1. THE Proclamation published in *Gazette* No. 3, of the seventeenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, relative to recruiting for the Permanent Forces, is hereby cancelled, and the following substituted in lieu thereof :-

In selecting recruits for the Artillery (No. 1 Company, Permanent Militia) and Torpedo Corps (No. 2 Company, Permanent Militia), preference will be given to members of the Volunteer Force who are between eighteen and twenty-eight years of age, and have at least one year's efficient service at the time of making their application. Exception will be made in the case of special artificers, engineers, elec-tricians, tradesmen, or men who have served in Her Majesty's naval or military forces. naval or military forces.

racter, one of which must be from the commanding officer of the corps in which they are serving. 5. On being informed that he has been appointed, the candidate will report himself for enrolment at the Mount Cook Barracks, Buckle Street, Wellington, within twenty-one days, otherwise the vacancy will be offered to the next on the list, and he will be held to have forfeited his appoint-ment, unless in case of certified sickness, when he may be replaced at the head of the list within three months if then fit for service. fit for service

6. Candidates for appointment who do not receive intimation that they are to join the Forces before the first of January next after the date on which they made their original application are to renew such application. These further applications are to reach the officers named in paragraph four before the first of February in each year.

7. In the event of a candidate failing to renew his applica-tion, as in paragraph six, his name will be struck off the list of those desirous of employment in the Permanent Force. 8. The minimum height for the Artillery is five feet nine

WHEREAS by section fourteen of "The Native Land Court Act, 1894," it is enacted that the Native Land Court shall, as regards all lands within the meaning of sub-section ten of section fourteen aforesaid, have jurisdiction as in the said subsection mentioned : Provided that the Court shall not proceed to exercise such jurisdiction unless the Governor in Council shall by order authorise the same to be done : to be done :

And whereas the land specified in the Schedule hereto is land in respect whereof the Court has jurisdiction as afore-said, and it is expedient that the Court should be authorised

to exercise the same: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby authorise the said Court to exersaid colony, doth hereby authorise the said Court to exer-cise in respect of the said land the jurisdiction conferred as aforesaid—that is to say, to determine whether or not the said land or any part thereof was, on the investigation of title thereto, intended by the Native Land Court, or by the nominal owner or owners of such land, to be held by such nominal owner or owners in trust for Natives not named in the title, and to determine who are the Natives (if any) entitled beneficially to such land, and to order the inclusion of such Natives in the title, either together with or in lieu of the nominal owners or any of them, and for the purpose aforesaid to order the cancellation or together with or in lieu of the nominal owners or any of them, and for the purpose aforesaid to order the cancellation or amendment of any existing instrument of title, and the issue of such new Crown grants or other instruments of title as may be necessary, and generally to exercise in respect of the said land all the jurisdiction and powers conferred on the Native Land Court by subsection ten of section fourteen of "The Native Land Court Act, 1894."

HENRY FABER BROWN (hereinafter referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say, — 1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Monday in each month, at half-past seven o'clock p.m., at the Woodbury Schoolhouse, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the fifth day of April one thousand eight hundred and ninety, seven of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the mem-bers may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

Regulations for the Inspection, &c., of Milk and Dairies, Christchurch District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-second day of February, 1897. **Present**:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

COUNCIL. WHEREAS by the third section of "The Public Health Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1881," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make such regulations as he shall think fit for the following purposes, or any of them, and so that such regulations may either be of general application throughout the whole colony, or may only apply to one or more districts,— (1.) For the registration with the Local Board of all are

