ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fifteenth day of December, 1902.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Public Domains Act, 1881," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke a certain Order in Council, dated the eighteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, making delegation of certain powers in manner as therein appears; and doth hereby, with the like advice and consent, and in respect of the land hereinafter mentioned, delegate all the powers conferred by the said Act, except the powers conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, for the period of ten years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act), to the undermentioned persons, who shall be known as the Kimberley Domain Board, namely,—

CHARLES McCAUSLAND, ALEXANDER HAY, John Brown, WILLIAM STOTT, and DUNCAN McBEATH

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipula-

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the second Monday in each month, at eight o'clock p.m., at the schoolroom, Kimberley, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the twelfth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and three.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting. at such meeting.

3. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum.

Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the second Monday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. The Board shall prepare and submit at each annual of the proceedings of the Board for the

5. The Board shall prepare and submit at each annual meeting a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of December, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister of Lands as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman of

such meeting.

7. If, by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

8. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

And with the like advice and consent as aforesaid doth hereby also order that this delegation shall take effect in respect of the parcel of Crown land described in the Schedule hereto.

Any person who after the coming into operation of this by-law shall use any vehicle for heavy traffic within the boundaries of the Eden Terrace Road District without having boundaries of the Eden Terrace Road District without having first paid the said license fee for such vehicle, or obtained the permission of the said Board under clause 2 of these by-laws, and paid the charges prescribed thereunder, or who shall do or cause to be done or be concerned in doing anything contrary to any provision of these by-laws, or shall omit to do anything required to be done by him by any such provision, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these bylaws, and on conviction thereof shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding £5.
4. "Heavy traffic" shall mean the transportation of any

Any constable or any officer of the Board may stop and detain any vehicle which in his opinion infringes any of these by-laws, and inspect, examine, and measure the tires thereof, and the weight of such vehicle and the contents thereof; and the driver or person for the time being in charge of such vehicle shall permit such inspection, examination, measurement, and weighing to be made accordingly, and shall, if so requested by any such constable or officer of the Board, take such vehicle, together with the contents thereof, to the nearest public weighbridge, and then and there weigh to the nearest public weighbridge, and then and there weigh the same, and no person shall obstruct any such constable or officer in or about the making of such inspection, examina-

By-laws for the Management of the Picton Railway Wharf.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by "The Government Railways Act, 1900," I, Joseph George Ward, the Minister for Railways, do hereby make the following by laws for the management of that portion of the Picton section of railways (being one of the railways open for traffic in the Colony of New Zealand) known as the Picton Railway Wharf, that is to say:—

BY-LAWS.

1. The Harbourmaster shall have power to close the Picton Railway Wharf, or any portion thereof, whenever he considers it advisable to do so, and no person shall enter upon the wharf or portion thereof so closed without the consent of the Harbourmaster.

2. No person shall be allowed on the said wharf unless he has, in the opinion of the Harbourmaster, legitimate business to warrant his presence thereon.

3. No person shall disobey the orders of the Harbourmaster, or in any way obstruct the traffic on the said wharf, or make use of abusive or improper language thereon, or refuse or fail to truly state the nature of his business warranting his presence on the said wharf when asked by the Harbourmaster so to do.

4. Every person when on the said wharf, whether employed on the wharf or not, shall be under the control of the Harbourmaster, and shall immediately leave the wharf if ordered to do so by him.

5. Every person who commits a breach of any of the foregoing by-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £1 if he is employed in or about the railway and the by-law relates to his conduct, and to a penalty not exceeding £10 in any other case.

By-laws of the New Zealand Institute of Surveyors (made under the Provisions of "The New Zealand Institute of Surveyors and Board of Examiners Act, 1900").

BY-LAWS.

Designation.

1. THE association shall be called "The New Zealand Institute of Surveyors," hereinafter styled "the Institute."

Objects.

Objects.

2. The objects of the Institute shall be to secure uniformity of professional practice; to originate and to promote reform and improvement in surveys; to regulate the remuneration for surveyors' services; to provide a competent authority to express the opinions of the profession as a whole upon the conduct of any of its members, and upon any matters touching their general interests or well-being; to afford the public requiring the assistance of surveyors guarantee of their competency; to provide opportunities for the discussion of professional questions; and to promote friendly relations amongst surveyors, both within and beyond the colony.

Constitution.

Constitution.

