WHEREAS by section one hundred and fourteen of "the Public Works Act, 1894" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation publicly notified, direct that any bridge already constructed, or which may hereafter be con-structed, over or across any river or arm of the sea shall, from and after a date to be fixed in such Proclamation, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of such local authority as shall be mentioned in that behalf in such Proclamation; and may by any such Proclamation as afore-said fix and determine whether all or any, and, if so, what part, of the cost, whether theretofore incurred or thereafter to be incurred, of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing any such Proclamation as afore-said dix and to whom any such payment is to be made : And when, and to whom any such payment is to be made : And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that the Governor may from time to time, with the view of deter-mining whether it is expedient to vest the exclusive care, control, management, and maintenance of any such work in any local authority, direct any person to be a Commis-sioner to inquire into and report to him upon any matter which he shall deem necessary to enable him to determine any such question as aforesaid: And whereas a Commissioner was appointed and an inquiry was duly held with a view to determining what local authority could most conveniently and efficiently con-trol the work mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and herein-after referred to as "the said bridge," and what proportion of the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or recon-structing the said bridge should be paid by any, and, if so, which, local authority or authorities: And whereas such Commissioner did report to the Governor after due inquiry his opinion as to the matters respecting which he was ap-pointed to report: And whereas it is expedient to make provision under

pointed to report: And whereas it is expedient to make provision under the said Act for the purposes and in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the

said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and direct that the said work described in the Schedule hereto, and known as the "swing-bridge on or near the boundary between the Borough and County of Whangarei," shall, from and after the date of this Proclamation, be under the exclusive care, and control, and management of the Whangarei Borough Council; and in further pursuance of the aforesaid powers and authorities I do hereby fix and determine that the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said bridge shall be borne by the Whangarei Borough Council in the proportion of one-half, and by the Whangarei County Council in the proportion of one-half, of the cost : And I do hereby fix and determine that the cost of main-taining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said bridge at any future time shall be borne by the said local bodies in the said proportions respectively. And I do hereby also further direct that any contribution hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Whangarei County Council shall be paid from time to time, in the pro-portion hereinbefore prescribed, out of the county funds of the County Council, within a period of thirty days after

County Council shall be paid from time to time, in the pro-portion hereinbefore prescribed, out of the county funds of the County Council, within a period of thirty days after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the said Wha-ngarei Borough Council; and all such payments shall be made from time to time to the Clerk of the said Borough Council for and on account of such borough Council for and on account of such borough.

 (b.) Of every person of whose qualification as a burgess he is satisfied; and also
 (c.) Of every person who makes personal application to him at his office for enrolment in respect of any specified qualification; and also
 (d.) Of every person who makes, and delivers or transmits to him at his office, a claim for enrolment as next hereinafter provided.

 (2.) Such claim for enrolment shall be in the form or to the effect set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, and the claimant's signature shall be attested by either a Justice of the Peace, or a Postmaster, or a minister of religion, or a burgess of the borough, or the Town Clerk.
 (3.) It shall be the duty of the Council to keep at the Town Clerk's office a supply of blank printed claim-forms for the free use of claimants under the aforesaid paragraph (d).
 (4.) Names appearing on the burgess roll for any year shall be continued on the burgess list for the succeeding year, except in the case of persons who are known to the Town Clerk to have died or to have lost their qualification, and it shall be his duty to report in writing to the Council all names thus omitted, and the reasons of the omis sion. names thus omitted, and the reasons of the omission.

For the purpose of amending the burgess list by the addition of new names after the burgess list has become the burgess roll, supplementary burgess lists may from time to time be prepared; and with respect to every such supple-mentary list the following provisions shall apply:— (1.) The names shall be entered therein in alphabetical order of suprementary and shell be numbered con-

- order of surnames, and shall be numbered con-secutively, commencing, in the case of each sepa-rate part of the list, with the number next follow-ing the last number in the same part of the last-number list ther in force. preceding list then in force.

 (2.) Each supplementary burgess list shall be deemed to be incorporated with the original burgess list, and, when corrected, signed, and certified in manner provided by section 69 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1886," shall be a supplementary burgess roll, and be deemed to be incorporated with the original burgess roll then in force.






