New County of Opotiki divided into Ridings, &c.

(L.S.) RANFURLY, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

A PROCLAMATION. I exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Counties Act, 1886," and "The Whakatane County Act, 1899," I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby divide the new County of Opotiki, as constituted by the said Acts and as described in the First Schedule hereto, into three ridings, to be called the Ohiwa Riding, the Opotiki Riding, and the Waioeka Riding, and declare the names of the said ridings respectively in the Second Schedule hereto.

the names of the said ridings respectively in the Second Schedule hereto. And I do hereby declare that one member shall be elected for the Ohiwa Riding, one member for the Opotiki Riding, and five members for the Waioeka Riding. And I do further declare that Wednesday, the twenty-eighth day of March, one thousand nine hundred, shall be the day upon which the election of the first Council of the said County of Opotiki shall take place, and that Saturday, the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred, at two o'clock in the afternoon, shall be the time, and the County Council Offices, Church Street, Opotiki, shall be the place, at which the first meeting of the said Council shall be held.

FIRST SCHEDULE. COUNTY OF OPOTIKI.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north generally by the sea from the Maraetotara Road to Cape Runaway; thence towards the east and south-east generally by the Waiapu and Cook Counties; and to-wards the west generally by the Opotiki County, as described in the Schedule to "The Whakatane County Act, 1899."

Bonuses for Encouragement of New Zealand Hemp (Phor-mium tenax) Industry.-Notice No. 535.

Department of Agriculture, Wellington, 13th February, 1899.

BONUS No. 1. BONUS of £1,750 is offered for a machine or process for dressing New Zealand hemp (*Phormium tenax*) which shall be an improvement on the machines or processes now in use, and which shall, after trial, be found to materially reduce the cost of production, improve the product, or increase the quantity of dressed fibre. The following are the conditions :---

1. All applications for the bonus must be sent addressed to the Hon. the Minister for Agriculture, Wellington, and must reach him not later than the 31st March, 1900. Each application must be accompanied by a description of the machine or process, particularly stating improvements on present machines or processes, and also the cost at which the machine or process can be supplied.

2. The applicants must be prepared to submit their machines or processes to examination at such time and place as the Government may direct.

piace as the Government may direct. 3. The Government shall appoint a committee of three or more experts, to whom all applications shall be submitted. Such committee shall, after perusal, state what machines or processes they deem worthy of consideration, and may in-spect the same at any place within the colony; and, having so inspected the whole or any of them, may direct that the whole or any of them be brought for further trial to such place as they may think fit.

The cost of bringing the machines or appliances on to the ground, from within the colony, supplying the necessary shafting, motive-power, and buildings, to be defrayed by the Government. If any machine sent from beyond the colony is awarded the bonus or part thereof, then the cost of bring-ing such machine shall be borne by the Government. The following shall be the basis of the test:— The committee shall supply a sufficient and equal quan-tity of green hemp to each machine or process as a test. The cost of producing the same;

On completion of the tests the committee shall furnish report to the Minister on all the machines or processes

a report to the Minister on all the machines or processes which they have examined or tested, and shall state,—

- (1.) The machine or process which they consider on the whole the most efficient and economic.
- whole the most efficient and economic.
 (2.) Whether they consider that any machine or process tested so materially reduces the cost of production, or improves the product, as to be worthy of the whole bonus or of a part only.
 (3.) Whether, in the event of no one machine or process being entitled to the whole bonus, they deem any machine or process worthy of a part of the bonus, and, if so, how much.

BONUS NO. 2.

A bonus of £250 is offered for a process of utilising the waste products of the hemp. The first three conditions of Bonus No. 1 to apply to this
