A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and eight of "The Mining Act, 1898," as amended by section twenty-two of "The Mining Act Amendment Act, 1899" (hereinafter termed "the said Acts"), it is enacted that on application in that behalf the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, constitute and set apart the whole or any part of any watercourse to be a watercourse into which may be discharged any tailings, *débris*, and waste water produced by or resulting from mining operations carried on under the said Acts, and in which or on the banks of which mining operations may be lawfully carried on:

And whereas such application as aforesaid in respect of the watercourses described in the Schedule hereto was duly notified and gazetted, as provided by the said Acts, on the date set out in the description of such watercourses in the said Schedule:

And whereas His Excellency the Governor has decided to exercise the powers conferred upon him by the said Acts:

Now, therefore, His Excellency Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, doth hereby constitute and set apart the watercourses described in the Schedule hereto to be watercourses into which may be discharged any tailings, *débris*, and waste waters produced by or resulting from mining operations carried on under the said Acts, and in which or on the banks of which mining operations may be lawfully carried on; and doth hereby further prescribe that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the second day of March, one thousand nine hundred and three.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Counties Act, 1886," and "The Mount Herbert County Act, 1902," I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby divide the new County of Mount Herbert, as constituted by the said Acts, into two ridings, to be called the Port Victoria Riding and the Port Levy Riding, and declare that the boundaries thereof shall be those set forth under the names of the said ridings respectively in the Schedule hereto.

And I do hereby declare that four members shall be elected for each of the abovenamed ridings.

And I do further declare that Friday, the thirtieth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and three, shall be the day upon which the election of the first Council of the said County of Mount Herbert shall take place, and that Thursday, the fifth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and three, at two o'clock in the afternoon, shall be the time, and the schoolhouse at Charteris Bay shall be the place, at which the first meeting of the said Council shall be held.

*Amending Regulations for Drawback of Duty on Goods exported from the Colony.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-third day of December, 1902.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the ninth section of "The Customs Duties Consolidation Act, 1882," that the Governor may, by Order in Council, from time to time specify the articles on which a drawback of duty paid on importation into New Zealand may be allowed on exportation therefrom, and the rate of drawback to be so allowed; and may alter and cancel any such Order, and may approve of regulations and conditions under which drawbacks may be allowed: And whereas the ninth section of "The Customs and Excise Duties Act, 1888," provides that a drawback of duty paid on New-Zealand-brewed beer may be allowed on the exportation thereof in bottle, and such

drawback shall be subject to the same regulations and conditions as are applicable to drawback allowed under the ninth section of "The Customs Duties Consolidation Act, 1882": And whereas it is expedient to amend the drawback regulations published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-seventh September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight (Class D, New Zealand beer), to the extent and in the manner hereinafter specified:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the hereinbefore-in-part-recited Act, doth order that the regulations under the heading "Class D," as published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-seventh September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, be and the same are hereby altered as follows, viz.: All the words after "paid thereon," appearing in the first paragraph of the said clause, shall be omitted from the said paragraph, and in lieu thereof the words "if the Collector is satisfied that the claim for drawback is genuine" shall be substituted.

*Regulations under "The Government Accident Insurance Act, 1899."*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-third day of December, 1902.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the fifteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and one, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand did, in exercise and pursuance of the powers vested in him by the thirty-fourth section of "The Government Accident Insurance Act, 1899" (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), make regulations for directing the use of tables fixing the rates of premium to be charged for insuring employers and other persons against their liability under "The Workers' Compensation for Accidents Act, 1900," "The Employers' Liability Act, 1882," and its amendments, and at common law: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said recited Order in Council, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in the exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in this behalf vested in him, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby revoke the said Order in Council prescribing the rates of premium for the class of insurance as mentioned aforesaid, and in lieu thereof doth hereby order and direct that, as from the date of the coming into operation of this Order in Council, the rates of premium for insuring employers and other persons against their liability

under "The Workers' Compensation for Accidents Act, 1900," "The Employers' Liability Act, 1882," and its amendments, and at common law respectively, shall be as specified in the Schedule hereto; and by and with the like advice and consent aforesaid, His Excellency doth hereby further order that this present Order in Council shall take effect on and after the first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and three.

SCHEDULE.

PREMIUM RATES.

The rates of premium shall be computed upon the amount spent in wages, and shall be fixed by the Commissioner having regard to the nature of the risk; provided, nevertheless, as follows: (a.) In the case of each policy the minimum premium shall be 10s. (b.) Subject to the aforesaid minimum, the premium shall not exceed, in respect of every £100, or fraction thereof, paid in wages, the rate shown in the subjoined table, according to the category in which, in the opinion of the Commissioner, the risk should be classified, with an increase of 33 $\frac{1}{3}$  (thirty-three and a third) per centum on the rates shown in the said table on and after the 1st day of April, 1903 (the date of the coming into operation of "The Workers' Compensation for Accidents Act Amendment Act, 1902").

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Tuesday in each month, at half-past two o'clock p.m., at the County Council Office, Ashburton, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Tuesday, the third day of February, one thousand nine hundred and three.
  2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.
  3. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.
  4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the first Tuesday in February in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. *Warrant apportioning the Cost of maintaining the Cattle Valley Road.*

RANFURLY, Governor.

WHEREAS by section eight of "The Public Works Act Amendment Act, 1900," it is enacted that in any case where a road in one district is largely used by or for the purpose of traffic to or from any other district or districts, and affords access to or from such district or districts, and the Governor is of opinion that it is equitable that the latter district should contribute towards the cost of constructing or maintaining the whole or any portion of such road in the former district, the Governor may from time to time apportion the cost of constructing or maintaining the whole or any part of such road among the local authorities of the respective districts as he thinks fit; and for that purpose, and to enable effect to be given thereto, the provisions of sections one hundred and thirteen and one hundred and fourteen of the principal Act shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply:

And whereas the Mount Peel Road Board has made application to the Governor to apportion the cost of maintaining the road described in the Schedule hereto between the said Road Board and the Mackenzie County Council, and herein-after referred to as "the said road":

And whereas by section one hundred and fourteen of "The Public Works Act, 1894," it is further provided that the Governor may, with the view of determining what proportion, if any, of the cost of maintaining the work should be borne by any local authority, direct any person to be a Commissioner to inquire and report to him upon any matter which he shall deem necessary to enable him to determine any such question aforesaid: And whereas a Commissioner was appointed and an inquiry duly held: And whereas such Commissioner did report to the Governor, after due inquiry, his opinion thereon:

And whereas the Governor is of opinion that the said road should be maintained and that the cost of maintenance should be apportioned as hereinafter appears:

Now, therefore, I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Acts, do hereby authorise the Mount Peel Road Board to maintain the said road. And I do hereby declare that the cost of maintaining the said road, from and after the date of this Warrant, shall be borne by the Mount Peel Road Board and the Mackenzie County Council in the following proportions: viz., the Mount Peel Road Board shall contribute three-fourths and the Council of the County of Mackenzie one-fourth of the said cost; provided, however, that the sum to be paid by the Mackenzie County Council as its proportion of the said cost for any one year shall not amount to more than ten pounds.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE DUNEDIN STOCK EXCHANGE, AS AT NOVEMBER, 1902.

Constitution.

1. This association shall consist of the undersigned, and of such other persons as may be hereafter elected in accordance with the rules, and shall be called "The Dunedin Stock Exchange."

2. When the word "association" occurs in the following rules and regulations it shall be taken to mean the Dunedin Stock Exchange.

Objects of the association.

3. The objects and purposes of the association are the exchange of quotations, the facilitating of purchases and sales of shares, scrip, stocks, and debentures, and the maintenance of honourable dealings amongst its members, and for that purpose the decision and settlement of all disputes between members or affecting members.

Management and annual meeting.

