WHEREAS by "The Civil Service Reform Act, 1886," it ments to the Civil Service shall be by competitive examina-tion, which shall be held periodically in the chief centres of population, and that from the most successful competitors in the order of their merit shall be selected candidates to fill all vacant cadetships in the Civil Service : And whereas by the seme Act it is a macted that no cadet hereafter enounted the same Act it is enacted that no cadet hereafter appointed shall receive more than one hundred pounds per annum until he has passed the Senior Civil Service Examination :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by virtue of the power and authority conferred upon him by the tenth section of the said Act, and by and with the advice and con-sent of the Executive Council of the colony, doth make the following regulations respecting the examinations required by the said Act :--

REGULATIONS.

1. The competitive examination, hereinafter called "the Junior Examination," required by "The Civil Service Re-form Act, 1886," and the Senior Civil Service Examination referred to in the same Act, and hereinafter called "the Senior Examination," shall be held every year in the month of January, between the sixth day and the eighteenth day of the month, in every city or borough in which the Board of any education district has its office, and in any other places that may from year to year he selected for the murpose by that may from year to year be selected for the purpose by the Minister of Education.

2. Every candidat; for the Junior Examination must give notice to the Minist r of Education, and such notice must be in a form prescribed by the Minister of Education, and must be sent so as to be delivered at the office of the Minis-ter not later than the thirty-first day of October next before the examination. With the aforesaid notice, each candidate must send.... must send-

- (a.) Evidence of having attained the age of fifteen years;
 (b.) Testimonials as to character;
 (c.) A bank receipt for the payment of one guinea to the Public Account at some branch of the bank at which the Public Account is kept; and

Latin;

- 5. Maori :
- 6. Algebra;
- Euclid;
 English history;
- 9. Elementary mechanics ;
- 10. Elementary physics; 11. Elementary chemistry;

 At the Junior Examination the papers set in English, arithmetic, geography, and English history will be based on the programme of the public-school standards. In geography the elements of mathematical and physical geography will be required, and the general topography of and political geography of the world (without minute detail), with mapdrawing (from memory) of European countries and British dependencies; in history, a fair knowledge of the period from 1603 to 1837, and a cursory knowledge of the chief.
 Latin and Greek: Questions in grammar; translation

- hts prior to 1603.
 Latin and Greek: Questions in grammar; translation of easy passages, at sight, from and into the language. in which the candidate is examined.
 French, German, Italian, and Maori: As in Latin and Greek; but the papers not so elementary.
 Algebra: To simple equations, inclusive.
 Euclid: Books I. and II.

- Elementary mechanics: The elements of statics, dyna-mics, and hydrostatics.
- Elementary physics : Heat, sound, light, and electricity. Elementary chemistry : The non metallic elements, and
- Elementary chemistry: The non metallic elements, and the atomic theory. Elementary biology: Questions will be set in zoology and botany, but candidates will not be required to answer in both subjects. The subjects are: (a) Zoo-logy—elements of animal physiology; (b) Botany— elements of the morphology and physiology of flower-ing plants, including the main characteristics of the chief native and introduced natural orders. Shorthand: Writing fifty words a minute (reporting style).

I N pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by "The Public Works Act, 1894," "The Government Railways Act, 1894," and "The Public Works and Govern-ment Railways Acts Amendment Act, 1895," I, Alfred Jerome Cadman, the Minister for Railways, do hereby make the following by-law regulating the terms on which private sidings on railways of the New Zealand Government open for traffic may be constructed and used, and do hereby declare that the same shall come into force on the day of the publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette, and shall apply to all such railways generally, namely :--

BY-LAW.

1. A limited number of private sidings will be granted on railways of the New Zealand Government open for traffic, and such sidings only will be granted as the Railway De-partment, after full consideration, finds can conveniently and safely be allowed.

and safely be allowed. 2. No siding-access to any such railway will be permitted unless formal application is made, and the consent of the Minister for Railways, in writing, is first obtained thereto; and no consideration will be accorded to applicants upon the plea that they have incurred expense in anticipation of obtaining such consent. 3. The siding, when granted, will be constructed by the Minister, but the applicant shall pay to the Minister a premium for constructing the same, the amount being agreed in each instance and paid before the work of con-struction is begun.

4. The applicant shall pay a yearly rental for such siding, such payment to be made in equal sums quarterly in ad-vance at the following rates per annum :---

- (a.) For any siding access not being at a railway-station, £50.
- (b.) For any siding-access at either of the chief stations, Auckland, Napier, Wellington, Lyttelton, Christ-church, Timaru, Oamaru, Port Chalmers, Dun-edin, Invercargill, Bluff, £50.
 (c.) For any siding-access at any other railway-station, £25

Upon the expiration of the term for which any existing rights have been granted (whether before or after this bylaw comes into force), the grantees may renew their tenure under this by-law at the option of the Minister for Railways, but, failing the Minister's approval thereto, the siding will be removed by the Minister.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF LAND.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF LAND. This block is situated generally on the slopes of the Three Kings Ranges, lying between the head waters of the Waio-waka and Maraimanga Streams, and also the branches of the Pakowai Stream, about nine miles from Rakaunui, on the Alfredton-Weber Road, at its junction with the road from Pahiatua and Makuri. The area comprises generally hilly and undulating land, intersected by valleys with good flats on the principal streams; the gullies, however, merging into gorges in places. The block is fairly well watered by numerous streams, the smaller of which will probably be dry in summer. About three-fourths of the area is covered with light mixed forest, comprising matai, rimu, kahikatea, birch, tawa, rewa, &c., with a few totaras, and a mixed undergrowth of supplejack, rangiora, &c. The remaining fourth of the area is covered with manuka scrub, through portions of which the fire has passed, and grass has grown. The formation is papa, with patches of sandstone. The soil varies in quality from poor to good. Rakaunui contains a store, post-office, and school, and is approached from Pahiatua and Makuri by thirty miles of dray-road, twenty-three of which is metalled, the balance being a good horse-road. The distance to Eketahuna is about the same, by a well-formed dray-road.
