Bonuses for Encouragement of New Zealand Hemp (Phormium tenax) Industry.—Notice No. 535.

Department of Agriculture, Wellington, 13th February, 1899. Bonus No. 1.

A BONUS of £1,750 is offered for a machine or process for dressing New Zealand hemp (*Phormium tenax*) which shall be an improvement on the machines or processes

which shall be an improvement on the machines or processes now in use, and which shall, after trial, be found to materially reduce the cost of production, improve the product, or increase the quantity of dressed fibre.

The following are the conditions:—

1. All applications for the bonus must be sent addressed to the Hon. the Minister for Agriculture, Wellington, and must reach him not later than the 31st March, 1900. Each application must be accompanied by a description of the machine or process, particularly stating improvements on present machines or processes, and also the cost at which the machine or process can be supplied.

2. The applicants must be prepared to submit their

2. The applicants must be prepared to submit their machines or processes to examination at such time and place as the Government may direct.

3. The Government shall appoint a committee of three or

3. The Government shall appoint a committee of three or more experts, to whom all applications shall be submitted. Such committee shall, after perusal, state what machines or processes they deem worthy of consideration, and may inspect the same at any place within the colony; and, having so inspected the whole or any of them, may direct that the whole or any of them be brought for further trial to such place as they may think fit.

The cost of bringing the machines or appliances on to the ground, from within the colony, supplying the necessary shafting, motive-power, and buildings, to be defrayed by the Government. If any machine sent from beyond the colony

shafting, motive-power, and buildings, to be defrayed by the Government. If any machine sent from beyond the colony is awarded the bonus or part thereof, then the cost of bringing such machine shall be borne by the Government.

The following shall be the basis of the test:—

The committee shall supply a sufficient and equal quantity of green hemp to each machine or process as a test.

The committee shall take into consideration—

The time occupied by each machine or process in the operation:

operation;
The cost of labour and time required after the fibre has left the machine or process before it is ready for

The percentage of dressed fibre and tow produced by

each machine or process;
The cost of producing the same;
The cost of the machine, and the simplicity and dura-

bility of the working parts.
On completion of the tests the committee shall furnish a report to the Minister on all the machines or processes which they have examined or tested, and shall state,—

 The machine or process which they consider on the whole the most efficient and economic.
 Whether they consider that any machine or process (2.) Whether they consider that any machine or process tested so materially reduces the cost of production, or improves the product, as to be worthy of the whole bonus or of a part only.
(3.) Whether, in the event of no one machine or process being entitled to the whole bonus, they deem any machine or process worthy of a part of the bonus, and if so how much

and, if so, how much.

Bonus No. 2.

A bonus of £250 is offered for a process of utilising the waste products of the hemp.

The first three conditions of Bonus No. 1 to apply to this

also.

The committee shall supply a sufficient and equal quantity of the waste products to each process as a test.

On completion of the tests the committee shall report to the Minister, and shall give the following particulars of each process: (a.) The nature of the article made. (b.) The quantity produced, and the cost of production. (c.) The value of the product. (d.) Whether any of the processes are of sufficient importance to warrant the Minister in giving (1) the whole, or (2) any part, of the bonus; (3) if a part only, how much. only, how much.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 368, against 402 in December—a decrease of 34. The deaths in January were 202—an increase of 6 on the number in December. Of the total deaths, males contributed 115, females 87. Seventy-seven of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 38·12 per cent. of the whole number; 64 of these were under 1 year of age. There were 34 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Seven men, 66, 67 (two), 70, 72, 74, 75, and three women, 66, 67, 79, died at Auckland; two men, 72, 74, and two women, 75, 76, at Wellington; eight men, 65, 68, 69 (two), 71, 75 (two), 77, and three women, 70, 72, 82, at Christchurch; and four men, 68, 71, 77, 88, and five women, 65, 70 (two), 75, 81, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at each of the four centres. The rates for January are,—

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—Deaths in this class at the four centres taken together showed a marked increase for January over December of last year. But the increase is nearly all at Christchurch, where the mortality from zymotic diseases amounted to 20 deaths in January against 1 in December: 15 of these 20 at Christchurch and its suburbs were caused by diarrhoal diseases, 3 by measles, 1 by diphtheria, and 1 by typhoid fever. At Auckland there were 12 deaths—4 from diarrhoal diseases, 4 from measles, 2 from whooping-cough, and 2 from typhoid fever. At Wellington diarrhoal diseases caused 4 deaths, measles 1, and typhoid fever 1. Dunedin had only 1 death from diarrhoa and 1 from typhoid.

Constitutional Diseases.—The deaths at the four towns were 54 in January, being the same number as in December. 18 persons died of cancer, 27 of phthisis and other tubercular diseases, and 2 from diabetes.

Local Diseases.—Of a total of 75 deaths, 15 were from diseases of the nervous system (including 3 meningitis and 6 apoplexy), 17 of the circulatory system (mostly heart-disease), 12 of the respiratory (bronchitis, pneumonia, &c.), 23 of the digestive, 1 of the lymphatic, 5 of the urinary (3 Bright's), 1 of the reproductive system, and 1 of the organs of locomotion.

Violent Deaths.—There were 8 in January, all accidental. A pensioner died from the effects of a fractured thigh, a steward from falling into the hold of a steamer, a seaman was found drowned, a carrier was killed by falling from a cart upset by cyclists, a bootmaker killed himself by discharging unintentionally a rifle, a lumper was killed by falling down the hold of a ship, a storekeeper was drowned in a tank, and an infant died from operation at birth.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