4. The management of the association shall be vested in a committee of the whole, and such committee shall have direction and control of the affairs of the association. Ten members of the governing body shall be necessary to constitute a quorum for all purposes other than the calling-over of the list and the calling of a special meeting, for which purposes four members shall suffice. A general meeting of the association (to be called the "annual meeting") shall be held during the month of December in each year, at which the annual report and balance-sheet, duly audited, shall be presented, and an executive committee and auditor may be appointed; such executive and auditor to hold office for one year from 1st January following. The executive committee to consist of five members, the chairman, and the secretary, of whom three shall form a quorum; such executive to manage and control all the minor affairs of the exchange—viz., the compilation of the price-list, and all matters, financial or otherwise, for which it is not essential or in contravention of the constitution of the exchange that a full meeting of members should be convened or held.

Chairman, vice-chairman, and trustees.

5. At the annual meeting the committee shall appoint a chairman for a period of twelve months from 1st January following. They shall also appoint for a similar period three members of the association as trustees of the association; and all shares, property, and funds (other than the current account) shall be invested in their names. Any lease or other undertaking of the association shall be executed by the said trustees, who shall be indemnified by the association against any loss that may arise in connection therewith. The members of the executive committee shall be vice-chairmen, and in the absence of the chairman one of the vice-chairmen only shall act. Their turn of duty shall be in alphabetical order, and be taken in monthly periods. The chairman for the time being may exercise both a deliberative and a casting vote.

Quorum.

6. If there is not a quorum present at any ordinary or special meeting, the members present may adjourn the meeting to such day and time as they think fit, provided that each adjournment shall not be for a longer period than seven days.

Powers of committee.

7. The committee shall have power to make, vary, amend, or repeal such rules and regulations from time to time as exist or may be required for carrying on the business of the association, and shall also have power to carry out the rules and regulations of the association, and to fill up any casual vacancy or vacancies occurring in the executive committee or in connection with the chairmanship.

Cases of dispute.

8. In cases of disputes between members which one or more may desire should be settled by the committee or the executive, the complainant shall state his case in writing, and pay in advance to the secretary a hearing fee of 10s. 6d., and undertake to abide by the decision when given, and the committee or executive shall, at their discretion, be empowered to order the repayment of such fee to the complainant by the defendant. If disputants are not agreed as

to the case being decided by the executive, the case shall be brought before the committee. In any case in which a non-member requires the intervention of the committee he must forward to the chairman of the exchange a written statement of his case, accompanied by a hearing fee of £1 1s., and undertake to abide by, and forthwith to carry out, the decisions of the committee, in the same manner as if he were a member of the association.

Adjudication of disputes.

9. No member shall participate in the adjudication of a case in which he, or his firm, or any member of his firm, is personally interested. The committee or the executive shall have power to adjudicate and decide.

Evidence for committee.

10. Every member of the association, and every clerk to a member, shall attend before the committee or the executive when required, and the member shall give, and cause his clerk or clerks to give, such information to the committee or the executive as may be in his or their possession relative to any matter then under investigation.

Infringement of rules.

11. Any member proved guilty of dishonourable or contumacious conduct, or of wilfully infringing the rules of the association, or of conduct which would, in the opinion of the members, render the member unfit to remain a member of the association, or of conduct which, in the opinion of the members, might prove derogatory to the interests of the association, shall be liable to expulsion. The charge against the accused member must, in the first instance, be submitted in writing to the committee by a member, of which charge a copy shall be forthwith transmitted to the member accused; and if, upon due investigation, the committee be of opinion that the circumstances require it, a special meeting shall be convened for the purpose of investigation and adjudicating thereon. The opinion of such special meeting shall be obtained by ballot, when, if three-fourths of the members present and voting in person at the meeting shall decide that the accused member has merited expulsion, he shall cease to be a member of the association, and the same shall be notified to him forthwith by the secretary: Provided that such meeting shall have power, in lieu of expulsion, to suspend such accused member for a period not exceeding six months. Notwithstanding anything contained in the former part of this rule, a majority of the executive committee shall have power to call any member of the association before them who may be suspected of dishonourable conduct, or conduct that would unfit him to remain a member of the association. After investigating the case the executive committee may report to the committee, who shall proceed as laid down in the former part of this rule.

Power to suspend or expel.

12. The committee shall have full power to suspend or expel any member who (1) fails to comply with a decision, order, or award of the committee or executive, or (2) fails to keep a cash-book and records of all his transactions. The case of any member proceeded against under this rule shall be brought before a special meeting. The opinion of such special meeting shall be obtained by ballot, when, if three-fourths of the members present and voting in person at the meeting shall decide that the member has merited suspension or expulsion, he shall be suspended for such time as the meeting shall decide, or be expelled.

Suspended member.

13. During the time a member is suspended under these rules, or has not paid a fine inflicted by the association, he shall have no right to attend any of the ordinary daily meetings or the special meetings of the association, nor shall he have during such time any rights of membership.

Alteration of rules.

14. Notice of any proposed alteration of or addition to these rules must be given in writing at one meeting of the committee, and be considered and determined not sooner than the seventh day thereafter, and not later than fourteen days thereafter.

Special meeting.

15. A notice calling a special meeting, read to an ordinary meeting by the chairman, and posted in the exchange room not less than twenty-two hours previous to the time fixed for holding such special meeting, shall be held to be sufficient notice to members of the calling of such meeting: Provided that the secretary shall send written notice to all members not present at the time the meeting is called.

Appointment of secretary and reader.

16. A secretary and also a reader shall from time to time be appointed by the executive committee, at remunerations to be fixed by the executive committee, and shall hold office at their pleasure.

**Duties of secretary.**

17. The secretary shall cause records to be kept of the sales, purchases, transactions, and proceedings of the ordinary daily meetings, and the proceedings of all other meetings. He shall keep the accounts, prepare a yearly balance-sheet as at the 30th November in each year, and have the custody of all the books and papers, and perform such other duties as the committee or executive committee may prescribe. The official stamps of the association, embodying the words "Scrip forwarded to the company's office this day," and "Scrip in support of this transfer for shares forwarded to the company's office this day," shall be kept in the custody of the secretary; and on the request of any member, accompanied by the payment of 1s. and postage, he shall personally affix one or other of the said stamps to any transfer required, appending thereto his ordinary signature as secretary, and the *date written in full*. He must, however, first have received from the applicant the original scrip or transfer and scrip, both of which he will hand to or forward at once by registered letter to the secretary or legal manager of the company in question, with an intimation as to the number of transfers marked with the stamp, and the numbers of shares embodied in each transfer. He must also keep a record of all such transactions in the register provided for the purpose. The secretary shall keep the official stamps above referred to in a safe, under lock and key, and should any misuse be made of them through his neglecting this or any other necessary precaution he shall be liable for any loss occasioned thereby. He shall, as soon as possible, pay all moneys he may receive (except fees for marking) into the banking account of the association. All cheques drawn on the banking account shall be signed by the chairman and secretary.

**Absence of secretary or reader.**

18. In the absence of the secretary or reader from any meeting the chairman shall carry out their duties, or may appoint another member or members to do so.

**Admission to association.**

19. The members may admit by ballot such persons (being not less than twenty-one years of age) as they deem eligible, on payment of £250. A notice of each application shall be exhibited in the exchange room for a period of not less than seven days before the applicant can be balloted for. Every applicant must satisfy the executive committee as to his financial position, and must be nominated by one member and seconded by another. He must address and sign a letter in the following form:—

"To the Chairman of the Dunedin Stock Exchange.

"SIR,—I am desirous of becoming a member of the Dunedin Stock Exchange, under such rules and regulations as you have appointed; and I hereby agree to pay my entrance fee on election, and the subscription, and such calls as may be subsequently made under Rule 25; and I also agree, in case my conduct shall at any time be considered objectionable by the members of the association, that I will not, in the event of my being suspended, disqualified from membership, or expelled, raise any suit in equity or at law against the said association or any member or members thereof.

