That nothing herein contained shall authorise the said Board to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations thereunder.

regulations for the purpose of the registration and inspection of dairies, and otherwise: And whereas it is expedient to make and prescribe the regulations hereinafter set forth

make and prescribe the regulations hereinafter set forth:
Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony
of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers
and authorities contained in the above-recited Act, and of
all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling him in
this behalf, and acting by and with the consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the
regulations set forth hereunder, and doth hereby declare
that such regulations shall, on and after the first day of
January, one thousand nine hundred and one, apply to and
be in force throughout the colony.

#### REGULATIONS.

In these regulations the following words and expressions shall have the meaning hereby assigned to them, unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction:

#### INTERPRETATION.

 "Dairy" means—
 (a.) A milk-house, milk-shop, dairy factory, and any other place where dairy produce is collected, deposited, treated, separated, prepared, or manufactured, or is sold or offered or exposed for sale, and includes-

(b.) A farm, stock-yard, milking-yard, paddock, shed, stable, stall, and any other place where cows from which the milk-supply of a dairy is obtained are depastured or kept.

"Owner" means the owner, whether jointly or severally, and includes the owner's agent or manager; it includes also, in the case of a company, the manager, secretary, or other principal officer thereof.

#### REGISTRATION OF DAIRIES.

2. Every owner of a cowshed or other building or place where cows are stalled or kept for the purpose of milking (whether now in existence or hereafter to be constructed), the milk or cream from which is disposed of by sale solely

the milk or cream from which is disposed of by sale solely or partly for consumption in the colony, shall register such building as a dairy with the Inspector of Stock for the district in which the building is situated.

3. The application for registration shall be in the Form No. I set forth in the Schedule of these regulations. Such form may be obtained at the office of any Inspector of Stock.

4. Every application for registration in respect of buildings now existing shall be lodged annually with the Inspector of Stock for the district not later than the 1st day of March in each year, but no certificate shall be issued in respect of such buildings prior to the 1st April following the date of such application; and in the case of new buildings erected or dairying operations commenced after the 1st March in any year, then at least one month prior to the completion of such building or the commencement of such operations, as the case may be.

as the case may be.
5. Every certificate of registration shall be in the form set forth in No. 2 of the forms contained in the Schedule hereto, and the certificate of registration may be withheld pending the completion in accordance with these regulations of the

premises sought to be registered.

6. The fee to be paid on the grant of every certificate of registration shall be the sum of 5s. annually. Every registration shall continue in force until the 31st March follow-

ing the date of registration.

tration shall continue in force until the 31st March following the date of registration.

7. In any case where an owner or occupier, having obtained a certificate of registration, fails to comply with the requirements of these regulations, or commits a breach thereof, any Inspector may, by writing under his hand, call upon such person to show cause why his certificate should not be cancelled. If upon inquiry the Inspector is satisfied that the certificate of registration should be cancelled, he shall call upon the owner thereof to deliver up the same, and, upon receipt, cancel such certificate by writing across the face thereof the word "Cancelled," and adding the name of the Inspector and date. It shall be the duty of the Inspector to retain every certificate so cancelled, and to make entry in the register of the fact of such cancellation. Any person refusing so to deliver up such certificate shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations. Any owner or occupier whose certificate has been cancelled may subsequently apply again for a fresh certificate, on proof of compliance with these regulations in all respects. The cancellation of a certificate shall in no way control the right to proceed for a breach of these regulations, if the Inspector so elects.

Construction, etc., and Water-supply of Dairies.

## Construction, etc., and Water-supply of Dairies.

8. It shall not be lawful for any person to occupy or use any premises as a dairy, whether so occupied or used at the commencement of these regulations or not, except in conformity with the following provisions:

(a.) In every building where cattle are stalled over the night the available air-space for each animal shall not be less than 500 cubic feet.
(b.) The ground-space of every such building, including the stalls, shall be floored to the satisfaction of the Inspector, and shall be constructed with open drains or gutters running the whole length thereof along and immediately behind the stalls, and extending beyond the cowshed.
(c.) Every shed or stable where cows are kept shall be lighted, ventilated, and cleansed to the satisfaction of the Inspector.
(d.) Every shed or stable where cows are kept shall have the walls and roof thoroughly coated with a sufficient coating of lime whitewash, and shall be recoated in a similar manner at least every three months, or oftener if directed by the Inspector.
(e.) All droppings, manure, excrement, filth, and other

months, or oftener it directed by the inspector.

