Altering Boundaries of Waipawa and Patangata Counties.

RANFURLY, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL. At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this thir teenth day of November, 1900.

Present:

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE R. J. SEDDON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

W HEREAS in exercise of the powers conferred by section three of "The Counties Act 1886 Amend-ment Act, 1895" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), the Waipawa County Council and the Patangata County Council Waipawa County Council and the Patangata County Council respectively did, by an instrument bearing date the twenty-fourth day of October, one thousand nine hundred, for-mally agree that the boundaries of the said counties should be altered to the extent set forth in the said instrument and also in the Schedule hereto: And whereas it is expedient that such alteration of boundaries be approved by the Go-vernor in Council, and that such altered boundary be defined in terms of the said Act: in terms of the said Act :

Now, therefore, I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby order and declare that, on and after the publication of these presents in the New Zealand Gazette, the boundaries of the Counties of Waipawa and Patangeta, respectively, shall be these act for the mode and Patangata respectively shall be those set forth under their respective headings in the Schedule hereto.

PATANGATA COUNTY.

For a period of about one month before the new light is exhibited from Wonga Shoal, the existing Port Adelaide illuminating apparatus will be removed from its present position at the entrance to the river. During its transfer to the Wonga Shoal Tower, a light of the third order, re-volving every thirty seconds (as at present), visible for about fifteen (15) miles, will be exhibited from a temporary tower erected on the position now occupied by the Port Adelaide Lighthouse.

Subsidies to Public Libraries.

Education Department

NOTICE is hereby given that the sum of £3,000 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries

The distribution will take place on the 8th February, 1901, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the 31st

Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the olse January, 1901. A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club, whose member-ship is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year from subscriptions and donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town. In the division of the vote, a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus aurmented : but

be divided according to the amounts thus augmented ; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than 275— that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which dis-tribution is based exceed £100.

The whole of the subsidy must be expended in the pur-chase of books for the library. Application to share in the distribution must be by means

of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of which it is indee, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1900; and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:
