Vesting Control of the Bridge and Approaches thereto across the Mouth of Anderson's Bay, Otago Harbour, in the Portobello Road Board, and apportioning the Cost of Maintenance.

> RANFURLY, Governor. By his Deputy, JAMES PRENDERGAST. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and fourteen of "The Public Works Act, 1894" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, inter alia, enacted that the Governor

may, by Proclamation publicly notified, direct that any bridge already constructed, or which may hereafter be constructed, over or across any river or arm of the sea shall, from and after a date to be fixed in such Proclamation, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of such local authority as shall be mentioned in that behalf in such Proclamation; and may by any such Proclamation as aforesaid fix and determine whether all or any, and, if so, what part, of the cost, whether theretofore incurred or thereafter to be incurred, of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing any such bridge, is to be provided and paid by any local authority, and, if so, by what local authority; and may by any such Proclamation as aforesaid direct how, and when, and to whom any such payment is to be made.

And whereas it is expedient to make provision under the hereinbefore-in-part-recited Act for the purposes hereinafter mentioned:

Regulations under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1900."

RANFURLY, Governor. By his Deputy, JAMES PRENDERGAST. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fourteenth day of January, 1901.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN exercise of the powers in this behalf conferred upon him by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1900," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said Act:—

REGULATIONS.

DISTRICT ELECTORS LIST AND ROLL.

- 1. The Town Clerk of every borough shall, on or before the 5th day of March in every year, make out the district electors list.
- The district electors list shall be prepared in the form and shall contain the particulars specified in the First Schedule hereto.
- Schedule hereto.

 3. In preparing the district electors list it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk to make it as complete as possible, and for that purpose the following regulations shall apply:—

 (1.) He shall place thereon the name—

 (a.) Of every person of whose qualification as an elector he is satisfied; and also

 (b.) Of every person who makes, and delivers or transmits to him at his office, a claim for enrolment as next hereinafter provided.

 (2.) Such claim for enrolment shall be in the form or to the effect set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, and the claimant's signature shall be attested by either a Justice of the Peace, or a Postmaster, or a minister of religion, or an elector of the borough, or the Town Clerk.

 (3.) It shall be the duty of the Council to keep at the Town Clerk's office a supply of blank printed claim-forms for the free use of claimants under the aforesaid paragraph (b).

 - claim-forms for the free use of claimants under the aforesaid paragraph (b).

 (4.) Names appearing on the district electors roll in respect of a freehold or ratepayer's qualification for any year shall be continued on the district electors list for the succeeding year, except in the case of persons who are known to the Town Clerk to have died or to have lost their qualification; and it shall be his duty to report in writing to the Council all names thus omitted, and the reasons of the omission.

 (5.) He shall omit the name of every person enrolled.
 - (5.) He shall omit the name of every person enrolled in virtue of a residential qualification who, not being a candidate at such election, appears from
- being a candidate at such election, appears from a comparison of the rolls used at any election of a Mayor or Councillors not to have voted thereat.

 4. The Town Clerk shall keep the district electors list in his office, and allow it to be inspected without fee by all persons interested therein during office hours until the 12th day of March; and he shall, on or as soon as possible after the 5th day of March, publicly notify that such lists are ready for inspection at his office.

5. All objections under section 17 of the Act must be in writing under the hand of the objector, in the form in the Third Schedule hereto, and must be addressed to the Town Clerk, and delivered at his office on or before the

Town Clerk, and delivered at his office on or before the 17th day of March.

6. The Town Clerk shall make and sign a list of all such objections in the form in the Fourth Schedule hereto, and shall keep such list in his office, and allow it to be inspected without fee by any person interested therein during office hours from the 18th to the 21st day of March.

7. The Council shall amend the district electors list by

correcting every error set forth in any such objection and proved to the satisfaction of the Council to exist therein; and the Mayor shall initial every alteration so made in the district electors list.

8. A copy of the district electors roll, and of all its supplements, and also the original manuscript roll with all its amendments and corrections, shall be kept open for public inspection at the office of the Town Clerk during office

hours without fee.

hours without fee.