(e.) All droppings, manure, excrement, filth, and other impurities or offensive matter shall be scraped, swept, or otherwise collected together and removed immediately after each milking from cowsheds used merely for the daily milking of cattle, and in the case of all other cowsheds at intervals the day, and always immediately he throughout the day, and always immediately before milking is commenced. Every stock-yard or milking-yard shall at all times be kept drained, cleaned, and in a sanitary condition to the satis-

cleaned, and in a sanitary condition to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

(f.) Every cowshed and every milk-house or building where milk is kept or stored shall be well and properly drained to the satisfaction of the Inspector. No such shed, house, or building shall drain into any place into which any offensive matter shall be discharged, or directly into any sewer, unless well as a well-as a parameter and to the satisfaction of the satisfa unless such sewer be properly trapped to the satis-

faction of the Inspector.

(g.) Every farm shall be provided with a supply of pure water, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, for the purposes of watering the stock kept thereon, and for the cleansing of the milk-vessels and dairy

utensils.

(h.) If the Inspector shall at any time consider that the water used in or upon any dairy for any purpose, or that the food supplied to the cattle in or upon any dairy, is unfit for use, he may, by notice in writing to that effect, signed by him, call upon the owner or occupier to remedy the defect within the time specified, or to abstain from using such water in or upon such dairy for all or any of the purposes connected therewith, and also to abstain from using such food.

(i.) Immediately on the receipt of such notice the owner

or occupier, as the case may be, shall proceed to comply with the requisitions thereof.

9. No person shall allow to remain within any milkhouse or building used for milking purposes any article of a character likely to endanger the purity of the milk deposited or stored therein.

10. All cans or other vessels whatsoever used in or about any dairy, whether for receiving or storing or in the distribution of milk, shall be thoroughly cleansed within four hours of having been used for any purpose whatsoever, by first being rinsed with cold water, then scalded with hot water (or steamed), scoured, and afterwards rinsed with clean water and carefully dried.

11. All conveyances used in or about any dairy for the con-

water and carefully dried.

11. All conveyances used in or about any dairy for the conveyance of milk shall from time to time be thoroughly cleaned to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

12. Every conveyance used for the conveyance of milk for sale shall have the name of the owner legibly printed there-

13. No person shall take milk from any cow whose milk is intended to be sold or used for human food, nor permit any such milk to be taken, until the udder and teats of such cow have been thoroughly cleansed.

14. Before commencing to milk any cow the hands of the person milking must be thoroughly washed and kept cleansed until the milking and handling of milk is finished for the time being.

time being.

15. Every owner or occupier of a dairy shall provide in, upon, or about his dairy premises, and shall upon demand show to the Inspector, sufficient facilities for boiling the water required for all the purposes mentioned in these regulations.

16. All milk intended for human food shall, immediately after milking, be removed from the milking-shed or stockyard, and once at least carefully strained through some apparatus sufficient for the purpose, and then cooled to a temperature of not more than 65°.

#### MISCELLANEOUS.

17. It shall not be lawful for any owner or occupier of a dairy

(a.) To allow any person suffering from an infectious dis-order, or having recently been in contact with a

person so suffering, to milk any cow or to handle any vessel used for or containing milk for sale, or allow such person in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of the trade or business of the dairyman or milk-vendor so far as regards the

the dairyman or milk-vendor so far as regards the production and distribution of milk; or,

(b.) If himself so suffering, or having recently been in contact as aforesaid, to milk any cow or handle any vessel used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part in the conduct of his trade or business sofar as regards the production, distribution, or storage of milk, until in each case all danger of the communication of infection to the milk, or of its contamination, has ceased.

3. It shall be the duty of every owner or occupier of a

milk, or of its contamination, has ceased.

18. It shall be the duty of every owner or occupier of a dairy forthwith to notify the Inspector if any member of his family or any person employed about a farm is attacked by or is suffering from any contagious disease; and similarly if any of the cows of such owner or occupier appear to be suffering from any disease or disorder of any nature tending to contaminate or injuriously affect milk.

19. If the Inspector considers it advisable in the interests of the public health, he shall notify the owner or occupier of

19. If the Inspector considers it advisable in the interests of the public health, he shall notify the owner or occupier of such dairy, as the case may be, that the dairy produce of such dairy shall not be removed therefrom; or may give such other notification as the Inspector thinks necessary in the interests of public health. Such notification shall remain in force until cancelled by the Inspector.

20. No dairyman or purveyor of milk shall purchase, suppty for sale to others, sell, or expose in or about any dairy premises for sale, or mix with milk produced for sale on any dairy premises occupied by him, any milk from any cow which is or is suspected to be diseased or in an unhealthy condition, or from any cow which has calved less than four clear days.

21. No person or company shall sell or offer for sale any

21. No person or company shall sell or offer for sale any milk or cream other than that obtained from a registered dairy, and in any proceeding for breach of this regulation the onus of proof shall be upon the person or company

charged.

