A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1886," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor may at any time, upon the petition of the Mayor and Council of a borough, publicly notified, by a Proclamation, alter the boundaries of such borough so as to include therein any land which ought reasonably to be included in such borough: And whereas a petition has been presented to me by the Mayor and Councillors of the Borough of Motueka praying me to alter the boundaries of the said borough so as to include therein the piece of land described in the First Schedule hereto, being land which ought reasonably to be included in the said borough:

Now, therefore, I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said borough are hereby altered so as to include within the limits of the said borough the land described in the First Schedule hereto, and that the said borough shall henceforth be bounded as specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA TO BE ADDED TO THE BOROUGH OF MOTUEKA.

SECTIONS 121, 122, 123, parts of Section 9, and part of Section 187, all of Block III., Motueka Survey District.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

BOROUGH OF MOTUEKA.—EXTENDED BOUNDARIES.

ALL that area in the Nelson Land District bounded by a line commencing at the south-western corner of Section No. 234, Block VII., Motueka Survey District, and proceeding thence in a due easterly direction to the Moutere Mud-flat, at the south-eastern corner of Section No. 1 of 173 of the said Block VII.; thence in a generally north-easterly direction by the eastern boundaries of Sections Nos. 1 of 173, 3 of 173, 170, 2 of 170, and 169, to the southern boundary of Section No. 144, Block IV., of the said survey district; thence in an easterly direction to the sea-beach at the south-eastern corner of the said Section No. 144; thence in a generally northerly direction along the line of high-water mark to the south-eastern corner of Section No. 29 of the said Block IV.; thence in a westerly direction to the south-

eastern corner of Section No. 129 of the said Block IV.; thence in a northerly direction to the south-eastern corner of Section No. 126 of the said Block IV.; thence in a westerly direction to the south bank of the Motueka River; thence in a generally southerly and westerly direction, along the south bank of the present course of the Motueka River (including the islands in the said river), to the western boundary of Section No. 215, Block III., of the said survey district; and thence in a due southerly direction back to starting-point at the south-west corner of said Section No. 234: excluding from the above-described area the Motueka Wharf.

Despatch.—Convention with Costa Rica relative to Trade-marks.

Downing Street, 13th November, 1900.

SIR,—I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your government, a copy of a Convention between the United Kingdom and the Republic of Costa Rica for the reciprocal protection of trade-marks and designs, signed at Guatemala on the 5th March, 1898, the ratifications of which were exchanged in London on the 29th September, 1900.

2. I have to call your attention to Article II. of the Convention, from which you will observe that, if it is desired that the stipulations of the Convention should be made applicable to the colony under your government, notice to that effect must be given to the President of the Republic of Costa Rica within one year from the date of the exchange of the ratifications.

3. I have therefore to request that you will be good enough to inform me at your early convenience of the wishes of your Government in the matter.

CONVENTION BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE REPUBLIC OF COSTA RICA FOR THE RECIPROCAL PROTECTION OF TRADE-MARKS, ETC.

Signed at Guatemala, 5th March, 1898.—Ratifications exchanged at London, 29th September, 1900.

HER Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Excellency Señor Don Rafael Iglesias, President of the Republic of Costa Rica, desiring to conclude a Convention for the reciprocal protection of trade-marks and designs, have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, George Francis Birt Jenner, Esq., Her Britannic Majesty's Minister Resident in Central America, &c.; and

His Excellency Señor Don Rafael Iglesias, President of the Republic of Costa Rica, Honourable Señor Don Ricardo Villafranca y Bonilla, Consul-General of the Republic of Costa Rica at Guatemala:

Who, having communicated to each other their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following articles:—

ARTICLE I.

The subjects or citizens of each of the contracting parties shall have, in the dominions and possessions of the other, the same rights as are now granted, or may hereafter be granted, to subjects or citizens in all that relates to trade-marks, industrial designs, and patterns.

In order that such rights may be obtained, the formalities required by the laws of the respective countries must be fulfilled.

ARTICLE II.

