Terms and Conditions of Lease of Village-homestead Allot-ments in Southland.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-eighth day of January, 1898.

Pr. sen' : The Honourable W. C. Walker presiding in Council.

W HEREAS by the one-hundred-and-sixty-ninth section of "The Land Act, 1892," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands in any village settlement shall be disposed of, subject as in the said section is provided: And whereas by a Proclamation made under the said Act on the twenty-ford day of December one thousand eight hundred and by a Proclamation made under the said Act on the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, and published in the New Zealand Gazette on the sixth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, the land described in the First Schedule hereto has been set apart under the said Act and declared open for lease as village-homestead allotments, and it is expedient to fix the terms and conditions upon which the said land when the dimension of

to fix the terms and conditions upon which the said land shall be disposed of : Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby fix the terms and conditions on which the land mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall be disposed of by way of lease in perpetuity, and which said terms and conditions are set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, and also doth direct that the land shall be leased as village-homestead allotments only.

Millwood is situated two miles and a half due south of Longbush Railway-station, on the Invercargill-Dunedin Railway-line. It lies near the north margin of Seaward Forest, and is all bush-clad; the land being nearly level, and of good quality. A sawmill is in operation in the im-mediate vicinity of the settlement. 10. No lessee shall hold more than the limit stated in the First Schedule, including that already held, and all allot-ments shall be held for his or her sole use and benefit, and not for the use or benefit of any other person whomsoever. No married woman shall be eligible as a selector; but this provision shall not apply to any married woman who may become a transferee under a will or by virtue of an intestacy.

11. All the provisions of the said Act, so far as applicable, shall extend and apply to the lands affected by these regula-tions, and to the applications and leases to be made and issued thereunder, and generally to the interests created, and the persons whose rights, liabilities, or interests are thereby affected; and the mention of any particular provision of the said Act shall not be deemed to exclude any other provision of the period Act explicitly to the rest are as provision of the said Act applicable to the particular case.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 320, against 395 in January, a decrease of 75. The deaths in February were 156, a decrease of 58 on the number in January. Of the total deaths, males contributed 89, females 67. Fifty-eight of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 37:18 per cent. of the whole number; 53 of these were under 1 year of age. There were 40 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Five men, 67, 74, 75, 77, 78, and five women, 65, 68, 69, 83 (two), died at Auckland; six men, 66, 68, 76, 79, 82, 86, and seven women, 68, 69, 77, 78, 83, 91, 97, at Wellington; three men, 70, 78, 88, and five women, 66, 75, 77, 78, 87, at Christehurch; and seven men, 65 (three), 70, 74, 77, 92, and two women, 67, 84, at Dunedin.

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In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland, Wellington, and Dunedin, but raises it at Christchurch. The rates for February are :---

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths at the four chief cities and suburbs were 53 altogether from this class of disease. Influenza caused 22 deaths (exactly the same number as in January)—4 at Auckland, 6 at Wellington, 3 at Christchurch, and 9 at Dunedin. There were 27 deaths from diarrhœal diseases—14 at Auckland, 8 at Wellington, 5 at Christchurch, but none at Dunedin. Typhoid fever caused 4 deaths—3 at Dunedin and 1 at Wellington.

Constitutional Diseases.-Of 24 deaths, cancer contributed 12 and phthisis 7.

Local Diseases.—The deaths in this class fell from 96 in January to 50 in February. The deaths from nervous diseases (including apoplexy, meningitis, &c.) were only 7 in February against 26 in January; from diseases of the circulatory system, 8 against 21; from diseases of the respiratory system, 15 against 19. From diseases of the digestive system the fall was from 23 to 15. The remaining deaths for February were 2 from diseases of the urinary system, 2 from those of the reproductive system, and 1 of the organs of locomotion.

Violent Deaths.—These numbered 7—5 from accident and 2 from suicide. A cab-driver died from injuries caused by a runaway horse; a woman was burnt to death by her clothes catching fire; another died from administration of chloroform; and two infants were accidentally smothered. One suicide was that of a woman who cut her throat, another the case of a bricklayer who poisoned himself.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
