

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-second day of October, 1900.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Public Domains Act, 1881," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke certain Orders in Council, dated thereof, doth hereby revoke certain Orders in Council, dated the third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and ninth day of August, one thousand eight hun-dred and ninety-seven, making delegation of certain powers in manner as therein appears; and doth hereby, with the like advice and consent, and in respect of the land hereinafter mentioned, delegate all the powers conferred by the said Act, except the powers conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, for the period of ten years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act) to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Wanaka Islands Domain Board, namely,—

ROBERT MCDOUGALL, JOHN IRONSIDE, GEORGE MILLER, THEODORE RUSSELL, and ANDREW McDougall

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipula-

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipula-tions hereinafter contained, that is to say,— 1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the third Wednesday in each month, at three o'clock p.m., at Pembroke, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Wednesday, the twenty-first day of Novem-ber, one thousand nine hundred. 2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting. at such meeting.

3. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time. 4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the third Wednesday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

his successor. 5. The Board shall prepare and submit at each annual meeting a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of December, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister of Lands as soon as possible after each annual meeting. 6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

such meeting. 7. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the mem-bers may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

Chairman. 8. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting. And with the like advice and consent as aforesaid doth hereby also order that this delegation shall take effect in respect of the parcel of Crown lands described in the Schedule hereto.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section twelve of "The Land for Settle-ments Act Amendment Act, 1896," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations to authorise advances to be made out of the Land for Settle-ments Account to successful applicants for the allotments, in aid of the cost of forcing up alporting the successful applicants for the allotments,

autorities Account to successful applicants for the allotments, in aid of the cost of fencing and planting the same and building dwellinghouses thereon, provided that in no case shall the total advance to any one such applicant exceed twenty pounds, nor shall any advance exceed pound for pound of the sum expended by him in fencing, planting, and building as aforesaid: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section twelve of the aforesaid Act, and by and with the advice and con-sent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations authorising advances being made to the successful applicants in the Aorangi Settlement, in the Wellington Land District, which has been acquired under "The Land for Settlements Act, 1894," and its amendments.

REGULATIONS.

1. ADVANCES may be made to lessees in the Aorangi Settle-ment under section 12 of "The Land for Settlements Act Amendment Act, 1896," and such advances shall be made upon and subject to the following conditions :---(1.) If the lessee is married an advance of not more than £20, and if he is single an advance of not more than £10,

may be made to him towards the cost of fencing and planting the land comprised in his lease, or of building a dwelling-house thereon if no dwellinghouse already exists.
(2.) Such advance shall not exceed one-half the value of the fencing, planting, and building actually done or erected by the lessee on the land.
(3.) No advance shall be made save on the written certificate of an inspector appointed in that behalf by the Land Board, specifying the total value of the work done by the lessee and the amount of the advance to which he is entitled, and certifying that such work has been well and faithfully done, and to the inspector's satisfaction.
(4.) Such advance, together with interest thereon at the rate of 5 per cent. per annum, computed from the date of the advance, shall be repayable by the lessee to the Receiver of Land Revenue on the half-yearly rent days specified in the lease held by such lessee, by equal half-yearly instalments in advance, extending over such period, being not less than five nor more than ten years, as with the approval of the Minister the Land Board thinks fit to prescribe : Provided that the lessee may, at any time during such period, repay the whole or any less number of the then future instalments, and obtain a duly proportionate rebate of interest. instalments, and obtain a duly proportionate rebate of interest.

(5.) A certificate under the hand of the Commissioner shall at all times and from time to time be conclusive evidence as to the date and amount of the advance, the amounts and due dates of the instalments, and the sums paid and unpaid in respect thereof.

As long as any such instalment remains unpaid the lessee shall insure all buildings and erections in the name of Her Majesty in a sum equal to the full insurable value thereof, and for the purposes of this provision the covenant for insurance set out in the Schedule to "The Land Transfer Act, 1885," shall be implied in the lesse. that the Governor in Council is authorised under the said Act to set apart any specified area of Crown lands within a kauri-gum district to be kauri-gum reserves under the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to create and set apart the kauri-gum reserves hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and con-sent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby set apart the several areas of Crown lands respectively described in the Schedule hereto as kauri-gum reserves, with the names respectively set over the descriptions of such reserves in the said Schedule.