9. At the annual sitting of the Council mentioned in section 18 of the Act, the Mayor and not less than two other members of the Council shall sign the district electors list as amended, and certify thereon to its being correct; and the district electors list so corrected and certified shall be the district electors roll of the borough, and shall come into force upon the 1st day of April, and shall continue in force until a new district electors roll comes into force in like manner. like manner.

10. For the purpose of amending the district electors list by the addition of new names after the district electors list has become the district electors roll, supplementary district electors lists may from time to time be prepared; and with respect to every such supplementary list the following regu-

lations shall apply :-

(1.) The names shall be entered therein in alphabetical order of surnames, and shall be numbered con-secutively, commencing with the number next following the last number in the last preceding

list then in force.

(2.) Each supplementary district electors list shall be deemed to be incorporated with the original dis-trict electors list, and, when corrected, signed, and certified in manner provided by Regulation 9 shall be a supplementary district electors roll, and be deemed to be incorporated with the original dis-trict electors' roll then in force.

11. Appeals to a Magistrate under section 19 of the Act

may be made as follows:—

(1.) An objection in writing under the hand of the objector shall be lodged with the Clerk of the Magistrate's Court not later than the 7th day of April, and a copy of such objection shall also be lodged with the Town Clerk not later than the said 7th day of April.

 (2.) The objection may be in the form in the Third Schedule hereto, or as near thereto as may be.

 (3.) The Magistrate shall hear and determine the appeal at such convenient place and time, not being later than the third Wednesday in April, as he appoints, and not less than seven days' notice shall be given of the date so appointed.

The combined roll required under section 21 of the Act shall be prepared by striking out from the district electors roll, and every supplementary district electors roll in force for the borough on the fourteenth day previous to the taking of the poll for which such combined roll is required, the name of every person whose name appears on such rolls more than energy and no other electrics shell be made in energy. than once; and no other alterations shall be made in any such roll after that day until after the taking of the poll.

 13. Such combined roll shall be authenticated in the manner prescribed by Regulation 9 in the case of the district

electors roll.

14. In case the district electors roll for any borough or ward is not, from any cause whatever, made out and completed so as to come into force at the prescribed time, the district electors roll for that borough or ward for the year preceding shall (unless the time for making out and completing a new roll is extended under section 427 of the Act) hair preceding shall (unless the time for making out and completing a new roll is extended under section 427 of the Act) be in force for the year for which a roll has not been made out and completed as aforesaid.

15. (a.) As soon as practicable after the original district electors roll or any supplementary district electors roll or combined roll comes into force, copies thereof shall be printed by the Council.

(b.) But where the total number of electors are as a line of the council.

(b.) But where the total number of electors on any roll or supplementary roll does not exceed two hundred, the Council may by resolution declare that such roll or supplementary

roll shall be typewritten and not printed.

(c.) The Town Clerk shall supply any person with a copy of the printed or typewritten district electors roll, together with all its printed or typewritten supplements, on payment

16. The Town Clerk is liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 in every case where he refuses, or wilfully neglects, or unreasonably delays—

(1.) To place on the district electors list the name of any person who makes written claim for enrolment as person who makes written claim for enrolment as provided by paragraph (b) of subclause (1) of Regulation 3; or

(2.) To faithfully and promptly perform any other duty imposed on him by the Act or these regulations.

17. If the Council fails or unreasonably delays to keep at the Town Clerk's Office a supply of blank printed claimforms for the free use of claimants, as provided by subclause (3) of Regulation 3, or to faithfully and promptly perform any other duty imposed on it by the Act or these regulations, every person (whether the Town Clerk or any member of the Council) who is party to or responsible for such failure or delay is severally liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

COLLECTORS AND ACCOUNTANTS

18. Before any officer intrusted by the Council with the custody or control of moneys by virtue of his office enters thereon, the Council shall take such sufficient security from him for the faithful execution thereof as it thinks fit.

19. Every person receiving any moneys belonging to or on account of the Corporation of the borough (hereinafter referred to as "a Collector") shall, at such times as the Council directs, pay all moneys so received by him into the bank to the proper account of the District Fund; and shall in any case on the Saturday in each week pay into the bank all such moneys then in his hands.

