HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by section three of "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883," that the powers conferred by the seventeenth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," may be exercised from time to time:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the third day of April, one thousand nine hundred and two, the Rangiora Timber Company (Limited) was authorised to construct a wharf at the Narrows in Hokianga Harbour, as shown on plans marked M.D. 2505:

And whereas it is desirable that dues and rates should be prescribed for the use of the said wharf:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred by "The Harbours Act, 1878," and the amendments thereof, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby prescribe that the dues and rates specified in the Schedule hereto shall be charged and taken, on and after the publication of this Order in Council in the *New Zealand Gazette*, for the use of the said wharf at the Narrows, in Hokianga Harbour, and doth further order that such dues shall be paid to the said Rangiora Timber Company (Limited).

Making Further Regulations under "The Land and Income Assessment Act, 1900."

RANFURLY, Governor.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-first day of July, 1902.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of all the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Land and Income Assessment Act, 1900" (hereinafter termed "the Act"), His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following additional regulations under and for the purposes of the said Act, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Whenever the Commissioner of Taxes has reason to believe that any taxpayer establishing or carrying on business in New Zealand intends to carry on such business for a short time only, he may at any time and from time to time require such taxpayer to give security by way of bond, in the form (No. 1) set forth in the Schedule hereto, or by way of deposit to the satisfaction of the Commissioner, for the due assessment and payment of income-tax on the profits derived from any such business.

2. The receipt for a deposit provided for by section sixty-nine of the Act shall be in the form (No. 2) set forth in the Schedule hereto.

3. If any taxpayer refuses to enter into a bond or to pay a deposit when required to do so by the Commissioner, he shall be liable to a penalty of not less than ten pounds nor more than fifty pounds.

WHEREAS by "The Land and Income Assessment Act, 1900," it is provided that if at any time the Commissioner of Taxes has reason to believe that any taxpayer establishing or carrying on business in New Zealand intends to carry on such business for a short time only, he may at any time and from time to time require such taxpayer to give security by way of bond, deposit, or otherwise to the satisfaction of the Commissioner for the due assessment and payment of income-tax on the profits derived from such business; and whereas it appears that the said so intends to establish or carry on business in New Zealand, and hath proposed to give the security of these presents for the due assessment and payment of all income-tax that may be levied upon or be payable by him in respect of such business or the profits derived therefrom, and the said Commissioner has agreed to accept such security: Now, the condition of the above-written bond or obligation is such that if the said shall, upon demand, make to the said Commissioner such returns or statements as he the said Commissioner may from time to time require, and shall also pay to the said Commissioner all income-tax which under the provisions of the said recited Act or the regulations thereunder may be lawfully assessed or levied upon or in respect of the profits arising from the said business, then the above-written bond or obligation shall be void, but otherwise shall be and remain in full force and virtue.

Warrant apportioning the Cost of maintaining a Portion of the Great South Road between the Counties of Levels and Waimate.

RANFURLY, Governor.

WHEREAS by section eight of "The Public Works Acts Amendment Act, 1900," it is enacted that in any case where a road in one district is largely used by or for the purpose of traffic to or from any other district or districts, and affords access to or from such district or districts, and the Governor is of opinion that it is equitable that the latter district should contribute towards the cost of constructing or maintaining the whole or any portion of such road in the former district, the Governor may from time to time apportion the cost of constructing or maintaining the whole or any part of such road among the local authorities of the respective districts as he thinks fit; and for that purpose, and to enable effect to be given thereto, the provisions of sections one hundred and thirteen and one hundred and fourteen of the principal Act shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply:

And whereas the Council of the County of Levels has made application to the Governor to apportion the cost of maintaining the road described in the Schedule hereto between the said Council and the Council of the County of Waimate:

And whereas by section one hundred and fourteen of "The Public Works Act, 1894," it is further provided that the Governor may, with the view of determining what proportion, if any, of the cost of maintaining the work should be borne by any local authority, direct any person to be a Commissioner to inquire and report to him upon any matter which he shall deem necessary to enable him to determine any such question as aforesaid:

And whereas a Commissioner was appointed and an inquiry duly held: And whereas such Commissioner did report to the Governor, after due inquiry, his opinion thereon:

And whereas the Governor is of opinion that the said road should be maintained:

Now, therefore, I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Acts, do hereby authorise the Council of the County of Levels to maintain the said road; and I do hereby declare that the cost of maintaining the said road shall be borne by the Council of the County of Levels and the Council of the County of Waimate in the following proportions—viz., the Council of the County of Levels shall contribute five-sixths, and the Council of the County of Waimate one-sixth, of the cost of maintaining such road.

