Regulations under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1900."

RANFURLY, Governor.

In pursuance of the power and authority conferred by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1900," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand doth hereby revoke the regulations made under the said Act on the sixth day of January last respecting financial adjustments, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said Act as hereinafter set forth, namely:—

REGULATIONS.

Financial Adjustments.

1. Whenever, upon the constitution of a new borough, or 1. WHENEVER, upon the constitution of a new borough, or any alteration of the boundaries of an existing borough, agreements for financial and other adjustments are required to be made as specified in section one hundred and eighty-three of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1900," such agreements shall respectively be made and executed within three calendar months from the date of constitution of the new borough or date of alteration of boundaries respectively as the case may be respectively, as the case may be.

2. All such agreements shall provide, inter alia, for the

2. All such agreements shall property of the following matters:—

(a.) What part of the real and personal property of the local authority or local authorities directly affected by such constitution or alteration shall respectively become the property of the new borough or other authority acquiring the severed area, as the case may be.

- (b.) What part of the rates payable to the existing local authority or local authorities from which such new borough or added area has been taken shall be deemed payable to such new borough or other authority acquiring such severed area respectively.
- (c.) What part of the debts, liabilities, or engagements of such existing local authority or local authorities, whether absolute and outstanding at the date of such severance or then contingent or prospective (if the same be capable of extinction), shall be liabilities or engagements of such new borough or other local authority acquiring such severed area respectively.

severed area respectively.

(d.) What part of the interest and sinking fund of any loan raised by such existing local authority or local authorities shall be payable by the new borough or other local authority acquiring such severed area respectively.

3. If no such agreements as aforesaid be made within the said period of three calendar months from the date of such constitution or alteration of boundaries as aforesaid, then, upon the written application of either of the local authories directly affected by such constitution or alteration, the Governor may appoint one or more persons to be Commissioners to inquire and report to him upon any matters which he shall deem necessary to enable him to make an adjustment of property, liabilities, contracts, and engagements between such local authorities. The Commissioners shall report to the Governor, after such inquiry as engagements between such local authorities. The Commissioners shall report to the Governor, after such inquiry as they think necessary, their opinion as to the matters inquired into, but it shall not be obligatory on the Governor to act in accordance with any opinion or recommendation expressed or made by the Commissioners. Any such Commissioner shall have all the powers of a Board or Commission appointed by the Governor in Council under the provisions of "The Commissioners' Powers Act, 1867." After consideration of the report of the Commissioners, the Governor shall, by Warrant under his hand, make such adjustment or award as he shall deem just. Such adjustment or award shall be notified to the parties by the Colonial Secretary. All applications under this regulation shall be addressed to the Colonial Secretary.

4. Any such adjustment or award may provide for all or

the Colonial Secretary.

4. Any such adjustment or award may provide for all or any of the matters mentioned in regulation two, and may declare in whom any property shall be vested, and for what estate, and by whom any moneys shall be paid, or other acts and things done (including the payment by either party of the whole or any part of the costs and expenses of such inquiry), and generally may give such directions as may be necessary for giving full effect to these regulations.

5. Every such adjustment or award shall be final and conclusive as between the parties.

Recovery of Proportion of Cost of Bridge, &c., when more than one District benefited.

6. With respect to the demand and recovery of the proportion of the cost of any work under section 219 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1900," the following provisions

shall apply:—
(1.) Such proportion of cost may be demanded from the contributing local authority in instalments as the work progresses, at such intervals of not less than one month as the constructing local authority thinks fit. Every such demand shall be by notice in writing signed by the Clerk of the Council of the contributing local authority.

(2.) The instalments shall bear the same proportion to the value of the work executed as the proportion of cost to be paid by the contributing local authority bears to the total cost of the work.

(3.) All payments shall be made to the Clerk of the said Council.

(4.) Any instalments not paid within thirty days of the receipt of the aforesaid notice may be recovered in any Court of competent jurisdiction as a debt due to the constructing local authority.