20. The bank shall give receipts for all moneys so paid in, and such receipts shall be a sufficient discharge to the Collector for the amount named therein.

21. Every Collector shall, once at least in each week, give to the Treasurer a list of all moneys collected by him, showing by whom they were paid, and accompanied by the receipt of the bank for such moneys.

22. (1.) Every Collector shall give to every person paying rates, rents, tolls, or any other moneys belonging to the Council, a receipt for the same, in such form as the Council

(2.) Forms of receipts shall be supplied to the Collector numbered with consecutive numbers; and the Collector shall account for the use of all such forms, and shall append to the list mentioned in the last preceding regulation the number of the receipt which he has given to each person from whom he has received money.

(3.) Such receipts shall be exempt from stamp duty.
23. Every Collector shall from time to time, as directed, make a return to the Council of the names of all persons

who have neglected or refused to pay any rates or other

moneys due by them.

24. Every person in whose hands any money is placed for expenditure on behalf of the Council shall render full and faithful accounts of the expenditure of all such moneys, at such times and in such manner and supported by such vouchers as the Council directs, and shall pay over the balance of any such moneys in his hands to any person appointed by the Council to receive the same on demand.

25. If any moneys belonging to the Corporation appear at any time to be lying in the hands of any person, and not to be duly accounted for, such moneys shall be deemed to be a debt due by such person to the Corporation, and may be recovered by any person authorised by the Council in that behalf, together with full costs of suit, in any Court of com-

petent jurisdiction.

ACCOUNTS AND AUDIT.

26. The Treasurer shall, within fifteen days after the 31st 26. The Treasurer shall, within fifteen days after the 31st day of March in every year, prepare a balance-sheet of the District Fund, showing, under such heads as the Auditor requires, an abstract of the receipts and expenditure of the General Account, and each of the separate accounts kept in accordance with section 164 of the Act, during the year ending on the 31st day of March previous, together with the statements following:—

(1.) A statement of the whole assets and liabilities of the

(1.) A statement of the whole assets and habilities of the borough upon the said 31st day of March, exclusive of the public debt and sinking funds:
(2.) A statement of the public debt of the borough, showing the total debt outstanding under the head of each loan raised, and the sinking fund in the hands of the Commissioners to provide for the represent of each such lean;

in the hands of the Commissioners to provide for the repayment of each such loan:

(3.) A statement of the reserves and other real estate belonging to the Corporation, showing the terms and rent for which any parts thereof are let on lease or otherwise, and the amounts of the rents

in arrear in each case:

(4.) A statement-

(a.) Of the amount of each rate struck or recurring for the year ending on the 31st day of March, the amount thereof collected, and the

March, the amount thereof collected, and the amount outstanding at the end of the year, as shown by the rate-book;
(b.) Of the amount outstanding at the beginning of that year of each rate struck or recurring for previous years, the amount thereof collected during the year by order of the Council, and the amount outstanding at the end of the year.

27. (a.) The Controller and Auditor-General shall audit the

accounts, and an officer authorised by him shall attend at the office of the Council as soon after each accounting period as possible, and examine the annual balance-sheet and state-

as possible, and examine the annual balance-sheet and statements, and compare them with the Treasurer's books, and with the bank pass-books, bank receipts, vouchers, and other documents explaining and supporting the same.

(b.) The Auditor may attend at the office of the Council at any time for the purpose of examining the books and documents up to the date of his visit.

28. If the Treasurer, or any other person having the custody or control of any of the books or papers which the Auditor is empowered to examine, refuses to produce the same, or in any way obstructs the Auditor in the examination thereof, be shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

29. (a.) As soon as possible after such examination the Auditor shall certify to the correctness of such balance sheet and statements, either wholly or with such exceptions as he thinks fit, and shall send the same so certified to the Council

and statements, either wholly or with such exceptions as he thinks fit, and shall send the same so certified to the Council on or before the 30th day of April, or as soon thereafter as possible; and the Council shall forthwith publish the same in the borough, with the report of the Auditor thereon.

(b.) Where the publication of the balance-sheet and report would incur considerable expense, the Governor may, by Warrant under his hand, prescribe some other means of publication, and if the provisions of such Warrant are duly observed the balance-sheet and report therein referred to shall be deemed to be duly published.

