Warrant authorising the Minister of Lands to construct a Traffic-bridge over the Rangitikei River at or near the Township of Bull's, and apportioning the Cost of the Bridge.

RANFURLY, Governor. WHEREAS, under the provisions of section one hun-dred and thirteen of "The Public Works Act, 1994" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), and "The Public Works Acts Amendment Act, 1900," the Minister of Lands has made application to the Governor to authorise the con-struction of the bridge mentioned in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the said bridge"), and to appor-tion the cost of constructing the said bridge between the Minister on behalf of His Majesty the King, the Rangitikei County Council, the Manawatu County Council, and the Bull's Town Board: And whereas the Governor is of opinion that the work should be done: And whereas by subsection five, (b), of section eleven of

And whereas by subsection five, (b), of section eleven of "The Public Works Acts Amendment Act, 1900," it is therein enacted that the provisions of section one hundred and thirteen of the said Act shall apply to the said bridge,

and thirteen of the said Act shall apply to the said bridge, notwithstanding that a contract may have been already accepted for it by the Government: Now, therefore, I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the hereinbefore-mentioned Acts, and of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby authorise the Minister of Lands to construct the said bridge; and I do hereby declare that the cost of constructing the said bridge shall be borne and paid by the said County Councils and Town Board in the following proportions—namely, the Rangitikei County Council shall pay to the Minister of Lands the sum of two thousand nine hundred and eighty-five pounds five shillings and elevenpence, the Manawatu

County Council shall pay to the Minister of Lands a like sum, and the Bull's Town Board shall pay to the Minister of Lands the sum of one thousand two hundred and seventyof Lands the sum of one thousand two hundred and seventy-nine pounds eight shillings and two pence. And the Minister of Lands shall provide the balance of the cost of construction of the said bridge out of moneys voted for that purpose by Parliament. Such payments shall be made by the Rangi-tikei County Council, by the Manawatu County Council, and by the Bull's Town Board respectively by such instalments and at such times during the progress of the works as the Minister of Lands may request.

Regulations under "The Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1900."

RANFURLY, Governor.

DURSUANT to and in exercise of the powers in this behalf conferred upon him by "The Industrial Con-ciliation and Arbitration Act, 1900" (hereinafter called "the said Act") His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand doth hereby repeal the regulations made under the said Act on the 5th day of November, 1900, and in lieu thereof doth hereby, for the purposes of the said Act, make the following regulations, that is to say :--

INDUSTRIAL UNIONS AND ASSOCIATIONS.

1. Application for registration as an industrial union or industrial association may be in the form numbered 1 in the Schedule hereto.

The certificate of registration and incorporation of an 2. The definition of registration and motophysical of an industrial union or industrial association may be in the form numbered 2 in the Schedule hereto. 3. Any industrial union or industrial association the regis-

Any industrial union or industrial association the registration whereof has been refused under section 11 of the said Act may appeal to the Court by filing in the office of the Clerk of Awards a notice, in duplicate, in the form numbered 3 in the Schedule hereto. The Clerk shall forward one copy of the notice to the Registrar, who shall transmit to the Clerk all papers in reference thereto, and thereupon the appeal shall be deemed to be before the Court.
 The statutory declaration verifying the annual list of members and officers of an industrial union or association may be in the form numbered 4 in the Schedule hereto.

5. The application for registration of a branch office of any registered industrial union or industrial association under section 14 of the said Act may be in the form numbered 5 in the Schedule hereto.

CANCELLATION OF REGISTRATION.

6. The application for cancellation of the registration of an industrial union or industrial association under sec-tion 20 of the said Act may be in the form numbered 6 in the Schedule hereto.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENTS.

7. The Clerk of Awards in each district, being a Deputy Registrar of the Supreme Court, shall keep in his office (being the same office as the Supreme Court Office wherein he is Deputy Registrar) a register of all industrial agree-ments, duplicate originals whereof are filed therein. Such duplicates shall be numbered consecutively in the order in which there are filed and the register spill soft forth the which they are filed, and the register shall set forth the date of the agreement, and of the filing thereof, the names of the parties thereto, and of every industrial union, indus-trial association, or employer who, in the presoribed manner, signifies concurrence therein.

8. Such concurrence as aforesaid may be signified by filing in the same office as that in which the industrial agreement is filed a notice in the form numbered 7 in the Schedule hereto, and every notice of concurrence shall bear the same number as the industrial agreement to which it relates.

9. Such notice shall in the case of an industrial union or association be executed under seal, and in the case of an employer shall be signed by him and shall specify his address and occupation.

BOARDS OF CONCILIATION.

10. Nomination-papers, consent-papers, and voting-papers for the purpose of election of members of the Board of Conciliation may be in the forms numbered respectively 8, 9, and 10 in the Schedule hereto.

