

Additional Regulations under "The Mining Act, 1898."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty eighth day of June, 1899.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. IN exercise of the powers conferred upon him by "The Mining Act, 1898," and of all other powers and au-thorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the additional regulations hereunder set forth, and doth hereby declare that they shall be read together with the regulations (hereinafter called "the principal regulations") made by Order in Council dated the twenty-seventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and gazetted on the thirtieth idem. on the thirtieth idem.

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS.

MARRING-OUT OF CLAIMS AND OTHER MINING PRIVILEGES. 1. Clause 22 of the principal regulations is hereby amended follows

- (1.) It shall be sufficient if the pegs stand not less than 2 ft. above the surface of the ground, in lieu of 3 ft.
- (2.) Without affecting the requirement of pegs at the angle-points, it shall be sufficient if along the boundary-line the distance between any one peg and the next does not exceed 1,200 ft. in the case of a race, tunnel, or road, and 600 ft. in any other case.
- (3.) In lieu of cutting a trench it shall be sufficient if the direction of the boundary-line on each side of the peg is shown by a finger-post or tree-blazing, or in any other manner reasonably suffi-
- (4.) So much of subclause (5) of clause 22 as refers to the therein mentioned initial letters is hereby revoked.

APPLICATIONS IN RESPECT OF MINING PRIVILEGES.

2. It shall not be necessary for the applicant, his solicitor or agent. to attend in person at the office of the Registrar for the purpose of filing the application; and, in the event of the application reaching the office after office-hours, the time of filing shall be deemed to be the time when the office is next open for business.

3. The sketch-plan referred to in subclause (4) of clause 23 of the principal regulations shall not be necessary, and that subclause is hereby revoked accordingly: Provided that any time before the application is finally disposed of the Warden may require the applicant to supply

alaposed of the warden may require the applicant to supply a plan. 3a. The notification to be given by the applicant under subclause (9), and the duplicate original to be posted by him on the ground under subclause (10) of the aforesaid clause 23 shall be respectively given and posted on the day of the filing of the application, or as soon thereafter as is practicable, any-thing in those subclauses to the contrary notwithstanding.

REGISTRATION OF MINING PRIVILEGES, AND OF INSTRUMENTS AFFECTING THE SAME.

Register.

4. The Register may be divided into parts as follows:--Part I.: Claims. Part II.: Water-rights. Part III.: Busi-ness-site Licenses. Part IV.: Residence-site Licenses. Part V.: Special-site Licenses. Part VI.: Mineral Licenses. Part VII.: Miscellaneous. And registrations may be re-corded accordingly, nevertheless without affecting the nu-merical sequence of the instruments registered.

Annual Renewal of Registration in the Case of Licenses for Water-races.

for Water-races. 5. Within thirty days after the expiration of one year after the date of the original registration of any license for a water-race, and within the same period after the expira-tion of each subsequent year of the term of the license, the registration thereof shall be renewed by the licensee, and for that purpose the following provisions shall apply:--(1.) Such renewal shall be effected in the same manner, mutatis mutandis, as in the case of the original registration, save that the license shall be pro-duced to the Registrar, and that the entry to be made in the Register, as also the memorial to be indersed on the license, shall specify the data

be indorsed on the license, shall specify the date

of the renewal, together with the following not "Registration of license originally registered as No. renewed for year ending [Date, being one year, two years, or otherwise, as the case may be, computed from the date of the original registration].'

(2.) There shall be payable in respect of each such renewal a fee of 1s.

Index-books.

6. In addition to the index books prescribed under clause 77 of the principal regulations, the Registrar shall also keep a nominal index book which shall be in the form numbered 68 nominal index book which shall be in the form humbered of in the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain, in alpha-betical order of surnames of grantors or transferors as ap-pearing in the Register, the specified particulars of all registrations effected or renewed after the coming into operation of the Mining Act :

Provided that in any case where in respect of any registra-tion the number of grantors or transferors exceeds one, it shall be sufficient if the nominal index contains the name first appearing in the Register, together with the words "and another" or "and others," as the case may be.

General.

7. All references to the seal of the Court in clauses 65, 67,

and 69 of the principal regulations are hereby revoked. 7A. The fee payable, under clause 74 of the principal regu-lations, for a certified copy of any registered document is hereby reduced to 6d. per folio of ninety words or any part thereof.