30. (1.) Within fourteen days after the certificate is received from the Auditor the Council shall hold a special meeting for considering such balance-sheet and statements, and the report of the Auditor; and, if it thinks that the balance-sheet fails to show fully and truly all the dealings with the borough funds, may make such alterations therein, not being contrary to the report of the Auditor or to the provisions of the Act, as it thinks fit, and shall finally settle the same.

(2.) The Mayor shall sign the balance-sheet so settled,

(2.) The Mayor shall sign the balance-sheet so settled, which, when so signed, shall be deemed to be the true accounts of the borough for all purposes.

31. (1.) The Commissioners of Sinking Funds shall, within fifteen days after the 31st day of March in every year. prepare a balance-sheet showing in respect of each loan the transactions during that year, and a statement also in respect of each loan of the whole of the sinking funds in the hands of the Commissioners, and the securities in which those funds are invested at the end of the year.

(2.) Such balance-sheet and statement shall be signed by the Commissioners, and clauses 27 to 29 of these regulations

the Commissioners, and clauses 27 to 29 of these regulations shall, mutatis mutandis, apply thereto.

32. (1.) The Council shall, on or before the 30th day of June in each year, cause to be prepared and sent to the Colonial Treasurer a copy of the balance sheet as signed by the Mayor for the year ending on the 31st day of March previous, together with such other accounts and particulars as the Colonial Treasurer directs.

(2.) The Mayor of every borough who wilfully neglects or refuses to comply with the provisions of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty of £5 for every such neglect or

(3.) The Colonial Treasurer shall lay such accounts and particulars before Parliament within ten days after he has received the same if Parliament is in session, and, if not, then within ten days after its first meeting at the next session thereof.

33. The cost of auditing the accounts of the borough, as on the Borough Fund, and shall be paid into the Public Account to the credit of the Consolidated Fund. The amount so fixed shall be deemed to be a debt due to the Crown, and may be recovered accordingly.

PETITIONS.

34. The following regulations shall apply to all petitions made under this Act, whether to the Governor or to the Council:

(1.) Except in cases where it is otherwise expressly provided, every petition shall be signed by at least three-fifths of the electors of the borough if the subject-matter thereof relates to the entire

borough, or by at least three-fifths of the electors of such ward or wards of the borough as may be affected by the subject-matter of the petition.

(2.) The signatures to every such petition shall be verified by solemn declaration in the form following, made and signed by some person or persons residing in the district to which the petition

refers:—
"I, A. B., do declare that the signatures affixed to the above petition, initialled by me [or which I have marked (describing the mark)], are the genuine signatures of the persons whose they purport to be, and that such persons are electors of the City [or Borough, or Ward, as the case may be] of [Name the city, borough, or ward].

BRIDGES AND FERRIES.

35. With respect to the matters referred to in section 219 of the Act, the following regulations shall apply:—

(1.) The Council proposing to construct the work shall prepare plans, specifications, and estimates of the work, and shall send a copy thereof to the Minister for Public Works and to each local authority asked to contribute to the cost of the work, together with a notice stating—

(a.) The proportion of the cost which it is proposed each local authority should bear;
(b.) That it is the intention of the Council on the expiration of two months from the date of the notice to apply to the Governor for power to construct the work, and to recover the proportion of the cost from the local authority mentioned in

the notice; and
(c.) That any objection to the proposal must be sent to the Governor within such period of two

months.

(2.) At the expiration of such period the Council may make application to the Governor for power to construct the work on the terms mentioned in such notice

(3.) Any local authority making an objection must send the same to the Governor within such period of two months, and shall state in such objection the grounds thereof.

(4.) A copy of such objection shall be sent to the Coun-

cil proposing to construct the work.

36. (1.) Whenever an inquiry is ordered by the Governor to be held touching any of the matters referred to in section 220 of the Act, the person authorised to make such inquiry shall have all the powers of a Commission appointed under "The Commissioners' Powers Act, 1867."

(2) All costs and expenses attending as incidental to the

(2.) All costs and expenses attending or incidental to the inquiry shall be a charge upon the revenues of such local authority or local authorities as the Governor directs, and may be recovered as a debt due to Her Majesty in any com-

petent Court.

