WHEREAS by section four of "The Native Land Laws Amendment Act, 1895," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council, except from the operation of section one hundred and seventeen of "The Native Land Court Act, 1894" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), for a limited period or otherwise, and either generally or for such purposes and subject to such restrictions as shall be in such Order specified, any land, wheresoever situate, which is for the time being subject to the operation of the said section, or any interest therein or right over the same, or may in like manner make such exception in favour ex-elusively of any lessee or other person who has been bond clusively of any lessee or other person who has been bond fide in occupation of and has made improvements on such

clusively of any lessee or other person who has been *bota jide* in occupation of and has made improvements on such land, or has paid money to Native owners for lease or pur-chase thereof, prior to the passing of the said Act: Provided that no Order in Council under the provisions of this section shall take effect until after the expiration of two months from the date of the publication thereof in the *Gazette*: Provided also that every alienation under the provisions of this sec-tion shall be confirmed by the Court in terms of section fifty-three of the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred by section four of "The Native Land Laws Amendment Act, 1895," and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby except from the operation of section one hundred and seventeen of "The Native Land Court Act, 1894," for the purpose of alienation by way of sale, all that block or parcel of land, situate in the Pro-vincial District of Auckland, containing three hundred and five acres three roods twenty-four perches, more or less, inter historic of Alexand, containing since inducted and five acres three roods twenty-four perches, more or less, known as Okahuatiu No. 10 28<sup>8</sup>, and being the land com-prised in a partition order of the Native Land Court, dated the sixth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and hinety-seven, in favour of Peti Aata.

The North Island Main Trunk Railway, which is under construction, passes through the township, where a reserve has been made for proposed railway-station. The area comprises open, flat, and undulating land laid down in English grasses. Remnants of the forest—stumps and logs —still remain.