LABOUR CONDITIONS.

8. In the case of a claim the title whereto is surrendered for purposes of exchange or amalgamation, the minimum number of workmen to be employed in proportion to the acreage, as prescribed by clause 81 of the principal regulations, shall be computed from the date on which the claim was originally marked out or taken possession of.
9. The application, under section 85 of the Mining Act, for authority to employ less than the prescribed minimum number of workmen may be in the form numbered 69 in the First Schedule hereto, and with respect to the application the following provisions shall apply:—

The application med not be publicly notified by advertisement unless the Warden otherwise directs.
The application may be granted in whole or in part as the Warden in his discretion thinks fit, and, if granted, shall be granted by certificate of reduction in the form numbered. 8. In the case of a claim the title whereto is surrendered

- (8.) The certificate shall be registered in the same man ner as in the case of a certificate of protection.

SUBBENDER FOR PURPOSES OF EXCHANGE.

10. With respect to the surrender of title for purposes of exchange under section 128 of the Mining Act, the following

- exchange under section 128 of the Mining Act, the following provisions shall apply:—

 The application need not be publicly notified unless the Warden otherwise directs.
 The consent of the Minister, under subsection (24) of section 186 of the Mining Act, to the corresponding mining privilege shall be necessary in the cases therein mentioned.
 - cases therein mentioned.
 (3.) The license for the corresponding mining privilege shall be in the ordinary form, with the addition of a memorandum, to be noted or indorsed on the license under the hand of the Warden and the seal of the Court, specifying—

 (a.) The fact that the license is issued in exchange for a surrendered mining privilege, and the name, description, and registered number of the surrendered nrivilege :

the surrendered privilege; (b.) The priorities, encumbrances, liens, and interests referred to in subsection (8) of sec-tion 128 of the Mining Act.

AMALGAMATION OF CLAIMS.

11. The provisions of the last-preceding clause of these regulations shall, mutatis mutandis, apply in the case of amalgamation of claims under section 129 of the Mining Act:

Provided that before granting the application the Warden shall be satisfied that there has been expended in mining operations on each of the claims not less than £10.

RENEWAL OF LICENSES FOR MINING PRIVILEGES.

13. Except in the case of tunnel prospecting licenses (for the renewal whereof provision is made in clause 10 of the principal regulations), the following provisions shall apply with respect to the renewal of licenses for mining privileges :

- (1.) The application for the renewal may be in the form numbered 71 in the First Schedule hereto, and shall be filed in the office of the Registrar within not more than two months nor less than one month before the expiration of the current term by effluxion of time, but need not be notified or advertised.
- (2.) The renewal shall be effected by issuing a fresh license in the ordinary form, expressed on its face to be issued in renewal of the former license, and with the same priorities, and subject to the same encumbrances, liens, and interests.
- Additional Provisions for the Safety of Life and Property in Connection with Mining Operations. Additional General Rules.

- 13. In addition to the general rules prescribed by section 206 of the Mining Act, the following general rules shall as far as practicable be observed in every mine :—

 (1.) The extent of ventilation to be prescribed under subsection (1) of section 206 of the Mining Act shall be at the rate of not less than 100 cubic feet of air per minute for every person, and 150 cubic feet of air per minute for every horse, whilst employed under ground :
 - employed under ground: Provided that in any case where the Inspector is satisfied that the aforesaid rate is insufficient is satisfied that the atoresaid rate is insufficient or more than sufficient for the purpose of pro-viding adequate ventilation either throughout the underground workings generally, or in any specified portions thereof, he may from time to time require such rate to be increased, or autho-rise it to be diminished, to such extent as in the circumstances he thinks reasonable.
 - circumstances he thinks reasonable.
 (2.) In any case where the Inspector is of opinion that, by reason of the use of timber or other inflam-mable material in a mine, there is risk of fire, he may require the holder of the mine to provide such number and description of smoke protectors as the Inspector thinks necessary, having regard to the nature and extent of the workings and of the right. the risk.
 - (3.) Any requirement, order, or direction of the Inspector (3.) Any requirement, order, or direction of the Inspector under the aforesaid section 206, or the principal regulations, or these regulations, may be made by writing under his hand addressed in general terms to the person in charge of the mine, and delivered at the mine; and it shall be the duty of the mine-owner and mine-manager to comply therewith in so far as is practicable.
 (4.) A printed copy of this clause of these regulations shall be kept posted in the office, and on some building or board in a conspicuous place, in connection with every mine.