By-law for New Zealand Government Railways. — Taking Vehicles or Large Animals on to Passenger-platforms.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by "The Public Works Act, 1894," "The Government Railways Act, 1894," and "The Public Works and Govern-ment Railways Acts Amendment Act, 1895," I, Joseph George Ward, the Minister for Railways, do hereby make the following by-law regulating the taking of vehicles or large animals on to passenger-platforms on railways of the New Zealand Government open for traffic, and do hereby declare that such by-law shall come into force on the day of the publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette, and shall apply to all such railways generally, namely :--

BY-LAW.

1. No person shall take or attempt to take any horse or other large animal, or any vehicle (cycles excepted), on to any platform at which passenger-trains arrive or from which such trains depart, unless for the purpose of loading or unloading such animal or vehicle into or from a railwaywagon.

2. No person shall ride or attempt to ride any animal or cycle on to or upon any such platform for any purpose whatsoever.

Any person who shall commit a breach of the foregoing by-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not ex-ceeding £10 for each such breach.

Memorandum as to the Importation of Dogs into Great Britain from Abroad.

THE disease of rabies in dogs and of hydrophobia in man, which remains prevalent in almost all other parts of the world, has become practically extinct in this country, and the regulations of the Board are designed to prevent its reintroduction.

reintroduction. 2. The importation of dogs into Great Britain from any foreign country, or British possession other than the Chan-nel Islands, without the sanction of the Board is prohibited by Orders made under the Diseases of Animals Acts;* and the landing of a dog from abroad (whether originally ex-ported from Great Britain or not) will, unless a license has previously been obtained, render the owner liable to a penalty of £20 and the possible seizure of the dog. 3. Every person who wishes to import a dog must make

previously been obtained, render the owner liable to a penalty of £20 and the possible seizure of the dog. 3. Every person who wishes to import a dog must make application in writing for the necessary license, on a form which will be supplied for the purpose, and the form should be accompanied by a letter addressed to the Secretary, Board of Agriculture, 4, Whitehall Place, London, S. W., explaining the circumstances under which the application is made, and stating how long the dog has been in the possession and per-sonal charge of the applicant. It is to be understood, how-ever, that an application is not necessarily followed by the issue of a license to land the dog, and that the Board cannot sanction the landing of dogs which usually live abroad, but which their owners while on a visit to this country wish to bring with them. 4. Every application must be made by the person who will be the owner of the dog during the period of detention in this country, and it should be forwarded in sufficient time to enable the Board to make full inquiries into the circum-stances and as to the suitability of the premises in which it is proposed that the dog should be isolated, and to permit of their decision being communicated to the application properly accept a dog for shipment to Great Britain from abroad unless the license is produced at the port of embarkation, and they are liable to prosecution if the dog is landed illegally. 5. At the present time the only isolation station so approved is the Dog Sanatorium, Bed-dington Lane, Mitcham, Surrey, to the manager of which establishment communications respecting terms, &c., should be addressed be addressed.

7. Dogs landed with licenses, Form A, should be for-warded in crates or hampers, and with the utmost possible expedition, to the isolation station.

expedition, to the isolation station. 8. If, however, the applicant is able to declare that the dog has been in his personal charge for three months, he may apply for a license, Form B, which requires the deten-tion of the dog for a period of six months on some suitable private premises, to be specified by the applicant and ap-proved by the Board, where the dog will be under the super-vision of the officers of the Board and of the local authority, for whose inspection it should be produced when required. If, however, the general conditions imposed are properly carried out, the Board are prepared, on the production of a certificate of a duly qualified veterinary surgeon that the dog is not affected with, or suspected of, rabies, to consider applications for the release of the dog after a period of ninety days.

applications for the release of the dog after a period of ninety days. 9. The applicant's private place of residence is regarded in most instances as a suitable place of detention for a dog detained under a license, Form B, provided that he is the householder, and that no other dogs are kept upon the pre-mises. Hotels, flats, lodgings, barracks, or other similar premises where the dog cannot be conveniently isolated, or where the owner of the dog cannot guarantee that the animal can be detained for the full period required by the Board, are not regarded as suitable places of detention. For a similar reason private residences are seldom suitable where more than one dog is to be imported. If the applicant has no fixed residence where the dog can be kept under his own charge, arrangements should be made for the detention of the dog for the necessary period at an isolation station, or on the premises of an experienced veterinary surgeon.

the dog for the necessary period at an isolation station, or on the premises of an experienced veterinary surgeon. 10. On arrival at a port in Great Britain, and before the dog can be landed, the holder of the license is required to produce it for the inspection of the officer of Her Majesty's Customs.

11. The license requires the dog, when landed, to be taken by the nearest available route, and without unnecessary delay, to the premises specified therein, and the arrival of the dog there must at once be notified in writing to the Board.

