A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and eight of "The Mining Act, 1898," as amended by section twenty-two of "The Mining Act Amendment Act, 1899" (hereinafter termed "the said Acts"), it is enacted that on application in that behalf the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, constitute and set apart the whole or any part of any watercourse to be a watercourse into which may be discharged any tailings, *débris*, and waste water produced by or resulting from mining operations carried on under the said Acts, and in which or on the banks of which mining operations may be lawfully carried on:

And whereas such application as aforesaid in respect of the watercourses described in the Schedule hereto was duly notified and gazetted, as provided by the said Acts, on the date set out in the description of such watercourses in the said Schedule:

And whereas His Excellency the Governor has decided to exercise the powers conferred upon him by the said Acts:

Now, therefore, His Excellency Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, doth hereby constitute and set apart the watercourses described in the Schedule hereto to be watercourses into which may be discharged any tailings, *débris*, and waste waters produced by or resulting from mining operations carried on under the said Acts, and in which or on the banks of which mining operations may be lawfully carried on; and doth hereby further prescribe that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and one.

*Apportioning the Cost of Maintenance, &c., Main Drain,
Sluggish River Drainage District, County of Manawatu.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Land
Drainage Amendment Act, 1898" (hereinafter
termed "the said Act"), a Commissioner was appointed
and an inquiry was duly held with a view to determining
what amount should be paid by the Horseshoe Drainage
Board to the Sluggish River Drainage Board for or
towards the cost of managing, maintaining, repairing,
improving, or reconstructing certain drains or watercourses
running through or situated within the Sluggish River
Drainage District, and also of all drainage-works connected
therewith or appertaining thereto: And whereas such
Commissioner did report to the Governor, after due in-
quiry, his opinion as to the matters respecting which he
was appointed to report: And whereas it is expedient to
make provision under the said Act for the purposes and in
the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly,
Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and
in exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the
said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise
enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and direct
as follows—that is to say:—

1. That the drain situated in the Sluggish River Drainage
District usually known as the "Main Drain," and hereinafter
called "the said drain," shall from and after the date of this
Proclamation be under the exclusive care, control, and management
of the Sluggish River Drainage Board.

2. I fix and determine that the future cost of maintaining
and repairing the said drain shall be provided and paid
from time to time by the under-mentioned local authori-
ties in the proportion set opposite the name of each local
authority—that is to say:—

The Sluggish River Drainage Board in the proportion of
one-half of such cost.

The Horseshoe Drainage Board in the proportion of one-
half of such cost.

3. I direct that any payment hereby required to be made
as aforesaid by the said Horseshoe Drainage Board shall be
paid from time to time in the proportions hereinbefore fixed
and determined, out of the funds under the control of the
said Horseshoe Drainage Board, in each case within a period
of thirty days after demand in writing made by or on behalf
of the Sluggish River Drainage Board; and all such pay-
ments shall be made from time to time to the Secretary
of the said Drainage Board for and on account of such
Drainage Board.

4. And I further direct that half the costs, charges, and
expenses of and incidental to the inquiry by the Commis-
sioner aforesaid touching and concerning the premises shall
be paid and borne by the said Sluggish River Drainage
Board, and half such costs, charges, and expenses by the
said Horseshoe Drainage Board.

WHEREAS it is provided by the fourth section of "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), that whenever any Harbour Board is desirous of executing or constructing any harbour-works upon lands vested in such Board or upon lands of the Crown of such a nature that the same could, under "The Harbours Act, 1878," only be carried out and executed under the authority of a special Act, the Board may apply to the Governor in Council for a special Order, and, if the Governor in Council thinks fit, such Order may be made and granted:

And whereas the Auckland Harbour Board (hereinafter called "the Board") is desirous of executing or constructing a certain timber breastwork in Auckland Harbour upon lands vested in the Board, and the said work is of such a nature as aforesaid, and the Board has applied to the Governor in Council for the issue of a special Order:

And whereas the conditions precedent to the granting of a special Order prescribed by the said Act have been duly performed and observed, and it appears expedient that such Order should be made:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation:

Now, therefore, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby authorise and empower the Board to execute or construct a timber breastwork in Auckland Harbour, as shown on plan marked M.D. 2446, such breastwork to be carried out and constructed in accordance with plan and specifications marked M.D. 2446, and subject to the provisions of the said Act. And it is hereby ordered and declared that the said work shall be completed on or before the thirty-first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and three.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Public Domains Act, 1881," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke a certain Order in Council, dated the twenty-fifth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, making delegation of certain powers in manner as therein appears; and doth hereby, with the like advice and consent, and in respect of the land hereinafter mentioned, delegate all the powers conferred by the said Act, except the powers conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, for the period of ten years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act), to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Rahotu Domain Board, namely,—