Minister of Lands, do, in respect of the Government roads known as Tirau-Rotorua (from the Piako County boundary to its junction with Tauranga-Napier Road), Tauranga-Napier Road (from the Tauranga County boundary to Runanga, Taupo-Tokaanu Road (from its junction with the Tauranga-Napier Road at Waipahihi to Tokaanu), Lichfield-Atiamuri Road (from the Piako County boundary to its junction with the Tauranga-Napier Road near Mangaharakeke Stream), Wairakei-Puketara Road (from Wairakei to its junction with the Tauranga-Napier Road at Puketara), Rotowhero-Waikaremoana Road (from Rotowhero to Ruatahuna), Maketu-Rotorua Road (from the Tauranga County boundary at Waiwhakaretu to Rotorua), Rotorua-Te Teko Road (from its junction with the Maketu-Rotorua Road (from the Mamaku Railway-station to its junction with the Tirau-Rotorua Road), Mamaku-Arahiwi Road (from Mamaku to Arahiwi), Rotorua-Taupo Road (from its junction with the Tauranga-Napier Road at the Hemo Gorge through Waiotapu to Taupo Township); all roads in Mamaku Village; Waimangu Geyser Road (from its junction with the Rotorua -Taupo Road near 13-mile post from Rotorua (Earthquake Flat) to Waimangu Geyser), Rotorua-Wairoa Road (from its junction with the Rotorua-Ngongotaha Mount Road (where it branches off from Napier -Tauranga Road, about a mile and quarter north of Rotorua, to the summit of Ngongotaha Mountain), Maraeroa-Oturoa Road (from its junction with the Tauranga - Napier Road near the 7-mile post from Rotorua to its junction with Tirau-Rotorua Road), hereby make the following by-laws: make the following by-laws:-

1. The use of bullocks as traction animals on the said roads is prohibited for the period from 1st May to 1st November in any year.

2. The haulage or transportation on the said roads of any vehicle, engine, or machine coming under the definition of "heavy traffic" within the meaning of clause (a) of subsection (1) of section 130 of "The Public Works Act, 1894," during the months of May, June, July, August, and September in any year shall cease.

"Heavy traffic" is defined, in the section above referred to, to be "the transportation of any vehicle, engine, or machine which shall itself, or together with any thing or things being transported thereon, weigh more than one and a half tons avoirdupois to each pair of wheels."

3. The width of tires of all vehicles upon the said roads, whether plying for hire or not, shall bear the following proportion to the number of animals employed to draw the same, that is to say: The haulage or transportation on the said roads of any

I do hereby prescribe that the weight of timber carried on any vehicle subject to these by-laws shall be ascertained by measurement at the rate of 600 superficial feet of timber to the ton weight avoirdupois; and I do further prescribe that the manner of ascertaining the weight of the following articles shall be by computation according to the following scale:-

Wheat, 10 bags of 4 bushels to 1 ton weight avoirdupois. Barley, 12 Oats, 14

5. The driver of any vehicle or machine shall, at the verbal request of any person authorised by me, stop such vehicle or machine, and shall give such information as to the load thereon or contents thereof, and as to the quantity,

the load thereon or contents thereof, and as to the quantity, weight, size, or measurement of the same, as such person shall require, and the driver shall stop such vehicle or machine for such reasonable time as such person may require for the purpose of ascertaining such quantity, weight, size, or measurement.

6. If any person shall commit a breach of any of the foregoing by-laws he shall be liable, upon conviction for such breach, to a penalty of £5: Provided that the Court before which proceedings may be taken in respect of such breach may, if it thinks fit, impose such lower penalty as it may think adequate to the particular case.

SCHEDULE.

THE MAORI COUNCIL OF THE TAURANGA MAORI DISTRICT.

By-laws.

THE Maori Council of the Tauranga Maori District, constituted under "The Maori Councils Act, 1900," hereby makes the following by-laws, under and by virtue of the said Act, such by-laws to come into operation upon approval thereof by the Governor, and the publication of the same in the Gazette and Kahiti:—

Interpretation.

In these by-laws, except when inconsistent with the context, or when otherwise expressly provided, the following expressions shall have the meanings attached thereto:

"The said Act" means "The Macri Councils Act, 1900."

"The Council" means the Maori Council of the Tauranga Maori District, constituted under the said

"Committee" or "Village Committee" means the Village Committee or Komiti Marae of a Maori

Village Committee or Komiti Marae of a Maori kainga, village, or pa, appointed by the Maori Council under the provisions of the said Act.