3. Members.—The Institute shall consist of persons who possess the qualifications required by section 9 of "The New Zealand Institute of Surveyors and Board of Examiners Act, 1900," and are members of the Institute.

4. Management.—The affairs of the Institute shall be managed by a Council, consisting of President, two Vice-Presidents, Honorary Treasurer, and six members.

5. The seal of the Institute shall be kept in the charge of the Honorary Treasurer.

The Council may, in the name and on behalf of the Institute shall.

The Council may, in the name and on behalf of the Institute, enter into any contract and do or omit any act or thing which the Institute could do or omit, and not required thing which the institute could do of only, and not required to be actually done at a meeting of the Institute.

Any contract which, if made by private persons—
Firstly, must be by deed;
Secondly, must be in writing, signed by the parties

thereto:

Thirdly, may be made verbally without writing.

Thirdly, may be made verbally without writing.

When made by the Council—

In the first case, shall be in writing under the seal of the Institute, and signed by two members of the Council (of whom one shall be the President);

In the second case, shall be signed by two members of the Council (of whom the President shall be one), on behalf of and by direction of the Council;

In the third case, may be made verbally without writing by the Council, or by any two members thereof, on behalf of and by direction of the Council, but no verbal contract shall be made for any sum exceeding verbal contract shall be made for any sum exceeding twenty pounds;

and all such contracts may, in like manner, be varied or dis-

charged respectively.

Qualification and Privileges.

6. Members shall be persons possessing the qualifications prescribed by section 9 of "The New Zealand Institute of Surveyors and Board of Examiners Act, 1900," and hereinafter referred to as "the said Act," who have been engaged for not less than three years in conducting surveys in the field after obtaining their license.

7. Persons shall be eligible as associates should they hold a license to practice under "The New Zealand Institute of Surveyors and Board of Examiners Act, 1900," or if they are graduates in engineering and surveying of any recognised

graduates in engineering and surveying of any recognised university, and shall be styled associates of the Institute.

8. The following shall be eligible as honorary members: Gentlemen who, from their position, are able to be of assistance to the Institute in furthering its aims, or those who are eminent for science and experience in pursuits kindred to those of its members, but who are not engaged in regular practice as surveyors or civil engineers.

9. The following shall be eligible as fellows: Members who shall have been in practice as surveyors for not less than ten years.

than ten years.

10. The following shall be eligible as students: Cadets in General Government Survey or Public Works Department, or persons serving articles with surveyors.

11. Privileges.—Subject in all cases to compliance with these by-laws, members and fellows shall be entitled to all the privileges of the Institute. Associates shall have the same privileges as members, but shall not be entitled to become members of the Council or to nominate officers of the Institute, or to vote at any meeting of the Institute, or propose or second any resolution at any meeting. Honorary members shall not be entitled to take part in the management of the Institute, but shall in other respects be entitled to the privileges of members, and may be present at any meeting of privileges of members, and may be present at any meeting of the Institute.

Students may attend all meetings of the Institute, but may not take any part in the management of the Institute.

Admission to the Institute.

12. Persons seeking election as members or associates of 12. Persons seeking election as members or associates of the Institute shall first obtain the approval of the Local Committee in their respective districts, and shall have their names submitted to the Council in writing in Form A, signed by two members of the Institute, and shall submit to the Council such documentary evidence or proofs as may be required as to the nature of their qualifications; and the Council shall, at the next ordinary meeting ensuing after such application, proceed to consider the same; and, in the event of the Council deciding by a majority present to favourably entertain such application, it shall cause it to be submitted to the Institute at its first annual or ordinary meeting which shall take place after such application shall have been considered by the Council, and if such meeting shall not signify its disapproval of such person he shall be deemed elected.

13. Persons qualified for admission as honorary members may be proposed by not fewer than six fellows or members. The nomination paper shall state the reason for proposing to confer the honour, and shall be sent to the Council not less than twenty-eight days before the annual meeting, to allow of the case being dealt with in a manner approved of by

the Council.

14. Students may be admitted by the Council on being proposed by a member.

15. All applications submitted to the Institute at any of its ordinary meetings or its annual meeting to admit persons as members, associates, or honorary members shall be decided by ballot, and by a majority of votes.

Local Committees.