- (1) For the registration with the Local Board of all persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk;
- (2.) For the appointment of Inspectors of milk and dairies ;
- dairies;
  (3.) For the inspection of cattle in dairies, and for prescribing and regulating the lighting, ventilation, cleansing, drainage, and water-supply of dairies, and cowsheds, and yards in the occupation of persons following the trade of cowkeepers or dairymen, or used by them in connection with such occupation;
  (4.) For securing the cleanliness of milk-shops, milk-stores, and of milk-vessels used for containing milk for sale by such persons;
- milk for sale by such persons;
- (5.) For prescribing precautions to be taken for protect ing milk against infection or contamination, and for prohibiting the sale of milk in cases where the public health would be likely to be endangered by such sale;
- (6.) For authorising Local Boards to make regulations for the purposes aforesaid, or any of them, sub-ject to such conditions, if any, as the Governor in Council may prescribe: And whereas it is desirable that regulations should be made

for the aforesaid purposes, such regulations to be in force in the districts hereinafter mentioned :

the districts hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities contained in the above-recited Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling him in this behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the regulations hereinafter set forth, and doth hereby declare that such regulations shall, on and after the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, apply to and be in force in the following districts, namely : following districts, namely :-

City of Christehurch,	Borough of Sumner,
Borough of St. Albans,	Road District of Heathcote,
Borough of Sydenham,	Road District of Riccarton,
Borough of Linwood,	Road District of Halswell,
Borough of Woolston,	Road District of Spreydon.

### REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations the following words and expressions shall have the meaning hereby assigned to them, unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction :-

- "Local Board" means the Local Board of Health con-stituted by "The Public Health Act, 1876":
- "District" means the area comprised within the juris-
- diction of a Local Board :
  "Inspector" means any person appointed by any Local Board to act as the inspector of dairies, cowsheds, and milk-shops or stores, and shall include any person to whom the Inspector may, with the consent of the Local Board, delegate his powers or any of thom . them:
- "Clerk" means any person appointed as Town Clerk under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1886," or holding an analogous appointment under any body included in the term "Local Board":
- airy" means any building, shed, or place used for the purpose of depositing, keeping, or storing milk or " Dairy cream : "Cowshed " means any building, shed, stall, or covered
- place used for the purpose of milking, stalling, or
- place used for the purpose of milking, stalling, or stabling of cattle:
  "Dairy premises " means any building, shed, land, or place used for stalling, grazing, feeding, or milking cattle for producing milk or cream to be sold or supplied, or any building for the deposit, keeping, or storing of milk or cream when so produced:
  "Milk-shop or store" means any building, shed, or place used for the purpose of depositing, storing, or exposing milk or cream for the purpose of selling or disposing thereof:
- disposing thereof : airyman " means the occupier of any dairy premises
- " Dairyman as herein defined, or any person engaged in the pro-
- duction of milk for sale or supply to other persons : "Milk-vendor" means the occupier of any milk-shop or store as herein defined, or any person engaged in the distribution or storage of milk for sale or supply to other persons:
- "Keep means keep, retain, or to permit to remain, whether permanently or temporarily.

### Registration.

2. It shall not be lawful for any person to carry on in any district the trade of dairyman or milk-vendor unless he is registered as such in accordance with these regulations.

3. There shall be kept at the office of the Local Board a register of all persons from time to time carrying on in the district the trade of dairyman or milk-vendor, and such

district the trade of dairyman or milk-vendor, and such register shall from time to time be revised and corrected. 4. The Local Board shall, in manner hereinafter men-tioned, register every such person; but the fact of such registration shall not be deemed to authorise such person to occupy as a dairy, cowshed, milk-shop, or store any par-ticular building, or in any way preclude any proceedings being taken against such rerson for non-compliance with or infringement of any of these regulations, or any further regulations which may hereafter be made for any of the purposes specified in the 3rd section of "The Public Health Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1881." 5. Every person desiring to be registered shall fill in with the required particulars, and hand to the Clerk at the office

the required particulars, and hand to the Clerk at the office of the Local Board or Local Boards within whose district or the Local Board of Local Boards within whose district or districts such person carries on, or proposes to carry on, the trade of dairyman or milk-vendor, an application to be provided for that purpose by the Local Board free of ex-pense. The particulars required to be stated in such appli-cation shall be pense.