"District" means the Tauranga Maori District, proclaimed by the Governor under the said Act by Proclamation dated the 15th day of February, 1902.

"Native township" means a township constituted under "The Native Townships Act, 1895."

"Prescribed" means prescribed by rules or regulations made under the said Act or by these by-laws.

(A.) Health and Personal Convenience.

(Section 16, Subsection 1.)

1. Human corpses shall be buried, if the death occurs between the 15th day of March and the 15th day of September (both days inclusive) in any year, within four days after death; and, if the death occurs between the 16th day of September and the 14th day of March of the following year (both days inclusive), within three days after death, unless

(both days inclusive), within three days after death, unless the Council shall otherwise direct, or unless it is otherwise provided for by any Act of the General Assembly.

2. It shall be the duty of the nearest relatives of the deceased, or, in their absence, of the owner or occupier of the house or premises wherein deceased died, to comply with the provisions of the last preceding by-law; and all or any of them shall be deemed to be guilty of a breach thereof as the Council may deem fit, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one pound.

3. No human corpse shall be buried, except with the permission of the Council, in any place other than a burial-ground recognised by the inhabitants of a Maori kainga, or reserved or set apart by them or some duly constituted authority as a burial-ground.

thority as a burial-ground.

4. No human corpse shall be permitted to lie in state in front of any meeting-house or in the courtyard (marae) thereof, but may lie in state at some other spot in the vicinity that may be indicated by the Chairman of the Village Committee or the member of Council for the riding.

5. The Council may, by notice in writing in Form A in the Schedule hereto, require the owner or occupier of any house within a kainga (other than cooking-houses, kautas, and outbuildings) which shall be erected after the coming into operation of these by-laws to construct or provide a couch or raised bedstead in such house at least 1ft. above the ground; and any person who, after service of such notice, shall refuse or neglect within the time specified in such notice to comply with the same shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one pound. not exceeding one pound.

(B.) Cleansing Houses.

(Section 16, Subsection 2.)

6. The Chairman of the Council, or any person duly authorised by the Council in that behalf, may by notice in writing direct the owner or occupier of any house or other building in a dirty and unwholesome state to clean or cause the same to be cleaned within a time to be specified in such notice, which may be in Form B in the Schedule hereto. And if

after service of such notice upon him any person shall refuse

after service of such notice upon him any person shall refuse or neglect to comply with such notice, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one pound for the first offence and not exceeding two pounds for every subsequent offence.

7. The Council may order the removal, renovation, or destruction of any building in a dirty and unwholesome state, if in its opinion it is unsuitable for human accommodation, or if the owner or occupier thereof fails after due notice to clean, renovate, or himself remove or destroy the same. Any costs incurred by the Council in and about such cleaning, renovation, removal or destruction shall be a debt due to the Council, recoverable as liquidated damages

such cleaning, renovation, removal or destruction shall be a debt due to the Council, recoverable as liquidated damages by process in the Magistrate's Court.

8. The Village Committee may in its discretion ease or modify the application of the foregoing By-laws Nos. 5, 6, and 7, in the case of any old, ill, or feeble person occupying any such buildings as aforesaid, so that such by-law may not press heavily on such person. The Chairman of the Village Committee shall report the case and all the circumstances to the Chairman of the Council, whereupon the Council shall consider such case and decide whether is sha'l devote part of its funds towards cleansing and otherwise improving the dwellings of such sick, old, or feeble persons. persons.

(C.) Nuisances.

(Section 16, Subsection 3.)

9. No nightsoil, refuse, or offensive rubbish shall be cast

9. No nightsoil, refuse, or offensive rubbish shall be cast or deposited or allowed to flow into any spring, stream, or watercourse that flows through or past a Maori kainga, and which is used as a water-supply by the inhabitants of such kainga, or any other kainga on the banks of such stream or near such spring.

10. No person who is the owner or occupier of any premises within a Maori kainga shall permit or suffer any nightsoil or refuse or any offensive rubbish or matter of any kind whatever to accumulate or remain or be in or upon such premises, or upon any foretpath, street, drain, or any public thoroughfare, so as to be injurious or dangerous to health or so as to cause an offensive smell.