16. The Council may from time to time appoint members of the Institute to be a Local Committee in any of the following "Post and Telegraph Districts" of the colony, viz.: Auckland, Blenheim, Christchurch, Dunedin, Gisborne, Greymouth, Hokitika, Invercargill, Napier, Nelson, New Plymouth, Oamaru, Timaru, Wanganui, Wellington, and Westport.

The committee shall consist of not more than ten or less

than four persons.

There shall be a chairman appointed by the committee, who shall have a casting vote as well as a deliberative one. The members of the committee shall hold office for three years from the date of their appointment, but may be removed by the Council.

The Council may on the death, resignation, or removal of any member of a Local Committee appoint some other member or associate of the Institute residing and practising in the district to be a member in his place, but the person so appointed shall hold office so long only as the person whom he succeeds would have held office.

The functions of Local Committees shall be-

(1.) To inquire into and report to the Council any facts or circumstances showing or tending to show a breach has been committed of the provisions of sections 16 and 20 of "The New Zealand Insti-tute of Surveyors and Board of Examiners Act, 1900."

(2.) To inquire into and report to the Council any facts

(2.) To inquire into and report to the Council any facts or circumstances which, in the opinion of the committee, would render it advisable that any member, associate, fellow, or student should be suspended or cease to be such.
(3.) To inquire into and report to the Council any facts or circumstances which, in the opinion of the committee, would make it improper to admit any person to become a member, associate, fellow, or student of the Institute. student of the Institute.

(4.) To report to the Council any facts or circumstances affecting the interests of the Institute or the members thereof, or in which the Institute may be concerned or interested.

Local Committees may make regulations for their good government, but such regulations shall require the consent of the Council to their validity.

Contribution to the Funds

17. The subscription for members shall be £1 1s. per annum, due and payable in advance on the 1st day of December in each year; and any member while his subscription shall be six months in arrear shall not be entitled to be elected a member of the Council or to any office of the Institute, or to nominate any person to be a member, associate, honorary member, or fellow, or to vote at any meeting, or take any part in the management of the Institute; and any member whose subscription shall be two years in arrear shall be deemed to have severed his connection with the Institute, and his name shall be erased from tion with the Institute, and his name shall be erased from the roll.

18. The subscription for associates shall be half a guinea per annum, and for students 5s. per annum, payable in advance on the 1st day of December in each year. Any associate or student whose subscription shall be two years in arrear shall be deemed to have severed his connection with arrear shall be deemed to have severed his connection with the Institute, and his name shall be erased from the roll. New members or associates on admission shall pay an entrance fee of £1 ls. An associate, at the expiration of three years from the time of becoming an associate, shall (if not previously elected a member) become such without payment of any further entrance fee, but this proviso shall only apply to associates who hold the qualification required by section 9 of the said Act.

19. Any member not in arrears for subscription may compound for the payments of all future annual fees by the payment in advance of £10 10s.

22. In the event of an extraordinary vacancy occurring in the Council, by death, absence from the colony for six months (except by leave of the Council), incapacity from mental or bodily disease (of which fact the Council shall be

The Honorary Treasurer shall, subject to the direction of the Council, have the supervision of the monetary affairs of the Institute; shall order the collection of all moneys on account of the Institute; shall keep a current account at such bank as the Council may direct; and shall furnish a properly audited account and balance-sheet to accompany each annual report.

each annual report.

26. The ordinary meetings of the Council shall be held at such time and place as it may from time to time determine; and, in the event of there not being a quorum present within a quarter of an hour of the time appointed for any meeting, the President, or in his absence the Secretary, may adjourn such meeting to such other time, distant not more than seven days, as he may see fit, or may declare such meeting to have lapsed.

27. The President of his own motion may, and upon a

requisition signed by three members of the Council or ten members of the Institute shall, convene a special meeting thereof; and at any such special meeting no business shall be entertained other than that specified in the requisition.

28. At all meetings of the Council every question shall be

decided by a majority of the members present, and by show of hands.

29. Payments from the funds of the Institute shall be made only upon the order of the Council, and by cheque drawn by the Secretary, signed by the President or Vice-President, and countersigned by the Honorary Treasurer.

30. The Council shall prepare, and shall cause to be submitted to the Institute at each annual meeting, a report of the transactions and proceedings for the past year, together with a balance-sheet, as provided in By-law No. 31, duly audited by the Auditors to be appointed as hereinafter directed.

Meetings of the Institute.

