Line 2: Inserting a comma after "measuring."

In the drawings: Striking out Figures 1, 2, 3, and 4, and inserting three fresh figures.

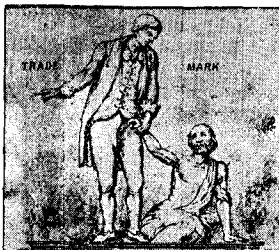