11. At any such election as aforesaid an industrial union may distribute its votes at pleasure amongst all the candi-dates to be elected by its division. Thus, if there be two candidates to be elected by the industrial unions of workers in a given district, a union of workers may give two votes to one candidate and none to the other.

to one candidate and none to the other. 12. Notice of any question or dispute for the decision o the Returning Officer under subsection (22) of section 38 of the said Act shall be given in writing to the Returning Officer by the party raising the same. 13. For the purpose of electing the Chairman of the Board, the members present at he meeting called for the purpose shall select to preside at that meeting one of their number, who shall have a deliberative but no casting vote. Nominations of qualified persons shall then be received from members. If there be only one person nominated, he shall be declared elected as Chairman. 14. If there be more such nominations than one, the

14. If there be more such nominations than one, the 14. If there be more such nominations that one, the person receiving an absolute majority of votes of the mem-bers present shall be elected. To that end the names of all the persons so nominated shall be written on a list and sub-mitted to the vote. The name of the person receiving the smallest number of votes shall be struck out, and the re-maining names shall be again submitted to the vote. This process is to be repeated until some one person receives the votes of the majority of the members present and voting, and he shall be the elected Chairman.

15. In the event of two such persons remaining on the list with an equal number of votes, and neither of them being able to obtain an absolute majority, then, when all failed, the members of the Board shall be deemed to have failed to elect a Chairman, and the Governor shall appoint one.

SPECIAL BOARDS OF CONCILIATORS.

16. The application for the constitution of a Special Board ٥f Conciliators may be in the form numbered 11 in the Schedule hereto.

17. Regulations 13 to 19 hereof shall, mutatis mutandis, apply to such Special Boards, and the forms thereby pre-scribed may be used, with such modifications as are required in each particular case.

INDUSTRIAL DISPUTES.

18. Applications for the reference of an industrial dispute for settlement to the Board (hereinafter called "a Refer-ence") may be in the form numbered 12 in the Schedule hereto.

hereto. 19. When filing a Reference in the office of the Clerk, the applicant shall also lodge as many copies thereof as there are other parties to the dispute. The Clerk shall indorse on each copy a memorandum signed by him, setting forth the fact and date of the filing of the original, and shall then forthwith post one such copy by registered letter, addressed to each of the said other parties to the dispute. 20. All References shall be numbered consecutively in the order in which they are filed, and the Clerk shall keep a register thereof, setting forth the number of the Reference and the date of the filing thereof, together with the name of the applicant and of the other parties to the Reference. 21. All documents subsequently filed, lodged, or issued in

21. All documents subsequently filed, lodged, or issued in the matter of the Reference shall bear the same number as

the Reference to which they relate, and shall be initialed in the form numbered 13 in the Schedule hereto. 22. The Clerk shall convene a meeting of the Board by posting to each member a notice in the form numbered 14 in the Schedule hereto.

23. The date of such meeting shall be not sconer than seven nor later than fourteen days after the day on which the notice convening the same is posted, and the notice shall be posted within three days after the filing of the Deformed Reference.

24. The Clerk shall post by registered letter, addressed to each party to the Reference, a notice of the day, hour, and place of such meeting.
25. Such notice may be in the form numbered 15 in the Schedule hereto, and shall be posted at least three days before and exclusive of the day of meeting.
26. A party to a Reference who desires to appear by agent, or (where allowed) by solicitor or counsel, shall sign and file in the Schedule hereto.

in the Schedule hereto. 27. Where all the parties to a Reference consent to the appearance of counsel or solicitor, such consent may be given in the form numbered 17 in the Schedule hereto, and the same shall be filed in the office of the Clerk.

29. The memorandum of consent referred to in section 57 of the said Act may be in the form numbered 19 in the Schedule hereto.

WITNESSES.

30. A summons to a witness shall be in duplicate, in the form numbered 20 in the Schedule hereto. The Clerk shall sign both duplicates, retaining one and issuing the other for service by the applicant. Service shall be effected by deliver-ing a copy to the witness, and at the same time producing the original for his inspection if so desired. 31. Any number of witnesses may be included in one sum-

since the copy served need contain only the name of the witness upon whom it is served. If the summons is issued out of the Court of Arbitration it shall bear the seal of the Court; if issued by the Board of Conciliation, it shall be signed by the Clerk on behalf of the Board.

THE COURT OF ARBITRATION.

The Clerk shall indorse on each copy a memorandum signed by him, setting forth the fact and date of the filing of the original, and shall then forthwith post one such copy by registered letter, ad-dressed to each of the said other parties to the dispute. 34. All papers and proceedings before the Court shall proceedings before the court shall

34. All papers and proceedings before the Court shall bear the same number as before the Board, and be similarly initialed, with the addition of the words, "Before the Court of Arbitration."

