WHEREAS by the one-hundred-and-sixty-ninth section of "The Land Act, 1892," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands in any village settlement shall be disposed of, subject as in the said section is provided: And whereas by a Proclamation made under the said Act on the fifteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and one, and published in the New Zealand Gazette on the twentieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and one, the lands

published in the New Zealand Gazette on the twentieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and one, the lands described in the First Schedule hereto have been set apart under the said Act and declared open for lease as a village settlement, and it is expedient to fix the terms and conditions upon which the said lands shall be disposed of:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby fix the terms and conditions on which the lands mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall be disposed of by way of lease in perpetuity, and which said terms and conditions are set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

These sections are situated at the junction of the Stour River and the south branch of the Ashburton River, adjacent to the Mount Somers coal-pits, and distant about eight miles in a north-westerly direction from the Mount Somers Railway-station. They comprise flat land, with light soil, but in some places rather swampy.

5. Each applicant shall state his or her residence, occupation, and condition in life (namely, whether married or single), and will be required to make the declaration prescribed in Schedule C of the said Act.

6. Each applicant shall pay the first half-year's rent, together with the lease- and registration-fee, immediately the application has been approved or declared successful at the ballot.

7. All rents must be paid half-yearly in advance, on the 1st days of January and July in each year, as provided in section 157 of the said Act; and the first half-year's rent is payable as before provided.

8. Improvements and residence on the land comprised in

8. Improvements and residence on the land comprised in each lease shall be as provided in Part III. of the said Act. The provisions of section 144, and all other provisions of the said Act with respect to substantial improvements, shall apply accordingly to lessees under these regulations. The provisions of section 141, and all other provisions of the said Act in respect of compulsory residence, shall apply accordingly to lessees under these regulations.

9. No lessees shall subdivide, sublet, or transfer the land held by him under these regulations, except under and subject to the provisions of Part I. of the said Act.

10. No lessee shall hold more than one allotment, and such allotment shall be held for his or her sole use and benefit, and not for the use or benefit of any other person whomsoever. No married woman shall be eligible as a selector; but this provision shall not apply to any married woman who may become a transferee under a will or by virtue of an intestacy. 8. Regulations under "The Government Accident Insurance Act, 1899."

RANFURLY, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this fifteenth day of July, 1901.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the fifth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and one, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand did, in exercise and pursuance of the powers vested in him by the thirty-fourth section of "The Government Accident Insurance Act, 1899" (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), make regulations for directing, among other things, the use of tables fixing the rates of premium to be charged in connection with accident insurance contracts: And whereas it is expedient to revoke such tables in so far as they relate to the rates of premium for insuring employers and other persons against their collective liability under "The Workers' Compensation for Accidents Act, 1900," "The Employers' Liability Act, 1882," and its amendments, and at common law, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in the exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in this behalf vested in him, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby revoke that portion of the Second Schedule to the said Order in Council prescribing the rates of premium for the collective class of insurance as mentioned aforesaid, and in lieu thereof doth hereby order and direct that the rates contained in the Schedule hereto shall be the rates of premium for insuring employers and other persons against their collective liability under "The Workers' Compensation for Accidents Act, 1900," "The Employers' Liability Act, 1882," and its amendments, and at common law respectively; and in further exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities aforesaid, His Excellency doth hereby order that this present Order in Council shall take effect on and after the date of the publication hereof in the New Zealand Gazette.