WILLIAM CHICK PHILLIPS,
HARRY LANGMAN,
WILLIAM RALSTON WRIGHT,
THOMAS ALEXANDER BRADLEY, and
WILLIAM HOWELL

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the fourth Saturday in each month, at three o'clock p.m., at the office of the Parihaka Road Board, Rahotu, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Saturday, the twenty-fourth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and one.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the fourth Saturday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. The Board shall prepare and submit at each annual meeting a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of December, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister of Lands as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

7. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

8. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

And with the like advice and consent as aforesaid doth hereby also order that this delegation shall take effect in respect of the parcel of Crown land described in the Schedule hereto.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fourteenth day of August, 1901.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twelfth section of "The Public Domains Act, 1881," it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred, save as is therein mentioned, to any person or persons, for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such Order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas, pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule hereto, situate in the Marlborough Land District, is declared to be brought under the operation of and to be subject to the provisions of the said "Public Domains Act, 1881":

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth hereby, and in respect of the land hereinafter mentioned, delegate all the powers conferred by the said Act, except the powers conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, for the period of ten years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act), to

THE KAIKOURA COUNTY COUNCIL,

which shall be known as the Takahanga Domain Board (herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the third Saturday in each month, at 10.30 o'clock a.m., at the County Council Office, Kaikoura, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Saturday, the twenty-first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and one.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The Chairman of the Council shall be the Chairman of the Board. He may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote.

5. The Board shall prepare and submit at each annual meeting a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of December, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister of Lands as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

And with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby also order that this delegation shall take effect in respect of the parcel of Crown lands described in the Schedule hereto.

WHEREAS the ownership of the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto requires to be ascertained, and it is also necessary to determine the relative shares or interests of the Native owners of the said land:

* The remaining suburbs do not lie within borough boundaries, and particulars respecting them have not been obtained for the Vital Statistics. The total population of Auckland and its suburbs was 67,226 persons, and that of Christchurch with its complete suburbs amounted to 57,041 persons.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 523, against 406 in June—an increase of 117. The deaths in July were 224—an increase of 82 on the number in June. Of the total deaths, males contributed 115, females 109. Seventy-two of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 32.14 per cent. of the whole number; 50 of these were under one year of age.

There were fifty deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Five men, 65, 67, 69, 74, 84, and five women, 65, 67, 70, 85, 86, died at Auckland; four men, 68, 70, 72, 75, and three women, 76, 84, 86, at Wellington; seven men, 67, 73, 74, 76, 80, 84, 87, and eleven women, 67, 68, 71 (two), 72, 73 (two), 74, 78, 80, 85, at Christchurch; and ten men, 65 (three), 68, 70, 71, 75, 76, 77, 78, and five women, 66, 67, 68, 83, 94, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland and Wellington, but raises it at Christchurch and Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—There were 18 deaths registered in July as occurring from this class of disease at the four chief cities and their suburbs. Of these, influenza caused 5 deaths, 1 at Wellington and 4 at Christchurch. Whooping-cough was fatal at Christchurch, where 1 death is observed, and diphtheria at Wellington (also 1 death). There was one death from typhoid fever at Auckland and another at Wellington. From diarrhoea the mortality was 3 deaths, 2 at Auckland and 1 at Christchurch. Erysipelas, consequent on vaccination, caused 1 death at Auckland.

Parasitic Diseases.—One death is found to have been attributable to hydatids at Wellington.

Constitutional Diseases.—Of 35 deaths at the four centres, 15 were from phthisis, and 10 from cancer, 6 from tubercular meningitis, 1 from general tuberculosis, and 1 from tabes mesenterica. The remaining deaths were 1 from diabetes and 1 from rheumatism.

Local Diseases.—There were 21 deaths from diseases of the nervous system, 1 from organs of special sense (exophthalmic goitre), 33 from diseases of the circulatory system, 43 of the respiratory, 19 of the digestive, 2 of the lymphatic, 6 of the urinary, and 3 of the reproductive systems.

Violent Deaths.—These numbered 8, all accidental. A boy was run over by tram; there was a case of suffocation by burning, 4 cases of drowning, 1 death from obstruction of windpipe, and 1 death from difficult birth.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
