Amending the Description of the Native Township of Te Puia.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the description contained in the Schedule to a certain Proclamation made the tenth day of November last, under the provisions of "The Native Townships Act, 1895," setting apart land for the Native Township of Te Puia:

WHEREAS by section fourteen of "The Native Land Court Act, 1894," it is enacted that the Native Land Court shall, as regards all lands within the meaning of subsection ten of section fourteen aforesaid, have jurisdiction as in the said subsection mentioned: Provided that the Court shall not proceed to exercise such jurisdiction unless the Governor in Council shall by Order authorise the same to be done: to be done:

And whereas the land specified in the Schedule hereto is land in respect whereof the Court has jurisdiction as aforesaid, and it is expedient that the Court should be authorised

said, and it is expedient that the Court should be authorised to exercise the same:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby authorise the said Court to exercise in respect of the said land the jurisdiction conferred as aforesaid—that is to say, to determine whether or not the said land or any part thereof was, on the investigation of title thereto, intended by the Native Land Court, or by the nominal owner or owners of such land, to be held by such nominal owner or owners in trust for Natives not named in the title, and to determine who are the Natives (if any) entitled beneficially to such land, and to order the inclusion of such title, and to determine who are the Natives (if any) entitled beneficially to such land, and to order the inclusion of such Natives in the title, either together with or in lieu of the nominal owners or any of them, and for the purpose aforesaid to order the cancellation or amendment of any existing instrument of title, and the issue of such new Crown grants or other instruments of title as may be necessary, and generally to exercise in respect of the said land all the jurisdiction and powers conferred on the Native Land Court by subsection ten of section fourteen of "The Native Land Court Act, 1894."

fide in occupation of and has made improvements on such land, or has paid money to Native owners for lease or purchase thereof prior to the passing of the said Act: Provided that no Order in Council under the provisions of this section shall take effect until after the expiration of two months from the date of the publication thereof in the Gazette: Provided also that every alienation under the provisions of this section shall be confirmed by the Court in terms of section fifty-three of the said Act:

WHEREAS by the twelfth section of "The Public Domains Act, 1881," it is, inter alia, enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred, save as is therein mentioned, to any person or persons, for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such Order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas, pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto, situate in the Canterbury Land District, and being Reserve No. 3224, is declared to be brought under the operation of and to be subject to the provisions of the said "Public Domains Act, 1881":

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth by this present Order delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Waikuku Domain Board, namely,—

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 409, against 425 in May, a decrease of 16. The deaths in June were 158, a decrease of 38 on the number in May. Of the total deaths, males contributed 89, females 69. Thirty-nine of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 24.68 per cent. of the whole number; 30 of these were under 1 year of age. There were 37 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Four men, 65, 68, 71, 77, and six women, 65 (two), 66, 77, 85, 90, died at Auckland; four men, 68, 72, 80, 82, and five women, 68, 70, 73, 79, 81, at Wellington; three men, 78, 79, 84, and three women, 69, 75, 77, at Christchurch; and nine men, 65, 66 (three), 67 (two), 72, 76, 77, and three women, 70, 72, 79, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rates at each of the four centres. The rates for June are.—

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The total number of deaths at the four chief towns and suburbs for June was 16, against 28 in May, 30 in April, 43 in March, and 53 in February. Influenza caused 3 deaths in June—I at Auckland and 2 at Christchurch. Diphtheria also contributed 3 deaths—I at Auckland, 1 at Wellington, and 1 at Dunedin. From typhoid fever the mortality was confined to 5 deaths—2 at Auckland and 3 at Wellington. The mortality from diarrhoeal diseases was singularly small, the deaths numbering 3 altogether—all of them at Wellington. Besides those above referred to, there was I death from erysipelas and I from puerperal septicæmia—both at Auckland.

Constitutional Diseases.—The deaths last month numbered 37, 26 being from phthisis. The mortality from cancer was low, comprising 6 deaths, against 18 in the previous month.

Local Diseases.—Of 76 deaths, 13 were from diseases of the nervous system, 19 of the circulatory, 23 respiratory, 12 digestive, 5 urinary, and 4 of the reproductive system.

Violent Deaths.—There were 4 accidental deaths and 2 suicidal. All the accidental deaths were at Auckland. A ship's cook died of concussion of brain with drowning, a journalist was "found drowned," an infant met his death by suffocation from being overlain, and another died from hemorrhage and exhaustion.

A woman committed suicide by means of poison, and a draper by shooting himself.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