The stipulations of the present Convention shall be applicable to all the colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, excepting to those hereinafter named—that is to say, except to India, the Dominion of Canada, Newfoundland, the Cape of Good Hope, Natal, New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, Tasmania, South Australia, Western Australia, New Zealand:

Provided always that the stipulations of the present Convention shall be made applicable to any of the above-named colonies or foreign possessions on whose behalf notice to

that effect shall have been given by Her Majesty's Representative to the President of the Republic of Costa Rica within one year from the date of the exchange of ratifications of the present Convention.

ARTICLE III.

The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged in London as soon as possible.

It shall come into operation one month after the exchange of ratifications, and shall remain in force until the expiration of one year from the day on which either party may give notice of its intention to terminate it.

In witness whereof the undersigned Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

INDIA.—EAST COAST.

On a date to be hereafter fixed, a triple-flashing white light of the second order, giving three flashes every 10 seconds, will be exhibited on a rock at Seven Pagodas or Mahabalipuram, latitude 12° 37', longitude 80° 11', instead of the fixed red dioptric light of the fourth order now displayed there.

2. The new light will be visible eighteen miles in clear weather. The arc of illumination is from N.E. through E. to S.S.W. (191° 30'). Bearings are magnetic, and from seaward.

VICTORIA.—PORT OF PORT PHILLIP.—SOUTH CHANNEL.

Referring to General Notice to Mariners, Victoria, dated 1st June, 1898, page 67, it is hereby notified that the 26 ft. shoal patch midway between Nos. 1 and 2 buoys, South Channel, has now moved north-eastward of such position, and on the 29th instant it was ascertained that a knoll with a minimum depth of 26 ft. over it at low water had formed on the line of leading-lights between No. 1 and No. 3 buoys of such channel.

The following bearings were taken over such knoll:—

Point King, S. 28° 33' E.
No. 1 buoy, N. 50° 37' W.
No. 3 buoy, N. 77° 05' E.

Masters and others in charge of ships drawing 26 ft. or more are recommended to keep about one (1) cable-length southward of the line of leading-lights in the South Channel when navigating their vessels through the channel to westward of No. 3 buoy.

AFRICA.

KOWIE RIVER (PORT ALFRED).—The following information respecting Kowie River (33° 36' S., 26° 54' E.) has been received:—*Winds and Currents.*—The prevailing winds in summer are from an e. to S.-e. direction during the day, calms and light airs off the land at night, but occasionally a strong S.E. wind blows continuously day and night for two or three days. During the winter, w. winds blow with bad weather at times, but a gale may be blowing in the offing when it is fine near the coast. The Agulhas current sets to the wrd. sometimes very strongly at a distance of 5 to 25 miles from the coast, and a current sometimes setting against the wind is experienced in the roadstead (assisting vessels to ride), which prevents the regular tidal ebb and flow being perceptible. *The Bar.*—The bar is composed of sand over rk.; w. and S.-w. gales send in a heavy swell, which deposits more sand on the bar, making it impassable for two or three days; this deposit, however, is usually scoured out by the following spring tides. The passage over the bar in consequence varies considerably in direction, position, and depth. *Directions, &c.*—Upon a vessel appearing off the port, the Harb. Master, who is also Shipping Master, will come on board, if weather permits, and point out a berth, otherwise a berth will be sig. from the Port Office. The best anchorage is in from 15 to 17 fms., with the entr. of the river open and the Port Office flagstaff on the wrn. bank near the entr. bearing N. 25° W., the holding-ground here being good, and the position outside the rollers. The holding-ground in other areas is generally not good, being sand over patches of rk. The anchor should be buoyed, coir riding-stoppers being used for the cables, and arrangements made for slipping in case of bad weather, when the end of the cable must also be buoyed. Topgallant yards and masts should be struck, the topsails double-reefed, and the vessel always kept ready for sea, strict attention being paid to all sigs. made from the Port Office so that there will be no delay in putting to sea when the sig. to do so is made. By keeping within 12 miles of the coast the very heavy sea which gets up outside that dist., due to the Agulhas current, will be avoided. All vessels visiting this port should be provided with the best ground-tackle and a stout coir spring to ride by. With the wind from the wrd. or wrd. it is preferable to ride at single anchor with a whole cable and a spring on, but with a sly. wind and dirty weather, and with no chance of putting to sea, it is better to give the vessel a good sheer, let go a second anchor before veering on the first, and then veer both cables together. Masters are strongly advised to remain on board as much as possible, and to exercise discretion in permitting boats to leave their vessels at any time, as accidents have occurred through drifting. *Sigs.*—Mariners can communicate their wishes to their agents through the Port Office by use of the Commercial Code, and every assistance will be rendered as far as practicable. Vessels not possessing the Commercial Code can make the following sigs.: (1.) Ensign in foretopmast rigging.—I am in want of a cable. (2.) Ensign in maintopmast rigging.—I am in want of an anchor. (3.) Ensign in fore rigging.—I have parted a bower cable. (4.) Ensign in main rigging.—Want an anchor and cable. (5.) Wheft—where best seen.—I want assistance. *Weather Sigs.*—The

