

Prohibiting the Introduction of Scale-infested Fruit.--Notice No. 575.

RANFURLY, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it has been made to appear to my satisfaction that considerable quantities of fruit infested with various species of scale insects have been and are still imported into New Zealand, to the danger and detriment of the plantations of fruit-trees in this colony: And whereas it is expedient to prohibit the introduction of such fruit to this colony:

Now, therefore, I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by virtue of the power and authority conferred upon me by the third section of "The Orchard and Garden Pests Act, 1896," do hereby revoke a Proclamation (No. 503) prohibiting the in-troduction of scale-infested citrus fruit only, appearing in the New Zealand Gazette dated the ninth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim and declare that the introduction into New Zealand of any fruit infested with any species of scale insect (coccid), or in or on which there are traces that any such pest is or has been present in any form or stage of development, is hereby absolutely prohibited; and, if any of development, is hereby absolutely prohibited; and, if any fruit hereby prohibited is imported into this colony, then such fruit, and the packages containing the same, shall be dealt with in the manner provided by section six of the said Act with respect to plants and other things unlawfully introduced to the colony.

Trout - fishing, District. Regulations for Auckland Acclimatisation

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-third day of October, 1899.

Present: HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," His Excel-lency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regula-tions for all that part of the colony known as "The Auck-land Acclimatisation District," as the same is defined in the said regulations, and the waters thereof, except as herein-after mentioned; and doth hereby declare that these regula-tions shall, as from the date of the publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette, supersede all regulations at variance therewith. therewith.

REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS. 1. LICENSES to fish for trout in all waters within that dis-trict or part of the North Island known as "The Auck-land Acclimatisation District," which includes the Counties of Rodney, Waitemata, Eden, Manukan, Coromandel, Thames, Ohinemuri, Raglan, Waikato, Waipa, Piako, Rotorua, Kawhia, and Taupo West, may be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Auckland Acclimatisa-tion Society (hereinafter termed "the said society"), or any one authorised by the said Secretary in that behaff: Provided, however, that all fishing with rod and line, except with artificial fly, is prohibited in the Waimakariri River from its source to its junction with the Waihou or Thames River, and that all fishing is prohibited in the following streams within the County of Rotorua: All the tributaries of the Waikorowhiti, near Rotorus, and the Mangaweri and Mangapikopiko tributaries of the Whirinaki River. 2. For every license to fish for trout in the waters in the Auckland Acclimatisation District, issued to men under the hand of the Secretary of the Auckland Acclimatisation Society, or any one authorised by the said Secretary in that behalf, a fee of one pound will be charged.

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3. The Secretary of the said society, or his deputy, may issue licenses for the whole season to women for the sum of five shillings each; and to boys under the age of sixteen years for the whole season for the sum of ten shillings each; and to men, on and after the fifteenth day of January in any year, and until the fifteenth day of April in the same year, for the sum of twelve shillings and sixpence each. 4. Any holder of a license may fish with one rod and line

4. Any holder of a license may lish with one for and life for trout, and may use a landing-net or gaff to secure any trout caught with such rod and line, in all waters within "The Auckland Acclimatisation District," from the first day of November in any one year to the fifteenth day of

day of November in any one year to the fifteenth day of April in the year following, both inclusive.
5. No license shall authorise any person other than the person named therein to fish, and that with natural or artificial fly, insect, worm, or fish only.
6. No person shall have in his possession any of the salmonidæ or trout between the eighteenth day of April and the thirty-first day of October, which period is hereby appointed a close season for all such fish : Provided always that this regulation shall not apply to fish caught by the officers of the said society for purposes of acclimatisation.
7. No person shall put, throw, or place, or allow to be put, thrown, or placed, into any river or stream, on y dynamite or

or entrance of any such river or stream, any dynamite or other explosive substance, or any sawdust or sawmill refuse,

other explosive substance, or any sawdust or sawinin refuse, or anything of any kind or description whatever poisonous, deleterious, or noxious to fish. 8. No person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill, in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon-parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned to the meter from reheave it was taken to the water from whence it was taken. 9. No person shall fish for trout without a license; and

every person fishing shall, on demand of any ranger, con-stable, member of the said society, or person producing a license, produce and show to such ranger, member, constable, or person his license, and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing such trout.

10. Every trout not exceeding nine inches in length from nose to tip of tail, taken or caught by any person, shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

11. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other unsportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout; nor shall any of the above-mentioned baits be used with any medicated or chemical

mentioned baits be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever. 12. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish with or use any net or other engine, instrument, or device for taking fish in any river or stream within the district aforesaid, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream. 13. For the purposes of these regulations, the mouth of every such river or stream shall be deemed to include every outlet of the same and the sea-shore between such outlets, and shall extend over a radius of one-quarter of a mile from

and shall extend over a radius of one quarter of a mile from the point or line where the waters of such river or stream

the point or line where the waters of such river or stream meet those of the sea or of any harbour at low water. 14. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale, or shall fish for the purpose of obtaining for sale, any salmon, trout, or any part thereof. 15. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be less than forty shillings or more than fifty periods.