- (a.) The occupation of the applicant, whether dairyman or milk-vendor:
- (b.) The exact address of the place where he exercises or proposes to exercise such occupation : (c.) The dimensions of his dairies, cowsheds, and milk-
- shops or stores: (d.) The accustomed number of cattle milked or pro-

posed to be milked on his dairy premises. Such application shall be in the Form A in the Schedule

hereto. 6. Within a reasonable time after the receipt by the Local Board being Board of such application, and upon the Local Board being satisfied that the dairy premises or milk-shop or store of the applicant are in accordance with these regulations, the applicant shall be entitled to receive from the Local Board, free of expense, a certificate under the hand of the Clerk that he has been registered in accordance with the par-ticulars so furnished. The said certificate shall be in the Form B in the Schedule hereto, and shall have attached thereto a copy of these regulations: Provided that the Clerk may issue temporary licenses pending a meeting of the Local Board.

Foard. 7. The production in any legal proceedings of any such certificate purporting to be signed by the Clerk as aforesaid shall be *primâ facie* evidence that the person described in such certificate has been registered in accordance with these regulations, without any further proof of the signature of the said Clerk, or of the fact that the person purporting to act in that conceive way validly appointed that capacity was validly appointed.

## Inspection of Cattle in Dairies.

8. The Inspector shall from time to time visit the cowshed, and as far as possible the whole of the dairy premises, of each registered dairyman, for the purpose of inspecting the cattle milked, stalled, or kept there.

Inspecting the cattle miked, stalled, or kept there. 9. In case the Inspector shall have reason to suppose that a dairyman has disposed of any cow or cattle that he, the Inspector, may suspect to be diseased, the Inspector shall inquire as to the disposal thereof, and the dairyman shall fully disclose to the Inspector the mode of disposal of such cow or cattle, and shall disclose to the Inspector the name or names of the person or persons into whose possession the cow or cattle where here neared cow or cattle may have passed. 10. If the Inspector shall be of opinion that any one or

more of the said cattle is or are diseased, or is or are in an unhealthy condition, the Inspector shall serve upon such dairyman a notice in writing, specifying or describing the cow or cows which is or are diseased or is or are in such unhealthy condition, and shall also, if in his opinion the state nearthy condition, and shall also, if in his opinion the state of the cattle or any of them is such as to warrant the course, certify in such notice that the sale of the milk from the dairy premises of such dairyman or from the specified cow or cows is likely to endanger the public health. Such notice shall be in the Form C in the Schedule hereto. A copy thereof shall be immediately transmitted to the Clerk. 11. After service of such notice upon the dairyman, and henceforth until notification to him of the cancellation of the Inspector's certificate as hereinafter mentioned, the said deiryman.

- (a.) Shall not mix any milk from the said dairy pre-mises or from the said cow or cows, as the case
- may be, with other milk.
  (b.) Shall not sell or use for human food any such milk.
  (c.) Shall not sell or use for the food of swine or other

animals any such milk. 12. At any time after receipt of such notice as last mentioned, such dairyman may serve a notice on the Inspector

- (a.) Stating that all the cattle on the said dairyman's
- (b.) Stating that an the cathe on the said dairy man s dairy premises are free from disease or are in a healthy condition; or
  (b.) Stating (if such be the case) that the said cattle have been inspected by a veterinary surgeon (whose name and address shall be set out in such notice), and that such veterinary surgeon is of opinion that the specified cattle are not diseased, or are not in an unhealthy condition, or as the

case may be. 13. Upon receipt of such notice the Inspector shall forthwith make a fresh inspection. 14. If the Inspector, upon such fresh inspection, shall be

