

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of March, 1901.

Present:

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE R. J. SEDDON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL. W HEREAS by "The Shorthand Reporters Act, 1900," is senacted that the Governor in Council, with the concurrence of at least two of the Judges of the Supreme Court, may from time to time make such regulations as he deems nece

- (1.) For examining as to the fitness and qualifications of applicants for appointments as authorised reporters under this Act;
 (2.) For prescribing the duties of such reporters;

b) application for a processing the second system of system of systems of shorthand writing to be used by such reporters, and the mode of transcribing the shorthand notes;
(4.) For securing as far as practicable uniformity of system of reporting under this Act;
(5.) For regulating the mode in which reports made under this Act shall be preserved and made a permanent record of the proceedings;
(6.) For fixing the fees to be paid in respect of reports, or of certified copies of transcriptions, or in respect of any other specified matter relating to reporting under this Act, and for determining by whom such fees shall be payable;
(7.) And generally for any other purpose which he deems necessary in order to give full effect to this Act : Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Executive Council of the said colony, and with the concurrence of his Honour Joshua Strange Williams, a Judge of the said Court, doth hereby make the following regulations under and for the purposes of the said Act;—

REGULATIONS.

Examinations.

1. Candidates for appointment as authorised shorthand reporters will be examined by an Examiner or Examiners appointed for that purpose from time to time. Examina-tions will be held at such times and places as the Minister of Justice more provided to the such times and places as the Minister of Justice may appoint.

2. Applications for appointment must be in writing, ad-dressed to the Under-Secretary for Justice, Wellington, and

(a.) Evidence that the applicant has attained the age of twenty-one years;

- 3.
- twenty-one years;
 (b.) A fee of two guineas;
 (c.) At least two testimonials as to character.
 The subjects of examination will include—

 (a.) Ability to write at a rate of not less than 150 words per minute, and to read his notes at sight with a reasonable degree of facility.
 (b.) Rapidity and accuracy of transcription (all transcriptions to be typewritten).
 (c.) Candidates will also be required to satisfy the Examiners that they possess educational qualifications sufficient to enable them to report proceedings in the law-courts with intelligence and understanding.

3. The Examiners will report the result of the examina-tion to the Minister of Justice, who, if satisfied that any successful candidate is a fit and proper person to be ap-pointed an authorised reporter, may advise His Excellency the Governor to make such appointment accordingly.

Duties of Reporters.

4. Subject to the directions of the Court, authorised re-porters will be required to take a complete note of the evidence of witnesses, minutes of the proceedings, and such other matters as the Court may order.

System of Shorthand Writing, and Uniformity.

5. As a general rule Sir Isaac Pitman's system of phono-graphy must be used, but an authorised reporter who has passed the examination prescribed by these rules in any other well-recognised system will be at liberty to use that

other well-recognised system will be at horry to use that system. 6. All transcriptions must, as far as practicable, be legibly typewritten, and at least three copies must be supplied— one, the original, for record in the Court, and one copy each, taken by means of carbonised paper or any other suitable means, for the respective parties. In proceedings in the Supreme Court a copy must also be supplied to the Judge. The notes of evidence must be indexed for reference.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this third day of April, 1901.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

DURSUANT to and in exercise of the powers in this behalf conferred on him by "The Slaughtering and Inspection Act, 1900," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations :

REGULATIONS.

INTERPRETATION.

1. In these regulations, "the Act" means "The Slaugh-tering and Inspection Act, 1900."

REGISTRATION OF ABATTOIRS.

2. (1.) The application for registration of an abattoir shall be in the form numbered 1 in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be signed by the Town Clerk of the controlling authority and forwarded to the Secretary for Agriculture at Wellington.

(2) Forms of application shall be obtainable from the Secretary for Agriculture, at Wellingt n, free of charge.
3. With the application shall be sent a ground plan of the building, together with two copies of the scale of charges

which the controlling authority proposes to make for the use of the abattoir, or for the storage of stock or carcases, or for the slaughtering of stock, or for stallages, rents, or tolls. 4. One copy of such scale of charges shall be submitted to the Governor for his approval, and if approved shall be constitud.

gazetted.

5. The certificate of registration shall be in the form numbered 2 in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall continue in force until cancelled.