22. It shall not be lawful for any person following the trade of a dairyman or purveyor of milk to use any milk-store, or permit the same to be used, as a sleeping apartment, or for any purpose incompatible with the preservation of the cleanliness of the milk-store and of the milk-vessels

of the cleanliness of the milk-store and of the milk-vessels and the milk therein, or in any manner likely to cause contamination of the milk therein.

23. It shall not be lawful for any owner or occupier to keep or permit to remain any swine in any cowshed or milk-house, or any other place where dairy produce is collected, deposited, treated, separated, prepared, or manufactured, or sold or offered or exposed for sale, or within a distance of 50 yards from any part thereof.

24. It shall not be lawful for any owner or occupier to erect, construct, or permit to remain any fowlhouse, manure, cesspool, closet, or urinal in or about or within a distance of 30 ft. from any part of any cowshed or milk-house. Nor shall it be lawful for such person to construct or permit to remain any sewage-drain or gully or other drain trap in or remain any sewage-drain or gully or other drain trap in or about any such cowshed or milk-house.

about any such cowshed or milk-house.

25. No conveyance used for or in connection with the transport, carrying, or distribution of milk from or about dairy premises shall be used for the purpose of carrying any manure, excrement, or filth, pig's wash, pig's food, or other animal or decaying vegetable matter, or for the purpose of carrying brewers' grains; and, in case any such cart shall be so used contrary to these regulations, the owner or occupier of such dairy premises, and also the owner of such cart, shall be guilty of an offence for each occasion on which such cart shall be so used so used.

26. No owner or occupier shall purchase, supply for sale to others, sell, or expose in or about any dairy premises, milkshop, or store for sale, or mix with milk produced for sale on any dairy premises occupied by him, any milk produced at, in, upon, or about any dairy premises, cowshed, or dairy which is not registered in accordance with these regulations.

27. Any notice or other document required to be served

upon any owner, occupier of premises, or purveyor of milk under these regulations shall be deemed to be sufficiently served either by giving the same to him personally or by leaving the same at his usual or last known place of abode with any person there appearing to be over the age of fourteen years.

28. Any person who commits a breach of any of the foregoing regulations, or in anywise obstructs any Inspector, shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £50, and the certificate, if any, held by such person shall, ipso facto, be cancelled.

Making a Regulation for the Issue of Special Licenses to cut Railway-sleepers.

#### RANFURLY, Governor.

In pursuance and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by "The Land Act, 1892," I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby make the regulation contained in the Schedule hereto, and such regulation shall be read with the regulations of the twelfth March, one thousand nine hundred. hundred.

#### SCHEDULE.

61. Licenses to cut railway-sleepers for use on New Zealand railways may be issued on payment of a fee of 5s. per annum, payable in advance. Such license shall entitle the annum, payable in advance. Such license shall entitle the person named therein to split, cut, or hew railway-sleepers on the land mentioned and described therein; but such license shall not entitle the holder thereof to cut, split, or hew any timber included in any sawmill license, or in any license where the timber has been sold by appraisement at auction or otherwise, or on any land held under lease or license from the Crown. The license shall state the class or classes of timber to which it applies, and it shall expire at the period of twelve months from the date thereof. Every holder of such a license shall pay a royalty of 3d. for every railway-sleeper so cut, split, or hewn, whether such sleepers are accepted by the Railway Department or not. Such royalty shall be paid to the Receiver of Land Revenue before the sleepers are delivered to the Railway Department, and that department shall require proof that the royalty has been paid before accepting the sleepers, or, failing such proof, shall deduct from the amount otherwise payable for the sleepers the royalty herein provided for, and

ing such proof, shall deduct from the amount otherwise payable for the sleepers the royalty herein provided for, and shall pay the same to the Public Account.

If the holder of a special license hereunder shall cut, split, or hew timber for any other purpose than for railway-sleepers for New Zealand railways, or shall use any other timber than is stated in such license, or shall attempt to sell and deliver sleepers to the Railway Department without having first paid the royalty thereon as herein provided, or shall wantonly damage or destroy any bush, timber, or trees other than as may be necessary in felling trees for railway-sleepers, or shall wastefully use any trees so felled so that as many sleepers as possible are not obtained therefrom, or if any unlicensed person shall cut, split, or hew railway-sleepers on any land to which this regulation applies, then in any such case such licensee or person shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence, and on conviction thereof he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds (£20), and the Commissioner of Crown Lands may in his discretion cancel such license, or suspend it for any period he may think fit: Provided that nothing herein shall operate to prevent the seizure of timber illegally cut on lands to which this regulation applies.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER "THE PHARMACY ACT, 1898." Election of Members of Board.

1. The Registrar shall conduct the election of the members of the Board in accordance with the provisions hereinafter made in that behalf.

