WHEREAS by the fifth section of "The Alcoholic Liquors Sale Control Act, 1893," it is among other things enacted that when the population of any riding of a county wherein the whole of "The Counties Act, 1886," is in force has suddenly increased in a large degree, and a petition signed by not less than one hundred residents thereof has been presented to the Governor, praying that power be granted to the Licensing Committee to issue a license or licenses therein, the Governor may, unless the determination of the electors has been previously made that no licenses shall be granted, by Order in Council grant such authority as in the said section mentioned: And whereas no licenses shall be granted, by Order in Council grant such authority as in the said section mentioned: And whereas the population of the Waitekauri Riding of the County of Ohinemuri (being a county wherein the whole of "The Counties Act, 1886," is in force) has suddenly increased in a large degree, and the said riding is situate in the Ohine-muri Licensing District as now constituted by law: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor, signed by not less than one hundred residents of the said riding, praying that power may be granted to the Licensing Committee of the Ohinemuri Licensing District to grant publicans' licenses within the said riding: And whereas no determination of the electors in the said riding has been previously made that no licenses shall be granted in the said district: said district :

- (1.) The machine or process which they consider on the whole the most efficient and economic.
 - Whether they consider that any machine or process tested so materially reduces the cost of produc-tion, or improves the product, as to be worthy of (3.) Whether, in the event of no one machine or process
 - machine or process worthy of a part of the bonus, and, if so, how much.





Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 364, against 347 in July—an increase of 17. The deaths in August were 212—an increase of 45 on the number in July. Of the total deaths, males contributed 122, females 90. Forty-six of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 21.70 per cent. of the whole number; 37 of these were under 1 year of age.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rates at Auckland, Christchurch, and Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths at the four centres from these diseases were the same number in August as in July—viz., 12. There had been no less than 40 deaths in May. Measles caused 2 deaths at Dunedin in August, and influenza 1 at the same town; whooping cough, 2 at Auckland; diphtheria, 1 at Christchurch; and typhoid fever, 1 at Wellington.

Constitutional Diseases.—Of 40 deaths in this class at the chief towns and suburbs, 23 were from phthisis, and 13 from cancer. The mortality from these two diseases was 17 per cent. of the total deaths from all causes.

Local Diseases.---Of 118 deaths, 26 were from diseases of the nervous system, 28 of the circulatory, 28 of the respiratory, 19 of the digestive, 2 of the lymphatic, and 15 of the urinary systems.

Violent Deaths.—There were 9 accidents and 1 suicide at the chief cities with suburbs. A female hotelkeeper was run over by a vehicle at Wellington; a boy was killed by falling from a ladder, a girl accidentally burned, a locksmith found drowned at Christchurch; three militiamen lost their lives at Mahanga Bay by an explosion of gun-cotton; an infant died of umbilical hemorrhage in Wellington, and another at birth in Dunedin. The suicide was that of an engineer, who shot himself, at Auckland, while temporarily insane.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