11. No horses, cattle, sheep, dogs, or other animals shall

11. No horses, cattle, sheep, dogs, or other animals shall be buried within a Maori kainga.

12. No person shall permit or suffer any dead animal or any portion of any dead animal to be upon or to lie upon his land or any portion thereof occupied by him in close proximity to the public road or any public place so as to cause an offensive smell.

13. No person shall throw or leave any dead animal on any property within a Maori kainga or upon a public road

whereby any offensive smell is or is likely to be created.

14. Every person who commits a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws Nos. 9, 10, 11, 12, and 13 shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one pound.

(D.) Drunkenness.

(Section 16, Subsection 4.)

15. No alcoholic liquor shall be supplied, drunk, or brought

15. No alcoholic liquor shall be supplied, drunk, or brought to any Maori hui, gathering, or meeting of any kind, or for any purpose whatsoever, whether held in a Maori kainga or at any other place within the district, except townships and European lots in a Native township.

16. Where a public meeting is held by invitation, the person or persons issuing such invitation shall be jointly and severally liable, if he or they supply or cause to be supplied any alcoholic liquor to the visitors, or any of them, or to any person whatso-ver attending such meeting, to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

17. Any person found drunk at any Maori meeting shall be liable to a fine of not less than ten shillings and not exceed-

ing two pounds.

18. Any person found drunk in any Maori kainga shall be Any person found drunk in any Maori kainga shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five shillings for the first off-nee, not exceeding ten shillings for the second offence, and not exceeding one pound for every subsequent offence.
 Anv person shall be guilty of an offence who—

 Being drunk, or under the influence of liquor, enters a meeting-house, or achurch, or some other public building within a Maori pa.
 Takes any alcoholic liquor into such meeting-house church, or public building.

church, or public building.
(3.) Drinks or causes any one else to drink any alcoholic liquor in any such meeting-house, church, or publie buildir g.

And such person shall be liable to a penalty of not less than five shillings and not exceeding one pound for a first offence, and not exceeding two pounds for every subsequent offence.

(E.) Tohungas.

(Section 16, Subsection 5.)

20. It shall not be lawful for any tohunga or alleged tohunga to cause any patient under his treatment to bathe in cold water.

21. It shall not be lawful for any such tohunga to hinder or prevent the attendance of a duly qualified medical practitioner on such patient, or the treatment of such patient with European medicines suitable to the complaint or pre-

scribed by a duly qualified medical practitioner.

22. It shall not be lawful for any person alleged to be a tohunga to charge or receive any fee or reward for his

services.

services.

23. Any person committing a breach of the above By-laws Nos. 20, 21, and 22 shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

24. Wherever, on account of the practices of any person alleged to be a tohunga, he gathers a following and establishes himself in any kainga, or travels from one kainga to another with such following, so as, in the opinion of the Council or of any Village Committee, to cause serious inconvenience to the inhabitants of any kainga or to any of them by councils. any Village Committee, to cause serious inconvenience to the inhabitants of any kainga, or to any of them, by causing waste of food or substance, or in any other way, the Council may, by notice in writing, direct such tohunga to desist from such practices, and if he persist the Council may impose a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

25 The Council may grant a license, after full inquiry, to persons skilled in the use of Maori herbs or wairakau for medicinal purposes, for such term and subject to such conditions as the Council may deem fit. Such license shall have force only within the district.

(F.) Stray Cattle.

(Section 16, Subsection 8.)

26. Any person allowing cattle, horses, or other cattle to roam at large in a Maori kainga or through the streets of any kainga occupied as a township may be fined the sum of not more than two shillings and sixpence for each animal (cattle or horses), and one shilling for each sheep, pig, or

27. Any person furiously riding a horse in any kainga or through any streets of any Maori kainga occupied as a township, or furiously driving any sledge, wagon, carriage, or other vehicle through the same, may be fined a sum not

exceeding one pound.

(G.) Hawkers.

(Section 16, Subsection 13.)

28. The following by-laws shall apply to Indian, Assyrlan, and other hawkers selling their wares in the Maori kaingas within the district—that is to say:

(1.) Such person shall have a license from the Council before he may vend his wares within the kaingas

of the district.