2. The Registrar shall, in the month of October in each year, proceed to the election of as many persons to be members of the Pharmacy Board of New Zealand as there are vacancies created by the provisions of sections 11 and 12 of "The Pharmacy Act, 1898."

"The Pharmacy Act, 1898."

3. If any extraordinary vacancy shall occur, the Registrar shall, upon being notified by the Board that a vacancy has occurred, proceed to the election of a person, being a registered pharmaceutical chemist, to fill such vacancy. And the person elected shall hold office only for the residue of the term of the member in whose stead he is elected.

4. At every election for members to serve on the Board the Registrar shall, by advertisement in the New Zealand Gazette and any other papers approved by the Board, give notice of his intention to proceed, on a certain day to be named therein, not being more than thirty days after such publication, to hold an election of fit and proper persons to serve as members on such Board; and he shall in the said advertisement appoint a day not less than ten days nor more than twenty days after such publication on or before which than twenty days after such publication on or before which all candidates for election must be nominated as hereinafter provided; and he shall also, in the same advertisement, specify the time and place when and where nominations will be received, and shall sign such notice and affix the date it is given thereto.

is given thereto.

Any person registered as a pharmaceutical chemist in New Zealand desirous of nominating a candidate shall fill up a nomination paper in the form of the First Schedule hereto, stating therein the Christian name and surname of the candidate, together with other particulars required by the Schedule; the nomination paper shall be signed by not less than two persons duly qualified to vote at such election, and also by the person named therein as a candidate accepting the nomination. Nomination papers must be lodged or delivered by post before 4 o'clock in the afternoon of the day fixed for receiving nominations.

6. The Registrar shall, in the event of there not being a

6. The Registrar shall, in the event of there not being a greater number of persons nominated than are required to be elected, make a return to the Board and declare such person or persons to have been duly elected member or members of the Board; but, if the number of persons nominated is greater than the number of persons required to fill the vacancies, a poll shall be taken, and the Registrar shall have voting-papers printed in the form of the Second Schedule hereto,

and sign each of such papers, and cause one of them, together with an envelope, not fastened, with the name and address of the Registrar printed thereon, to be sent by post to the last known address of every registered pharmaceutical chemist resident within the district for which the vote is

7. Every voter must strike out from the voting-paper received by him the names of those candidates for whom he does not wish to vote, so that in no case shall there remain upon any voting-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of members to be elected.

any voting-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of members to be elected.

Each voting-paper shall be signed by the voter in the presence of a witness, who shall attest his signature. The voter shall then enclose his voting-paper in the envelope furnished to him with the printed address of the Registrar thereon, fasten it down, and post the same so that it snall be received by the Registrar in course of post not later than 10 o'clock on the morning fixed for holding such election.

Any voting-paper that does not comply with all the requirements of this regulation shall be rejected by the Registrar.

S. If a candidate at any election sign and deliver to the Registrar not later than twelve clear days before the day fixed for holding such election a notice, in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, stating that the candidate retires from the election, the Registrar shall omit the name of such person so retiring from the voting-papers; but if by such retirement the number of candidates is reduced to the number of vacancies to be filled, the Registrar shall declare the remaining members to be duly elected.

9. The Registrar shall, on the day named in the advertisement for holding any election, and in the presence of any scrutineers appointed by any candidate, proceed to open the envelopes which have been returned to him with his printed address thereon, and to take out the voting-papers therein contained: if he is satisfied that each vote is properly given

envelopes which have been returned to him with his printed address thereon, and to take out the voting-papers therein contained: if he is satisfied that each vote is properly given he shall proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate, and, as soon as conveniently may be after the day of holding the election, the Registrar shall give public notice, by advertisement in the New Zealand Gazette, of the number of votes given to each candidate, and shall declare the candidates, not exceeding the number of vacancies, who have received the greatest number of votes to be duly elected as members of the Pharmacy Board of New Zealand; and, if two or more candidates shall have received an equal number of votes, the Registrar shall in each case have a casting vote. have a casting-vote.

10. Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint in writing one scrutineer to be present when the Registrar opens the envelopes containing the voting-papers on the day appointed for holding the election.

11. If at the time fixed for any election there be no candi-

dates nominated, or a less number of candidates be nominated than there are vacancies, the Board may appoint any duly registered chemist or chemists to fill the vacancy or vacancies.