"I am, Sir, &c."

**Ballot.**

20. In balloting for members, one black ball in five shall exclude.

**Rejected applicant.**

21. If any applicant for admission should, on ballot, be rejected, such rejection shall be conclusive for three months.

**Notification of membership.**

22. The secretary shall, on the day of election of a new member, notify in writing such new member of his election, and every member shall, within three days of his admission and his notification thereof by the secretary, pay his entrance fee and subscription and sign the rules and regulations of the exchange, thereby pledging himself to abide by the same and by all subsequent amendments thereof.

**Non-compliance of new member.**

23. If a newly elected member does not comply with the above rule his election shall be void, unless he shall justify the delay to the satisfaction of the committee, or the committee shall otherwise decide to dispense with this rule.

**Cessation of claim.**

24. All members resigning or being expelled shall cease to have any claim whatever on the property or funds of the association.

**Annual subscription.**

25. The annual subscription shall be £10 10s. (payable in two instalments—on the 1st of June and the 1st of December of each year), and the executive committee shall have power to make such other calls as may be necessary to meet current expenses, to be payable within fourteen days from the date of such call.

**Subscription in arrear. Deceased member.**

26. It shall be competent for the committee to suspend any member whose subscription or call shall have remained unpaid for fourteen days from the date on which such subscription or call is due; and, further, if such subscription or call shall remain unpaid for the space of one month from the date on which it is due, the seat shall be rendered liable to forfeiture at the discretion of the committee. In the case of a deceased member, notice of the dates when subscriptions or calls fall due shall be sent to the executors by the secretary of the association, who shall at the same time direct attention to the provisions of this rule.

**Contracts between members.**

27. In all contracts, members shall be held to be principals to each other in so far as the delivery and payment for shares, stock, and debentures is concerned, and the prices shall be net. The commission of brokers when dealing on account of private clients to be paid them by their clients.

**Insolvency.**

28. A member who may become insolvent or otherwise fail in his engagements with his creditors ceases to be a member, although he may not be at the same time a defaulter on the association, and no application for his re-admission, except as a new member, shall be entertained. The seat of an insolvent member who is not a defaulter on the association, and has no outstanding or contingent liabilities with any of its members, shall, however, be an asset for the benefit of his creditors, subject to the provisions of Rule 34 as to disposal of same.

**Members of firms.**

29. Where one of the members of a firm is a member of the association, the entrance fee payable by another member of the same firm shall be reduced one-half: provided that, in the event of a dissolution of such partnership taking place, the member who entered at a reduced entrance fee, should he desire to remain a member, shall be required to pay, within one month after such dissolution has taken place, a sum which shall, with the amount already paid by him, make up the full entrance fee payable at the date of his election; and until such sum be paid the member shall be considered not to have paid his entrance fee (as provided by these rules), and shall not be entitled to attend the exchange-room or have any of the rights of membership, and shall cease to be a member. No member who has not paid the full entrance fee payable at the date he became a member shall have power to deal, by transfer or otherwise, with his seat on the exchange.

**Seat of member.**

30. The seat of each member shall be his own property, irrespective of his being in partnership with another member or not. It shall be competent for a member to hold more than one seat. A member, however, who may hold more than one seat shall only be entitled to exercise one vote.

**Votes.**

31. Each member shall have one vote at all meetings, which vote may be exercised by proxy through another member, except where the rules provide to the contrary (*vide* 11, 12, and 44).

**Other exchanges.**

32. The privileges of membership shall be suspended if a member, either personally or by his partners, clerks, or agents, shall become a member of or attend any other exchange in Dunedin where shares are dealt in. The Committee may remove the suspension.

**Partnership.**

33. A member shall not enter into or be in active partnership with any person other than a member, unless such partner shall have been approved by a majority of the members present at a special general meeting convened for the purpose.

**Transfer of membership.**

34. Any member shall have the right to transfer his membership, under the following provision: When any member wishes to transfer his membership, the name of the proposed transferee shall be submitted to the committee, and he shall be balloted for (in terms of Rules 19 and 20), when, if elected, transfer may be made. In no case shall any transfer of membership be permitted until all dues to the Stock Exchange shall have been paid in full, said dues being hereby declared a prior lien upon the proceeds, to be satisfied in full before any distribution thereof shall be made. Transferee shall pay to the exchange £5. The transfer of a seat from one member to another shall be subject to the provisions contained in this rule, with the exception of the condition as to balloting.

**Member's clerk.**

35. Every member shall supply to the exchange in writing the name of any clerk or employee who is authorised by him

to deal on his behalf outside the exchange rooms, and shall undertake in writing to hold himself responsible for all transactions entered into by the said clerk or employee with other members.

**Auction sales.**

36. No member of this association, nor his partner or clerk or any one employed by him, shall be allowed to attend auctions to bid, directly or indirectly, for stock, debentures, bonds, or shares of any description (forfeited shares excepted), and no member shall be allowed, directly or indirectly, to tender for stock, bonds, debentures, or shares of any description in a private, deceased, or bankrupt estate. A fine of £20 shall be inflicted in any case where a member of this association has been found guilty of doing business, directly or indirectly, with auctioneers who hold sales of shares by auction.

**Fee for call list.**

37. Any company in New Zealand wishing to be placed on the call list shall be charged a fee of £5 5s. A company applying for registration on the exchange list shall supply a list of directors, objects, and capital of the company, also a full list of shareholders, and the number of shares held by them. The association reserves to itself power to decline to list any company, also to remove any company from the list.

**Increased fee.**

38. The association reserves to itself the power to charge an increased fee for listing any company in the Provincial District of Otago which has not been floated by a member of this exchange.

**Reports for Press.**

39. A member receiving information about any company quoted by the exchange, and such member wishing to publish same in any newspaper, shall do so only in the name of the exchange.

**Penalty for divulging proceedings.**

40. Any member divulging the proceedings of the association shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £20. Members may, however, give information as to quotations or sales without mentioning the names of members quoting or dealing.

**Hours of meeting.**

41. The association shall hold two daily meetings—viz., at 10.30 a.m. and 3 p.m.—except on Saturdays, when one meeting shall be held at 10.30 a.m.

**Authorised partner or clerk may attend meetings.**

42. It shall be competent for the committee to grant the clerk of a member or partner of a member permission to attend the daily meetings of the association for the making of quotations and transactions on behalf of said member; but the member shall first undertake, by writing addressed to the committee, that he will be responsible for the sales and purchases effected by such authorised partner or clerk. The sanction of the committee may at any time be withdrawn. Such authorised partner or clerk shall have no vote nor any voice in the management or administration of the association. The attendance of partner or clerks shall only be permitted in the case of a member's illness, absence from town, service on a jury, or other emergency, and such conditions must be shown to the satisfaction of the chairman. Members represented by a partner or clerk shall be charged £1 1s. per month, or for any part of a month.

**Scale of charges.**

43. The brokerage chargeable on transactions to both buyer and seller shall be as follows:—

The minimum charge on any transaction is 7s. 6d. Buyers pay stamp duty and transfer fees. A penalty not exceeding £50 and not less than £25 shall be inflicted for any breach of the above tariff—which tariff, however, shall not apply to London, Australian, and Tasmanian transactions.

**Sharebrokers.**

44. Members of the Otago Stock Exchange and of the Equitable Stock Exchange may be admitted from the 1st December, 1900, to the Quotation Hall at a fee of £5 5s. per annum, payable half-yearly in advance. Members of the exchanges mentioned, whether paying the fee or not, shall be dealt with at net prices. Any other broker who wishes admission to the Quotation Hall shall be admitted on payment of a fee of not less than £25 per annum, and subject to his being first approved of by a majority of the committee personally present at a meeting specially called, and of which not less than twenty-two hours' notice shall have been given.