37. Tolls payable at any bridge or ferry under sections 256 to 263 of the Act may be leased in manner and subject to the terms and conditions following:—

(1.) The letting shall be for a period not exceeding one

year.

(2.) The letting shall be by public auction or sealed tenders, after due public notice given.

(3.) Security to the satisfaction of the Council shall be

given for the rent to be paid.

(4.) The scale of tolls shall not be altered during the lease without the consent of the lessee, except on

lease without the consent of the lessee, except on payment of compensation.

(5.) The lessee, or any person appointed by him in writing, shall be deemed to be a Collector appointed by the Council.

38. If any person refuses to pay a toll for which he is liable, the Collector may seize and distrain any cattle or vehicle in respect of which such toll is payable, or any goods carried in such vehicle or on such cattle.

39. If such toll, with reasonable charges for the seizure and distress, and for the maintenance of such cattle, is not paid

39. If such toll, with reasonable charges for the seizure and distress, and for the maintenance of such cattle, is not paid within four days, the Collector may sell such cattle, vehicle, or goods by public auction, and apply the proceeds of the sale in payment of such toll and charges, and shall pay the residue, if any, to the owner on demand.

40. Instead of making such seizure and distress, the Collector may recover from any person refusing to pay a toll for which he is liable the amount of such toll, with such compensation for loss of time in recovering the same as the Court thinks fit.

41. Every person is liable to a penalty not exceeding £5

(1.) Leaves a road and returns thereto within 300 yards on either side of the toll-gate with intent to evade paying toll.

(2.) Hires or plies for hire in any boat or punt across a river, stream, or creek within half a mile in a straight line from any public ferry in working order, or bridge open for traffic across the same, at which tolls are payable.
42. Every person is liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 who attempts by force to evade the payment of any toll, or resists or obstructs the Collector in the execution of his duty.
43. Every Collector is liable to a penalty not exceeding £5

(1.) Demands a larger toll than is payable by law.(2.) Does not maintain the board required by section 257 of the Act in a legible condition.

(3.) Refuses to give his name, or gives a false name, on the request of any person of whom he has demanded toll.

Is drunk when in discharge of his duty.

(5.) Obstructs any person in passing when the lawful toll has been tendered.

(6.) Uses any abusive or offensive language to any person passing.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 402, against 406 in November—a decrease of 4. The deaths in December were 148—a decrease of 21 on the number in November. Of the total deaths, males contributed 69, females 79. Forty-two of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 28:38 per cent. of the whole number; 38 of these were under one wear of age.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland, but raises it at Wellington and Dun-

Specific Febrile and Zymotic Diseases.—The mortality in the four chief cities and their suburbs for December, 1900, was limited to 13 deaths, of which 5 were from diarrhoeal diseases—4 at Auckland and 1 at Wellington. Influenza accounts for 4 more deaths—1 at Wellington, 1 at Christchurch, and 2 at Dunedin. Typhoid fever was fatal at Wellington in 1 case, and again at Christchurch, where there was also 1 death. The above, with 1 death from septicemia at Christchurch, and 1 from diphtheria at Dunedin, complete the total.

Constitutional Diseases.—Of 29 deaths, 14 were attributable to phthisis and 7 to cancer. Tubercular peritoritis, with tubercular meningitis and general tuberculosis, contributed 5 deaths. The remaining 3 deaths were from purpura, anæmia, and rheumetic gout

and rheumatic gout.

Local Diseases.—The total of deaths at the four centres in this class was 70 for December. Diseases of the nervous system caused 15 deaths; of the circulatory, 24; of the respiratory, 12; of the digestive, 9; of the urinary, 6; and of the reproductive system, 4 deaths.

Violent Deaths.—Of a total of 7 deaths, 6 were accidental and 1 homicidal. All the accidental deaths took place at Christohurch. An aged woman was killed by shock following on a dislocation; a labourer was dragged by his horse till he died; a carter run over by a dray, a wool-classer by a railway-engine; a girl was accidentally poisoned by arsenic; and an infant was suffocated. The homicidal death was that of a child murdered by his father at Auckland.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
