Christchurch; and five men, 66, 71, 75, 76, 86, and three women, 76, 80, 23, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the death rate for last month at Auckland, Wellington, and Christchurch, but raises it at Dunedin. The rates for December are,—

Specific Febrile and Zymotic Diseases.—There were 17 deaths at the four chief towns, with their suburbs, in December, against 5 in the previous month. Diarrhead diseases caused 6 deaths in December, all at Auckland. Influenza was fatal in 4 cases, 1 death being at Wellington, 2 at Christchurch, and 1 at Dunedin. Three deaths resulted from typhoid fever—1 at Auckland and 2 at Dunedin. There were besides 1 death (at Wellington) from diphtheria, and 3 deaths from syphilis and stricture.

Parasitic Diseases.—One death from hydatids is observed, against 1 in November.

Constitutional Diseases.—The mortality for December (47 deaths) was much higher than in November, when the deaths were only 30. From cancer there were no fewer than 24 deaths—7 at Auckland, 9 at Wellington, 4 at Christchurch, and 4 at Dunedin. Phthisis contributed 15 deaths; other tubercular diseases, 3; diabetes, 2; and rheumatism, with rheumatic

gout, 3.

Local Diseases.—These numbered 59 altogether: 18 being from diseases of the nervous system (5 apoplexy, 4 meningitis);

Violent Deaths.—These were 6, all the result of accidents. A carter was killed by his horse falling on him, a labourer y falling from a ladder, and another by a fall of earth; a butcher and an adult female were drowned; and an infant died

from difficult birth.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific The subjected table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
