Regulations under "The Christchurch Tramways District Act, 1902.

RANFURLY, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-ninth day of April, 1903.

Present:

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE R. J. SEDDON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL. I N exercise of the powers in this behalf conferred upon him by "The Christchurch Tramways District Act, 1902," and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf. His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the consent and advice of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said Act :-

REGULATIONS.

Electors Lists and Rolls.

1. The Clerk of the Christchurch Tramway Board shall, on or before the 1st day of May in the year 1903, and in every subsequent year on or before the 5th day of March, make out for each sub-district, as defined in section 4 of the said Act, a list of the electors as defined in section 6 of the

said Act.
2. Every such list of electors shall be prepared in the form and shall contain the particulars specified in the First

Schedule hereto.

3. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to make every such list as complete as possible, and for that purpose he shall place thereon the name-

(a.) Of every person of whose qualification or qualifications as an elector he is satisfied; and also

(b.) Of every person who makes and delivers or transmits to him at his office a claim for enrolment as next hereinafter prescribed.

next hereinafter prescribed.

4. Every claim for enrolment shall be in the form or to the effect set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, and the claimant's signature shall be attested by a Justice of the Peace, or a Postmaster, or a minister of religion, or an elector of the district, or the Clerk of the Board, or the Clerk of any local authority.

5. It shall be the duty of the Board and of the Clerk to keep at the office of the Board a supply of blank printed claim-forms for the proper use of claimants for the purposes aforesaid.

aforesaid.

6. Names appearing on any sub-district electoral roll in respect of a freebold or rating qualification for any year shall be continued on the sub district list of electors for the succeeding year, except in the case of persons who are known to the Clerk to have died or to have lost their qualification; and it shall be his duty to report in writing to the

Board all names thus omitted, and the reasons of the omissions

7. The Clerk shall omit the name of every person enrolled in virtue of a residential qualification who, not being a candidate at the last preceding election, appears from a comparison of the rolls used at such election not to have voted thereat.

8. The Clerk shall keep the sub-district electors lists in his office and allow them to be inspected without fee by all persons interested therein during office hours until the 5th day of May, 1903, and in each subsequent year until the 12th day of March, and he shall as soon as possible after the said lists have been prepared publicly notify that such lists are ready for inspection at his office.

 All objections under section 7 of the said Act must be in writing under the hand of the objector, in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, and must be addressed to the Clerk, and delivered at his office on or before the 9th day of May, 1903, and in each subsequent year on or before the 17th day

of March.

10. The Clerk shall, in respect of each sub-district, make and sign a list of all such objections in the form of the Fourth Schedule hereto, and shall keep such lists in his office, and allow them to be inspected without fee by any office, and allow them to be inspected without fee by any person interested therein during office hours from the 11th to the 14th day of May in the year 1903, and in cach subsequent year from the 18th to the 21st day of March.

11. The Board shall amend each sub-district electors list by correcting every error set forth in any such objection, and proved to the satisfaction of the Board to exist therein;

and the Chairman of the Board shall initial every alteration

so made in any sub-district electors' list.

12. At a sitting of the Board to be held not later than the
15th day of May in the year 1903, and of which previous
notice shall be given in three consecutive issues of a newspaper circulating in the district, and in each subsequent year at the annual sitting of the Board mentioned in section 7 of the said Act, the Chairman and not less than two other members of the Board shall sign each sub-district electors list as amended, and shall certify thereon to its being correct, and for the year 1903; each sub-district electors list so amended and certified shall thereupon come into force as and shall be the Christchurch Tramways District electoral roll for the sub-district named therein; and for each subsequent year each sub-district electors list so amended and certified shall be the Christchurch District electoral roll for the sub-district named therein, and shall come into force upon the 1st day of April following such annual sitting; and in every case every such electoral roll shall continue in force until a new electoral roll comes into force in like manner.

13. A copy of each sub-district electors roll and of all its supplements, and also the original manuscript roll with all its amendments and corrections, shall be kept open for public inspection at the office of the Clerk, during office hours, without fee.

14. For the purpose of amending any sub-district electors list or roll by the addition of new names after such subdistrict electors list has become the sub-district electors roll, supplementary sub-district electors lists may from time to time be prepared; and with respect to every such supple-mentary list or roll the following regulations shall apply:—

(1.) The names shall be entered therein in alphabetical

order of surnames, and shall be numbered consecutively, commencing with the number next following the last number in the preceding list then in force.

(2.) Each supplementary sub-district electors list shall be deemed to be incorporated with the original sub-district electors list, and, when amended, corrected, signed, and certified in manner provided by Regulation 12, shall be a supplementary district electors roll, and be deemed to be incorporated with the original district electors roll then in force.

then in force.

