Vesting Control of the Tamaki Bridge in the Pakuranga Road Board, and apportioning Cost of Maintenance.

RANFURLY, Governor. (L.s.)

A PROCLAMATION.

HEREAS by section one hundred and fourteen of "The Public Works Act, 1894" hereinafter termed "the said Act", it is, inter alia, enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation publicly notified, direct that any bridge already constructed, or which may hereafter be constructed, over or across any river or arm of the sea shall, from and after a date to be fixed by such Proclamation, be rom and after a date to be fixed by such Proclamation, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of such local authority as shall be mentioned in that behalf in such Proclamation; and may by any such Proclamation as aforesaid fix and determine whether all or any, and, if so, what part, of the cost, whether theretofore incurred or thereafter to be incurred, of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing any such bridge, is to be provided and paid by any local authority or authorities, and, if so, by what local authority or authorities; and may by any such Proclamation as aforesaid direct how and when and to whom any such payment is to be made:

And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that the Governor may from time to time, with the view of determining whether it is expedient to vest the exclusive care, control, management, and maintenance of any such bridge in any local authority, direct any person to be a Commissioner to inquire into and report to him upon any matter which he shall deem necessary to enable him to determine any such question as aforesaid:

And whereas a Commissioner was appointed and an inquiry was duly held with a view to determining what local authority could most conveniently and efficiently control the bridge known as "the Tamaki Bridge at Panagure" under the exclusive care, control, and management of such

authority could most conveniently and efficiently control the bridge known as "the Tamaki Bridge at Panmure" mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and hereinafter re-ferred to as "the said bridge," and what proportion of the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing

the said bridge should be paid by any, and, if so, which, local authority or authorities: And whereas such Commissioner did report to the Governor after due inquiry his opinion as

to the matters respecting which he was appointed to report:
And whereas it is expedient to make provision under the said Act for the purposes and in the manner hereinafter set

said Act for the purposes and in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do, in the first place, revoke a previous Proclamation dated the twenty-seventh day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, published in the New Zealand Gazette, No. 65, of the twenty-ninth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, vesting the said bridge in the Pakuranga Road Board on the terms therein stated, and do hereby proclaim and direct that the said bridge shall, from and after the date of this Proclamation, be under the exclusive care and control and management of the Pakuranga Road Board; and in further pursuance of the aforesaid powers and authorities I do hereby fix and determine that the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said bridge shall be borne by the Pakuranga Road Board in the proportion of twenty-five per centum, the Mount Wellington Road Board sixteen per centum, Howick Road Board twelve per centum, Paparoa Road Board nine per centum, Tamaki West Road Board hire per centum of the cost.

And I do hereby fix and determine that the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said

And I do hereby fix and determine that the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said bridge from time to time shall be borne by the said local bodies in the said proportions respectively.

And I do hereby also further direct that any contribution hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Mount Wellington, Panmure, Howick, Paparoa, Tamaki West, Turanga, Tamaki East, and Maretai Road Boards shall be paid from time to time respectively, in the proportions hereinbefore prescribed, out of the funds of the said Road Boards, in each case within a period of thirty days after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the Pakuranga Road Board, and all such payments shall be made from time to time to the Clerk of the said Road Board, for and on account of such Road Board. account of such Road Board.

Present: THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

In exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Public Domains Act, 1881," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke a certain Order in Council, dated the twenty-second day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sinctly cover making delegation of certain reverses. dred and ninety-seven, making delegation of certain powers in manner as therein appears; and doth, with the like advice and consent, by this present Order, delegate, but only with respect to the piece or parcel of land described in the Schedule hereto, all the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Woodbury Public Domain Board, namely.

The cost of producing the same;
The cost of the machine, and the simplicity and dura-

bility of the working parts.

On completion of the tests the committee shall furnish a report to the Minister on all the machines or processes which they have examined or tested, and shall state,-

(2.) Whether they consider that any machine or process tested so materially reduces the cost of production, or improves the product, as to be worthy of the whole bonus or of a part only.