31. The annual meetings of the Institute shall be held during the months of December or January in each year, on such a date and at such hour and place as the Council shall determine, to receive the report and balance-sheet for the past year, to appoint office-bearers for the year ensuing, to elect fellows, and to transact such other business as may properly arise out of these matters. All candidates for the office of President, of Vice-President, of Honorary Treasurer, or of member of Council shall be nominated by not less than two members of council shall be nominated by hot less than two members of the Institute, after obtaining their consent, by notice in writing delivered or sent to the Secretary so as to reach him not less than twenty-eight days prior to the date of the annual meeting at which the election is to take place. The Secretary shall insert notice of all such nominations in

the circulars convening the annual meeting.

32. An ordinary meeting of the Institute may be convened at such hour and place as the Council shall determine.

33. The annual and ordinary meetings shall receive and deal with the reports and recommendations of the Council; decide upon admission of new members, associates, and honorary members; deal with any business of which any member shall have given notice to the Council not less than twenty-eight days previous to such meeting; hear and discuss any paper; and discuss and decide upon any matter arising out of any such business.

34. The President of his own motion or the Council may, and upon receipt of a requisition signed by not less than truck members of the Institute shall convene a special

twelve members of the Institute shall, convene a special meeting thereof to receive and deal with the reports and remeeting thereof to receive and deal with the reports and recommendations of the Council; to decide upon the admission
of new members, associates, or honorary members; to deal

35. At each annual meeting the Institute shall elect two auditors to examine and certify to the condition of the auditors to examine and certify to the condition of the accounts of the Honorary Treasurer; and, in the event of its failing to elect such auditors, or in the event of the death or absence from the City of Wellington of an Auditor, or his incapacity from mental or bodily disease (of which the Council shall be sole judge), or his refusal to act, the Council may elect an Auditor or Auditors.

may elect an Auditor or Auditors.

36. Every annual or other meeting of the Institute shall be convened by circular, a copy of which shall be sent to each member, associate, honorary member, and student by the Secretary or other proper officer, not less than twenty-one days prior to the date of such intended meeting; and every such circular shall state the time and place of meeting, and the nature of the business to be entertained thereat

37. At all meetings of the Institute the President, there be no President, or if he be not present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for holding the meeting, one of the Vice-Presidents, or a member as determined by the meeting by a show of hands, shall preside, and shall, in the event of the voting being equal, give a casting vote. In the absence of both President and Vice-Presidents the the absence of both President and Vice-Presidents the meeting shall elect a chairman from among themselves, who shall for the time being exercise the functions of the Presi-

38. At all meetings of the Institute every question shall in the first instance be decided by a show of hands (except in the case of the election of office-bearers, members, associates, honorary members, and fellows). No question can ciates, honorary members, and fellows). No question can be decided upon except due notice has been given of same to Secretary not less than twenty-eight days before date of questions which, in the opinion of the Council, are important enough to be submitted to them by filling up voting-papers sent by the Secretary, who will be expected to fill them up in such a form that the words "Yes" or "No" can be written against each question, so that the direct vote of all absent members can be obtained upon every matter brought before the Institute. Ten members present at a meeting may, in writing, require a ballot to be taken upon any proposition before the meeting, except that of adjourn-

ment, and such ballot shall be taken in such manner at such time and place as the chairman directs, and he may adjourn the meeting for the purpose of taking such ballot. Unless such ballot is demanded a statement by the chairman that a resolution has been carried, and an entry to that effect in the book of proceedings of the Institute, shall be conclusive evidence that such resolution has been carried.

39. At every meeting of the Institute ten members shall form a quorum. In the event of there not being a quorum present within fifteen minutes of the time appointed for any meeting, the President, or, in his absence, a majority of the members present by a show of hands, may adjourn such meeting to such other time, distant not more than seven days, as he or they may see fit, or declare such meeting to have lapsed.

40. In the event of any meeting lapsing for want of a quorum, the business which could have been transacted at such meeting may be transacted at the next ordinary meet-

ing, if such meeting consents, and in such case shall take precedence at such ordinary meeting.

41. The Institute at any annual meeting may elect not more than two fellows. The voting to be by ballot in the manner hereinafter prescribed for the election of office-bearers, members, associates, and honorary members. All candidates for fellowship shall be nominated in writing by at least six members, and such nominations shall be sent by post or delivered to the Secretary so as to reach him not less

post or delivered to the Secretary so as to reach him not less than twenty-eight days before the annual meeting.