following sigs. will be shown from the Port Office: (1.) A black ball over union jack.—Veer about 70 fms., see second anchor clear. (2.) A black ball under union jack.—Put to sea at once, get an offing. (3.) Flag (blue, white, blue hor.) over union jack.—Send down topgallant yards and mast, point yards, see everything clear for working ship as far as practicable. (4.) Union jack over white and blue flag.—See third anchor clear, and prepare for bad weather. (5.) Union jack over red, white, blue (vert.) flag.—Heave up second anchor and shorten into same scope as before. *Bar Sigs.*—(1.) Black ball at wrn. yardarm.—Bar impassable. (2.) Black ball hoisted half-way up.—Bar dangerous. (3.) A working flag (red pierced white) will be hoisted when the bar is practicable for tug-boats and lighters; it will be kept half-mast when special caution is necessary in crossing the bar, and hauled down altogether when the bar is impassable. Pilots are always in readiness with a steam-tug to take vessels in or out, and no vessel should attempt to enter the river even in most favourable weather without a pilot. No ships' boats should attempt to cross the bar, however smooth it may appear. The whole of the above sigs. are to be answered by the answering pennant hoisted where best seen, and promptly acted upon: neglect to do so will be reported to Lloyd's, and also to the owners. Masters, however, should not necessarily wait for the sigs., but take timely precautions. The first rise of a low barometer indics. a strong w. gale, the first fall of a high barometer foretells a strong e. gale with short chopping sea. Port Alfred is in tel. and daily postal communication with Cape Colony generally, and railway communication will follow very shortly. Dec.

PORT NATAL.—On 1st Jan., 1901, Rocket-house Beacon and the three white lts. exh. therefrom is to be disc. The Town Hall tower (in West Street), in 29° 51½' S., 31° 2¼' E., by day, and the elec. lts. in the same street by night, will give approx. the same anchorage-bearing as the Rocket-house Beacon and lts. Nov.

INNAMBAN RIVER ENTR.—On 1st Nov., 1900, the F. white lt. on BURRA Pt. (23° 45' S., 35° 33' E.), S. side of river entr., was to be replaced by a F. and fl. white lt. every 80 secs., a partial ecl. precedes and follows the fl., vis. from N. 5° E., through N., W., and S., to S. 25° E., elev. (probably the same as the old lt.) 80 ft., R. 15 miles, exh. from a white Lt.-H. with green cupola, 31 ft. high. Dec.