14. If the Inspector, upon such reast inspection, shall be of opinion that such cattle are still in an unhealthy con-dition, the Inspector shall, accompanied by a veterinary surgeon approved by the Local Board, make a fresh inspec-tion of such cattle. The dairyman shall be notified by the Inspector of such proposed inspection at least six hours prior thereto, and he shall be entitled to attend such inspection with a veterinary surgeon approved of by the Local inspection with a veterinary surgeon approved of by the Local Board, and confer as to the health and condition of the Within twenty-four hours after making such incattle. spection the veterinary surgeon accompanying the Inspector

The decision of the veterinary surgeon accompanying the Inspector shall be final, and, if his notice shall render it necessary, the Inspector shall serve upon the dairyman an amended notice in pursuance thereof. 16. At any time after receipt of such last-mentioned

amended notice in pursuance thereof. 16. At any time after receipt of such last-mentioned notice such dairyman may notify the Inspector that the requisitions thereof have been complied with, and the In-spector shall thereupon make a further inspection: Pro-vided always that no Inspector shall be compellable to inspect any dairy premises more than three times in any one month or four times in any two months. 17. If and so soon as it shall be made to appear to the Inspector from any inspection, or from any such notice of

Inspector from any inspection, or from any such notice of the veterinary surgeon accompanying him, that the requisi-tions (if any) which shall have been made have been complied with, or have from any cause whatever become unde-sirable or unnecessary, and that the danger to the public health has ceased to exist, he shall thereupon cancel his certificate, and shall immediately transmit to the said dairyman a notice in writing to that effect signed by him. Such notice shall be in the Form D in the Schedule hereto.

## Construction, &c., and Water-supply of Dairies, Cow-

*construction, ac., and water-supply of Davres, Cou-sheds, dc.* 18. It shall not be lawful for any person following the trade of dairyman to occupy or use as a dairy or cowshed any building, whether so occupied or used at the commencement of these regulations or not, if and so long as the con-struction, lighting, and ventilation, including air-space, and the cleansing, drainage, and water supply thereof, are not in conformity with the requirements of these regulations.

- (a.) The ground-space of every such cowshed, including the stalls, shall be floored to the satisfaction of the Inspector, and shall be constructed with open drains or gutters running the whole length thereof along and immediately behind the stalls.
- (b) Every cowshed and dairy shall be lighted, venti-lated, and cleansed to the satisfaction of the Inspector.
- (c.) Every such cowshed and dairy, and all the internal fittings of every such cowshed and dairy other than the floor, shall be coated in a good, proper, and workmanlike manner with a sufficient coating of lime whitewash, and shall be recoated in a similar manner at intervals not exceeding twelve months.
- (d.) All droppings, manure, excrement, filth, and other impurities or offensive matter shall be scraped, swept, or otherwise collected together and re-moved, otherwise than by the use of water, from all cowsheds, in the case of cowsheds used merely for the design with more of orthe dimension on way.
- all cowsneds, in the case of cowsneds used interely for the daily milking of cattle, directly after every such milking, and, in the case of all other cowsheds, at intervals throughout the day.
  (e.) The entire ground-space of every such cowshed (including the stalls), and also of every such dairy, shall also whenever so required by the Inspector be thoroughly washed over and cleansed with water water.
- (f.) Every such cowshed and dairy shall be well and properly drained, to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

No such dairy shall drain into any cesspool into which any offensive matter from any other building shall be discharged, or directly into any

- building shall be discharged, or directly into any sewer, unless such sewer be properly trapped to the satisfaction of the Inspector.
  (g.) All dairy premises shall be supplied, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by means of pipes or otherwise, with a supply of clear and pure water, sufficient for all purposes of watering the cattle stalled or milked there, for cleansing the milkvessels as prescribed in these regulations, and for all other reasonable and necessary purposes. all other reasonable and necessary purposes. (h.) If the Inspector shall at any time consider that the
- f the Inspector shall at any time consider that the water of any well or coming from any other source in or upon any dairy premises, or used therein, or that the food supplied to the cattle in or upon any dairy premises, is unfit for use, he may, by notice in writing to that effect, signed by him, call upon the dairyman to fence up or close such well or other source and all means of access to the same, or to abstain from using any water coming therefrom in or upon such dairy premises for all or any of the purposes connected therewith, and also to abstain from using such food. Such notice shall be in the Form E in the Schedule hereto. mmediately on the receipt of such notice, the
- (i.) Immediately on the receipt of such notice, the dairyman shall proceed to comply with the requisitions thereof, and during the continuance of the same it shall be unlawful for him to