Such broker must undertake in writing to charge commission at our tariff on all his transactions, whether taking place in the Quotation Hall or not. He must also undertake in writing to be subject to our rules. Should he be proved to have committed any breach of our tariff or rules, he shall forfeit his right to enter the Quotation Hall. Business shall be done with such brokers by our members at net prices. Any broker in Dunedin or suburbs who is not a member of the Otago or Equitable Exchanges, and who is not admitted to our Quotation Hall, shall be dealt with by our members only at the tariff rates provided in Rule 43, and subject to the penalties therein provided for any breach of the said rule.

**Business on 'change.**

45. Offers to buy or sell shares, scrip, or stock shall be definite as to number and price, and remain open until the line be passed by the reader; and, in the event of any dispute arising between members as to sale or purchase of any stock during the reading of the list, such dispute shall be settled by the chairman, whose decision shall be final.

**Record of sales.**

46. After every sale on 'change the recorder shall, if required, call the name of the company, the number of shares sold, and the price, also the names of the seller and buyer. He shall also record the sale in the book provided for that purpose. At the close of the meeting the whole of the transactions shall be again read out, and, unless objection be then made, the record shall be binding on both parties. In the event of any dispute the decision of the chairman shall be final.

**Time for delivery of documents.**

47. When sales are effected the selling member must deliver the documents within ten days, except in the case of Tasmanian and Australian stocks, when twenty days shall be allowed, unless a special time for delivery is stated at the time of sale. If the documents are not delivered by 1 o'clock on the tenth day, or if Australian or Tasmanian stocks on the twentieth day, or by 11 o'clock if it should fall on a Saturday, the buying member shall, subject to his having given not less than twelve hours' notice in writing to the selling member, and subsequently not less than twelve hours' notice in writing to the chairman of the exchange, of his intention so to act, have the right to purchase or buy the said shares on 'change at the risk of the seller (who shall pay to the funds of the association a fee of 10s. 6d.), through the chairman of the exchange, on the following or any subsequent day within the period of six weeks from date of the original purchase.

**Option for seller to complete.**

48. If a buyer does not claim in writing delivery of documents until after six weeks from date of purchase, or, in case of a time bargain (other than the regulation number of days), until six weeks after the date agreed upon for completion, it is optional with the seller to complete, unless otherwise agreed in writing.

**Option for buyer to complete.**

49. If a seller does not tender delivery of documents within six weeks of date of sale, or, in the case of a time bargain, within the time agreed upon, the buyer may refuse to take delivery by giving the seller seventy-two hours' notice in writing of his intention to do so, it being understood that the buyer must take delivery of the shares if tendered within the said seventy-two hours. The seventy-two hours' notice must not, however, be given on or include Saturday, Sunday, Stock Exchange or bank holiday.

50. If a seller does not tender, or a buyer does not request, delivery of documents within three months from date of transaction, the same shall be null and void.

**Buyer's name.**

51.

**Ante-dated transfers.**

52. No member need accept delivery of a transfer dated more than fifteen days previous to date of delivery, unless it can be proved that he has reasonable time to carry out his transaction with his buyer and have the transfer stamped and lodged for registration within the period provided by law.

**Conduct of meeting.**

53. No member shall be permitted to leave the exchange room at any ordinary daily meeting until the chairman has declared the ordinary business closed, without the express sanction of the meeting, under penalty not exceeding £20. Such member going out during a meeting shall not be allowed to re-enter during the same meeting except with the express sanction of the meeting; and any member impeding business, either by attempting to deal in shares, scrip, or stock out of their turn, or by conversation not relevant to the subject before the meeting, or by any noisy, disorderly, or improper conduct whatever, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £1, and for each repetition of the offence shall be liable to a further fine not exceeding £1, or may be suspended for a

period not exceeding three months, and may thereupon immediately be expelled from the meeting. Such fines, penalties, and suspensions to be inflicted or imposed by the chairman, subject, however, to an immediate appeal to the members present in the room, whose decision shall be final. The committee, or any special meeting called for the purpose, may remit such fines or any part thereof, or remove such suspension or any portion thereof. No member so fined shall be entitled to attend the room or to take his seat, or have any of the rights of membership, until all fines and penalties inflicted on him are paid.

#### Communications during call.

54. Telegrams and other written communications may be received by members during business meetings, but no messages shall be sent out during such meetings.

#### Genuineness of documents.

55. The seller of shares or stocks is responsible for the genuineness and regularity of all documents delivered until reasonable time has been allowed to the transferee to execute and duly lodge such documents for verification and registration. In case of dispute, such time to be decided by the committee; but in no case (excepting that of fraud or proved misrepresentation) shall a member be liable for any loss sustained unless he shall have received written notice of such loss within sixty days (or, in the case of transactions in which transfer has to be completed in Europe, 130 days), from the date of the delivery of documents. Should written notice be given within the time specified, the dispute, if not otherwise settled, shall be adjudicated on by the committee, and their decision shall be final and binding on the members interested.

#### Dividends.

56. Members shall be responsible to one another for payment of dividends on shares (other than mining shares) sold by them for fourteen days previous to closing of books of any company, and such dividend must be paid within fourteen days, or, in case of companies having their office outside New Zealand, within twenty-eight days after the due date of such dividend being payable; but no member shall be responsible for any error or omission or frauds in connection with any transaction after the expiration of two months from date of settlement, unless the selling broker has been a party to the fraud or irregularity.

#### Mining dividends.

57. In gold-mining shares, the selling member shall be responsible for only one dividend, such dividend to be paid within fourteen days, or, in cases of companies having their office outside New Zealand, within twenty-eight days, after the due date of such dividend being payable. It must, however, be claimed within one month of due date.

#### Dividends, calls.

58. All transactions between members in New Zealand stocks shall be "ex dividend" on and after the date on which the same is payable; and in cases where shares are not sold on a premium or discount basis, calls shall be paid by the holder of the shares at the date upon which the call is struck. All transactions between members in Australian and Tasmanian stocks shall be "ex dividend" on and after the date on which the same is payable, and calls shall be paid by the holder of shares on the date on which such calls are payable.

#### Liability of members for calls.

59. When one member of the exchange purchases shares from another member, and no buyer's name is asked for or supplied, the buying member shall be liable for all calls struck thereafter; unless he can show *bona fide* that he purchased on behalf of a client. In cases of dispute, the executive committee shall appoint a sub-committee of two members, who shall examine such books and documents of the disputants as they may consider necessary to enable them to make a reliable statement of facts to the executive committee, who shall thereupon adjudicate the case within a reasonable time.

#### Delivery of security.

60. Purchasers shall not be required to take delivery and pay for securities rendered after 1 o'clock p.m. on ordinary business days, or after 11 a.m. on Stock Exchange half-holidays. No settlements will be made between members on Saturdays, unless the buyer intimates to the seller that he is prepared to take delivery and pay for shares.

#### Transactions off 'change.

61. All transactions between members taking place outside the exchange room shall be subject to the rules and regulations of the association.

#### Failure to meet engagements.

62. Should it come to the knowledge of any member of this association that a broker or private individual, either in Dunedin or elsewhere, is failing to meet his engagements, the

said member must at once report the circumstance to the Chairman, who will bring the matter before the members at the first meeting for decision as to what action shall be taken. Any member failing or neglecting to report to the chairman as above specified shall be liable to be fined a sum not exceeding £20, or to be suspended, at the option of the committee.