- THE BOARD OF EXAMINERS AND CERTIFICATED MINE-MANAGERS AND BATTERY SUPERINTENDENTS. The Board.

14. With respect to the Board of Examiners the following

- 14. With respect to the Board of Examiners the following provisions shall apply: -
 (1.) At all meetings of the Board the quorum shall be four, and the Chairman appointed by the Governor shall preside: Provided that if at any meeting the Chairman is absent, the members present may appoint one of their number to act as chairman at such meeting in his stead, and, whilst so acting, the person so appointed shall have all the powers of the Chairman.
 (2.) Each member of the Board who is not otherwise employed in any department of the public service
 - ach member of the Board who is not otherwise employed in any department of the public service shall receive by way of travelling-expenses the sum of £1 11s. for each day's absence from his place of abode for the purpose of attending at a meeting of the Board, including the day of his leaving his place of abode, but not the day of his return thereto.
 - (3.) He shall also be repaid all sums properly expended by him for fares by railway, coach, or steamer in travelling for the purpose of such attendance.

Certificates by Examination.

- examinations the following provisions shall apply:—

 For the better conduct of the examinations the Board may appoint supervisors, with such func-tions and powers as the Board thinks fit.
 Every candidate for a certificate by examination shall, at least one month before the date fixed for the examination, make application in that behalf to the Secretary of the Board at Wel-lington

 lington.

- (3.) The application may be in the form numbered 72 in the First Schedule hereto.
- (4.) For the purpose of enabling the Board to determine or the purpose of enabling the Board to determine whether the candidate possesses the requisite practical experience, his application shall specify with sufficient particularity for identification and reference the respective mines in which he has been employed, and the period and nature of his employment therein, including, in the case of a battery superintendent's certificate, the nature of the chemical process used in the mine, and of the machinery and appliances connected there-with. with.
- (5.) For the purposes of section 190 of the Mining Act, the requisite practical experience of a candidate for a battery superintendent's certificate shall be actual employment for not less than twelve months in the working of the chemical process used in the mine, and of the machinery and ap-pliances connected therewith. (6.) The evidence in writing from previous employers in
- proof of the nature and extent of the candidate's practical experience, to be supplied to the Board as required by section 190 of the Mining Act, shall be so supplied at the same time as the application

is forwarded, or as soon thereafter as is possible. (7.) The subjects of examination for certificates as minemanagers shall consist of four Parts, as follows :-

Part 1.-Quartz and Alluvial Workings

(a.) The laying-out and construction of shafts, chambers, main drives or levels, adits, uprises, and stopes.

(b.) The timbering of shafts, adits, main drives or levels, passes, stopes, and generally the systems of timbering mines and filling up old workings.

(c.) Pumping appliances and the drainage of

(c.) Pumping appliances and the drainage of mines.
(d.) The haulage in shafts and on underground planes; also the strength of haulage ropes and chains.
(e.) The ventilation of mines and composition of gases.
(f.) Tapping water in mines, and the mode of constructing dams in underground workings to keep the water back.
(a.) Blasting and the use of explosives.

(g.) Blasting and the use of explosives. (h.) The effect that faults, slides, and mullock-bars have on lodes, and how to ascertain the direction of slides and heavals.

(i.) A knowledge of underground surveying, and of making plans of the underground workings, showing the dip or inclination and strike of the reefs or lodes.

(j.) A knowledge of the different rocks where gold, silver, tin, copper, zinc, lead, and antimony are found, and the formation of lodes and leads.

Part 2.-Dredaina.

(k.) The mooring and working of dredges, and e working of appliances required to carry on the gold-dredging operations. (l.) The strength of ropes, chains, machinery,

and appliances necessary to carry on dredging operations.

(m.) Pumping appliances for raising water for washing the dredged material, and supplying water for steam boilers.

(n.) The recovery of gold from the dredged material.

Part 3.-Hydraulic Sluicing.

(o.) The diamster, strength, and jointing of hydraulic pipes required to convey specified heads

of water. (p) The construction of water and tail races. (q) The working of auriferous gravels by hy-draulic sluicing, either by elevating (r otherwise, including sluices and gold-saving appliances.

