IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Post Office Savings Bank Act, 1867" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to make, and from time to time, as he shall see occasion, to alter, regulations for superintending, inspecting, and regulating the mode of keeping the accounts of depositors, and with respect to the making of deposits, and to the withdrawal of deposits and interest, and to all other matters incidental to the carrying the above-recited Act into execution: And whereas by Order in Council dated on the second day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, certain regulations were made under the authority of the said Act, and it is expedient to revoke clause twenty-six of such regulations, and to make other provision in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities for that purpose vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, cancel and revoke clause twenty-six of the regulations of the said weight section.

the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, cancel and revoke clause twenty-six of the regulations made by the said recited Order in Council of the second day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make and prescribe the regulation contained in the Schedule hereto: And, with the like advice and consent, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government doth hereby order and declare that this present Order in Council, and the regulation hereby made, shall come into force upon the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.
