Rules and Regulations for the Management of the Switzers Commonage.

#### JAMES PRENDERGAST, Administrator of the Government.

WHEREAS by section four of "The Land Act, 1892" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), the Governor is empowered to make, alter, or revoke rules, regulations, and orders for, among other things, the care, management, and protection in every manner of all commonages: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the warrant of the ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninetyfive, making rules and regulations for the management of the Switzers Commonage, and to make regulations for the care and management of the commonage, hereinafter described: Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, do hereby make the following rules, regulations, and orders for the care and management of the Switzers Commonage, described in the First Schedule of the Switzers Commonage, described in the First Schedule to such regulations, and doth hereby declare that such regu-lations shall come into force on the day of the gazetting

1. For the purpose of carrying out these regulations the following persons are appointed a Committee for the care, management, and protection of the said commonage,—

James Handyside, of Waikaia, storekeeper;
Hugh Sproat, of Waikaia, blacksmith;
James Watson, of Waikaia, flourmiller;
James Hardman, of Waikaia, miner;
John Thornton, of Waikaia, miner;
Henry G. Clarke, of Waikaia, miner;
Patrick de Laurie, of Waikaia, miner;

Patrick de Laurie, of Waikaia, miner;
who shall be known as the "Switzers Commonage Committee" (hereinafter referred to as "the Committee"). Three of such Committee shall retire by ballot in December in each year, but they shall be eligible for reappointment as hereinafter provided.

2. On the first Wednesday in January in each year an election shall take place from among the holders of licenses to depasture cattle or stock upon the said commonage (hereinafter termed "licensed holders") for the purpose of electing three members of the Committee instead of the three retiring members; and the names of such persons, when so elected, shall be submitted to the Governor for approval, and if so approved they shall take the place of the three retiring members.

3. The Committee shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Wednesday in each month, at 7 o'clock p.m.,

ness on the first Wednesday in each month, at 7 o'clock p.m., at Waikaia, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Committee. The first meeting shall be held on Wednesday, the seventh day of July, 1897.

4. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or

by any two members of the Committee, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, speci-fying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

acted at such meeting.

5. Any three of the said Committee shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

6. The members of the Committee shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the first Wednesday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor. At such meeting a Secretary shall also be appointed by the Committee.

7. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

8. If, by retirement, resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

a Chairman.

9. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Committee present at a meeting.

10. The words "great cattle" shall be construed to mean and include cattle, horses, mules, and asses, male or female, and their offspring above six months of age; and the words "small cattle" shall be construed to mean sheep, male and female, and their offspring above the age of six months.

11. License-holders may run great or small cattle upon the lands described in the First Schedule upon the conditions mentioned in the depasturing license, to be obtained as hereinafter provided.

as hereinafter provided.

12. Persons desirous of obtaining a depasturing license must lodge with the Receiver of Revenue at Waikaia an application in writing in the form or to the effect contained

in the Second Schedule hereto, and deposit therewith the license-fee payable hereunder. If such application be refused the fee shall be refunded to the applicant.

13. The Committee shall have power to refuse to grant any license, also to limit the number of cattle which may be depastured under any license. They shall also have power to specify the kind of cattle which may be depastured under any license.

14. The number of cattle to be depastured shall be mentioned in the license, and the rent to be paid in respect of such license shall be calculated upon the following scale, that is to say :-

Every such license shall be in the form or to the effect contained in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall expire on the 31st day of December in every year, when such license may be renewed in accordance with the foregoing provisions. Every license shall be granted subject to the conditions herein set forth, and shall be signed by the Chairman of the Committee. man of the Committee.

15. The revenue derived from license fees or otherwise from the said commonage shall stand first charged with the cost of the destruction and prevention of the spreading of rabbits upon such commonage; such cost to be ascertained in such manner as may be fixed and determined by the Chief Inspector of Stock.

16. All cattle depastured must be branded, and the brand and a description of the cattle must be registered with the Ranger. The Ranger shall issue a certificate of registration in such form as he thinks fit, and the fee for every such certificate shall be 1s. But if the brand is registered with the application no further registration shall be necessary.

the application no further registration shall be necessary.

17. No great cattle suffering from any disease shall be depastured upon, nor shall any pigs or goats be allowed to trespass or be at large upon or within, the lands described in the First Schedule. No bull, ram, or stallion shall be depastured without the express permission in writing of the Chairman of the Committee. Any person or persons committing a breach of this provision shall be liable, on the information of such Chairman, as for trespass of cattle on Crown lands; and the Chairman of Committee for the time being is hereby empowered to lay any such information.

18. If any licensee shall at any time commit or suffer a breach of the conditions or terms upon which the license is granted, as the same are herein set forth, the Chairman of the Committee may, on such evidence as he thinks fit, cancel and determine the license held by such licensee, and he shall have no claim to any refund or allowance in respect thereof.