#### Additions and Alterations to Rules of Dunedin Stock Exchange.

That Rule 17 be altered as follows:—

Rule 17, line 11, after the word "day," insert "and transfer marked by secretary of company in support of this transfer for shares forwarded to company's office this day." Same rule, line 18, delete the words "both of." Same rule, add at end, "It is understood that all documents handed to our secretary under this rule are guaranteed by the member presenting them to be good and valid without any writing to that effect. Should any loss occur in connection with such documents the member handing them in shall be responsible for same. Any member failing to make good any such loss within the time allowed by the executive committee may be debarred from attendance at the meeting of the exchange, and his seat may be forfeited and sold, and the proceeds used as the executive committee may decide."

That members of this exchange agree to recognise transfers marked officially by secretaries of the Stock Exchange of Canterbury, the Wellington Stock Exchange, and the Auckland Stock Exchange. Such markings only to be made in the case of companies which have their office outside the city in which the Stock Exchange is situated.

Addition to Rule 51:—

In the case of a time bargain the buyer's name must be supplied three days prior to due date if required, otherwise it shall be competent for the selling member to insert the name of the buying member.

That money shall not be voted from the funds of the exchange outside of actual working-expenses, unless supported by a majority of three-fourths of the members present at a special meeting.

That, in regard to new issues, the phrase "cum rights" means the right to apply for the new issue, and that if the buyer wishes the new issue he must give the seller notice in writing of his intention to take the new issue, such notice to be given not later than the day previous to the date of closing of application.

That a guarantee fund of £500 be created as from the 20th August, 1901, for the purpose of meeting the default of any members of this exchange as against another member or members.

(1.) No claim can be made upon the guarantee fund, except in connection with transactions taking place on 'change before the fall of the hammer.

(2.) No claim can be made in respect of time bargains, or of any sale to which a special condition or conditions are attached. Prompt-delivery sales made in compliance with paragraph 1 are, however, not to be barred.

(3.) No claim can be made in respect of any transaction in which delivery has been prolonged beyond thirty days from date of sale, unless under circumstances which are proved to the satisfaction of the executive committee to have been exceptional, and sufficient, in their opinion, to permit of a claim being allowed.

(4.) No member shall be entitled to claim on the fund for more than £200 in respect of the default of any other member.

(5.) No claim will be recognised unless it is notified to the chairman at or before the first meeting of the exchange following knowledge of the default. Should a member delay delivery by request, delay presentation of a cheque by request, or make any compromise, he shall not be entitled to make any claim for loss arising in connection with the transaction.

Addition to Rule 5 of the guarantee regulations:—

Provided, however, that if the chairman of the exchange is made acquainted with the circumstances, he may authorise delaying notification to the members for twenty-four hours, during which time the member complained against must undertake to do no business with other members of the exchange. If a settlement is not effected before the expiration of the twenty-four hours the chairman shall immediately notify the exchange.

(6.) That, as the default of one member may bring about the default of other members, at least seven days must be allowed to elapse from the announcement of the first default before claims can be adjudicated on.

(7.) The claim or claims in connection with each defaulting member shall be dealt with by a special committee to consist of the chairman and four members to be appointed by the general committee at a special meeting. The special committee shall decide on the merits of the case, it being under-

stood that no claim need necessarily be paid in full. Any member shall have the right of appeal to the general committee.

(8.) In every case of failure the chairman shall publicly fix the prices current in the market immediately before the declaration, at which price all persons having accounts open with the defaulter shall close their transactions by buying of or selling to him such stocks, shares, or other securities as he may have contracted to take or deliver, the differences arising from the defaulter's transactions being paid to or claimed from the chairman. In the event of a dispute as to the prices named, they shall be fixed by the special committee. The chairman shall not claim differences in a defaulter's estate until they become due.

(9.) The special committee shall have power to decide any points not provided for in the above rules.

Addition to Rule 34 :—

After the words "existing entrance fee," "but in the event of any member's seat being realised for the benefit of any creditors who are members of the exchange, that the exchange, should they see fit to do so, may register such transfer without the usual 10-per-cent. fee being paid."

The buying member must supply, if required, the name of the buyer before 4 p.m. on the first business day following the sale, but if the former day shall fall on Saturday or holiday, then the name must be supplied by 10 a.m. on the following business day. If this is not done it shall be competent for the selling member to insert the name of the buying member.

Addition to Rule 10 :—

Any special committee appointed by the exchange shall have power to call for and examine any books or documents belonging to a member. The said special committee shall have power, by a vote of the majority present, to impound any document or documents until a reasonable time has been allowed for them to report to the general committee, who shall decide finally as to the impounding of the documents.

Rule 47 :—

Strike out all the words from and including "When shares are purchased" to the end of the rule, and substitute the following: "When shares are purchased at the morning call by the chairman under this rule the seller must deliver the documents in negotiable order to the secretary of the exchange before 1 o'clock on the following business day. The buyer may, however, stipulate for delivery before 12 o'clock on the following business day by giving the seller, and also the secretary of the exchange, either verbal notice at the time of the sale (which notice will be recorded in the sales-book) or by giving written notice to that effect before 5 p.m. on the day of the sale to both the seller and the secretary of the exchange. If the shares are purchased at the afternoon call the same conditions shall apply, except that the hours for delivery shall be 5 p.m. and 4 p.m. respectively. In the event of the seller failing to deliver the documents to the secretary in negotiable order within the required time he shall pay to the chairman such sum as the executive committee shall decide, and they shall have power to disburse the whole or part of same in such sum or sums, and to such person or persons, as they see fit. When shares are delivered to the secretary under this rule he shall as soon as possible forward them on to the buyer, and settle with both parties in ordinary course. In the case of 'prompt delivery' sales between members (*i.e.*, without the intervention of the chairman) the time for delivery shall be 12.30 p.m. on the following business day."

That when a member used the word "best," or any word of a similar meaning, he must adhere to the same.

That it be an infringement of the rules of the exchange for members to attend private calls on days appointed as holidays.

That when the chairman is purchasing stock for prompt delivery no other member shall be allowed to compete with him.

That any member wishing to write to the papers in connection with mining claims or companies shall first submit the letter to the executive committee of the exchange for their approval and consent.

Rule 42 altered to read as follows :—

That the last clause of Rule 42 be interpreted to mean that a member's clerk coming on 'change, say, on the 15th of the month be entitled to attend till the 14th of the following month for the payment of £1 1s.

That telegraphic orders shall (unless stipulated to the contrary) be considered as open for execution till the closing-hour between the two telegraph-stations.

That in cases of disputes between members under Rule 8—where a hearing fee has been paid—that the party who loses the case pay the fee.

RULES OF THE WELLINGTON STOCK EXCHANGE.

Name.

1. This association shall consist of the undersigned stock and share brokers, and of such persons as may be hereafter elected in accordance with these rules, and shall be called "The Wellington Stock Exchange."

When the word "association" occurs in the following rules and regulations it shall be taken to mean the Wellington Stock Exchange.

Objects.

2. The objects and purposes of the association are the exchange of quotations, the facilitating of purchases and sales of shares, scrip, stock, and debentures, and the maintenance of honourable dealings amongst its members, and, for that purpose, the decision and settlement of disputes between members or affecting members.

Entrance fee.

3. The entrance fee for every elected member shall be £25, to be lodged with the secretary at the time of nomination.

Subscription.

4. The annual subscription shall be £5 5s., payable within thirty days from the 1st day of October in each year, and any other calls for current expenses to be made by the Committee, and payable within fourteen days from the date of such call.

Members, how admitted.

5. Members shall be elected by general ballot. Each candidate for admission shall be proposed by one member and seconded by another, in their own handwritings, in a book kept for that purpose, and the name, occupation or profession, and address of each candidate shall be stated, and at the next meeting of the association the secretary shall state the name of the candidate so proposed.