(2.) The license in the Form C in the Schedule hereto shall have force throughout the whole of the district, and the fee therefor shall be two pounds.
(3.) The Chairman or the Clerk of the Council, or a member of the Council duly authorised by the Council that backlet is expressed to issue one. Council in that behalf, is empowered to issue such

licenses.

(4.) All fees paid for licenses shall be forwarded to the office of the Council.

office of the Council.

(5.) The Secretary shall register the name and residence of all persons to whom licenses are issued. The said register shall be open to all persons who may wish to inspect the same. The fee for each search shall be one shilling.

(6.) Any person hawking goods without license within Maori kaingas in the district shall be liable to a negalty not exceeding five pounds.

penalty not exceeding five pounds.

(7.) The Council may cancel the license of any hawker if it is proved that such hawker is a confirmed drunkard or has been convicted by the law of

aronkard or has been convicted by the law of larceny or any other criminal offence.

29. A special license may be issued by the Chairman or Clerk or any member of the Council, or by the Chairman of the Village Committee of a kainga where any hui or gathering is held, to any person desirous of hawking and selling goods at such hui or gathering, on payment of a fee of ten shillings. Such license shall be in force only while such hui or gathering late and he larger. or gathering lasts, and no longer. Any person hawking and selling goods at such hut or gathering without special license, or a license as provided in the foregoing by-laws, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

(H.) Smoking.

(Section 16, Subsection 14.

30. Every person, whether European or Maori, who sells, gives, or supplies any cigarette, tobacco, or torori to any Maori under the age of fifteen years shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds,

31. Every Maori under the age of fifteen years who smokes tobacco, torori, or a cigarette, or any part of a cigarette, shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable for the first offence to a penalty not exceeding five shillings, for the second offence to a penalty not exceeding ten shillings, and for a third or subsequent offence to a repealty of one round. penalty of one pound.

(J.) Gambling.

(Section 16, Subsection 15.)

32. Any person, whether Maori or otherwise, desirous of establishing a billiard-room in any kainga, village, or pa, and any Maori desirous of establishing a billiard-room at any other place within the district, except townships (but not Maori lots within a Native township) and European settlements, shall first obtain a license from the Council, which may be granted subject to the following terms and conditions:

(a.) Such license shall be in Form D in the Schedule hereto.

The fee for such license shall be five pounds.

(b.) The fee for such license shall be five pounds.(c.) Such license shall remain in force for twelve months (c.) Such license shall remain in force for twelve months from the date thereof (unless sooner revoked by the Council as hereinafter provided).
(d.) All billiard-rooms shall be properly ventilated, and shall at all times be kept clean and in good order.
(e.) All billiard-rooms shall remain open on week-days, and culy between the hours of 8 a.m. and 11 p.m.

- Any person committing a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one pound for the first offence, not exceeding two pounds for the second offence, and for a sub-sequent offence shall be liable to have his license revoked.
- revoked.

 (f.) No Maori under the age of fifteen years shall be permitted to play billiards on such licensed premises, and, if discovered playing therein, the licensee or the person for the time being in charge of the premises shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for the first offence, and for a second offence the Council may revoke the license.

(g.) Renewal of license must be applied for before the expiry of the term for which a license has been granted.

Any Maori under the age of fifteen years found playing billiards in any place whatsoever shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five shillings for the first offence, not exceeding ten shillings for the second offence, and for a third

or subsequent offence to a penalty not exceeding one pound.

34. Any person keeping a billiard-room or a billiard-table in any Maori kainga, and any Maori keeping such a room or table at any other place within the district except townships (but not Maori lots within a Native township) and European settlements, without license from the Council, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty-five pounds.

35. Any person found playing for money, whether by cards or any other game, within the precincts of any kainga, shall

or any other game, within the precincts of any kainga, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten shillings for the first offence, not exceeding one pound for the second offence, and not exceeding two pounds for every subsequent offence.

36. Any person, Maori or otherwise, the owner or occupier of any house or premises situate in any Maori kainga who shall permit or allow gambling or playing for money in such house or upon such premises shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one pound for the first offence, not exceeding two pounds for the second offence, and not exceeding five pounds for every subsequent offence. for every subsequent offence.

