ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), Walter Robson, of Howick, farmer (hereinafter called "the licensee"), has applied to the Go-vernor in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore of Turanga Creek, in the Provincial District of Auckland, in order to erect a wharf thereon, and, in accordance with the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," has deposited plans in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 2120), showing the position in which it is intended to erect such wharf, the area of foreshore intended to be occu-pied, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the wharf: And whereas the Governor in Council has approved of the purpose for which the said foreshore is to be occupied : And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the licensee under the said Act, for the pur-pose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

and issued to the licensee under the said Act, for the pur-pose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the fore-shore on which the wharf is to be erected, as shown on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said wharf, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:— 1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as de-fined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and in-cludes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister. 2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore occupied by the said wharf, as shown on plans marked M.D. 2120. 3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensee shall, on

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensee shall, on demand, pay to the Minister the annual sum of one shilling, dating from the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom

5. Her Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment.
6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at his own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.
7. Any person authorised by the Minister may at all rea-

by the Minister. 7. Any person authorised by the Minister may at all rea-sonable times enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring him, within a reasonable time, to be therein pre-scribed, to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed

scribed, to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made. 8. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or incon-sistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regu-lation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amend-ments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

for that purpose. 10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee six calencompensation whatever, on giving to the licensee six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the licensee.
12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on his part.

TABANARI LAND DISTRICT.

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The above sections are subdivisions of the Patua Block, which lies on the north-western side of the Mount Egmont Forest Reserve, between the Pouakai and Patua Ranges, and behind the settled districts of Koru, Oakura, and Okato. The distance from New Plymouth to the nearest end of the block, viâ the Carrington Road, is about eleven miles, six miles being a metalled dray-road. The upper part of the block—that is, the part nearest the forest reserve consists of poor land, and lies at a considerable elevation, about 2,000 ft. above sea-level; the balance comprises fair soil, a little damp in some places, whether owing to the subsoil being somewhat retentive or to a layer of cemented gravel which shows in the bottom of some of the creeks it is difficult to say. The land is a good deal cut up by gullies, some of them only small, which make the individual flats narrow in extent. The country is very well watered. The timber is chiefly tawhero, with rata and rimu, and supplejack undergrowth; on the lower parts there is a little tawa, kohekohe, mahoe, &c., which disappear on the upper ground. There is not a great deal of rimu, but probably sufficient for building and fencing.

Importation of Dogs into Great Britain.-Notice No. 489.

Department of Agriculture, (Live-stock Branch), Wellington, 13th July, 1897. THE following order, issued by the Board of Agriculture of Great Britain, is published for general information. JOHN McKENZIE, Minister for Agriculture.

IMPORTATION OF DOGS ORDER OF 1897.

The Board of Agriculture desire to draw the attention of local authorities, shipowners, and the public generally to the provisions of this order, which regulates the landing in Great Britain of dogs brought from any other country except Ireland and the Isle of Man. The order is made to take effect on the 15th September, 1897, and it will be observed that no dog to which the order applies will be allowed to be landed in Great Britain with-out a license from the Board of Agriculture obtained previous to the landing.

Special attention is drawn to the following provisions of

the order :---

Applications for Licenses.

Applications for Licenses. Any application for a license is to be made in writing to the Secretary, Board of Agriculture, 4, Whitehall Place, London, S.W., and is to be accompanied by a statement signed by the owner of the dog to which the application relates or by his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, containing the following information (namely): (1) The description of the dog, stating so far as possible for purposes of identification the particulars of its breed, sex, age, and colour; (2) the country from which it is proposed to be brought; (3) the port at which it is proposed after being landed to be moved for the purposes of such detention and isolation as may be required by the Board, and also the route by which it is proposed to be moved to such place of detention. *Conditions of License.*

Conditions of License.

Conditions of License. The Board may insert in any license authorising the landing of a dog such conditions as they think necessary or desirable for the following purposes: (a) For prescribing and regulating the detention and isolation of the dog by and at the expense of its owner, for any period, not exceeding six months, at a place to be provided for that purpose by such owner, and to be described in the license; or (b) for regulating the movement of the dog to such place of de-tention, and its movement during the period of detention prescribed by the license.

tention, and its movement during the period of detention prescribed by the license. A dog landed under the authority of such a license shall be detained and isolated in accordance with the conditions of such license, and shall not be moved in contravention of any such condition.

Restriction on Granting of Licenses. An applicant for a license for the landing of a dog will be required to satisfy the Board that proper and suitable arrangements can be made for such detention and isolation of the dog as appears to the Board to be necessary or desirable.

desirable. In order that as little inconvenience as possible may be caused in the enforcement of the order, the Board trust that local authorities will assist them by taking steps to make its contents known as widely as possible in their districts. The Board would invite shipowners to co-operate with them by causing due notice to be given to passengers desirous of bringing dogs with them of the conditions under which alone dogs will be permitted to be landed in Great Britain, and with this view the Board would suggest that ship owners should instruct their agents abroad and the masters of their vessels to warn passengers, and prevent as far as possible the shipment of any dogs the owners of which may not have previously obtained the necessary license for their being landed. Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 360, against 357 in May, an increase of 3. The deaths in June were 157, a decrease of 19 on the number in May. Of the total deaths, males contributed 88, females 69. Twenty-two of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 14:01 per cent. of the whole number; 18 of these were under 1 year of age. There were 39 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: five men, 65, 73, 74, 83, 84, and five women, 70, 72, 77, 85, 90, died at Auckland; seven men, 65, 68 (two), 70, 71, 74, 78, and three women, 73, 76, 83, at Wellington; five men, 66 (two), 71, 83, 87, and two women, 77, 78, at Christchurch; and seven men, 66 (two), 72, 73, 76, 79, 88, and five women, 65 (three), 75, 89, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland and Wellington, but to raise it at Christ-church and Dunedin. The rates for June are— Death-rates per 1,000 of

Dunedin and suburbs 0.57 0.78 Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths at the four centres, with their suburbs, for June were limited to 12, against 15 in May and 24 in April. Influenza was fatal in 5 cases, 2 at Auckland and 3 at Dunedin; diphtheria caused 3 deaths, 2 at Auckland and 1 at Christchurch. Two deaths were from typhoid fever, 1 at Auckland and 1 at Christchurch. From diarrheeal diseases there was only 1 death, which occurred at Wellington. These, with a death from syphilis, com-plete the total mortality—which is very low—in this class. Parasitic Diseases.—A death from hydatids in the liver is noticed at Wellington. Constitutional Diseases.—The mortality for June included 37 deaths, against 38 in May. Cancer contributed 12 and phthisis 20 of the deaths for last month. Local Diseases.—Out of a total of 78 deaths, 20 were caused by diseases of the nervous system, 22 of the circulatory system, 21 of the respiratory system (bronchitis, pneumonia, &c.), 5 of the digestive system, 6 of the urinary system, 3 of the reproductive system, and 1 of the organs of locomotion. *Violent Deaths.*—Oit 0 deaths, 5 were accidental and 5 suicidal. A storeman was crushed to death in a hydraulic lift, a carter killed by injury to the brain caused by machinery of a gas-engine, and an aged woman died from shock after fracture of leg. A carpenter was found drowned in the River Avon, and an infant died from protracted birth. The suicides included thet of a grocer who cut his throat, a nurse who poisoned herself with "Rough on rats," a married woman who died from effects of acconite liniment self-administered, a tailor who also poisoned himself, and a woman who drowned herself. A verdict of "Temporary insanity" was returned in each case.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