**Ballot.**

6. The ballot shall take place at a call of shares in the call-room on the first call-day after fourteen days has expired from the day on which such candidate has been proposed. No ballot shall be valid unless one-half of the members actually vote, and, in case of the failure of a ballot by any means whatever, the name of the candidate proposed at such abortive ballot shall be balloted again for next call-day.

**Black balls. Rejected candidate.**

7. In balloting for members one black ball in five shall exclude; proxies shall not be allowed. No rejected candidate shall be again proposed for election within the space of six months after his rejection.

**Names of elected candidates to be posted.**

8. It shall be the duty of the secretary immediately after the ballot to post in the call-room the name of the candidate elected.

**Candidate to sign rules.**

9. Immediately after his election the candidate shall sign a copy of these rules, which shall be deemed a declaration of his submission to the rules and by-laws.

**Partnerships.**

10. All partners of any firms, or directors of any joint-stock company, acting as stock and share brokers, of which one partner or director shall be desirous of becoming a member of the association shall be simultaneously proposed for membership within one calendar month after the formation of such partnership. In the event of any partner not being elected the member shall dissolve the partnership. In the event of a director not being elected the company shall not be represented on the membership of the association. If one calendar month after such non-election the member has not dissolved such partnership, he shall be deemed to have retired from the association, and the committee shall announce to the members that he has so retired, and his name shall be erased from the list of members. A sharebroker residing out of Wellington may be represented by his attorney, in which case the names of the sharebroker and the attorney shall be simultaneously proposed for membership, and the above conditions as to election and partnership shall apply. The attorney shall have the same powers and privileges as an ordinary member, and both he and his principal shall be jointly and severally responsible under these rules and by-laws.

**Failing to pay subscription.**

11. If any member fail to pay the annual subscription due on the 1st October in each year, or within thirty days thereafter, or shall fail to pay all calls made within fourteen days from the date of the call being made, the secretary shall report the same to the committee, who may at their discretion inflict a fine on such member not exceeding £5.

**Statement of accounts.**

12. A statement of accounts, duly audited, shall be submitted by the committee of the association to the members at the annual meeting once in each year. The statement to be as at 30th September in each year.

**Office-bearers.**

13. The office-bearers shall be a chairman, vice-chairman, and a committee consisting of three members. The chairman and vice-chairman to be *ex officio* members of committee. Three to form a quorum.

**Vacancy in office, how filled.**

14. Any vacancy occurring among the office-bearers during the year shall be filled by the members of the association, and any person so appointed shall hold office till the next election of office-bearers.

**Annual financial meeting.**

15. There shall be an annual general meeting of the members of the association on or before the second Tuesday in the month of November (a quorum shall be not less than half the then members of the association) for the purpose of receiving the annual report and statement of accounts and electing office-bearers and an auditor for the ensuing year, and transacting any other business properly brought before the meeting. The duties of the office-bearers then elected shall commence forthwith.

**Retiring office-bearers.**

16. At every annual general meeting the whole of the office-bearers shall retire, and their places shall be filled up at such annual meeting. Such election shall take place by ballot. All such retiring office-bearers (except as hereinafter provided) shall be eligible for re-election without notice, but any other member wishing to become an office-bearer shall be proposed in writing by one member and seconded by another, and notice given to the secretary seven days at least before the day fixed for the annual meeting. One office-bearer shall, however, absolutely retire, and shall not be eligible for re-election for one year. The person to retire

shall be selected by ballot, or otherwise, as may be decided by the committee.

**Secretary.**

17. A secretary shall from time to time be appointed by the committee, with or without remuneration, and shall hold office at their pleasure.

**Duties of secretary.**

18. The secretary shall record the sales, purchases, transactions, and proceedings of the ordinary "call" meetings, and the proceedings of all other meetings, shall keep the accounts, prepare a balance-sheet as at 31st March and 30th September in each year, and have the custody of all books and papers, and perform such other duties as the committee may prescribe. The official stamps of the association, embodying the words "Scrip forwarding to the company's office this day," and "Scrip in support of this transfer for shares forwarded to the company's office this day," shall be kept in the custody of the secretary, and on the request of any member, accompanied by the payment of one shilling, he shall personally affix one or other of the said stamps to any transfer required, appending thereto his ordinary signature as secretary, and the date written in full. He must, however, first have received from the applicant the ordinary scrip, which he will forward at once under registered cover to the secretary or legal manager of the company in question, with an intimation as to the number of transfers marked with the stamp and the numbers of the shares embodied in each transfer. He must also keep a record of all such transactions in the register provided for the purpose. The secretary shall keep the official stamp above referred to in a safe under lock and key, and should any misuse be made of it through his neglecting this or any other necessary precaution, he shall be liable for any loss occasioned thereby.

**Absence of secretary.**

19. In the absence of the secretary from any meeting, the chairman shall carry out his duties, or may appoint another member or person to do so.

**Custody of funds.**

20. The committee shall have charge of the funds of the association, and all payments shall be made by cheques bearing the signatures of the secretary and two members of committee.

**Place of meeting.**

21. The association shall hold its meetings at such times and place as may be agreed upon.

**Official list.**

22. The list of quotations of prices and of purchases and sales effected or reported at the meetings of the association shall be the official list of the Wellington Stock Exchange; and the association shall not issue (nor be responsible for the issue by any of its members of) any other list of sales, prices current, or trade circular. Nor shall any member of this association be permitted to issue a list of quotations until such quotations have been approved of by the committee.

**Additional to or removals from official list.**

23. A majority of two-thirds of the members of the association present at any meeting may admit or remove the shares of any company to or from the official list if they see cause to do so.

**Quotation challenged.**

24. Any member whose quotation is challenged may be called upon to verify the same to the satisfaction of the committee. Failing verification, the case shall be referred by the committee to the members of the association, to be dealt with by them under Rule 29.

**Power to make and alter rules and by-laws.**

25. The members of the association shall have power to make new rules, and to make by-laws, and to alter the same from time to time; but no new rule or by-law shall be passed unless concurred in by a majority of the members present at a meeting composed of at least three-fifths of the members of the association.

**New rules, additions to, and alterations of rules and by-laws.**

26. Notice of any proposed new rule or by-law, alteration of or addition to the rules or by-laws, shall be given in writing at a meeting of the association, and shall be considered and determined on a day (appointed by the committee) not less than seven or more than fourteen days thereafter.

**Settlement of disputes and complaints.**

27. In any dispute arising between, or complaint against, members, the matter shall be referred to and be investigated by the committee, whose decision shall be final. Any member who shall not carry out or abide by such decision shall be suspended by the Committee from all privileges of membership for any period not exceeding seven days, and he

shall be forthwith reported to the association as under suspension; and, after the expiry of the term of suspension, if the member shall still not have conformed to the committee's decision, the members shall be convened by notice, not shorter than three days (during which time the offending member shall continue under suspension), to consider and determine whether he shall or shall not be finally disqualified from membership, such determination to be by the concurrence of four-fifths at least of the members present at such meeting. A quorum of such meeting shall consist of two-thirds of the members of the association.

Complaints from non-members.

28. It shall not be incumbent upon the committee to entertain any complaint submitted to them by any one not a member of the association against a member thereof, unless such member shall have been employed by the complainant in the capacity of broker; and in that or any other case in which a non-member desires the intervention of the committee, he shall, previously to the case being heard, pay five guineas, or such other sum as the committee may determine, to the secretary, and shall undertake in writing to abide by, and forthwith to carry out, the decision of the committee in the same manner as if he were a member of the association, the committee to have the power to repay the whole or part of such sum to the complainant.

Fines, expulsion, suspension.

