ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this first day of June, 1901.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken for a public work, to wit, the construction of a Courthouse and other public buildings at Waitangi, Chatham Islands:

And whereas the said land is held or occupied by Native owners, and the title thereto is not derived from the Crown: And whereas a map of the said land has been prepared in duplicate, as required by the eighty-eighth section of "The Public Works Act, 1894":

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers in any wise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby declare that the land shown upon such map, and described in the Schedule hereto, shall be deemed to be taken for the purposes of the public work hereinbefore mentioned; and the said land shall vest in His Majesty the King as from the fifteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and one.

SIR,—I have the honour to acquaint you, for the information of any persons who may be interested in the matter, that an official translation (in French) of the statutes and regulations with regard to the late Dr. Alfred Bernhard Nobel's bequest, approved by His Majesty the King of Sweden and Norway, has now been published, and that the *Chargé d'Affaires* for Sweden and Norway at this Court has asked that as much publicity as possible may be given to the contents of the publication.

It is understood that the amount available under the bequest for distribution annually in prizes to meritorious inventors and others is about £40,000; that it is divisible into five equal parts, to be assigned—(1) for the most important discovery in physical science, (2) for the most important discovery or improvement in chemistry, (3) for the most important discovery in physiology or medicine, (4) for the most remarkable literary work, and (5) for the greatest service in the cause of international peace; that the first distribution of prizes will take place on the 10th of December in this year; and that the competition is open to every one without regard to nationality.

By-laws relating to Traction-engines and Heavy Traffic on Roads and Bridges crossing over Railways.

IN pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me under "The Government Railways Act, 1900," I, Joseph George Ward, the Minister for Railways, do hereby make the following by-laws for regulating heavy traffic on roads and bridges crossing over railways.

SCHEDULE.

INTERPRETATION.

- "HEAVY traffic" in these by-laws means,—
(a) The transportation of any vehicle, engine, or machine which weighs, together with the load thereon, if any, more than one and a half tons avoirdupois to each pair of wheels.

(b.) The traction of any vehicle or thing, whatever its weight, by means of bullocks.

(c.) Any traffic which may from time to time be declared to be "heavy traffic" by Order in Council.

HEAVY TRAFFIC OVER PUBLIC ROAD-BRIDGES ON OR OVER RAILWAYS.

2. A traction-engine or other heavy traffic shall not be allowed to cross any bridge over a railway where a level crossing is available within a distance of one mile.

3. A traction-engine or other heavy traffic shall not be taken on or over any railway-bridge used for combined road and railway traffic, or over any public road-bridge on or over any railway, except in conformity with the following regulations:—

(a.) The owner or person in charge of any traction-engine or other heavy traffic shall give notice to the Engineer or officer in charge of the railway that he desires to take such traction-engine or heavy traffic over a certain specified bridge or bridges upon or over the railway, and shall in the notice describe particulars of the traction-engine or other heavy traffic, including the number of wheels, weight per wheel, width of tire, width between tires, and any other information that may be desired, and shall satisfy the Railway officer of the correctness of such description in any manner he may require.

(b.) On being satisfied that the traction-engine or other heavy traffic is properly described, and that the bridge or bridges are of sufficient strength to carry such traffic, the Engineer or officer in charge of the line of railway shall issue a permit for the crossing of such traffic over the bridge or bridges specified in such permit for any period not exceeding one year from date thereof.

(c.) Such permit may from time to time be renewed for any like period as aforesaid if the officer is satisfied as to the sufficiency of the bridge, and that the particulars of the traffic are such as to render the crossing of such traction-engine or other heavy traffic permissible.

(d.) A permit shall not be issued for any traction-engine or other heavy traffic where the load per wheel with tires less than five inches wide exceeds one and a half tons, or where with tires of from five inches to twelve inches wide the load exceeds two and a half tons, or where with tires of over twelve inches the load on any one wheel exceeds four tons.

(e.) Permits shall not be issued for any bridge for any engine or other heavy traffic where in the opinion of the Railway officer the loads or other particulars of the traffic would be dangerous to the structure.

(f.) Before proceeding to cross any bridge or level crossing the person in charge of any traction-engine or other heavy traffic shall produce the permit to any Railway Inspector, or ganger, or to the person in charge of the bridge; and the engine or other heavy traffic shall not under any circumstances be taken on to the bridge unless the bridgekeeper, if any, is in attendance.

4. A permit may at any time be cancelled if the particulars of the description of any traction-engine or other heavy traffic are found to be incorrect or misleading.

HEAVY TRAFFIC OVER PRIVATE BRIDGES OVER RAILWAYS.

5. A traction-engine or other heavy traffic having a greater load than two tons on a wheel shall not under any circumstances be taken on or over any private road-bridge over any railway, and heavy traffic having a greater load than one and a half tons on a wheel shall not be taken on or over any such bridge without a permit as provided in clause 2 of these by-laws.

HEAVY TRAFFIC ON PRIVATE LEVEL CROSSINGS.

6. A traction-engine or other heavy traffic shall not be taken across a railway over any private level crossing without a permit issued by the Engineer or officer in charge of the line of railway, and, if so directed by him, only in the presence of a railway servant responsible for the protection of the railway traffic.

PENALTY ON BREACH OF BY-LAW.

7. Every person is liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds who takes any traction-engine or other heavy traffic across any railway at any private level crossing, or on to any combined road-and-railway bridge, or public or private road overbridge, in breach of any of these regulations, or wilfully gives any wrong description of any such engine, vehicle, or heavy traffic, or crosses without a permit, or after any permit has expired or been cancelled, or in any way commits a breach of these regulations.

APPLICATION OF BY-LAWS.

8. These by-laws shall not apply in the case of any combined road-and-railway bridge for which special regulations

have been or may hereafter be made and published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

9. These by-laws shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1901.

HUNUA ROAD BOARD.

BY-LAW to prevent Obstruction and Damage, and to regulate the Traffic, on the Roads and Bridges within the Hunua Road District.

In pursuance of the powers vested in them by "The Road Boards Act, 1882," "The Public Works Act, 1894," and their amendments, the Hunua Road Board do hereby make the following by-law:—

"Any person who causes or allows any timber or other heavy material, not being wholly raised above the ground on wheels, to be dragged on a road shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £5 for every day upon which such offence is committed or suffered to continue.

"This by-law shall come into force within the road district on the 1st day of July, 1901."

In the event of more than one person producing the required quantities of quicksilver before the dates named, inquiry will be made by the officer above referred to, when, if it is found that each applicant is equally entitled to a bonus, the amount will be divided in proportion to the quantities produced by each applicant, but in no case shall any bonus be paid until at least one hundred thousand pounds (100,000 lb.) of quicksilver has been produced in the aggregate.