  19. (a.) It shall not be lawful for any person following the trade of milk-vendor to occupy as a milk-shop or store any building except in conformity with the provisions of this regulation.
  (b.) Every such milk-shop or store shall be lighted, ventilated, and cleansed to the satisfaction of the here the satisfaction of the satisfaction.

  - (c.) The floor and all internal fittings of every such milk-shop and milk-store shall be thoroughly swept or dusted and cleaned at least once in every twenty-four hours, and shall also be thoroughly scoured and cleansed with hot water at least once in every week.
  - (d.) No person shall have, sell, keep, whether for sale or otherwise, or permit to remain within any such milk shop or milk-store any articles or class of articles of a character likely to endanger the purity of the milk there, or the sale or keeping therein of which may have been prohibited by the Inspector by notice in writing.
- 20. (a.) All vessels whatsoever used in or about any dairy, cowshed, milk-shop or store, and whether for re-ceiving or storing or in the distribution of milk, shall be thoroughly cleansed in manner hereinafter mentioned.
  - (b.) Every such vessel shall, within four hours after it shall have been used for any purpose whatsoever, be rinsed out with cold water, then thoroughly scalded with hot water and scoured, and then again rinsed out with cold water and carefully dried.

- 21. (a.) No dairyman shall take milk from any cow whose milk is intended to be sold or used for human food, nor permit any such milk to be so taken, until the udder and teats of such cow have been thoroughly cleansed with water and carefully dried.
- (b.) Every dairyman shall provide and keep in a convenient place proper cloths and other materials for effecting such cleansing, and shall, upon demand, produce such cloths and materials to any learning. Inspector.

22. Every dairyman and milk-vendor shall provide in, upon, or about his dairy premises, milk-shop, or store, and shall upon demand show to the Inspector, sufficient facilities for boiling the water required for all the purposes mentioned in these regulations.

23. All milk supplied for human food shall once at least be carefully strained through some apparatus sufficient for that purpose.

### Miscellaneous.

24. It shall not be lawful for any person following the trade of dairyman or milk-vendor-

- (a.) To allow any person suffering from a contagious or infectious disorder, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows, or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of the trade or business of the dairyman or milk-vendor, so far as regards the production, distribution, or storage of milk; or
- (b.) If himself so suffering, or having recently been in contact as aforesaid, to milk cows or handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part in the conduct of his trade or business so far as regards the production, distribution, or storage of milk, until in each case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased. has ceased.

has ceased. 25. If in any case any dairyman or milk-vendor, or any member of his family, or any person living on or employed about any dairy premises, shall be attacked by or suffering from any contagious or infectious disease, the said dairyman or milk-vendor shall forthwith notify to the Clerk the fact that such person or persons is or are suffering from such (speci-fying what) disease. If this regulation shall not be complied with, then an offence shall be deemed to have been com-mitted by such dairyman or milkman, and repeated on each and every day during which his business shall have been carried on knowingly without such notification. 26. The Local Board or the Inspector shall, upon receipt of such notice, or upon being otherwise informed of the existence of any contagious or infectious disease, take such steps as may be deemed necessary to be taken for the pre-vention of injury to the public health, and in particular the Inspector, if he consider it advisable and necessary, shall certify that the sale of milk from such dairy premises is likely to prove injurious to public health. His certificate shall be in the Form F in the Schedule hereto. A copy thereof shall be served upon the dairyman or milk-vendor, and thereupon the consequences montioned in Particular