Board. 12. Where, however, dogs admitted under a license, Form B, are landed late in the day, and the place of deten-tion is distant from the port, the Board do not object to the journey of the dog being broken by its detention at some suitable place for one night, provided that it is kept apart from all other dogs, and that the journey is thereafter com-pleted with reasonable despatch.

13. The license should be retained by the person in charge of the dog, who is responsible for compliance with the con-ditions prescribed in the license. The license must be returned to the Board at the end of the period of detention, or at once if it is not made use of.

14. The dog cannot in any case be moved from the place of detention to other premises in the United Kingdom with-out a further license from the Board. Where the Board are out a further license from the Board. Where the Board are satisfied that exceptional circumstances have arisen which render the removal of a dog detained under a license, Form B, necessary or expedient, they are prepared to con-sider an application for a removal license, provided it is not proposed to remove the dog from a rural to an urban dis-trict, or from the original premises to a less suitable place of detention. Unless the dog is to be taken from the private provide of the approximation of a problem house in his occupation of detention. Unless the dog is to be taken from the prime residence of the owner to another house in his occupation, the premises of an experienced veterinary surgeon should be specified as the place of detention, and the removal cannot be authorised unless the dog can be detained at the second address for the remainder of the period of detention.

15. Where satisfactory arrangements of the character above indicated cannot be made by the owner, the dog must

above indicated cannot be made by the owner, the dog must be detained at the premises first specified, or removed to such place as the Board may direct. 16. During the period of detention under a license, Form B, the dog, when temporarily moved for exercise as provided in the license, must be properly muzzled with a wire-cage muzzle, and in charge of a competent person, and the former condition is also applicable when the dog is likely at any time to be brought into contact with other dogs.

17. Should a dog die, or be lost, whilst under detention, the fact should be at once reported to the Board, together with full information as to the symptoms preceding death, or the circumstances in which the loss took place. In the в

event of the dog sickening with any of the symptoms of rabies, it should be at once isolated, and the advice of a veterinary surgeon obtained.

18. A dog detained under a license of the Board cannot be moved to a vessel for exportation without a further license of the Board.

19. Licenses are issued by the Board to land performing 19. Licenses are issued by the Board to land performing dogs, if it can be shown that the dogs have been trained to take part in peformances for the entertainment of the pub-lic, and that they are to be imported for that purpose only, and that they are under an actual engagement to perform immediately on arrival. These licenses require that during a period of ninety days dogs so admitted shall be isolated from contact with all other dogs, that they shall not be taken into any public place unless properly muzzled in the manner set out in the license, and that during that period the Board shall at all times be kept informed of the premises upon which the dogs are detained. Satisfactory evidence

the Board shall at all times be kept morned of the premises upon which the dogs are detained. Satisfactory evidence must also be afforded that the animals are habitually kept apart from all other dogs, whether in this country or abroad. 20. For the convenience of persons passing through Great Britain the Board are prepared, in special cases, to issue licenses for the landing of dogs to be exported within a very four down. Application for such licenses about a provide the few days. Application for such licenses should specify the ports, the names of the vessels, the dates of their arrival and departure, and the address of some suitable place where the dog can be detained during the period that it remains in Great Britain. The license in this case should be indorsed by an officer of the vessel of departure, and returned to the Board by the owner. The dog cannot again be landed in Great Britain without a further license.

21. The experience of the Board has clearly shown that the frequent movement of pet dogs to and from the Con-tinent involves this country in serious danger, inasmuch as a pet dog may become infected with rabies without the knowledge and despite the utmost care on the part of its owner. It is therefore a matter of great importance to owners of dogs in Great Britain that dogs from abroad should only be admitted in instances where it has been satis-factorily established that some useful purpose will be served by their admission, or where a pet dog would otherwise be separated from its owner for a prolonged period. Pet dogs should not be taken abroad and thus exposed to the risk of infection, except in cases of real necessity

22. The Board earnestly invite the cordial co-operation of dog-owners in carrying out regulations which have been designed with a view to minimise the risk of reintroducing a very terrible disease.

Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

Bay. THREE scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition. One of these scholarships, to be called the senior scholarship, is open to all Maori boys under sixteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination: the other two scholarships are junior scholarships, one of which is open to all Maori boys under fifteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination who have attended a Native school or schools other than Te Aute or St. Stephen's, and whose attendance at school during the previous year is considered by the Inspector of Native Schools to have been satisfactory; the other is open to Maori boys whose attendance at any school other than Te Aute and St. Stephen's during the previous year has been similarly satisfactory. The senior scholarship is open to Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Native Schools Code, 1897.