16. If any person shall be convicted of any offence against these regulations the license (if any) held by the offender shall thereupon become void.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Public Domains Act, 1881," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Coun-cil thereof, doth hereby revoke a certain Order in Council, dated the twenty-sixth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, making delegation of certain powers in manner as therein appears; and doth hereby, with the like advice and consent, and in respect of the land hereinafter mentioned, delegate all the powers con-

ferred by the said Act, except the powers conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, for the period of ten years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act), to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Happy Valley Domain Board, namely .--

MIGHAEL MOFFITT, OI WAIKAIA, Gentleman; Colin Robertson, of Waikaia, Farmer; JAMES HANDYSIDE, of Waikaia, Storekeeper; JOSEPH DAVIDSON, of Waikaia, Farmer; and JOHN MACK, of Waikaia, Station-manager

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipula-

tions hereinafter contained, that is to say,— 1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on 1. The Board shail meet for the transaction of business on the first Thursday in each month, at half-past seven o'clock p.m., at the office of James Handyside, Wellington Street, Waikaia, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Thursday, the seventh day of December, one thou-sand eight hundred and ninety-nine.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the first Thursday in January in every succeeding year there-after, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

The Board shall prepare and submit at each annual 5. meeting a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of December, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister of Lands as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

7. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the mem-bers may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

8. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting

And with the like advice and consent as aforesaid doth hereby also order that this delegation shall take effect in respect of the parcel of Crown lands described in the Schedule hereto.

1. Government telephones may only be used by the public for the purpose of conversing over long-distance wires at such times as may be fixed and notified by the Electric Telegraph Commissioner.
2. The following are the charges to be paid by the public for the use of Government telephones at such times and for such purpose as aforesaid :-For a period not exceeding six minutes, 2s. 6d.; and a further charge of 2s. 6d. for every additional six minutes or portion of six minutes.

Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

HREE scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable THREE scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition. The senior scholarship is open to Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Maka-rini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Native Schools Code, 1897. Candidates for the junior scholarships will be examined in the subjects specified for Standard IV. in the Native Schools Code, 1897. The questions will, however, be somewhat more difficult than those set for the standard examinations. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 18th and 19th December, 1899.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 417, against 364 in August—an increase of 53. The deaths in September were 179—a decrease of 33 on the number in August. Of the total deaths, males contributed 98, females 81. Forty-five of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 25.14 per cent. of the whole number; 36 of these were under 1 year of age.

were under 1 year of age. There were 40 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Nine men, 68, 69 (two), 72 (two), 73, 74 (two), 75, and two women, 66, 87, died at Auckland; twelve men, 66, 67, 71 (two), 73 (three), 74, 88, 90, 91, 93, and two women, 77, 80, at Wellington; three men, 65, 68, 73, and three women, 67, 77, 78, at Christchurch; and six men, 66, 71 (two); 77, 86, 94, and three women, 69, 75, 98, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at each of the four centres

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths at the four chief centres and suburbs during September from this class of disease numbered 14, of which 9 occurred at Wellington. Seven of these 9 deaths at Wellington were from whooping cough and 2 from diphtheria. The last-named disease was also found at Auckland (1 death) and at Christ-church (also 1 death). Influenza and diarrhœa are noticed as fatal at Christchurch, and typhoid fever at Dunedin—1 death are death.

Constitutional Diseases.—As usual, the proportion of the total mortality at the chief centres from constitutional diseases was high, being 21.23 per cent., in September. The number of deaths was 38 at the four towns, comprising 15 from phthisis, with 1 from tuberculosis, 2 from tubercular meningitis, and 1 from tubercular disease of the bowels. From cancer there were 13 deaths, and 1 one from diabetes mellitus.

Local Diseases.—The mortality in this class was 50.28 per cent. of the whole for the month, the number of deaths being 90. Sixteen were caused by diseases of the nervous system, including 6 of children by convulsions; 1 death was from ear-disease (organs of special sense), 20 from diseases of the circulatory system, 22 of the respiratory, 16 of the digestive, 9 of the urinary (6 Bright's disease), and 6 of the reproductive systems.

Violent Deaths.—These numbered 17: 10 accidental, 2 homicidal, and 5 suicidal. A carter was crushed to death by a dray passing over him at Auckland; an adult male died at Wellington of paralysis, the result of falling downstairs; a child of 5 years died at Auckland of traumatic tetanus. There were 3 deaths from accidental drowning, and 3 of children overlain, and an infant died at birth. A labourer met his death by violence at the hands of another person, and a child was found dead with marks of violence. A young man of 20 years committed suicide by shooting himself at Dunedin; a salesman killed himself by cutting his throat, and a bootmaker by hanging himself, at Auckland; and 2 women poisoned themselves at Christohurch.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