#### Registrar and Deputy Registrars.

12. The Registrar shall attend all meetings of the Board and committees. It shall be his duty to superintend the affairs of the Board, under the direction of the Board and committees. He shall keep the books in a neat and orderly manner, receive all moneys, and pay them into the bank approved by the Board; and pay all accounts which have been passed by the Board for payment. Cheques drawn for this purpose shall be signed by the President and the Registrar. He shall also conduct the correspondence, issue all notices, take minutes of all meetings and read them, and make a report of all matters that come under his cognisance for the information of the Board and committees. He shall consult the President on any business requirtees. He shall consult the President on any business requiring attention between the various meetings, and be responsible for the safe custody of all documents, papers, and property of the Board under his control. He shall find, if required, surety in the sum of £100 in some fidelity or guaranrequired, surety in the sum of £100 in some fidelity or guarantee society, the premium upon which shall be recouped him by the Board. He shall keep the Register of Pharmaceutical Chemists in accordance with the provisions of the Act, and a register of all persons who have passed the qualifying examination. The fee for any inspection of either of these registers shall be 1s.

13. The Registrar shall receive all fees, fines, subscriptions, and donations, and other money which may become due or payable to the Board, and give a printed receipt for the same, retaining a block counterpart of such receipt.

14. The Registrar shall, in the month of January in each year, prepare and present to the Board a balance-sheet showing the exact financial position of the Board.

15. The Deputy Registrars shall receive fees, fines, subscriptions, donations, and other money payable in their respective districts, and give a printed receipt for the same, retaining a block counterpart of such receipt, and remit the amount of money received to the Registrar. All vouchers

for payment by Deputy Registrars shall be certified by one of the members for the district.

Deputy Registrars shall keep on hand and supply to applicants the forms of application required by these regulations. They shall act in conjunction with the members for their respective districts in all matters referred to them by the Registrar, and endeavour to insure the satisfactory working of the Pharmacy Act in their respective districts.

#### Auditor.

16. The Board shall, in the month of January in each year, appoint a fit and proper person as auditor, who shall hold office until the last day of December of the same year;

hold office until the last day of December of the same year; and may pay out of the moneys accruing under the Act a fee not exceeding two guineas to such auditor.

The auditor shall inspect the books and accounts of the Board, examine the annual balance-sheet prepared by the Registrar, and certify to the same if correct. He shall also investigate and examine all accounts and vouchers relating to or concerning the same which may be in the possession of the Registrar, examine the bank pass-book and ascertain that it corresponds with the account of the Board in the bank, and present an annual report to the Board stating the result of his inspection and examination.

#### Proceedings of the Board.

17. The President shall be elected by a majority of the members present at the first regular meeting of the Board in the month of January in each year; and if, for want of a quorum, or from any other cause, a meeting shall not be held, he shall be elected at the next meeting, seven days' notice having been given by the Registrar to each member of

notice having been given by the Registrar to each member of the Board.

18. The Board shall meet at its office on the second Tuesday of every month, at 10.30 a.m., or on such other day and hour as may be decided by the Board, and on such other days and at such times as the President or any two members of the Board shall desire by requisition in writing addressed to the Registrar, who shall thereupon send proper notice to all members of the Board.

19. If at the expiration of twenty minutes after the hour appointed for the meeting there shall not be a quorum, the meeting shall lapse.

20. At every meeting of the Board the first business shall be the reading and confirmation of the minutes of the previous meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to the accuracy of such minutes as a record of the proceedings. The minutes, when confirmed, shall be signed by the President or Acting-President. After signing the minutes the order of business shall be as follows,

Ordinary business, including postponed and former notices of motion.

21. Notices of motions or resolutions intended to be proposed at any meeting of the Board shall be given to the Registrar in writing at least seven days prior to such meeting. Notices so delivered shall be embodied in the business paper to be forwarded to all members of the Board.

22. The Board may from time to time appoint from amongst themselves any committee, and may by resolution at any time discharge a committee so appointed. The President shall ex officio be a member of all committees, and if present preside.

dent shall ex officio be a member of all committees, and if present preside.

23. No member of the Board shall be Registrar or auditor.

24. The common seal of the society shall be deposited in the office of the Board in charge of the Registrar, and used by the Registrar only in the presence of a member, when authorised by resolution, and entered upon the minutes of the proceedings of the Board. The member of the Board so present and the Registrar shall certify to the seal by their signatures.

25. The members of the Board for districts other than the central district shall be allowed to absent themselves from any ordinary or special meeting, unless requested to attend by notice from the Registrar at least thirty days before such

meeting.

26. The Board shall from time to time appoint examiners,

27. (1.) On and after the 1st January, 1901, the standard examination of the Board shall consist of two sections—viz., A and B. Candidates applying for the Board's certificate of competency must pass an examination in the following sub-

Section A. - Latin, English, arithmetic, elementary

Section B.—Materia Medica, botany, chemistry, practical chemistry, pharmacy, practical pharmacy.

A. (1.) Latin.—Translate into English and parse sentences from Cæsar's Commentaries, Book I.

(2.) English.—Grammar, including orthography and parsing, dictation, and composition.