19. No person shall remove beyond the boundary of the land described in the First Schedule any cattle other than those belonging to him, or for the removal of which he shall have authority from the Ranger, under a penalty not exceed-

have authority from the Ranger, under a penalty not exceeding £5.

20. If any person, not being licensed as aforesaid, shall depasture any great cattle or small cattle upon the lands described in the First Schedule, or a greater number of such cattle than shall have been apportioned to him, every such person shall be liable, on the information of the Chairman of Committee, as for trespass of cattle on Crown lands, and also to any penalty or disability imposed in respect of unlawful occupation of Crown land.

21. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to interfere with the powers or duties of the Commissioner of Crown Lands of the district in which the lands described in the First Schedule are situated, whether under "The Land Act, 1892," or under any other law or statute for the time being in force; and the said lands described in the First Schedule hereto shall, subject to the special provisions hereinbefore made, remain and be Crown lands for the purpose of the said Act, and subject thereto. said Act, and subject thereto.

Such committee shall, after perusal, state what machines or processes they deem worthy of consideration, and may inspect the same at any place within the colony; and, having so inspected the whole or any of them, may direct that the whole or any of them be brought for further trial to such place as they may think fit.

The cost of bringing the machines or appliances on to the ground, from within the colony, supplying the necessary shafting, motive-power, and buildings, to be defrayed by the Government. If any machine sent from beyond the colony is awarded the bonus or part thereof, then the cost of bringing such machine shall be borne by the Government.

The following shall be the basis of the test:—

The committee shall supply a sufficient and equal quantity of green hemp to each machine or process as a test.

(1.) The machine or process which they consider on the whole the most efficient and economic.

(2.) Whether they consider that any machine or process tested so materially reduces the cost of production, or improves the product, as to be worthy of the whole bonus or of a part only.

(3.) Whether, in the event of no one machine or process being entitled to the whole bonus, they deem any

One of these scholarships, to be called the senior scholarship, is open to all Maori boys under sixteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination: the other two scholarships are junior scholarships, one of which is open to all Maori boys under fifteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination who have attended a Native school or schools other than Te Aute or St. Stephen's, and whose attendance at school during the previous year is considered by the Inspector of Native Schools to have been satisfactory; the other is open to Maori boys whose attendance at any school during the previous year has been similarly satisfactory. The senior scholarship is offered for competition among Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Native Schools Code, 1897. Candidates for the junior scholarships will be examined in the subjects specified for Standard IV. in the Native Schools Code, 1897. The questions will, however, be more difficult than those set for the standard examinations. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 20th and 21st December, 1897.

Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools. Education

Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present themselves for examination. Such notice must be posted not later than the 31st October next.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 357, against 396 in April, a decrease of 39. The deaths in May were 176, an increase of 1 on the number in April. Of the total deaths, males contributed 103, females 73. Forty-eight of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 27.27 per cent. of the whole number; 42 of these were under 1 year of age. There were 39 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: eight men, 65, 73 (two), 76 (two), 80, 82, 97, and six women, 73, 75, 78 (three), 91, died at Auckland; six men, 67, 70, 71, 75, 77, 89, and two women, 78, 84, at Wellington; five men, 67, 69, 71, 75, 76, and three women, 66, 77, 79, at Christchurch; and seven men, 66 (two), 69, 77, 79, 82, 90, and two women, 77, 88, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Wellington, Christchurch, and Dunedin. The rates for May are—

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths at the four boroughs and suburbs during May from this class of disease were limited to 15 in number, against 24 in April. Of 15 deaths in May, 3 were at Auckland, 4 at Wellington, 5 at Christchurch, and 3 at Dunedin. There was 1 death from influenza and 1 from diphtheria at Christchurch, and 4 deaths from typhoid fever, 1 at each borough. Diarrheal diseases caused only 7 deaths—2 at Auckland, 2 at Wellington, 1 at Christchurch, and 2 at Dunedin. The above, with 1 death from syphilis and 1 from pyzemia, complete the total of 15.

Constitutional Diseases.—Of 38 deaths at the four centres, 12 were from cancer, 16 from phthisis, and 2 from diabetes.

Local Diseases.—There were 20 deaths from diseases of the nervous system, including 8 from apoplexy. Deaths from diseases of the circulatory system numbered 21; from diseases of the respiratory system, 19; of the digestive system, 16; of the urinary system, 7; of the reproductive system, 4.

Violent Deaths.—Nine were accidental, 1 suicidal, and 1 by hanging (an execution). A shipwright was killed by fall of timber, and a young woman by falling over a cliff. A coal-dealer died from shock consequent upon fractured ribs, a railway employé was run over by a truck, and a woman and child were burnt to death in a boarding-house. There were 2 deaths by drowning (a clerk drowned in Wellington Harbour, and a child under two years in a tub); also 1, of a storeman, from asphyxia (cause unknown). The suicide was that of a labourer, who poisoned himself with laudanum.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