42. Any resolution of the Institute at an ordinary or special meeting to rescind, alter, add to, or amend any of its by-laws, or any resolution the effect of which would be to annul a previous resolution, shall have no force until confirmed at a subsequent special or ordinary meeting of the Institute held not less than two months after the meeting at which such resolution shall have been adopted, and such at which such resolution shall have been adopted, and such resolution shall be reported to the Institute at such last-named meeting, and shall then be finally confirmed or disallowed.

43. No alteration of the by-laws of the Institute shall be made, except at a special meeting of the Institute convened No. 36, and confirmed at a subsequent meeting as provided by By-law No. 42; and any alterations or additions approved and adopted at such meeting shall have immediate

44. No meeting of the Institute, or the proceedings thereat, or anything done at such meeting shall be rendered invalid by reason that such meeting was not duly convened, or that anything required to be done or performed under any by-law preliminary or requisite to the holding of such meeting was

not done and performed.

45. If the whole of the members at a meeting of the Institute (not less than twenty) consider that it would be expedient in the interests of the Institute, in order to enable any business to be transacted thereat, to suspend any by-law, except By-laws Nos. 57 and 58, they may by resolution suspend such by-law, and thereupon, for the purposes of rendering valid such meeting and the proceedings thereat, but for no other purposes, the by-law suspended shall not be deemed to be in force. An entry in the book of proceedings of the Institute that such resolution was passed shall be conclusive evidence of that fact, and that it was assented to by all the members present (not less than twenty). 45. If the whole of the members at a meeting of the Insti-

twenty).

46. The chairman may, with the consent of any meeting, adjourn the meeting from time to time and hour and place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place.

Ballot-papers.

47. Before any meeting of the Institute, ballot-papers containing all the business to be brought before the meeting shall be sent to all members who may be entitled to vote. When an election of office-bearers or members is to take place, ballot-papers (Form B) shall be sent; every paper before being sent out to be numbered by the Secretary.

before being sent out to be numbered by the Secretary.

48. A member wishing to veto the name of any candidate or question shall cross out the name of such candidate or question. He may then send his paper to the Secretary sealed, and must put the number on the outside of the envelope, which must be marked boldly "Ballot-paper" only, or may cause it to be given in otherwise at the meeting. No absent member shall be entitled to vote on any question or at any election otherwise than by means of the ballot-paper marked and sent to him as aforesaid.

49. The ballot papers, after being arranged by the Secretary in the order of the numbers on the outside, shall be handed unopened to scrutineers appointed by the meeting, who shall open the covers and note the votes of those and

who shall open the covers and note the votes of those and any other ballot-papers that may be given in before the ballot is closed, provided that such papers have been duly marked as aforesaid. If in any ballot-paper more votes be

given in favour of the candidates for any class than are to be elected, the paper shall be treated as informal so far as the said class is concerned, or if a ballot-paper does not show clearly how a vote is to be recorded in regard to any candi-date, or in regard to any question, it shall be considered informal so far as the member's intention is doubtful, and no vote either way shall be recorded, but so much of the paper as shows clearly the intention of the member shall be accepted.

50. A statement shall be prepared by the scrutineers, showing in the case of each candidate, or in the case of each question—firstly, the number of votes recorded against and for the candidate or question, with the total number so recorded; secondly, the numbers of informal or doubtful votes of members who have sent in ballot-papers but have abstained from voting. If there be an equality of votes against or for a candidate, or against or for a proposition, the candidate shall be deemed not elected, or the proposition not carried, as the case may be.

Miscellaneous.

Miscellaneous.

51. As soon as practicable after each annual meeting a complete list shall be printed in the Journal next ensuing of the office-bearers for the year, and of the members, fellows, associates, honorary members, and students on the roll of the Institute at the time of the annual meeting. The report of the Council for the year and balance-sheet shall likewise be printed in the same Journal.

52. The name of any student who shall not before the annual meeting have paid his subscription for the year then current with arrears (if any), shall, if the Council so thinks fit, be omitted from the roll of the Institute, and he shall not be entitled to any of the privileges of the Institute; but the Council may restore the name of such student to the roll if all arrears are paid up to a later period.

if all arrears are paid up to a later period.

53. Any member whose subscription is six months in arrear shall not be entitled to receive a ballot-paper for any meeting; but, providing his subscription be not more than twelve months in arrear, a letter (Form C) shall be sent to him instead, and his ballot-paper shall be retained by the Secretary, but may be given to the member after payment of his subscription.