KULAO RAI ISL.—A fl. white lt. every 5 secs.—fl. 1/10 sec., ecl. 4 2/5 secs.; vis. from about N. 59° E., through N., W., and S., to S. 72° E., elev. 172 ft. above H.W., R. 20 miles, is exh. exper. from a grey pyra. Lt.-H. about 165 ft. high, in 15° 23¼' N., 109° 6' E., about 2 cables S. 60° W. from the N.E. pt. of the isl., entr. to Tong King Gulf. Dec.*

An outer bar buoy, named Shaweishan Bank buoy, surm. by a staff and globe, in 20 ft., in approx. 31° 22½' N., 122° 14½' E., with Shaweishan Lt.-H. N. 9° W., 2½ miles. 2. An inner bar buoy, named Chi Yao Bank outer buoy, surm. by a staff and cage, in 23 ft., in approx. 31° 24' N., 121° 56' E., with Drinkwater Pt. Lt.-H. N. 58° W., 7½ miles. 3. The Fairway buoy, in approx. 31° 24' N., 121° 59½' E., now the middle bar buoy, is red, and surm. with a staff and ball. To cross the bar in the deepest water, vessels should pass close srd. of the above-named buoys. *Tidal Information.*—In order to inform vessels approaching the bar what water they may expect in crossing it, a tide-gauge has been est. on Shaweishan Isl., and the height of the tide in ft. above the 20 ft. depths in the chan. will be sig. by the International Code to any vessel asking for this information. *Tsung Ming Crossing.*—Also, the Swashway, now named Tsung Ming Crossing, with a depth of 26 ft. at L.W. springs, and a width of 2 cables, between the N. and S. chan., N.- wrd. of Tsung Ming Bank, has been buoyed as follows: *a.* E. entr. buoy, conical, black, surm. by a staff and globe, moored in 39 ft., in approx. 31° 30½' N., 121° 33' E., with Middle Isl. beacon S. 29° E., 5½ miles. *b.* First Crossing buoy, conical, black, surm. by a staff and cage, moored in 29 ft., with Middle Isl. beacon S. 43° E., 6½ miles. *c.* Second Crossing buoy, conical, black, surm. by a staff and triangle, moored in 26 ft., with Middle Isl. beacon S. 55° E., 6½ miles. *d.* W. Spit buoy, conical, red and black, vert., surm. by a staff and globe, moored in 30 ft., with Middle Isl. beacon S. 67° E., 7½ miles. *Directions.*—Vessels bound to Shanghai through the N. chan., after passing Liu Chiao Lt.-H., should keep the coast of Tsung Ming Isl. about one mile dist. until the E. entr. buoy is sighted, when the course should be altered to pass about one cable to the nrd. of that buoy, and after passing the same dis. to the nrd. of the other three buoys in the crossing, stand over towards the S. wrn. bank of the Yang tse until about mid-chan., when a course may be shaped either up or down the river. *Caution.*—Allowance must be made for the flood tide, which sets to the N.- wrd. across the Swashway, especially between the E. Entr. and First Crossing buoys. Dec.

Arrivals and Departures in 1900.

Registrar-General's Office, Wellington, 21st January, 1901.

TABLES showing arrivals in and departures from the colony during the year 1900 are published for general information, with comparisons for the periods 1892 and onwards.

The number of persons who arrived in New Zealand last year (18,074) was slightly less than the number for 1899 (18,506), and similarly the departures for 1900, which numbered 16,243, were not quite equal to those for 1899, which amounted to 16,619.

The excess of arrivals over departures was 1,831 for last year, against 1,887 in the previous twelve months. But these figures include 215 men of the Contingents sent to South Africa in 1899 and 1,582 more who took their departure in the first quarter of the year 1900, which qualify the above comparisons, so that it is desirable to state the numbers exclusive of these troops.

Omitting the special element in the departures, consisting of the military who left for war purposes only, it will be seen that the results for 1900 are still more satisfactory than those for 1899, the gain for the later year exceeding the other by 1,311 persons.

The comparative tables show that the colony has drawn to itself, in each of the years 1892 to 1900, more population than it has parted with, notwithstanding the attractions of Australian and other goldfields, &c.

The figures under the heading "United Kingdom" for 1900 indicate an excess of 1,060 arrivals over the departures, and those for Australia an excess of 2,173.

Of 18,074 persons who arrived last year, only 1,871 were children—i.e., under twelve years of age; and of 16,243 departures the children numbered 1,302. Of the arrivals 10.35 per cent. are therefore found to be children, and of the departures 8.01 per cent.