29. In the event of any member being considered guilty of dishonourable or disgraceful conduct the committee shall report the matter to a meeting of the association specially convened for its consideration, and such meeting may (subject to the condition following) inflict upon such member such fine, or suspend him for such period, as it may deem fit or may expel him from the association. The concurrence of four-fifths at least of the members of the association present at such meeting shall be necessary to pass any resolution under this rule involving the infliction of fines, suspension, or expulsion. A quorum at such meeting shall consist of two-thirds of the members of the association.

Clerks of members.

30. It shall be competent for the committee, should they think fit, on application being made by a member in writing, to grant the partner or clerk of such member permission to attend the daily meetings of the association for the making of quotations and transaction of business on behalf of his partner or employer, provided, however, that such clerk must be not less than twenty-one years of age; but the member shall first undertake by writing addressed to the committee that he will be responsible for the sales and purchases effected by such partner or authorised clerk. The sanction of the committee may be at any time withdrawn. Such partner or authorised clerk shall have no vote, nor any voice in the management or administration of the association. No partner or clerk shall attend the ordinary daily meeting of the association until the member has received from the secretary notice of permission to attend.

Claims on the property or funds of the association.

31. A member resigning, or becoming disqualified from membership, or ceasing to be a member, or having been expelled, shall cease to have any claim whatever on the property or funds of the association.

Insolvency of a member.

32. A member who becomes insolvent, or who fails in his engagements with his creditor or creditors, shall, on proof thereof to the satisfaction of the committee, cease to be a member, although he may not be at the same time a defaulter on the Exchange. The seat of such member shall thereupon become the property of the association, to be dealt with in such manner as a majority of not less than two-thirds of the members in meeting shall think fit.

Members' contracts.

33. In contracts between members for the sale and purchase of shares and stocks they shall be held to be principals to each other.

Delivery of documents.

34. In case of any undue delay in the delivery of documents, the buyer may report same to the committee, who shall make inquiry into the circumstances attending such delay, and if in their opinion the delay is avoidable, the buyer shall have the right to cancel the purchase, or buy at the risk of the seller through another member of the association.

Buyer's name to be supplied.

35. The buying member must, if required, supply the name of the buyer within seventy-two hours, computed from the hour of sale. If this is not done, it shall be competent for the selling member to insert the name of the buying member.

Payment for documents.

36. Purchasers shall not be required to take delivery of and pay for documents until the following day, if tendered after 11 o'clock on Saturdays, and 1 o'clock on other days.

Failure of payment.

37. Sellers shall have the right to require the purchase-money to be paid in cash or marked cheque at the time and place of delivery of documents. In case of failure of payment by the buyer, the vendor may, within one day of default of settlement, or on any future day, either cancel the transaction or sell at the buyer's risk, through some member of the association, the securities involved, and the defaulting member shall forthwith pay to the vendor any difference between the original purchase-money and the net proceeds of the securities resold.

Separate transfers.

38. As between members the seller shall, if demanded, deliver to the buyer separate transfers of scrip representing the exact number of shares sold in each separate sale. Transfers requiring scrip must be delivered with scrip, or the transfers marked as correct by the institution to which the stock sold relate, or marked as correct by the secretary, provided the scrip are lodged with him to be forwarded to the company for registration of the transfer.

Buying or selling on 'change.

39. At all meetings of the association no offers to buy or sell, and no sales, shall be reported of shares of less value than £50 or of less in number than 100 if the shares be of less value than 10s.; or in respect of mining shares (other than coal) of less nominal or actual value than £25.

Transfer of seat.

40. Any member against whom there is no valid complaint under the rules may resign his membership by giving a written notice to the chairman, and he may concurrently therewith nominate a candidate for membership in his stead; but such candidate shall not become a member unless he be duly elected by ballot according to Rule 5, and shall have paid to the association the amount fixed for the time being; and in the event of such nominee being rejected at the ballot, the retiring member may nominate some other person or persons until a candidate nominated by him be accepted; and until the election of a successor, he may attend meetings of the association and conduct his business. The sum to be paid to the association, until otherwise determined, shall be ten (10) per cent. of the entrance fee for the time being, and such sum must be paid to the secretary before the nominee of the retiring member is eligible for election. In case a member wishes to sell his seat and fails to find a purchaser for the same, the association shall not create or dispose of any fresh seat until the seat of such retiring member is sold.

Death of a member, disposal of seat.

41. On the death of a member the committee of the association shall exercise the privilege of nomination for the benefit of his widow or children, or next-of-kin—subject to deduction, first, of his liabilities to the association and of the levies, if any, which shall have accrued since his decease, and, secondly, of his liabilities to any member, of which the committee shall have had notice—to whom the proceeds of the sale of the vacant seat (less 10 per cent. as an entrance fee for the successor of the deceased) shall be paid. No money to be paid until some person or persons are in a position to give a legal discharge. The estate of a deceased member shall have no legal claim whatever on the property or funds of the association.

Brokerage chargeable.

42. The brokerage chargeable on transactions shall be as under:—

Minimum charge, 5s. on any transaction, buyers paying stamp duty and transfer fees. The above rates (*in respect to mining other than coal-mining*) are chargeable to both buyer and seller. A penalty not exceeding £50 or less than £25 shall be inflicted for any breach of the above tariff. It shall, however, be competent for the association to remit the fine if agreed to by three-fourths of the members. Nothing in the foregoing rule shall debar a member of the association from transacting business (in shares other than mining) direct with private clients, but not with brokers or agents, at lower rates than above, provided that not less than half rates be charged.

No division of commission with outside brokers.

43. No member of this association, or his partner, clerk, or employee, shall, either directly or indirectly, divide commission with any person not a member of this association in the

City of Wellington, nor shall any member purchase shares at a net price from any person not a member of this association in the City of Wellington, but a member of this association may divide commission with any broker or agent who resides more than twenty-five miles from the City of Wellington.

*Committee power to investigate complaints.*

44. The committee shall have full power to investigate any complaint made by one member of this association against another for any alleged breach of Rules 42 and 43, and for the purpose of the investigation may call upon such accused member to produce any books or documents in his possession that they may require. The name of the complaining member shall not be divulged except to the chairman without such member's permission in writing.

*Penalty for breaches of Rules Nos. 42 and 43.*

45. Should the committee consider any member guilty of a breach of Rules 42 and 43, they shall report the same to the association, who shall investigate the charge, and if a majority of the members of the association in meeting find him guilty he shall for the first offence pay a sum not exceeding £50, for the second offence a sum not exceeding £100, and for the third offence he shall be expelled from the association. A quorum at such meeting shall consist of two-thirds of the members of the association.

*Disposal of proceeds of seats after disqualification, expulsion, &c.*

46. When any member shall be finally disqualified or expelled under any of these rules, or shall cease to be a member under Rule 31, the committee may sell such member's seat, subject to the purchaser being duly elected; and the proceeds of the sale shall be applied—first, in payment of any amount due to the association for the purchaser's entrance fee (*vide* Rule 40) and of any liability of the said member to the association, and of the levies, if any, which shall have accrued since he ceased to be a member; and, secondly, in payment rateably of the amount of such member's debts to the members who are creditors in respect of other Stock Exchange transactions; and any balance, after settlement of such claims as may be sanctioned by the committee, shall belong to the association.

*Closing offices.*

47. When a majority of the members of the association decide for any purpose upon closing their offices for share business all the members of the association shall be bound by such decision, and any member committing a breach of this rule shall be dealt with under Rule 29.

*No action in equity or law.*

48. The members of the association hereby undertake that they will not, in any case arising out of these rules, raise any action in equity or at law with reference to the grounds or effects of any decision of the members, notwithstanding any irregularity or informality in the proceedings.

*Quorum at call.*

49. A quorum at a call meeting shall be three.

*Advertising shares for sale or purchase.*

50. No member of this association shall advertise in any newspaper in New Zealand the fact that he has buyers or sellers for any stocks, shares, or debentures of any description whatever, except under special circumstances, when the consent of the chairman or the committee must be first obtained. Any breach of this rule shall be dealt with under Rule 29.