Village Committees.

87. The Council may delegate all or any of its powers under the foregoing by-laws to the Village Committee, and such Committee shall thereupon have full authority to exercise such powers within its kainga.

38. The Village Committee may impose a fine or a penalty for the breach of a by-law, but if the same is not paid within a specified time the Chairman of the Committee shall thereupon report such breach and all the circumstances of the case, and the failure to pay the fine or penalty imposed, to the Chairman of the Council.

^{*}The remaining suburbs do not lie within borough boundaries, and particulars respecting them have not been obtained for the Vital Statistics. The total population of Auckland and its suburbs was 67,226 persons, and that of Christchurch with its complete suburbs amounted to 57,041 persons, at the Census of March, 1901.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 441, against 467 in July—a decrease of 26. The deaths in August were 259, an increase of 28 on the number in July. Of the total deaths, males contributed 139, females 120. Sixty-six of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 25.48 per cent. of the whole number; 54 of these were under one year of age.

There were sixty-nine deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Twelve men, 65, 66, 68, 69, 71, 72 (two), 73, 75, 80 (two), 93, and eleven women, 66 (three), 71, 74, 75 (three), 82 (two), 96, died at Auckland; ten men, 66, 68, 70, 72 (two), 74, 76, 77, 80 (two), and two women, 69, 84, at Wellington; four men, 75 (two), 76, 77, and eleven women, 70 (two), 72 (two), 74, 75 (two), 78, 80, 83, 89, at Christchurch; twelve men, 65 (two), 67 (two), 69 (three), 70, 71, 73, 74, 85, and seven women, 65 (two), 67, 71, 74, 77, 84, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland, Christchurch, and Dunedin, but raises it at Wellington.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—Twenty-five deaths from diseases belonging to this class were registered during August as occurring at the four chief cities and suburban boroughs—viz., 4 at Auckland, 17 at Wellington, 2 at Christchurch, and 2 at Dunedin—against 15 in July. Of the deaths in August, 11 were from measles complicated with pneumonia, all at Wellington, the victims being returned troopers from South Africa. Scarlet fever caused 1 death at Christchurch, influenza 1 at Auckland, and whooping-cough 1 at Wellington. From enteric fever there were 4 deaths—2 at Auckland, 1 at Wellington, and 1 at Christchurch; and from diarrhosa 2 children and 1 woman of thirty-two years died at Wellington. To syphilis 2 deaths were attributed (1 at Wellington and 1 at Dunedin).

Dietetic Diseases.—There was only 1 death in this class—a gardener, sixty-two years of age, dying from alcoholism, at Auckland.

Constitutional Diseases.—Deaths from these numbered 38 in August: 19 of them were due to phthisis and tuberculosis, and 10 to cancer; and it is perhaps worthy of note that 1 death, that of a labourer aged seventeen years, was caused by that somewhat rare disease homophilia. Of the 8 remaining deaths in this class, 2 were due to diabetes, and 1 each to rheumatic arthritis, leuchemia, tubercular meningitis, pyonephrosis, and peritonitis, and 1 to tabes mesenterica.

Developmental Diseases.—Of the 29 deaths in this class, 12 were due to premature birth or malformation, and 17 to old age.

Local Diseases.—In August these totalled 141, against 126 in July—26 being from diseases of the nervous system, 31 from heart-disease and other diseases of the circulatory system, 52 from bronchitis, pneumonia, and other diseases of the respiratory organs, 18 from diseases of the digestive system, 7 from diseases of the urinary system, 5 from diseases of the reproductive system, and 1 each from caries of shoulder and ecthyma.

Violence.—Of the 14 deaths registered, 11 were returned as accidental and 3 suicidal. The accidental deaths were—2 fall or kick from a horse, 2 burns, 2 birth accidents, and 1 each from fall of earth, crushed skull, tetanus, suffocation (overlain), and intestinal obstruction. One of the suicides was by shooting, 1 by cutting of throat, and 1 by drowning.

Ill-defined and not-specified Causes.—Ten of the 11 deaths in this group were attributed to marasmus, and in 1 case, that of a child two days old, the Coroner's jury returned an open verdict of "Found dead."

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