shall be in the Form F in the Schedule hereto. A copy thereof shall be served upon the dairyman or milk-vendor, and thereupon the consequences mentioned in Regulation 15 hereof shall have full effect. 27. No dairyman or milk vendor shall purchase, supply for sale to others, sell, or expose in or about any dairy premises, milk-shop, or store, for sale, or mix with milk produced for sale on any dairy premises occupied by him, any milk from any cow which shall be or be suspected to be diseased or in an unhealthy condition, or which shall at the date of giving such milk be in season, or which shall have calved less than

four clear days prior to such date. 29. It shall not be lawful for any person following the trade of a dairyman or milk-vendor to use any milk-store or trade of a dairyman or milk-vendor to use any milk-store or shop in his occupation, or permit the same to be used, as a sleeping apartment, or for any purpose incompatible with the proper preservation of the cleanliness of the milk-store or shop, and of the milk-vessels and milk therein, or in any manner likely to cause contamination of the milk therein. 30. It shall not be lawful for any person following the trade of a dairyman or milk-vendor to keep or permit to remain any swine in any cowshed, dairy, milk-shop, or store, or within a distance of 60ft. from any part thereof. 31. It shall not be lawful for any person following the trade of a dairyman or milk-vendor to erect, construct, or permit to remain any fowl-house, dungstead, dungheap, latrine, urinal, water-closet, earth-closet, cesspit, or cesspool

in or about or within a distance of 30ft. from any part of any cowshed, dairy, milk-shop, or store. Nor shall it be

any cowshed, dairy, milk-shop, or store. Nor shall it be lawful for such person to construct or permit to remain any foul drain or gully or other drain-trap in or about any such cowshed, dairy, milk-shop, or store. 32. No milk-cart, milk-van, or other vehicle used for or in connection with the transport, carrying, or distribution of milk from or about dairy premises shall be used for the purpose of carrying any manure, excrement, or filth, pigs' wash, pigs' food, or other animal or decaying vegetable matter; and in case any such cart shall be so used contrary to these regulations, the owner of such dairy premises and also the owner of such cart shall be guilty of an offence for ealso the owner of such cart shall be guilty of an offence for each occasion on which such oart shall be so used.

33. No dairyman or milk-vendor shall purchase, supply for sale to others, sell, or expose in or about any dairy premises, milk-shop or store, for sale, or mix with milk produced for milk-shop or store, for sale, or mix with milk produced for sale on any dairy premises occupied by him, any milk pro-duced at, in, upon, or about any dairy premises, cowshed, or dairy which is not registered in accordance with these regulations. 34. The Inspector is hereby authorised and empowered to enter at any time on any dairy premises for any of the pur-poses of these regulations. Any person in any wise obstruct-ing him, or preventing him from making any such entry, shall be deemed guilty of an offence. 35. Any notice or certificate required to be served upon any dairyman or milk-vendor under these regulations shall be deemed to be sufficiently served either by giving the same to him personally or by leaving the same at his dairy pre-mises with any person employed or resident there. 36. The Inspector shall have full power to stop any vehicle containing or supposed to contain milk and question

vehicle containing or supposed to contain milk and question the driver thereof, and accompany or place his delegate in charge of such vehicle, so as to satisfy himself of the desti-nation of such milk and whence produced, and to take samples thereof.

samples thereof. 37. Any person who shall do any act forbidden to be done or declared not to be lawful, or shall omit to do any act directed to be done, under or by any of the foregoing regula-tions, or shall in any wise obstruct any Inspector, shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding £50, and in every case where such offence shall be a continuing one, then to a penalty not exceeding £50 for every day or part of a day during which such offence shall continue. 38. These regulations may be cited as "The Dairies In-spection Regulations."