15. Appeals to a Stipendiary Magistrate under section 7 of the Act may be made as follows:—

(1.) An objection in writing under the hand of the objector shall be lodged with the Clerk of the Magistrate's Court not later in the year 1903 than the 18th day of May, and not later in any subsequent year than the 7th day of April, and a copy of such objection shall also on or before the same days respectively be lodged with the Clerk. Clerk.

(2.) The objection may be in the form in the Third Schedule hereto, or as near thereto as may be.

(3.) The Magistrate shall hear and determine the appeal at such convenient place and time, not being later than ten days after the last day appointed for lodging such objections, as he appoints, and not less than seven days' notice shall be given of the date so appointed.

- 16. In case any sub-district electoral roll is not, from any cause whatever, made out and completed so as to come into force at the prescribed time, the sub-district electoral roll for the preceding year shall (unless the time for making out and completing a new roll is extended) be in force for the year for which a roll has not been made out and completed as aforesaid.
- 17. (a.) As soon as practicable after any original sub-district electoral roll, or any supplementary district electoral roll, comes into force, copies thereof shall be printed by the
- (b.) But where the total number of electors on any roll or supplementary roll does not exceed 200, the Board may declare that such roll or supplementary roll shall be typewritten and not printed, and whenever there shall be in existence a sufficient number of printed copies of any subdistrict electoral roll or supplementary roll, it shall not be obligatory on the Board to reprint such roll or supplementary roll.
- (c.) The Clerk shall supply any person with a copy of the printed or typewritten sub-district electoral roll, together with all its printed or typewritten supplements, on payment of Is.
- 18. The Clerk is liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 in every case where he refuses, or wilfully neglects, or unreasonably delays-
 - (1.) To place on the district electors list the name of any person who makes written claim for enrol-ment as provided by paragraph (a) of clause 3 of these regulations; or (2.) To faithfully and promptly perform any other duty
 - imposed on him by the Act or these regulations.
- 19. If the Board fails or unreasonably delays to keep at the Clerk's office a supply of blank printed claim forms for the free use of claimants, as provided by clause 5 of these regulations, or to faithfully and promptly perform any other duty imposed on it by the Act or these regulations, every person (whether the Clerk or any member of the Board) who is party to or responsible for such failure or delay is severally liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

REMUERA ROAD BOARD.—WATERWORKS BY-LAWS.

BY-LAWS of the Remuera Road Board, made in pursuance of "The Road Boards Act, 1882," and "The Road Boards Act 1882 Amendment Act, 1888," by special order, and sealed with the common seal of "The Inhabitants of the Remuera Road District" on the 20th day of March, 1903:—

In pursuance of sections 126 to 131 of "The Road Boards Act, 1882," and Part I. of "The Road Boards Act 1882 Amendment Act, 1888," and of all other powers and provisions it hereunto enabling, the Remuera Road Board hereby makes and levies the following rates, and declares the following as the conditions upon which the said Road Board will supply water on and to all the rateable properties within

the Remuera Road District from the date of these by-laws being duly gazetted.

Explanation of Terms used herein.

"Board" shall mean the Remuera Road Board.

"Ordinary supply" shall mean water supplied by meter, and to be used continuously by householders and residents

for their usual purposes.
"Extraordinary supply" shall mean water supplied to builders and others, and water supplied for any other pur-

poses than ordinary supply.
"Consumer" shall mean any person who has applied for or agreed to take water from the Board.

Ordinary Supply.

On properties in the Remuera Road District all consumers

On properties in the Remuera Road District all consumers to be supplied by meter at the following rates:—

1. If by ½ in. service meter and ½ in. service pipe, at 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, and minimum charge shall be for 2,500 gallons at least per quarter. Rent of meter, is. 3d. per quarter in addition.

2. If by ¾ in. service meter and ¾ in. service pipe, at 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, and minimum charge shall be for 3,500 gallons at least per quarter. Rent of meter, 2s. per quarter in addition.

3. If by 1 in. service meter and 1 in. service pipe, at 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, and minimum charge

1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, and minimum charge shall be for 5,000 gallons at least per quarter; rent of meter 3s. 6d. per quarter in addition.

4. All applications for the supply of water shall be made in writing at the office of the Board in the form set out in the Schedule hereto.

5. Rates by meter shall be payable quarterly.

The fee for cutting off and turning on water-supply, 5s. each.

each.
7. Persons making application for connection with the water-main shall pay to the Board 30s. for laying service pipe and necessary work in connection therewith to the boundary of the property to be supplied. This applies to applications made after 30th April, 1903.
8. Meters shall be fixed in such places as the Board shall direct, and be charged for as mentioned in scale of charges.
9. Should any mater be out of repair, or cease to register.