Part I.-Ratepayers' List.

The number of candidates to be selected annually varies according to the requirements of the Forest Service in India; the figures as regards each particular year will be ad-vertised from time to time. They will, in such case, have to pay the fee due in respect of each examination. + There is no form of application; the documents specified in paragraph 4, (2), clauses (a) and (b), should be enclosed in a covering letter addressed to the Secretary, Revenue Department, India Office, London. : With a view to prevent parents and guardians from incurring the inconvenience and expense of preparing candidates who may be physically unfit for the Forest Service, it is suggested that, before any such preparation is begun, candidates be submitted to examination by the medical adviser of the family, or any other qualified medical practitioner, with regard to the following points: (1) A weak constitution, (2) defective vision, (3) impaired hearing, (4) the existence of any congenital defect, (5) the condition of teeth. It is to be understood that this private examination is merely suggested to lessen the chances of disappointment, and that it is by no means intended to take the place of, or to influence in any way, the official examination, which is obligatory on all candidates. If the full number of competent probationers required in any year cannot be obtained from the persons so examined, the Secretary of State reserves a discretion to fill up the deficiency by selecting any other person or persons whom, after consulting the authorities of the College, he may consider properly qualified to become probationers for the Forest Service for the Forest Service.

for the Forest Service. 5. The course of study for candidates for the India Forest Service extends over about three years. For about seven terms the candidates will prosecute their studies mainly at the College, and during the period of foreign study, which will occupy the remainder of the course, they will visit, under suitable supervision, such continental forests as may be selected for the purpose. Excursions may also be made for purposes of instruction, both during term-time and during part of the vacations. part of the vacations.

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6. Each annual session begins in September, and is di-vided into three terms, with vacations of about four weeks at Christmas, two weeks at Easter, and eight weeks in the summer

7. When students are on tour, and during the course of practical instruction, whether in Great Britain or on the Continent, the Secretary of State will defray the expenses of (1) board, lodging, and washing (the aggregate maximum expenditure under these heads being 10s. per diam), (2) travelling-expenses, and (3) fees to local forest officers, &c. Students are required to provide their own class-books and

Students are required to provide their own class-books and drawing-instruments. Drawing-paper, drawing-boards, and surveying-instruments are provided by the College. 10. The prescribed course of study comprises the following subjects:—I. Auxiliary subjects: (1) geometrical drawing, (2) freehand drawing, (3) surveying, (4) forest engineering, (5) accounts, (6) German, (7) mechanics, (8) physics, (9) ohe-mistry, (10) geology and mineralogy, (11) entomology, (12) botany, (13) drill and gymnastics. II. Forestry, theo-retical and practical, in all its branches. 11. Every student is required to conform to the College rules, to exhibit due diligence in his studies throughout the course, and to give evidence of satisfactory progress in such manner as may be required, failing which, or in the event of serious misconduct, he will be liable to be removed from the College, or to be sent back from the foreign study, which may entail the loss of his appointment.

During the course of study the proficiency of the students will be tested by periodical examinations, and on the termination of their studies there will be a final examina-tion. Each student may also, at the disorction of the Secretary of State for India, be required from time to time to appear before the Medical Board at the expiration of the first year of residence at the College, and should the result be unsatisfactory he cannot claim to be allowed to complete the course. complete the course.

The subjects enumerated in paragraph 10 are grouped in certain main branches of study,* and a fixed minimum of qualification is required in each branch and in the subjects taught during the forest tours, as well as a certain minimum for all branches taken together. Students who obtain these minima will receive the College diploma in forestry. 14. Candidates who have obtained this diploma and are found to be of sound constitution and free from physical defects which would render them unsuitable for employment in the Forest Denartment (the final decision on which point

in the Forest Department (the final decision on which point will rest with the Secretary of State for India), will be ap-pointed Assistant Conservators in the Forest Department of India in the order of their standing at the end of the final examination. General Description of Land.

General Description of Land. The above-mentioned sections form portion of the Ngapaeruru Block, which is situate to the eastward of the Town of Dannevirke, and comprise all the forest country between the Waikopiro Settlement and the well-known Mangatoro Estate. 
