A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it has been made to appear to my satisfaction that considerable quanties of fruit-trees and plants infested with various species of scale insects have been and are still imported into New Zealand, to the danger and detriment of the fruit plantations of this colony: And whereas it is expedient to prohibit the introduction of such fruit trees and plants to this colony:

Now, therefore, I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by virtue of the power and authority conferred upon me by the third section of "The Orchard and Garden Pests Act, 1896" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), do hereby proclaim and declare that the introduction into New Zealand of any fruit or other trees or plants (including cuttings, buds, or and declare that the introduction into New Zealand of any fruit or other trees or plants (including cuttings, buds, or any other portion of a plant except fruit) infested with any species of scale insect (coccid), or in or on which there are traces that any such pest is or has been present in any form or stage of development, is hereby absolutely prohibited; and, if any fruit-tree, plant, or portion thereof respectively hereby prohibited is imported into this colony, then such trees or plants, and the packages containing the same, shall be dealt with in the manner provided by section six of the said Act with respect to plants and other things unlawfully introduced to the colony; and for the purposes of the said Act I hereby appoint the Ports of Auckland and Wellington to be the only ports of entry for plants, as defined by the said Act. said Act.

WHEREAS by section four of "The Native Land Laws Amendment Act, 1895," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council, except from the operation of section one hundred and seventeen of "The Native Land Court Act, 1894" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), for a limited period or otherwise, and either generally or for such purposes and subject to such restrictions as shall be in such Order specified, any land, wheresoever situate, which is for the time being subject to the operation of the said section, or any interest therein or right over the same, or may in like manner make such exception in favour exclusively of any lessee or other person who has been bona or may in like manner make such exception in tayour exclusively of any lessee or other person who has been bona fide in occupation of and has made improvements on such land, or has paid money to Native owners for lease or purchase thereof prior to the passing of the said Act: Provided that no Order in Council under the provisions of this section shall take effect until after the expiration of two months from the date of the publication thereof in the Gazette: Provided also that every alienation under the provisions of this section shall be confirmed by the Court in terms of section fifty-three of the said Act:

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took

place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 377, against 409 in June—a decrease of 32. The deaths in July were 162—an increase of 4 on the number in June. Of the total deaths, males contributed 92, females 70. Fifty-two of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 32·10 per cent. of the whole number; 33 of these were under 1 year of age. There were 44 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Four men, 68, 74, 76, 80, and six women, 68, 69, 73 (two), 77, 84, died at Auckland; six men, 66 (two), 70, 73 (two), 78, at Wellington; three men, 70, 74, 79, and two women, 76, 82, at Christchurch; and nineteen men, 65, 68, 69 (two), 71, 72, 74 (two), 75 (two), 76 (four), 77, 78, 82, 83 (two), and four women, 68, 70, 85, 93, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to raise the rates at Auckland and Christchurch, but lowers them t Wellington and Dunedin. The rates for July are,—

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths at the four centres and their suburbs in July numbered only 17, against 16 for the previous month, 21 for May, 30 for April, 43 for March, and 53 for February. Measles caused 1 death last month (at Wellington). Influenza was fatal in 3 instances, at Christchurch. Diphtheria is found at Dunedin (1 death). Typhoid fever contributed 1 death at Auckland and another at Wellington. Diarrhoeal diseases show 4 deaths —2 at Auckland and 2 at Wellington. Syphilis caused 3 deaths—1 at Auckland and 2 at Wellington. The rest of the deaths in this class are 1 (a child) from erysipelas, 1 from septicæmia, and 1 from puerperal fever—making a total of 17 deaths altogether. deaths altogether.

Constitutional Diseases.—The deaths fell from 37 in June to 28 in July, of which 17 were from cancer and 8 from phthisis.

Local Diseases.—These deaths rose from 76 in June to 90 in July: 21 were from nervous diseases (apoplexy, paralysis, insanity, &c.); 20 from diseases of the circulatory system; 30 from diseases of the respiratory system (bronchitis, pneumonia, pleurisy, &c.); 11 from diseases of the digestive system (gastritis, enteritis, liver-disease, &c.); 7 from diseases of the urinary system (Bright's disease, uremia, and others); and 1 from disease of the integuments.

Violent Deaths.—These numbered 6—4 accidental and 2 suicidal: A master mariner was killed at Wellington by the fall of a shackle; a girl of 6 years died from poisoned wound of hand, and a boy from accidental burning, at Dunedin; 1 infant from umbilical hæmorrhage, at Wellington.

A builder poisoned himself at Christchurch, and a storeman shot himself at Dunedin.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