(3.) Arithmetic.—The first four rules, proportion, vulgar and decimal fractions, British and Metric weights and measures.

(4.) Elementary Science.—Easy questions on non-metals and atomic theory (Kemshead or Jago); elementary botany (Snaith or Oliver).

B. (1.) Materia Medica.—Recognition of specimens of B.P. drugs, description of their characters and active drugs, description of their characters and active principles, knowledge of the sources from which they are obtained, their natural orders, and the official preparations into which they enter, and to judge the quality and freedom from adulteration or otherwise of the specimens submitted. (Squire's "Companion" and Bentley's "Organic Materia Medica.")

Medica.")

(2.) Botany.—Elementary knowledge of general morphology, anatomy, and physiology; principles of classification; description of specimens in botanical terms; knowledge of the vascular cryptogams; and to distinguish between the following twelve orders: Compositæ, Labiatæ, Papaveraceæ, Rutaceæ, Cruciferæ, Leguminosæ, Solanaceæ, Graminaceæ, Myrtaceæ, Ranunculaceæ, Rosaceæ, Umbelliferæ.

(3.) Chemistry and Practical Chemistry.—Elementary laws, organic and inorganic chemistry (particularly of the B.P. substances), qualitative analysis (including B.P. tests, and volumetric analysis), and to submit to practical examination therein; urinalysis.

(4.) Pharmacy and Practical Pharmacy. — Translation of Latin prescriptions, detection of dangerous doses, compounding and dispensing; explanation of the processes of making B.P. preparations. Antidotes.

(2.) Candidates may take at the one examination the subjects required for (1) both Sections A and B, (2) Section A only, or (3) Section B only, provided a pass has previously been obtained in Section A.

But at the one sitting 50 per cent. of the total number of marks in each subject of either section must be obtained in order to gain a pass in that section.

(3.) If a candidate lodges with the Registrar a certificate that he has passed the Matriculation Examination of any University or the Junior Civil Service Examination of New Zealand (provided that Latin be included), or any other examination approved by the Board, he shall not be required to pass in Section A.

(5.) The following text-books are approved by the Board: Snaith's or Joseph Oliver's Botany, Thomson's Botany, Prantl and Vine's Botany, Jago's or Kemshead's Chemistry, Attifield, B.P., Squire's Companion, Cripp's Pharmacy, Bentley's Organic Materia Medica.

28. Examinations shall be held half-yearly—viz., on the third Wednesday and following day or days in the months of April and October in each year—and shall take place at Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, and Dunedin, or at the discretion of the Board. #### Certificates of Qualification.

31. No certificate of qualification as a pharmaceutical chemist shall be issued to any person (other than those possessing any of the qualifications mentioned in section 27 of the Act and any amendments thereof) until he furnishes of the Act and any amendments thereof) until he furnishes proof to the satisfaction of the Board that he has attained the age of twenty-one years, and a statutory declaration, to be approved by the Board, that he has duly passed the prescribed examinations, and has faithfully and without unreasonable intermission served his apprenticeship for the term of three years as prescribed by subsection (2) of section 30 of the Act, accompanied by a statutory declaration of the person to whom he was apprenticed to that effect, and by his articles of apprenticeship and examination certificate.

32. All plates used for printing the forms of certificates shall be deposited in the Board's room in a box having two locks and two keys, one of which shall be in the custody of the President, and the other in that of the Registrar. No print shall be taken from any of the said plates except by order of the Board; and all prints taken shall be in the custody of the Registrar. custody of the Registrar.

#### Enrolled Managers.

33. Every registered chemist who absents himself from the town in which his business is situated for any period extending over one month shall leave such business in charge of his duly enrolled manager.

#### Headquarters of Society.

34. The headquarters of the society may be changed from time to time by vote of the majority of the members of the society.

The Board shall cause such vote to be taken upon the receipt of a petition signed by registered chemists representing not less than 10 per cent. of the number of registered chemists residing within New Zealand.

In these regulations the term "the Act" means "The Pharmacy Act, 1898," and "the Board" means the Pharmacy Board of New Zealand.

VICTORIA.—PORT PHILLIP HEADS.—STEAM-PILOTAGE SYSTEM.

MARINERS are hereby notified that, on and after the 1st January, 1901, vessels arriving off Port Phillip Heads and requiring the services of pilots will be boarded by means of a steam pilot-vessel, which will be substituted for the sailing-vessels at present employed in such service as set forth in the Admiralty Sailing Directions, 1897.

Such steam pilot-vessel will cruise within the limits of the present cruising-station as defined on page 430 of the said Sailing Directions, and in clause 16 of the Victorian Pilot Regulations.

Pilot Regulations.