6. The Secretary for Agriculture, or such other person as the Governor appoints in that behalf, shall, by such certificate, assign to the abattoir an official number, to distinguish that abattoir from all other abattoirs registered by him.

LICENSES IN RESPECT OF SLAUGHTERHOUSES AND MEAT-EXPORT SLAUGHTERHOUSES, AND THE REGISTRATION THEREOF.

7. For the purpose of issuing licenses in respect of slaughterhouses the colony shall be divided into nine dis-tricts, the names and boundaries whereof arc set out in the First Schedule hereto.

Every license now in force granted under any repealed Act relating to slaughterhouses shall continue in force only until the 30th day of June, 1901. 9. (1.) The application for a license in respect of a slaughterhouse or a meat-export slaughterhouse shall be in the form numbered 3 in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be accompanied by a ground plan of the building aud a copy of each newspaper in which the advertisement required by section 21, (2), of the Act is published. (2.) Forms of application shall be obtainable from any Inspector of Stock or local authority free of charge. (3.) The application shall be signed by the applicant and forwarded to the local authority of the district, together with the fee payable in respect of the license. 10. (1.) The local authority shall, before issuing a license, transmit the application, together with the proposed license and the fee payable in respect of the Minister; and the Minister, if he approve of the license, shall signify the same on the face of the license. (2.) The application for the renewal of any license of a slauphterhouse or meat-export slauptherhouse shall be made and provend of the license.

(2.) The application for the renewal of any license of a slaughterhouse or meat-export slaughterhouse shall be made so as to be received by the Secretary for Agriculture not later than the 1st day of May in every year.
(3). If the application is approved by the Minister, the Secretary for Agriculture, or such other person as the Governor appoints in that behalf, shall assign to the slaughterhouse or meat-export slaughterhouse, as the case may be, an official number, to distinguish it from all other slaughterhouses or meat-export slaughterhouses in respect of which a license is issued by him.

(3.) Where the total amount of inspection-fees paid in any period of twelve months ending the 30th day of June does not amount to the sum of £200, then the person liable for payment shall, with the last payment for that period, include the amount required to make up £200.

19. (1.) The manager of every abattoir or meat-export slaughterhouse shall, within the first five days of every month, forward to the Secretary for Agriculture a return, signed by the manager, of the number and description of all stock slaughtered at that abattoir or meat-export slaughter-

(2.) A similar return for the preceding three months, signed by the licensee, shall, within the first five days of the months of January, April, July, and October in every year, be forwarded by the licensee in respect of every slaughter-house house.

(3.) Forms of the return shall be obtainable free of charge from any Inspector of Stock.

SANITARY PROVISIONS.

20. In every slaughtering-place the killing-, dressing-, and hanging-places shall be floored with concrete or other material approved by the Inspector, and thoroughly ventilated.

21. If the walls of the killing- or dressing-place are of wood they shall be lined on the inside to a height of not less than 6 ft. from the floor with galvanised iron, and any wooden partitions or posts in those places shall in like manner be cased with galvanised iron.

22. The floor and lower portions of the walls, par-titions, and posts of the killing- and dressing-place shall be thoroughly washed down immediately after slaughter-ing for the day is finished, or oftener if directed by the Inspector.

23. (1.) Every part of the interior of the killing-, dressing-and hanging places (except such part as is lined or cased with galvanised iron) shall be thoroughly lime-washed at intervals of not less than three months.

(2.) Where any part is constructed of such materials as would, in the opinion of the Inspector, render lime-washing unnecessary, he may, by writing under his hand, waive the fulfilment of the requirements of this clause as to such part.

24. All knives, saws, cleavers, hooks, hanging rails, and other instruments, and all trollies or other conveyances used in or about the slaughtering-place, shall be kept thoroughly clean.

25. The race leading to the killing-place shall be paved to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

26. The stockyards attached to a slaughtering-place shall at all times be kept clean, and supplied with a sufficient supply of pure water for the watering of the stock yarded therein.

27. No hides, skins, fat, or other portion of any carcase likely to become a nuisance shall be stored in any killing-, dressing-, or hanging-place.

28. Every conveyance used for removing meat from any slaughtering-place shall be kept clean, and provided with a clean cover both under and over the meat conveyed therein. 29. In connection with every slaughtering-place, proper and sufficient urinal and closet accommodation shall be