T<sup>N</sup> pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," and "The Animals Protection Act Amendment Act, 1881," His Excellency Sir Trotection Act Amenament Act, 1881," His Excellency Sir James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, doth hereby notify that deer (bucks or stags only) may be shot and killed within the boundaries of the Otago Acclimatisation Society's district, subject to the following regulations and restrictions, namely namely :-

### REGULATIONS.

1. Licenses to shoot and kill deer (bucks or stags only) in the Otago Acclimatisation Society's district, except within the area hereinafter described, will be issued under the hand of the Chief Postmaster at Dunedin, on the recommendation of the Chief Postmaster at Dunedin, on the recommendation of the Secretary of the Otago Acclimatisation Society. For every such license to kill red deer a fee of  $\pm 3$  sterling will be charged; and no holder of any such license as aforesaid shall kill more than four stags under or by virtue of such license, and no stag with less than eight points shall be killed. And for every such license to kill fallow deer a fee of  $\pm 2$  sterling will be charged; and no holder of any such license as aforesaid shall kill more than four bucks under or by virtue of such license, and no buck with less than eight points shall be killed. be killed.

The said Chief Postmaster is hereby appointed and autho-

The said Chief Postmaster is hereby appointed and autno-rised to issue and sign the said licenses. 2. Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to kill fallow deer (bucks only), as provided in Regu-lation No. 1, from the 1st March, 1897, to the 20th April, 1897, and red deer (stags only), as provided in Regulation No. 1, from the 15th March to the 30th April, 1897. Ball-

artridge only to be used. 3. No doe, hind, or fawn will be allowed to be killed on any pretext whatever, and no dogs will be allowed to accom-pany either the licensee or any attendant he may have with him.

4. The licensee must give notice to the said Chief Post-master of the date on which it is his intention to stalk deer; such notice to be posted, or delivered, or telegraphed three clear days before such date.

5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorising any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.
6. No deer shall be shot within an area containing about 24,800 acres in one block, being parts of the Mid-Hawea, Longslip, Lower Hawea, and Lindis Districts, plans of which area will be issued by the Secretary of the Otago Acclimatisation Society to persons to whom licenses to shoot deer are granted are granted.

Bonuses for Encouragement of New Zealand Hemp (Phor-mium tenex) Industry.—Notice No. 430.

BONUS No. 1. BONUS of £1,750 is offered for a machine or process for dressing New Zealand hemp (*Phormium tenax*) which shall be an improvement on the machines or processes now in use, and which shall, after trial, be found to mate-rially reduce the cost of production, improve the product, or increase the quantity of dressed fibre. The cost of bringing the machines or appliances on to the ground, from within the colony, supplying the necessary shafting, motive-power, and buildings, to be defrayed by the Government. If any machine sent from beyond the colony is awarded the bonus or part thereof, then the cost of bringing such machine shall be borne by the Government. The following shall be the basis of the test :---The committee shall supply a sufficient and equal quan-tity of green hemp to each machine or process as a test. The time occupied by each machine or process in the operation;

operation The cost of labour and time required after the fibre has left the machine or process before it is ready for

left the machine or process before it is ready for baling;
The percentage of dressed fibre and tow produced by each machine or process;
The cost of producing the same;
The cost of the machine, and the simplicity and durability of the working parts.
On completion of the tests the committee shall furnish a report to the Minister on all the machines or processes which they have examined or tested, and shall state,—

- (1.) The machine or process which they consider on the whole the most efficient and economic.
- whole the most efficient and economic.
  (2.) Whether they consider that any machine or process tested so materially reduces the cost of production, or improves the product, as to be worthy of the whole bonus or of a part only.
  (3.) Whether, in the event of no one machine or process being entitled to the whole bonus, they deem any machine or process worthy of a part of the bonus, and, if so, how much.

