RANFURLY, Governor. (L.S.) A PROCLAMATION.

A FROCHAMATION. The pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Marriage Act, 1880," I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage district known as the Opotiki District, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said district is hereby divided anew into two marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow : be as follow :

OPOTIKI DISTRICT.

OPOTINI DISTRICT. All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north and north-west generally by the sea from the mouth of the Waiotahi River to Cape Runaway : thence towards the east and south-east generally by a right line to the summit of Hikurangi Mountain ; thence by a right line to Kapua Trig. Station ; thence by a right line to Arowhana Trig. Station ; thence by a right line to Trig. Station No. 139, Arowhana Survey District ; thence by a right line to Trig. Station No. 140, and by the last-mentioned line pro-duced to the Motu River ; thence by the right bank of the said Motu River to the north-western boundary-line of the Motu Block ; thence by the said Motu Block to the Koranga River ; thence by the right bank of the said Koranga River to its source ; thence by a right line to Maungatopere Trig. Station ; and thence towards the west by a right line to the source of the Waiotahi River ; and thence by a line along the middle of the said Waiotahi River to the sea, the place of commencement. of commencement.

WHAKATANE DISTRICT.

WHARATANE DISTRICT. All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north generally by the sea from the mouth of the Whakatane River to the mouth of the Waiotahi River: thence towards the east generally by a line along the middle of the latter river to its source; thence by a right line to Maungapohatu Trig. Station; and thence by a right line to Trig. Station No. 93, Ngapakira: thence towards the south by a right line to the mouth of the Huiarau Stream in Wai-karemoana: and thence towards the west generally by said Huiarau Stream to its source; thence by a right line to the source of the Whakatane River; and thence by the said Whakatane River to the sea, the place of commencement. And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come

I N pursuance and exercise of the power and authority Conferred upon me by the third section of "The Native Townships Act, 1895," I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ran-furly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the parcel of Native land situated in the Wellington Land District, and described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and the same is hereby set apart as a site for a Native township, and I do hereby assign the name of "Potaka" to such Native township.

Licensing J. T. Grifin to use and occupy a Part of the Fore-shore of Omaka River, Wairau, as a Wharf-site.

RANFURLY, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirty-first day of July, 1899.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under VV to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (bereinafter called "the said Act"), John Thomas Griffin, of Blenheim (hereinafter called "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore, and of the land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, in the Omaka River, Wairau, in order to erect a wharf thereon, and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," has deposited plans in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 2270 and 2282), showing the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark showing the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied, and the manner in which it is pro-posed to erect the wharf: And whereas the Governor in Council has approved of the purpose for which the said fore-shore and land below low-water mark are to be occupied: And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the licensee under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter ex-

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and converse of the Colony Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the licensee as afore-said; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark on which the wharf is to be erected, as shown on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said wharf thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

I. In these conditions the term winnister means the Minister having Charge of the Marine Department, as de-fined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the foreshore and land below low water mark necessary for the erection of the wharf, as shown on plan marked M.D. 2282.

In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of 10s., pay-able on the 1st day of July, dating from the 1st day of July, 1899, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Connect Council.

4. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. Her Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the

5. Her Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment. 6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at his own cost suitable and neces-sary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister. And whereas by Order in Council dated the fifth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 49, of the seventh day of the same month, the Governor in Council made general harbour regulations:

And whereas it is desirable to make additional general harbour regulations :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in pur-suance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the hereinbefore-in-part-recited Act, doth hereby order and declare that on and after the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, the following general harbour regulations shall be in force in all ports of the colony:---

GENERAL HARBOUR REGULATIONS.

GENERAL HARBOUR REGULATIONS. 41A. The master or person in charge of every cargo-vessel or hulk over 100 tons gross register on board of which persons are working or residing, lying alongside of any wharf, shall keep for the use of persons coming from or going on board such vessel or hulk a proper or secure gang-way with double side rails, or stanchions with ropes rove taut through the same, the top rail or rope being not less than 3 ft. 3 in. high, and shall cause such gangway to be securely fixed to and extend from one portion of the deck or side rail to the wharf, with a good solid bearing at each end, and to be so kept fixed so long as such vessel or hulk shall be alongside such wharf. 41B. In the event of the outer end of any such gangway resting on the vessel's or hulk's side rail, the master or person in charge of any such vessel or hulk shall keep sub-stantial steps fixed to lead from the end of the gangway to the deck.

In cases in which by the preceding regulations it is required that a vessel or hulk shall have a gangway fixed, the master or person in charge of such vessel or hulk shall keep a proper bright light fixed and burning bright and clear over such gangway from sunset to sunrise in such a manner as to light the whole length of it properly. 41b. The master of every vessel between 20 and 100 tons gross register, inclusive, on board of which persons reside, lying alongside of any wharf, shall keep a proper bright light fixed burning bright and clear from sunset to sunrise to mark the most suitable place for persons to go on board

41E. Any person committing a breach of any of the above regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 100$.