Part 4.-General.

(r.) A knowledge of arithmetic and the method of keeping mining accounts. (s.) A knowledge of Part V. of "The Mining Act, 1898"—oral.

(8.) Candidates who pass shall be entitled to first- or second-class certificates, according to merit: Provided that if the candidate fails in Part 1 he shall be deemed to have failed in the whole examination, and in no case shall he be entitled to a first-class certificate unless he passes satis-factorily in Parts 1 and 4, and also in either Part 2 or Part 3.

- (9.) If the candidate is the holder of a second-class certificate he shall state the fact in his applica-tion, in which case his examination shall be deemed to be for a first-class certificate, and if he passes he shall surrender his second-class certifi-
- (10.) The subjects of examination for certificates as battery superintendents shall be as follows: —

 (a.) The different modes of reducing and pul-

(a) The dimeters induces of rotating and particular versing ores.
(b) Amalgamating machines.
(c) The use of quicksilver, and methods of using it in connection with the extraction of gold and silver from ores.

(d.) Cyanide, chlorination, and other chemical (e.) The sampling and testing of ores.

General as to Certificates.

16. Certificates, whether by examination or without examination, shall be in such of the forms numbered 73 to 75 in the First Schedule hereto as are applicable.

17. The Board shall keep a register of all certificates issued by it, distinguishing those issued by examination from those issued without examination.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Duplicates of Documents lost or destroyed.

18. For the purposes of the issue of duplicates of lost or destroyed documents under the powers in that behalf con-tained in section 306 of the principal Act, the following pro-

- (1.) The apply: -- (1.) The application for the duplicate may be in the Form No. 76 in the First Schedule hereto, and shall be filed in the office of the Registrar, but need not be notified or advertised.

 - (2.) The statutory declaration embodied in the application shall be exempt from stamp duty.
 (3.) The Warden, if satisfied with the sworn proof of loss, may order the Registrar to issue a duplicate, and in such case the Registrar shall issue the management of the state of t same accordingly.
 - (4.) The duplicate shall be a copy of the original, with the addition of the words,-"Duplicate, issued this

day of 1 , in lieu of the original, which has been lost [or destroyed]. "A.B., Registrar."

(5.) The only fee payable shall be the application-fee of 2s.

Compensation in respect of Watercourses set apart for Discharge of Tailings.

19. The claim for compensation to be prescribed under section 109 of the Mining Act may be made in the form numbered 77 in the First Schedule hereto, or to that effect.

General as to Compensation.

20. Subject as last aforesaid, all claims for compensation against Her Majesty under the Mining Act may be made in such of the forms provided by "The Public Works Act, 1894," as are applicable, with all such modifications and alterations as the circumstances require.

As to Right to use Mining Works.

21. Subject to the provisions of section 164 of the Mining Act, the Warden may grant to any person working a claim the right to connect with and use any shaft, tunnel, or drive on any other person's claim

Provided that if such shaft, tunnel, or drive existed on the latter claim when it was taken up no compensation shall be payable by the grantee for or on account of the cost of construction.

As to Area, Form, and Dimensions of Sea-beach Claims.

22. Subclause (1) of clause 20 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking the words "and extending seawards indefinitely"; and subclause (2) of the same clause is hereby repealed.

As to Survey.

23. In every case where a claim or other mining privilege is surveyed, the surveyor's plan shall show the boundaries as marked out by the applicant, and the position of the pegs or other marks used in the marking-out.
24. On every angle- or corner peg used by the surveyor in surveying the land there shall be distinctly cut or burnt the applicant's distinguishing mark, together with, in the cases following the initial latters of the mining neivilege that is

following, the initial letters of the mining privilege, that is to say: S.C. for a special claim, E.C. for an extended claim, S.S. for a special site, W.R. for a water-race, T.R. for a tailrace, M.L. for a mineral license.

As to Expiry of Term of Licenses.

24A. The provisions of subclause (8) of clause 83 of the principal regulations (requiring the term of the therein-mentioned licenses to be so fixed as to expire on the 31st day of December) shall apply only in the case of licenses that are granted subject to the payment of rent or licensefee.

Fees.

25. Clauses 105 and 106 of the principal regulations (fixing certain fees, and the mode of payment thereof) are hereby

apply.




