A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS an extension of the Midland Railway from Belgrove to Tadmor (hereinafter termed "the said railway") is a railway the construction of which is authorised by "The Railways Authorisation Act, 1900": And whereas it has been determined to construct and maintain a portion of the same, namely, the Tadmor Section:

Now, therefore, I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by "The Public Works Act, 1894," and in exercise of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said portion of the said railway shall be that defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Powers delegated to the Warea Domain Board under "The Public Domains Act, 1881."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this fifth day of June, 1901.

Present:

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE R. J. SEDDON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Public Domains Act, 1881," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke a certain Order in Council, dated the twenty-second day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, in so far as it relates to the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto, making delegation of certain powers in manner as therein appears; and doth hereby, with the like advice and consent, and in respect of the land hereinafter mentioned, delegate all the powers conferred by the said Act, except the powers conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, for the period of ten years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act), to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Warea Domain Board, namely,—

- Alfred Clothier, of Warea, Farmer;
- Patrick Murphy, of Warea, Farmer;
- Samuel Jones, of Warea, Farmer;
- Fred. Binnie, of Warea, Farmer;
- James Ducker, of Warea, Farmer;
- Thomas Julian, of Warea, Farmer; and
- James Jeken Elwin, of Warea, Farmer

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Monday in the months of July, October, January, and April, at the hour of seven o'clock p.m., at the office of the Warea Co-operative Dairy Factory Company, at Warea, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and one.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the first Monday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. The Board shall prepare and submit at each annual meeting a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of December, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister of Lands as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

7. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

8. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

And with the like advice and consent as aforesaid doth hereby also order that this delegation shall take effect in respect of the parcel of Crown land described in the Schedule hereto.

Trout-fishing Regulations, Stratford District.

RANFURLY, Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Auckland, this tenth day of June, 1901.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," and the amendments thereof, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations for, and to have force and effect in, the County of Stratford and in the Borough of Stratford, and for and in all the lakes, ponds, rivers, streams, creeks, and other waters situated in the whole or in part in such County and [or] Borough of Stratford respectively; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall, as from the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, supersede all regulations at variance therewith.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall fish in any river, stream, creek, or other water situated in the whole or in part in the County of Stratford or Borough of Stratford without a license; and every person fishing in any such river, stream, creek, or other water shall, on demand of any Ranger, constable, member of the Stratford Acclimatisation Society, or person producing a license of such society to fish, produce and show to such Ranger, constable, member, or person, as the case may be, his license, the contents of his creel or bag, the fish then in his possession, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing fish.

2. Licenses to fish for trout in all the waters aforesaid shall be issued by the Stratford Acclimatisation Society under the hand of its Secretary for the time being. For every such license, except as hereinafter provided, a fee of ten shillings shall be charged: Provided that such licenses may be issued to boys not over sixteen years of age and to women and girls at a reduced fee of five shillings; and provided also that it shall not be obligatory on the said society to issue a license to any person in any case.

3. Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish for trout in any of the said waters from the first day of October in any one year to the thirty-first day of March in the following year, both days inclusive, between the hours of four a.m. and ten p.m. only; but no such license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person without his consent.

4. The said Secretary may issue day licenses to fish in any of the said waters to *bonâ fide* travellers and strangers not resident in the County of Stratford and [or] Borough of Stratford on their introduction to him by any two members of the said society, and on payment of a fee of two shillings and sixpence for each week's fishing: Provided that this payment may be remitted if the traveller or stranger be a member of or hold a valid license from any other society in New Zealand which grants the like privilege.

5. No person shall fish for, take, catch, or kill, or have in his possession, or attempt to fish for, take, catch, or kill, in any manner whatsoever, trout, between the first day of April and the thirtieth day of September in any year, both days inclusive, which last said period is hereby appointed and declared to be a close season for all trout.

6. Every such license as aforesaid shall entitle the person named therein, and no other person, to fish for trout with one rod and line and hook, and no more at any one time, and with the following baits: Natural or artificial fly, natural or artificial minnow, silveries, bullies, grasshoppers, spiders, caterpillars, creepers, and worms.