(3.) Whether, in the event of no one machine or process being entitled to the whole bonus, they deem any machine or process worthy of a part of the bonus, and, if so, how much.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 374, against 377 in September, a decrease of 3. The deaths in October were 156, an increase of 2 on the number in September. Of the total deaths, males contributed 87, females 69. Twenty-nine of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 18-59 per cent. of the whole number; 23 of these were under 1 year of age. There were 32 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: five men, 69, 73, 76, 77, 82, died at Auckland; three men, 70, 72, 74, and one woman, 72, at Wellington; five men, 69, 71, 75, 76, 83, and seven women, 65, 66, 67, 71, 78, 80, 83, at Christohurch; and eight men, 65 (two), 66, 67 (two), 73, 79, 86, and three women, 65 (two), 68,

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the death-rate at each of the four centres. The rates for

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths in this class at four boroughs and suburbs were 8 in October last, against 6 in September and 17 in August. Diphtheria caused 2 deaths last month—1 at Christohurch and 1 at Auckland. Enteric fever contributed only 1 death, which occurred at Auckland. From diarrhea there were 2 deaths, also at Auckland. A child of six months died at Christohurch of heart-disease, resulting from hereditary syphilis. There were also 2 deaths from erysipelas and septicæmia.

Constitutional Diseases.—Of the total, amounting to 37 deaths, 13 were from phthisis, 12 from cancer, 6 from other tubercular diseases, and 3 from rheumatism. An infant died from hæmophilia (hæmorrhagic diathesis). There were, besides, a death of an aged man from pernicious anæmia, and another from diabetes mellitus.

Local Diseases.—Of 87 deaths, 18 were from diseases of the nervous system (apoplexy, paralysis, &c.), 26 from diseases of the circulatory system (heart-disease, &c.), 18 of the respiratory system (bronchitis, pneumonia, pleurisy, &c.), 11 of the digestive system, 8 of the urinary system (including 6 Bright's disease), 3 of the reproductive system, and 3 of the integumentary system.

Violent Deaths.—11 were accidental and 2 were suicidal. Two boys were killed by a train colliding with 'bus at a railway-crossing; a labourer by the overturning of a dray; a child by a kick from a horse; an ironworker died from tetanus (wound of finger); a woman from operation for cyst; a girl from burns; and an epileptic youth from accidental scalding. A cabinetmaker and a seaman were found drowned, and an infant found dead from exposure and neglect. One suicide was that of a glass-cutter, who poisoned himself with "Rough on Rats"; the other a bricklayer, who made use of spirits of salts. spirits of salts.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.

Alterations to the Scale of Fares, Rates, and Charges in Force upon the New Zealand Government Railways.

In pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me under "The Public Works Act, 1894," and any amendment thereof, and also of "The Government Railways Act, 1894," I, Alfred Jerome Cadman, the Minister for Railways, do hereby make the following alterations in the scale of fares, rates, and charges in force on the New Zealand Government railways open for traffic, such alterations to come into force on and after the 22nd day of November, 1897:—

PART II.—LUGGAGE, PARCELS, HORSES, ETC. MILK.

Milk consigned to bonâ fide milk-condensing factories for the manufacture of condensed milk will be charged \$\frac{1}{2}d\$, per gallon for distances of fifteen miles and under, \$\frac{1}{2}d\$, per gallon for the next fifteen miles, and \$\frac{1}{2}d\$, per gallon for each additional thirty miles or fractional part thereof; provided that the consignment-note is indorsed by the consignor that the milk is bonâ fide for the manufacture of condensed milk.

PART IV.—GOODS: LOCAL RATES.

PICTON SECTION.

Except where otherwise specified, the maximum charge for goods of Classes A, B, C, D, consigned to Picton, will be 7s. 6d. per ton weight or measurement, at the option of the Railway Department, including wharfage and labour at ship's side at Picton when such goods are for export.

PART VI.—WHARVES.

NELSON SECTION.

Nelson Wharf.

Goods from ports situated in Golden and Tasman Bays, for export beyond the Provincial District of Nelson, landed on the Nelson Wharf and reshipped direct from the wharf, or stored in the railway-sheds to await the arrival of ship, will be charged half inwards wharfage rates only.