Such steam vessel will be distinguished by the same characteristics as apply to the fore-and-aft-rigged schooners at present engaged in the service at Port Phillip Heads.

During daylight such steam-vessel while on her station will keep constantly flying at the mainmast-head (as a signal that a pilot's services are offered to vessels) a red-and-white flag, the upper horizontal half of which shall be white and the lower half red.

From sunset to supply such vessels in the same constants.

From sunset to sunrise such vessel, when engaged on her station on pilotage duty and not at anchor, will, in addition to the lights required for all pilot-boats, carry, at a distance of 8 ft. below her white masthead light, a red light, visible all round the horizon, and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night with a clear atmosphere at a distance of at least two miles, and also the coloured side-lights required to be carried by vessels when under way.

By-laws for New Zealand Government Railways .- Conveyance of Passengers' Luggage.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by "The Government Railways Ant 1000" I Tours "The Government Railways Act, 1900," I, Joseph George Ward, the Minister for Railways, do hereby make the following by-laws regulating the carriage of passengers' luggage on the New Zealand Government railways open for traffic, and do hereby declare that such by-laws shall come into force on the day of the publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette, and shall apply to all such railways generally, namely:-

By-LAWS.

1. Passengers' luggage received, held, or conveyed by railway will be subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth:—

2. Luggage shall be designated as follows:-

Unchecked luggage—i.e., packages of every description which are conveyed as passengers' luggage, and which are not checked as hereinafter provided.

(b.) Checked luggage—i.e., packages of every description for which the passenger holds a luggage-check as hereinafter provided.

3. Passengers may, at their option, have luggage checked between any two stations on a continuous line of railway, and such checked luggage will thereafter be held and conveyed at the risk of the department, subject to the following

4. Each package must be distinctly addressed with the name of the passenger and the station to which he is proceeding; and if it is desired to check the luggage, the person delivering it must obtain a check for each package delivered. The department will not check luggage that is not fully and

legibly addressed.

5. Luggage to be checked must, if being forwarded from an officered station, be delivered at the railway-station from which the passenger is proceeding at least fifteen minutes, and luggage not required to be checked at least ten minutes, and tuggage not required to be checked at least ten minutes, before the advertised time of departure of the train by which it is to be conveyed, or the department will not be responsible for its despatch. Luggage (whether checked or unchecked) on which excess rates are payable must be delivered at the railway-station at least thirty minutes before the advertised time of departure of the train by which it is to be forwarded, or the department will not be responsible for its despatch

to be forwarded, or the department will not be responsible for its despatch.

6. Luggage to be forwarded from stations at which there are no officers in charge must be taken to guard's van, and be there handed to the guard of the train by which it is to be forwarded, immediately on arrival of the train at the station from which the luggage is to be conveyed. If the luggage is to be checked the person delivering it must obtain from the guard of train a check for each package delivered. The department will not be responsible for the despatch of luggage that is not presented at guard's van while train is standing at flag-stations. Charges on excess luggage, whether checked or unchecked, must be paid to guard, from whom a ticket must be obtained for the amount paid.

7. The checks obtained for the luggage must be surrendered by the person who takes delivery of the luggage at destination.

destination.

destination.

8. Except as hereinafter provided, no package of checked luggage will be delivered until the check has been surrendered. The department will not be responsible for any loss or inconvenience that may arise through the failure of passenger or his agent to produce the necessary check.

9. All charges on luggage which exceeds the weight specified in clause No. 25, or consists of articles which are not allowed by these regulations to be carried free, must be prepaid, and the person delivering such luggage must obtain an

paid, and the person delivering such luggage must obtain an paid, and the person delivering such luggage must obtain an excess-luggage ticket as a receipt for the charges paid, such ticket to be given up when the luggage is claimed. Passengers who fail to produce excess tickets for luggage on which excess charges are payable will be required to pay such charges before the luggage is delivered.

10. Passengers are not bound to see personally to the checking or excessing of their luggage, nor, except as provided in clause 11, to attend in person to obtain delivery of their luggage, but may arrange for any person, other than a

railway employé, to act on their behalf; the department, however, reserves to itself the right to demand the production of the passenger's ticket whenever it may deem such a step to be necessary, and to decline to accept any luggage for transit until such demand has been complied with.

11. Owners of luggage for stations at which there are no officers in charge must in all cases present themselves at the guard's van while the train is standing at the station, and claim and take delivery of their luggage, and must, in the case of checked luggage, deliver to the guard of train the checks received for same, failing which, the luggage, whether checked or unchecked, shall be treated as "lost luggage," and taken to the next officered station and there stored at the risk and expense of the owner.