7. No person shall use any other bait, or any method, device, or contrivance of any sort whatsoever, for the purpose of fishing for, taking, catching, or killing trout, except a rod, line, and hook, and a landing-net for fish taken with a rod, line, and hook.

8. No "cross-line fishing," "stroke-hauling," or other sportsmanlike device or contrivance shall be used for the purpose of fishing for, taking, catching, or killing trout, except a rod, line, and hook, and a landing-net for fish taken with rod, line, and hook; nor shall any of the above-mentioned baits be used with any medicated, poisoned, or chemical preparation whatever.

9. Every trout not exceeding eight inches in length from nose to tip of tail, taken or caught by any person, shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which such trout was taken.

10. No person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill, in any manner whatsoever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon-parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any of the salmonidæ or trout in any stage whatever; and any of the above-mentioned fish or things taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned to the water from which it was or they were taken.

11. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale, within the said County of Stratford and [or] Borough of Stratford any of the salmonidæ or trout, or take, fish for, catch, or kill any of the salmonidæ or trout in order to make sale of the same, without the permission in writing under the hand of the Secretary of the Stratford Acclimatisation Society first had and obtained for such purposes.

12. No person, persons, or corporation shall place, cast, or put in any of the rivers, streams, or waters or creeks mentioned in the Schedule hereto any sawdust or sawmill refuse, and the casting of sawdust or any sawmill refuse in any of the said rivers, streams, creeks, or waters is hereby prohibited.

13. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall be such sum of money, not exceeding fifty pounds and not being less than forty shillings, as the Justices of the Peace by whom the information charging such breach shall be heard, tried, determined, and adjudged shall appoint or fix, and such penalty is hereby imposed.

14. If any person shall be convicted of any offence against these regulations, the license (if any) held by the offender shall thereupon become void.

15. These regulations shall come into force as from the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

WHEREAS by subsection six of section eleven of "The New Zealand Institute of Surveyors and Board of Examiners Act, 1900" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that the members of the Surveyors' Board shall receive from the revenues of the said Board such fees as the Governor in Council may determine: And it is expedient to fix the fees hereinafter mentioned:

Bonus for the Encouragement of the Manufacture of Condensed Milk in New Zealand.—Notice No. 644.

A BONUS for the encouragement of the manufacture of condensed milk in New Zealand is offered under the following conditions.

The total amount offered is £1,000, and it will be paid at the rate of one-fifth of a penny per pound to the manufacturer or manufacturers of the first 1,200,000 lb. of long-keeping condensed milk manufactured in this colony between the 1st day of July, 1901, and the 30th day of June, 1902, subject to the following provisions:—

1. Part-payments of the bonus may be made with respect to each calendar month during the above-mentioned period. Applications for such payments must be made in writing and forwarded so as to reach the Secretary for Agriculture within fourteen days after the end of the month with respect to which the claim is made, and must be accompanied by a statutory declaration (for form see Schedule) to the effect that the conditions of these regulations have been duly complied with.

2. The bonus will be allotted in strict order of priority of receipt of such applications and declarations.

3. The bonus will only be granted on good sound marketable milk of the fair average quality of the condensed milk manufactured by the applicant during the period for which the bonus is available.

4. The milk must be either (a) long-keeping unsweetened condensed milk, made from normal full-cream milk, and containing at least 10 per cent. of butter-fat, with no added preservative, or (b) long-keeping sweetened condensed milk made from normal full-cream milk, and containing not less than 10 per cent. of butter-fat, with no added preservative other than pure cane-sugar.

5. No application for payment of bonus will be entertained unless the manufacturers have given the department an opportunity to take samples whenever it so desires from the milk manufactured during the period with respect to which the claim is made, nor unless satisfactory proof is given to the said Secretary as to the quantity of condensed milk manufactured in terms of these conditions, and generally in relation to all matters affecting such claim.

6. The department reserves to itself the right to refuse to grant any bonus on any condensed milk which does not appear to comply with the above regulations.