35. The Clerk in each industrial district shall be an officer

35. The Olerk in each industrial district shall be an officer of the Court, and shall attend all sittings thereof in his dis-trict. He shall keep the minutes of proceedings and the re-cords of the Court, and perform all such duties and exercise all such functions as the Court may direct. 36. Whenever the Clerk cannot conveniently attend the sittings of the Court, the Minister of Justice may appoint any other fit person to attend such sittings in the stead and as the deputy of the Clerk, and the deputy whilst so attend-ing shall perform the functions and duties of the Clerk. 37. Whenever the Clerk (being the Deputy Registrar of the

ing sum perform the functions and duties of the Clerk. 37. Whenever the Clerk (being the Deputy Registrar of the Supreme Court) is absent from the office of that Court the person for the time being acting as Deputy Registrar shall also act as the Clerk.

38. The Court may prescribe rules of procedure and prac-tice relative to all matters with which it has to do, and such rules shall be as valid as if incorporated with these regulations.

ENFORCEMENT OF AWABD, ETC.

39. Application to the Court for the enforcement of any award, or order, or industrial agreement, may be in such of the forms numbered 22 and 23 in the Schedule hereto as is applicable thereto.

40. Such application shall be filed in the office of the Clerk, and the applicant shall also lodge as many copies thereof as there are parties alleged to have committed breaches of the award, order, or industrial agreement. The breaches of the award, order, or industrial agreement. The Clerk shall indorse on each copy a memorandum signed by him setting forth the fact and date of the filing of the original, and shall then forthwith post one such copy by registered letter addressed to each of the aforesaid parties. 41. Every certificate to be given by the Clerk under the provisions of section 94, subsection (5), of the said Act may be in the form numbered 24 in the Schedule hereto.

APPOINTMENT OF EXPERTS AS ASSESSORS.

42. The nomination of an expert to sit as an Assessor with the members of a Board or Court, as provided in section 101 of the said Act, may be in the form numbered 25 in the Schedule hereto.

43. Every expert so nominated shall, by writing under his hand either on the nomination-paper or separate therefrom, signify his consent to act as Assessor. 44. The nomination-paper shall be lodged with the Clerk

If any Assessor dies, resigns, or refuses to act, the party nominating him may forthwith appoint another expert in his place: Provided that the proceedings shall not abate or be affected by any such vacancy. 46. The party or parties nominating an Assessor shall pay such Assessor's fee.



Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 521, against 402 in December—an increase of 119. The deaths in January were 205—an increase of 57 on the number in December. Of the total deaths, males contributed 105, females 100. Sixty of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 29.27 per cent. of the whole number; 52 of these were under one year of age.

There were fifty deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Seven men, 68, 72, 78 (two), 80, 82, 84, and eight women, 65, 66, 68, 70, 72, 78, 80 (two), died at Auckland; six men, 66 (two), 70, 76, 78, 88, and one woman, 71, at Wellington; seven men, 65, 67, 77, 78, 80 (two), 86, and six women, 72, 73 (three), 81 (two), at Christchurch; and six men, 67, 70, 73, 75, 79, 80, and nine women, 65 (two), 70, 71, 73, 74, 77, 82, 85, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rates at each of the four centres.

Specific Febrile and Zymotic Diseases.—The mortality from this class of disease at the four chief cities and suburbs rose from 13 deaths in December to 26 deaths in January, of which diarrhœal diseases caused 11 in the latter month against 5 in December, and typhoid fever 7 against 2. Of 11 deaths from diarrhœal complaints in January, 5 occurred at Auckland, 1 at Wellington, 3 at Christchurch, and 2 at Dunedin. There was 1 death from typhoid fever at Auckland, 1 at Wellington, 4 at Christchurch, and 1 at Dunedin. Influenza was fatal at Christchurch only in January, where there were two deaths. Whooping-cough is observed at Wellington (1 death) and at Dunedin (1). At Wellington 1 death from diphtheria is noticed. The total of 26 deaths in the class is made up by adding to the above 2 deaths from septicæmia and 1 from stricture 1 from stricture.

Parasitic Diseases .- There was 1 death from hydatids at Wellington.

Constitutional Diseases.—Of 25 death from hydratus at weighting on. Constitutional Diseases.—Of 25 deaths in this class, 11 were from cancer, 10 from phthisis, and 1 from diabetes. Local Diseases.—The mortality was much higher during January than for the previous month—107 deaths against 70. Twenty-one of the deaths in January were from nervous diseases, 1 from diseases of the organs of special sense, 30 of the circulatory system, 20 of the respiratory, 24 of the digestive, 5 of the urinary, 5 of the reproductive, and 1 of the interment of the deaths in January were from nervous diseases. the integumentary system.

Violent Deaths.-These numbered 14-11 accidental and 3 suicidal. A labourer died from fractured skull, a painter from a fall out of a cart, an expressman from collision with a railway-train, an aged man from accident to spine, a child from scalding; 4 persons were accidentally drowned, and 2 infants died from accident at birth. The suicides included 1 by wounds inflicted with a razor, 1 by drowning, and 1 by throwing herself out of a window.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