9. Should any meter be out of repair, or cease to register, or register inaccurately, or be considered so or to do so by the officer duly appointed by the Board, he shall estimate the consumption at the average of the previous four quarters charged to the consumer, and such decision shall be final, and the consumer shall pay the Board in accordance with such decision.

10. All water-meters must be enclosed in a wooden box, and the keys of both meters and boxes, duly labelled with the name of the owner, must be lodged at the office of the Board. If required by the consumer the box may have a glass front.

Extraordinary Supply.

11. Temporary supply to builders and others by meter shall be paid for at the rate of 2s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge for at least 10,000 gallons; but no rent shall be charged for the meter, and the consumer shall return the same to the Board in good order and condition.

12. Competent plumbers, approved by the officer appointed by the Board, may be licensed by the Board to lay pipes and by the Board, may be incensed by the Board to lay pipes and do any work in connection with water-supply on payment of an annual fee of £1 is., or by paying 2s. 6d. for every authority issued. No person, unless duly licensed by the Board, shall attach or alter or do any work in connection with any service pipe, or in any other way interfere with any pipe, tap, cock, or any matter or thing connected with the water-supply.

13. No licensed plumbers shall do any work connected.

13. No licensed plumbers shall do any work connected with the water-supply without giving at least one clear day's notice thereof, and receiving written authority to do such work from the officer appointed by the Board.

14. Plumbers shall be responsible for all damage done

or caused by them in performing any work whatever, either through bad workmanship or inferior material.

15. All work shall be done to the satisfaction and approval of the Waterworks Engineer or other officer appointed by the Board, and must be passed by him before the water shall be turned on at the main.

16. All drawing cocks used must be of the best quality and most approved description, and must be those known as "screw-down" valves; and in exposed or public places must be enclosed with a wood or iron box, under lock and key, of a size, quality, and description approved on behalf of the Board.

17. Every licensed plumber shall forward a monthly return (on forms supplied to him) of the work he has done during the preceding month to the office of the Board, and shall not be entitled to do any work in connection with the waterworks while he makes default in complying herewith. 18. In no case will the use of instantaneous-closing taps, valves, or cocks be permitted. Galvanised-iron piping of an approved quality only will be allowed for external services, and of the requisite sizes suitable to the requirements of the tenements, as shall be determined by the engineer or other officer appointed by the Board.

19. No direct connection shall be made with any steam-boiler or water-engine except by special consent of the Board, nor under any circumstances shall any connection be made whereby any water may be conveyed from any pipe to any

water-closet.

Rates in Arrear.

20. At the expiration of fourteen days from the date of any water rate being due, and after delivery of notice on the premises to which such water is laid on (excepting temporary supplies, which may be cut off after twenty-four hours' notice), it shall be competent for the officers of the Board to cut off any such supply in such manner as may be deemed advisable.

General.

21. No consumer shall attach or connect, or permit or allow to be attached to or connected with the waterworks any pipe or other apparatus, nor alter, permit, or allow any any pipe of other apparatus, nor sites, permit, or sites any alteration to be made in any existing pipe or apparatus so attached or connected, unless the work be done by a licensed plumber, and unless notice in writing in that behalf shall have been given by the licensed plumber employed to the Waterworks Engineer or other officer appointed by the Board, and the consent of such officer or engineer shall have been first obtained.

22. The Waterworks Engineer or other officer appointed by the Board shall keep a list of such plumbers as the Board shall license as aforesaid, to be called the List of Licensed Waterworks Plumbers, and it shall be lawful for the Board at its discretion to remove from such list the name of any plumber who in the opinion of such Engineer or officer shall have shown incapacity or shall have been guilty of negligence or any misconduct, or shall have refused or neglected to supply such Engineer or officer with any information removed by him is refused to supply such Engineer or officer with any information removed to any mand date or him deep the state of the state quired by him in reference to any work done or being done by such licensed plumber in connection with the waterworks, and to cancel his license as such plumber.

23. No person shall use on his property any water coming from the Board's mains unless the same shall have passed

through the meter measuring his supply.

Wrong or False Information.

24. No person shall give to any officer of the Board false information upon any matter pertaining to water-supply.

Penalties.

25. Any person who shall violate or fail to do or observe, or who shall in any way contravene, any of the above rules or any of the matters or things laid down in these by-laws, or who shall do any act, matter, or thing which he is prohibited from doing or is not allowed to do under the authority of these by-laws, shall for each and every such offence forfeit and pay a sum on conviction of £5, or of such lesser sum as the Court inflicting the same shall in its discretion think fit.