*Giving information to newspapers about any company.*

51. Any member of this association wishing to supply any information to one or more of the newspapers in New Zealand regarding any of the companies, mining or otherwise, whose stocks are dealt in in New Zealand, shall do so only through the Exchange, and such information must only be published with the consent of the chairman or the committee and in the name of the Exchange.

**BY-LAWS.**

*Priority of Seller.*

1. The member who, at ordinary "call" meetings, offers to sell any debentures, stocks, or shares at the lowest declared price, shall have priority over all other members in supplying at such price so much of such debentures, stocks, and shares as he may be willing to sell; but, having made a sale, he must, to maintain his priority, immediately declare himself as still a seller.

*Priority of Buyer.*

2. The member who, at ordinary "call" meetings, offers the best price for any debentures, stocks, or shares, shall have priority over all other members at such declared price for as much of such debentures, stocks, or shares as he may be willing to take; but, having made a purchase, he must,

to retain his priority, immediately declare himself as still a buyer.

*Penalty for Member or Members joining any other Exchange in Wellington.*

3. All the privileges of this association shall be withdrawn from any member during such period as he, his partners, or his clerk shall be a member of any other similar association or stock exchange within the City of Wellington.

*Stock and Share Broking Companies.*

4. No joint-stock company carrying on the business of stock and share brokers shall be placed upon the official call list of this association.

*Members selling responsible for Validity of Document.*

5. Any member selling shall be responsible for the validity at time of delivery of all documents delivered, and for the shares being free from all liability then past due at the time of sale. A call shall be deemed to be due on and after the day on which the same shall have been made or struck.

*Auction Sales, Tenders, &c.*

6. (a.) No member of this association, nor his partner, or clerk, or any one employed by him, shall be allowed to attend auctions within the City of Wellington or a radius of twenty-five miles therefrom to bid directly or indirectly for stock, debentures, bonds, or shares of any description (forfeited shares, and shares in deceased and bankrupt estates, and such other sales of bonds and shares as may be permitted by special resolution of the association from time to time, excepted).

(b.) No member of this association shall be allowed to tender for stock, bonds, debentures, or shares of any description in a private estate, shares in deceased and bankrupt estates excepted.

(c.) No member of this association shall be allowed to tender for stock, bonds, or debentures of any government, municipal or other corporations, except on such terms and conditions as may be sanctioned by the association.

(d.) Any member infringing this by-law shall be dealt with under Rule 29.

*Conduct of Members during "Call" Meetings.*

7. No member shall be permitted to leave the "call" room at any ordinary meeting until the chairman has declared the ordinary business closed, without the express sanction of the meeting, under penalty not exceeding £20. Such member going out during a meeting shall not be allowed to re-enter during the same meeting, except with the express sanction of the meeting; and any member impeding business, either by attempting to deal in shares, scrip, or stock out of his turn, or by conversation not relevant to the subject before the meeting, or by any noisy, disorderly, or improper conduct whatever, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £1, and for each repetition of the offence shall be liable to a further fine not exceeding £1, or may be suspended for a period not exceeding three months, and may thereupon immediately be expelled from the meeting. Such fines, penalties, and suspensions to be inflicted or imposed by the chairman, subject, however, to an immediate appeal to the members present in the room, whose decision shall be final. The committee, or any special meeting called for the purpose, may remit such fines, or any part thereof, or remove such suspension, or any portion thereof; and no member so fined shall be entitled to attend the room or to take his seat or have any of the rights of membership until all fines and penalties inflicted on him are paid.

Telegrams and other written communications may be received by members during business meetings, but no messages shall be sent out during such meetings.

*Transactions of Members outside Exchange Room.*

8. All transactions between members taking place outside the Exchange room shall be subject to the rules and regulations of the association.

\* The remaining suburbs do not lie within borough boundaries, and particulars respecting them have not been obtained for the Vital Statistics. The total population of Auckland and its suburbs was 67,226 persons, and that of Christchurch with its complete suburbs amounted to 57,041 persons, at the Census of March, 1901.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 486, against 426 in November—an increase of 60. The deaths in December were 254, an increase of 33 on the number in November. Of the total deaths, males contributed 141, females 113. Eighty-four of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 33.07 per cent. of the whole number; 57 of these were under one year of age.

There were fifty-four deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Ten men, 67 (two), 68, 71, 72 (three), 75, 80, 85, and one woman, 75, died at Auckland; eleven men, 66, 67, 69, 70, 71, 72, 73, 76, 79, 82, 92, and three women, 67, 70, 74, at Wellington; seven men, 67, 68, 70, 75, 76, 80, 82, and three women, 66, 69 (two), at Christchurch; and eleven men, 65, 67, 69, 71, 75, 76, 79, 83 (two), 85, 88, and eight women, 66, 68, 70, 71, 77, 78, 82, 89, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland and Wellington, but raises it at Christchurch and Dunedin.

*Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.*—Forty-five deaths from diseases of this class were registered in December last as occurring at the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs; and of these 27 were recorded at Auckland, 10 at Wellington, 3 at Christchurch, and 5 at Dunedin. Of this total measles was accountable for 19, whooping-cough for 15, diarrhoea for 3, typhoid fever for 2, scarlatina for 2, and diphtheria, influenza, puerperal septicæmia, and erysipelas for 1 each.

*Parasitic Diseases.*—One death in this class, that of a man aged fifty-four, from hydatids, was recorded at Auckland last month.

*Dietetic Diseases.*—Only 1 death, that of a child, from malassimilation of food, was attributed to this class of disease in December last.

*Constitutional Diseases.*—In December these totalled 49, an increase of 9 on the number registered in November, 18 being caused by phthisis, 16 by cancer, 4 by tubercular meningitis, 3 by diabetes, 3 by tuberculosis, 2 by tabes mesenterica, and 1 each by rheumatism (acute), rickets, and anæmia.

*Developmental Diseases.*—There were 28 deaths in this class, 14 of which were due to old age, and 12 to premature birth; atelectasis and spina bifida accounting for the other two.

*Local Diseases.*—Of the 113 deaths registered as caused by diseases of this class, 20 were caused by diseases of the nervous system, 1 by disease of organs of special sense, 13 by diseases of the circulatory system, 40 by diseases of the respiratory system, 22 by diseases of the digestive system, 2 by diseases of the lymphatic system, 10 by diseases of the urinary system, 4 by diseases of the reproductive system, and 1 by disease of the organs of locomotion.

*Violence.*—Nine violent deaths were recorded in December, and of these 7 were accidental and 2 suicidal. Of the accidental deaths 2 occurred at Auckland, a child of two years being crushed by a tub, and another of three years run over by a tram-car; in Wellington a labourer was run over by a railway-train, and an infant died from injuries received at birth; at Christchurch a girl of five years was scalded and a tailoress accidentally suffocated; in Dunedin an insurance clerk was drowned while bathing. Of the two suicidal deaths, both of which occurred at Auckland, 1 was a case of atrophine poisoning by a clerk, the other that of a labourer, who drowned himself: in each case a verdict of "Temporary insanity" was returned.

*Ill-defined and Not-specified Causes.*—Eight deaths from infantile debility were registered in December—1 at Auckland, 5 at Wellington, and 2 at Dunedin.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.

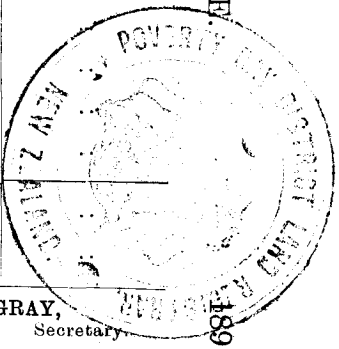