54. When the subscriptions of any member are in arrear for two years the Council shall send to such member, by post, a notice in the Form D in the Schedule hereto.

55. The Institute shall from time to time determine on minimum scales of fees for surveying.

56. Any person being a member, associate, fellow, or student may, by notice in writing sent or delivered to the Secretary, and upon payment of all arrears of subscriptions,

resign.

57. Any charge against any member shall be investigated by the Council, who may refer the matter to the Local Committee of the district in which such member resides for their opinion. The decision of the Council after such investigation shall be final.

58. The Council may suspend, or disqualify, or deprive of his privileges any member, associate, fellow, or student—

(1.) If he is convicted of felony or misdemeanour;

(2.) If his license is cancelled or suspended by the Surveyors' Board pursuant to "The New Zealand Institute of Surveyors and Board of Examiners Act, 1900";

(3.) Or on the ground of bad character, or for improper

(3.) Or on the ground of bad character, or for improper or unprofessional conduct in his business as a surveyor.

surveyor.

Before any person shall be so suspended, or disqualified, or deprived of his privileges, the Council shall hold an inquiry into the matter, and they shall serve notice of the place and time of such inquiry (not being less than two months from the services of such notice) specifying the alleged grounds for such suspension, disqualification, or deprivation, and the time and place for such inquiry, and such person shall be heard, with such witnesses as he may produce, and may be represented by counsel, and witnesses may be examined, cross-examined, and re-examined as in civil cases. If not less than five members of the Council shall, in writing, decide that the grounds alleged for such suspension, disqualification, or deprivation are sufficient and have been proved, then the Council may disqualify or deprive such person or may suspend such person for such time as it thinks fit.

then the Council may disqualify or deprive such person or may suspend such person for such time as it thinks fit.

59. The production of any document purporting to be a true copy of any by-law or of any proceedings of the Institute at any meeting, sealed with the corporate seal of the Institute, and signed by the President and one member of the Council, or by three members of the Council, shall be conclusive evidence that such by-law was duly and lawfully made, or that such proceedings took place, and that any resolution appearing in such proceedings was duly and lawfully arrived at.

fully arrived at. 60. All by-laws and rules of the Institute are hereby repealed, but such repeal shall not affect-

(1.) The validity, invalidity, effect, or consequence of anything at the time of such repeal done or suffered; or
(2.) Any then existing status or capacity; or
(3.) Any right, interest, or title then already acquired, accrued, or established, or any remedy or proceeding in respect thereof; or
(4.) The proof of any past act or thing.
Notwithstanding such repeal every power and act which may be necessary to complete, carry out, or compel the performance of any right under such repealed by-laws and rules may be exercised and performed in all respects as if such by-laws and rules remained in force, and all offences com-

by-laws and rules remained in force, and all offences committed or penalties or forfeitures incurred before such repeal may be prosecuted, punished, and enforced as if such by-laws and rules had not been repealed.

Rules of the New Zea'and Institute of Surveyors (made under the Provisions of "The New Zealand Institute of Surveyors and Board of Examiners Act, 1900").

RULES

To regulate the Proceedings of the Institute.

1. A T every ordinary meeting of the Institute the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding ordinary meeting, and of the minutes of any annual or special meeting which may have been held since such ordinary times of the proceedings are such ordinary meeting. nary meeting; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and such minutes, after having been confirmed, shall be signed

by the chairman.
2. After the signing of the minutes, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable:—

(1.) Reading of reports and recommendations of the Council and ordering thereon.

(2.) Admission of new members, associates, and honorary members.

(3.) Orders of the day, and ordinary business.
(4.) Motions of which notice has been given.
(5.) Reading and discussion of papers upon professional subjects.

3. At every annual meeting of the Institute the business shall be dealt with as set forth in the by-laws and in these

4. At every special meeting of the Institute the business shall be taken in the order in which it stands in the notice convening such meeting.

5. All notices of motion delivered or sent to the Council shall be dated, and the Council shall cause such notices to be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose in the order in which they shall be received.

6. No member of the Institute shall, unless by leave of two-thirds of the members present, make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, except in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the by-laws.

7. Except by leave of the Institute, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

8. No motion entered in the Notice of Motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the member who gave notice of the same, unless by some other member producing written authority from him to that effect.

9. Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in a discussion, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the member (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the member in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

10. Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before proceeding to address the Institute thereon.

11. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Institute.

12. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote until seconded, but any member may require the enforcement of any rule by directing the chairman's attention to its infraction.

13. Any member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but any member merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

14. If two or more members shall rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

15. The chairman shall rise in addressing the Institute to discuss any question.

16. No member shall address the Institute a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misunderstood.

17. The chairman shall decide upon points of order or practice, and his decision as to order or explanation shall be final in each case.

18. No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other member in a previous debate; and all im-putations of improper motives and all personal reflections on members shall be deemed disorderly.

19. Whenever any member shall make use of any disorderly expression, he shall be required by the chairman to withdraw such expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Institute.

20. Any member called to order shall sit down, unless per-

mitted to explain.

21. Any member making use of any disorderly expression or speaking out of order, and having been twice called upon to withdraw and to apologize for such disorderly conduct and refusing to do so, shall be guilty of an offence against this

22. Any member may of right demand the production of any documents of the Institute applying to the question under discussion.

23. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Institute, put the question first in the affirmative, and then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes

24. At any meeting of the Institute all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

25. No second or subsequent amendment shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

26. If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

27. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be

moved to the question; but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Institute for discussion at a time.

submitted to the Institute for discussion at a time.

28. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendments, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair.

29. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded at a meeting of the Institute, or any order of the day, be interrupted by the number of members present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted at any adjournment of such meeting, or if there be no adjournment, then at the next ordinary meeting. ment, then at the next ordinary meeting.

30. Any one or more of these rules may be suspended for a special purpose, on motion, upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended, except by a unanimous vote of the members present at a meeting of the Institute.

· Bonus for Treatment of Auriferous Black Sand.

5. The bonus will be paid on the certificate of an officer that not less than twenty persons other than the applicant for the bonus are successfully working the invention.

6. Any person who receives the bonus shall not be allowed to take out patent rights in New Zealand for his invention.

The receipts for the year from subscriptions and donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. 

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 426, against 484 in October—a decrease of 58. The deaths in November were 221, an increase of 2 on the number in October. Of the total deaths, males contributed 112, females 109. Eighty seven of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 39.37 per cent. of the whole number; 50 of these were under one year of age.

There were fifty-three deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Twelve men, 65, 66 (two), 69 (two), 70, 71, 73 (three), 75, 76, and five women, 69, 77 (two), 85 (two), died at Auckland; eight men, 66, 69, 70, 71 (two), 72, 82, 88, and two women, 65, 86, at Wellington; six men, 69 (two), 71 (two), 73, 77, and five women, 68, 71, 75 (two), 84, at Christohurch; and six men, 67, 69, 76 (two), 82, 84, and nine women, 67 (two), 69, 70, 76, 80, 82, 83, 92, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland and Christchurch, but raises it at Wellington and Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—Forty-six deaths from diseases of this class were registered in November as occurring at the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs; and of these 29 were recorded at Auckland, 12 at Wellington, 1 at Christchurch, and 4 at Dunedin. Of the total number registered, 26 were caused by measles, 3 by scarlet fever, 7 by whooping-cough, 5 by diarrhea, 1 by influenza, and 1 by diphtheria. There were also 2 deaths from hereditary syphilis, and 1 from stricture of urethra.

Dietetic Diseases.—There were 3 deaths in this class at the four chief towns during November—1 each from alcoholism, delirium tremens, and malnutrition.

Constitutional Diseases.—These totalled 40 in November, as compared with 32 in October, 17 being due to phthisis and general tuberculosis, 8 to cancer, 7 to tubercular meningitis and peritonitis, 3 to rheumatism, 3 to diabetes, and 2 to gout.

Developmental Diseases.—Eight of the 16 deaths in this class were due to old age, and 8 to premature birth or malformation.

Local Diseases.—In this class 109 deaths were registered, and of these 23 were caused by diseases of the nervous system, 21 by diseases of the circulatory system, 35 by diseases of the respiratory system, 20 by diseases of the digestive system, 5 by diseases of the urinary system, 4 by diseases of the reproductive system, and 1 by disease of the organs of locomotion.

Violence.—Only 1 violent death was recorded during November, that of a suicide by throat-cutting.

Ill-defined and Not-specified Causes.—In this class there were 6 deaths from marasmus or infantile debility.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