place. The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 346, against 363 in December, a decrease of 17. The deaths in January were 179, an increase of 38 on the number in December. Of the total deaths, males contributed 93, females 86. Sixty-seven of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 37:43 per cent. of the whole number; 57 of these were under 1 year of age. There were 34 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: one man, 66, and five women, 69, 70 (two), 72, 82, died at Auckland; five men, 65, 67, 72, 73, 77, and two women, 69, 77, at Wellington; two men, 66, 83, and three women, 73, 74, 82, at Christehurch; and nine men, 65, 66, 67 (two), 70, 71, 76, 79, 86, and seven women, 67, 71, 75, 77, 78, 80, 84, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the death-rate for last month at Auckland, Wellington, Christehurch, and Dunedin. The rates for January are,--

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases. — The deaths were more numerous in this class at the four centres during January than in December—32 against 17. The increase was caused by a greater mortality (28 deaths) from diarrhœal diseases last month—15 at Auckland, 6 at Wellington, and 7 at Christohurch—all of children under five years, except one. The other deaths comprised one each from influenza, enteric fever, stricture of urethra, and septicæmia.

Constitutional Diseases.—The high mortality for December, 1896, at the four centres and suburbs was reduced from 47, to 40 in January. Deaths from cancer fell from 24 to 15. There were, amongst others, 17 deaths from phthisis and 2 from diabetes.

Local Diseases.—The total for January is 70 deaths, against 59 in December: 23 deaths were from diseases of the nervous system, 16 of the circulatory system, 9 of the respiratory system, 13 of the digestive system, 6 of the urinary system, 1 of the reproductive system, and 2 of the organs of locomotion.

Violent Deaths.—Ten were accidental and 1 homicidal. A child fifteen months old was killed by falling off a sofa; a labourer died from injuries caused by falling of a tree; a mariner, an assistant steward, a sailmaker, and two children were drowned at Wellington; a tailoress was found dead in the ocean near Dunedin, a gardener was sufficiented in a drain, and the life of an infant was lost from "want of proper care on the part of the parents." The homicide was effected by striking with an axe, and held to be non-culpable by coroner's jury.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.

The said company, in accordance with the said contract, expended large sums of money on behalf of the said owners, and made advances to the said owners in pursuance of the said contract in connection with the said land.

D. The land which was intended to be alienated by the above-mentioned contract was the block of land called or known as the Paeroa No. 3 Block, above described, the original title to which is a certificate of title under the Native Land Court Acts, 1865 and 1867, bearing date the 23rd day of September, 1868. E. The estate in the said land which we seek to obtain

from the said Court is an estate in fee-simple.

F. The manner in which and the persons through whom we came to be invested with the title to the said land which we now hold are as follow :-

- (1.) Contract as above set out between the Native owners of the said Paeroa No. 3 Block and the New Zealand Native Land Settlement Company (Limited).
- (2.) Memorandum of mortgage, dated the 3rd day of July, 1888, by the said New Zealand Native Land Settlement Company (Limited) to the Bank of New Zealand.
- (3.) Memorandum of transfer, dated the 5th day of August, 1890, by the said Bank of New Zealand to the Bank of New Zealand Estates Company (Limited).

  (4.) Memorandum of transfer, dated the 10th day of July, 1891, by the Registrar of the Supreme Court of New Zealand at Gisborne to the said Bank of New Zealand Estates Company (Limited).
  (5.) Memorandum of agreement, dated the 17th day of February, 1892, between the Bank of New Zea-land Estates Company (Limited) of the first part, William Lee Rees, of Gisborne, solicitor, of the second part, and ourselves (the applicants) of the second part, and ourselves (the applicants) of the

We desire the estates and interests of the Native owners of the said land, and the estates and interests of all interests of all interests of all owners of the said land, and the estates and interests of all inter owners of the said land, and the estates and interests of all the several parties mentioned in paragraph F of this appli-cation, through whom we claim, to be bound by the decrees of this Court, and for that purpose require that copies of this application be served on them or their representatives according to the list herewith, and we desire that all others who may claim to be interested in this matter shall be treated as parties to these proceedings.