And I do hereby direct that any contribution hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the County of Waimate shall be paid from time to time, in the proportion hereinbefore prescribed, out of the funds of the said county, within a period of thirty days after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the Council of the County of Levels, and all such payments shall be made from time to time to the Clerk of the said Council for and on account of such Council.

Warrant apportioning the Cost of maintaining a Portion of the Otupua Road between the Counties of Levels and Waimate.

RANFURLY, Governor.

WHEREAS by section eight of "The Public Works Acts Amendment Act, 1900," it is enacted that in any case where a road in one district is largely used by or for the purpose of traffic to or from any other district or districts, and affords access to or from such district or districts, and the Governor is of opinion that it is equitable that the latter district should contribute towards the cost of constructing or maintaining the whole or any portion of such road in the former district, the Governor may from time to time apportion the cost of constructing or maintaining the whole or any part of such road among the local authorities of the respective districts as he thinks fit; and for that purpose, and to enable effect to be given thereto, the provisions of sections one hundred and thirteen and one hundred and fourteen of the principal Act shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply:

These lots are situated in the Marton Blocks Nos. 1 and 2, at distances ranging from about seven miles from Rangiwahia and about ten miles from Mangaweka, by formed dray-roads and bridle-tracks. * The remaining suburbs do not lie within borough boundaries, and particulars respecting them have not been obtained for the Vital Statistics. The total population of Auckland and its suburbs was 67,226 persons, and that of Christchurch with its complete suburbs amounted to 57,041 persons, at the Census of March, 1901.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 356, against 440 in May—a decrease of 84. The deaths in June were 186, an increase of 7 on the number in May. Of the total deaths, males contributed 91, females 95. Forty-five of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 24.19 per cent. of the whole number; 36 of these were under one year of age.

There were forty-seven deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Six men, 66, 69, 70, 71, 72, 73, and four women, 66, 72, 76, 80, died at Auckland; two men, 65, 70, and seven women, 65, 68, 69, 76, 79, 80, 81, at Wellington; nine men, 68, 69, 71, 75, 78, 81, 86, 87, 88, and four women, 72, 73, 77, 78, at Christchurch; eight men, 65 (two), 70, 72, 73, 76, 79, 82, and seven women, 71, 72 (two), 73, 76 (two), 97, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland, Wellington, and Christchurch, but raises it at Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—There were 9 deaths from this class of disease at the four centres and their suburbs during the month of June. Four of these were from diphtheria—3 at Auckland and 1 at Dunedin. Two resulted from whooping-cough, both at Wellington. Influenza is observed as causing two deaths at Wellington, and enteric fever 1 death at Dunedin. In May there were 26 deaths from zymotic diseases at the four chief towns.

Constitutional Diseases.—Of 47 deaths, 16 were caused by cancer and 19 by phthisis. Other tubercular diseases contributed 5 deaths. Of the remaining deaths, 3 were from diabetes.

Local Diseases.—The deaths for June at the four boroughs numbered 101, against 70 in May. Twenty-five of those for last month were from nervous diseases—8 of them meningitis and 8 apoplexy. Twenty-three resulted from diseases of the circulatory system, heart complaints, &c. Deaths from disease of the respiratory system were 26 (against 15 in May)—24 from bronchitis, pneumonia, and congestion of lungs. The remaining deaths belonging to the class were—12 from diseases of the digestive, 1 of the lymphatic, 9 of the urinary, 4 of the reproductive system, and 1 of the organs of locomotion.

Violent Deaths.—These numbered 4: 1 from suffocation, 1 from being run over, 1 from crushing, and 1 by misadventure with chloroform. These were all accidental. There were no suicides.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
