N pursuance of the power and authority conferred upon me by section four of "The Land Act, 1892," I, Uchter hn Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of John Mari New Zealand, do hereby revoke the warrant dated the twenty-sixth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and published in New Zealand Gasette No. 7, of the third day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, making rules and regulations for the management of the Papakaio portion of the Waitaki Islands Islands.

Rules and Regulations for the Management of the Papakaio Portion of the Wailaki Islands.

### RANFURLY, Governor.

WHEREAS by section four of "The Land Act, 1892" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), the Governor is empowered to make, alter, or revoke rules, regulations, is empowered to make, alter, or revoke rules, regulations, and orders for, among other things, the care, management, and protection in every manner of all unoccupied Crown lands: Now, therefore, I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ran-furly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pur-suance and exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, do hereby make the following rules, regula-tions, and orders for the care and management of the Crown lands within the banks of the Waitaki River described in the First Schedule to such regulations, which shall hereafter be known as the Papakaio portion of the Waitaki Islands, and do hereby declare that such regulations shall come into force on the day of the gazetting hereof.

#### REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS. 1. For the purpose of carrying out these regulations five persons shall be elected at a public meeting of the holders of licenses to depasture cattle or stock upon the said islands (hereinafter termed "licensed holders"), at Awamoko; on Friday, the 27th day of January, 1899; and the names of such persons, when so elected, shall be submitted to the Governor for approval, and, if so approved, shall be a Com-mittee for the care, management, and protection of the said islands, and shall be known as the Papakaio: (Waitaki Islands) Committee (hereinafter referred to as "the Com-mittee"). Three of such Committee shall retire by ballot in December in each year, but they shall be eligible for reap-pointment as hereinafter provided. 2. On the first Wednesday in January in each year an election shall take place from among the "licensed holders,"

instead of the three retiring members; and the names of such persons, when so elected, shall be submitted to the Governor for approval, and if so approved they shall take the place of the three retiring members. 3. The Committee shall meet for the transaction of busi-

3. The Committee shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Wednesday in each month; at 2 o'clock p.m.; at Awamoko, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Committee. This first meeting shall be held on Wednesday, the 1st day of February, 1899. 4. Special meetings may be convened by the Chaisman or by any two members of the Committee, provided that two days notice of such meeting, be given to seeh member, specifying the business to be transacted at such sp cial meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting. 5. Any three of the said Committee shall form a guorum

be transacted at such meeting. 5. Any three of the said Committee shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time. 6. The members of the Committee shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the first Wednesday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor. At such meeting a Secretary shall also be appointed by the Committee.

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8. If, by retirement, resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

a Chairman. 9. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Committee present at a meeting. 10. The words "great cattle" shall be construed to mean and include cattle, horses, mules, and asses, male or female, and their offspring above six months of age; and the words "small cattle" shall be construed to mean sheep, male and female, and their offspring above the age of six months. 11. 16. All cattle depastured must be branded, and the brand and a description of the cattle must be registered with the

The Ranger shall issue a certificate of registration in such form as he thinks fit, and the fee for every such certificate shall be 1s. But if the brand is registered with the application, no further registration shall be necessary. 17. No great cattle suffering from any disease shall be depastured upon, nor shall any pigs or goats be allowed to trespass or be at large upon or within, the lands described in the First Schedule. No bull, ram, or stallion shall be depastured without the express permission in writing of the Chairman of the Committee. Any person or persons com-mitting a breach of this provision shall be liable, on the information of such Chairman, as for trespass of cattle on Crown lands; and the Chairman of Committee for the time being is hereby empowered to lay any such information.

Sna,—I have the honour to transmit to you, for the con-sideration of your Government, a circular issued by the Board of Customs setting forth the modified practice now obtaining in the United Kingdom in regard to the treatment of goods passing through this country in transit for re-exportation, consequent upon the recent report of the Select Committee of the House of Commons on the Merchandise Marks Acts. It will be observed that the suggestion is made that the colonial authorities should satisfy themselves that goods bearing marks indicating British origin which arrive in a vessel which has cleared from a British port are really of British production or manufacture, and are not foreign goods which have merely passed through the United King-dom. # NOTE FOR COMMUNICATION TO THE GOVERNMENT OF INDIA AND TO COLONIAL GOVERNMENTS.

It is thought that it may be advisable, in connection with the subject of merchandise marks, to invite the attention of the Government of India, and of the Governments of those colonies which have legislated for the protection of indus-trial marks, to the following extract from the forty-second annual report of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Cus-toms, being that for the financial year 1897-98:---

toms, being that for the financial year 1897-98:---"The Select Committee\* further recommended that goods in transit should be exempted from the operation of the Merchandise Marks Acts. To give full effect to this recom-mendation, an alteration of the law would be required. But, acting in the spirit of the recommendation, we have, with your Lordships' concurrence, adopted the principle that no examination of goods in transit is to be made spe-cially for the purpose of scrutinising marks. Accordingly we now take notice of marks on such goods only if we meet

with your Lordships' concurrence, adopted the principle that no examination of goods in transit is to be made spe-cially for the purpose of scrutinising marks. Accordingly we now take notice of marks on such goods only if we meet with them in the course of examination of the goods for revenue purposes; and, as we are revising our transit regula-tions with a view to reducing to a minimum the opening and examination of packages in transit, the occasions on which, in future, marks will come under observation will be rare. As further recommended by the Committee, steps are being taken to ascertain what precautions may be necessary to prevent the Customs authorities in India and the colonies from being misled as to the origin of goods that have passed through the United Kingdom in transit." Goods of foreign manufacture may pass through the ports of the United Kingdom for places abroad in several ways. They may be imported into the United Kingdom, may remain there for some time, and then be re-exported. In that case the goods, on their arrival in the United Kingdom, are treated as though they were for home-consumption, and are subjected to full examination by the Customs. To goods of this class this memorandum has no reference. It refers only to goods that pass through the United Kingdom avowedly in transit, and such goods may be of two kinds. They may form part of a cargo loaded abroad, remaining a British port; or they may be transhipped in the United Kingdom, and form part of the cargo placed on board in this country. In the former case they are not, and never have been, subjected to inspection by the British Customs; but in the latter case they have, until recently, undergone a certain amount of examination, and occasional detentions have been made of goods in transit that violated the pro-visions of the Merchandise Marks Acts. In future, as will be gathered from the above extract, goods entered for tran-shipment will very seldom be examined by the British Customs, and it seems' right that the Customs in this

as satisfactory in respect of marks. It will thus be necessary for the Indian and colonial authorities to satisfy themselves that goods bearing marks suggestive of British origin, arriving in a vessel that has

cleared from a British port, are really of British production or manufacture, and are not foreign goods that have merely passed through the United Kingdom. As some guide on this point it may be well to remark that, according to the regulations of this country, when goods are reported and entered as in transit for a British possession, a transhipment certificate (in form annexed, usually printed on pink paper) is made out by the exporter or his agent, and, when signed by the proper Customs officer, is attached to the "clearance" of the ship. Thus a ship's papers contain evidence as to what portion of her cargo has been brought from abroad and put on board after transhipment : and it would be open to the Customs officers in India and the colonies to inspect such evidence if they thought fit. The evidence would not apply to goods loaded abroad, and carried forward to their destination in the same vessel; in regard to these it would remain necessary, in cases of suspicion, to find other means of ascertaining the circumstances under which they had been placed on board a vessel arriving from the United Kingdom.