12. Any person losing a luggage-check may be required to make a statutory declaration setting forth the number of the check lost, the number and description of the packages claimed, to indemnify the department against loss for wrong delivery, and to furnish such other proofs of ownership of luggage as the Railway Department may require, before such luggage shall be delivered. Should the proofs of ownership or the indemnity be deemed by the Railway Department to be insufficient, delivery of the luggage will be withheld, and the Railway Department shall not be liable for any inconvenience or loss suffered in consequence thereof.

13. Luggage will not be delivered at any station short of

13. Luggage will not be delivered at any station short of the destination to which it is addressed and labelled. Passengers who desire to break the journey en route must have their luggage labelled to the station at which they intend to

take delivery.

take delivery.

14. No luggage will be allowed to be taken into carriages unless it can be placed under the seat without inconvenience to other passengers; neither shall any person take into or carry in a railway-carriage any luggage which the railway officers deem to be inconvenient or objectionable.

15. Railway employés are not permitted to act as agents, or to undertake the charge of or accept responsibility in respect to luggage left temporarily at a station, unless the luggage has been booked and placed in the cloak-room.

16. Unchecked luggage will be carried solely at the risk of the owner.

the owner.

17. The department does not undertake to forward luggage of any description by any particular train, and will not be responsible for any luggage or parcels improperly left about the station premises. Luggage left at a station should be placed in the cloak-room.

placed in the cloak-room.

18. Checked luggage for officered stations not claimed within twelve hours of arrival at destination will be placed in the cloak-room and charged accordingly. Checked luggage for stations at which there are no officers in charge not claimed while train is standing at the station will be taken to the next officered station and treated as lost luggage, and be charged accordingly. Unchecked luggage not claimed immediately on arrival at destination will be treated as lost luggage, and charged accordingly.

19. The department reserves to itself the right to refuse any articles which, from their bulky or objectionable character, it is inexpedient to carry as passengers' luggage. Packages exceeding 2 cwt. in weight or 20 cubic feet in measurement will not be accepted for conveyance as passengers' luggage; such packages must be consigned, and will be

gers' luggage; such packages must be consigned, and will be conveyed and charged as goods.

20. Luggage the property of passengers who are booked to a station beyond the terminus of the train by which they are travelling may be labelled direct to destination shown on passenger's ticket, and be stored free of charge from time of arrival at the station where break of journey is necessitated until time of departure therefrom of the first available through train by which passenger can proceed direct to destination.

21. No person shall be entitled to check or send any luggage to any railway-station beyond the station of destination for which his ticket is available; nor shall any person send or carry as luggage any packages containing goods that are other than his own bona fide property, or his samples for arbitition only

22. Ordinary passengers will be allowed to take with them, free of charge, 112 lb. weight, consisting either of bona fide personal luggage, tourists', sportsmen's, or artists' gear, or any goods (except furniture and bulky musical instruments) which they may purchase bona fide for their own domestic

23. Workpeople will be allowed to take free of charge up to 112lb. weight of work-tools, or work which they do at their homes. When the weight exceeds 112lb. excess-luggage rates must be paid.

24. No luggage will be allowed free to excursionists by day

trips, but excursionists travelling by excursions extending over more than one day will be allowed to take with them, free of charge, 112 lb. of bonâ fide personal luggage.

25. In no case shall the aggregate weight carried free with any one passenger exceed 112 lb.

26. For every 56 lb. or fraction of 56 lb. above the weight | allowed, for every fifty miles or fraction of fifty miles,

charge will be 1s.

Commercial travellers will each be allowed to take 112 lb. weight of luggage, including weight of two sample bicycles, packed, free of charge. For every 56 lb. or fraction of 56 lb. above this weight, for every fifty miles or fraction of fifty miles, the charge will be 6d. The maximum quantity which will be carried at this rate is 10 cwt.; any additional quantity, if sent by passenger train, will be charged at the ordinary rates for passengers' luggage; or it may be consigned as goods at goods rates (Class B). Packages exceeding 2 cwt. in weight or 20 cubic feet in measurement will not be accepted for conveyance as passengers' luggage.

28. Theatrical companies luggage will be conveyed as follows:

By Passenger Train.—Companies of not less than six adult passengers will be allowed to take free of charge 2 cwt. of effects for each adult ticket held. All effects in excess of the quantity specified will, if loaded in guards van or in same vehicle as the company's free luggage, be charged 6d. for each 56 lb. or fractional part thereof for every fifty miles or fraction of fifty miles. If loaded and conveyed in special trucks the charge will be—for each four-wheel truck, 6d. per mile, minimum 15s., for each bogie truck, 1s. per mile, minimum £1 10s.

By Goods Train.—Scenery, Class A; luggage, half rates Class B. But in no case are charges to exceed the rates for conveyance by passenger train. All loading and unloading must be done by owners at their own risk and responsi-
