W HEREAS by the one-hundred-and-sixty-ninth section of "The Land Act, 1892," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands in any village settlement shall be disposed of, subject as in the said section is provided: And whereas by a Proclamation made under the said Act on the eleventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninetyday of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and published in the New Zealand Gazette on the twentieth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, the lands described in the First Schedule hereto were set apart under the said Act and declared open for lease as village settlements; and by an Order in Council issued on the twenty-fifth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and published in the New Zealand Gazette on the eighth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, terms and conditions of lease of the said lands were fixed, and it is expedient to revoke the aforesaid Order in Council, and to fix fresh terms and conditions of lease of the lands and to fix fresh terms and conditions of lease of the lands enumerated therein:

tion for improvements (if any) immediately the application has been approved or declared successful at the ballot.

7. All rents must be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st days of January and July in each year, as provided in section 157 of the said Act; and the first half-year's rent is payable as before provided.

8. Improvements and residence on the land comprised in

section 157 of the said Act; and the first half-year's rent is payable as before provided.

S. Improvements and residence on the land comprised in each lease shall be as provided in Part III. of the said Act. The provisions of section 144, and all other provisions of the said Act with respect to substantial improvements, shall apply accordingly to lessees under these regulations. The provisions of section 141, and all other provisions of the said Act in respect of compulsory residence, shall apply accordingly to lessees under these regulations.

9. No lessee shall subdivide, sublet, or transfer the land held by him under these regulations, except under and subject to the provisions of Part I. of the said Act.

10. No lessee shall hold more than the limit stated in the First Schedule, and all allotments shall be held for his or her sole use and benefit, and not for the use or benefit of any other person whomsoever. No married woman shall be eligible as a selector; but this provision shall not apply to any married woman who may become a transferee under a will or by virtue of an intestacy.

11. All the provisions of the said Act, so far as applicable, shall extend and apply to the lands affected by these regulations, and to the applications and leases to be made and issued thereunder, and generally to the interests created, and the persons whose rights, liabilities, or interests are thereby affected; and the mention of any particular provision of the said Act shall not be deemed to exclude any other provision of the said Act applicable to the particular case.

Amending the Regulations under "The Land for Settlements Consolidation Act, 1900."

WHEREAS by Order made under his hand dated the eighteenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and one, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the twenty-first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and one, certain regulations were made by the Governor fixing the terms and conditions for the disposition and occupation of lands acquired under "The Land for Settlements Consolidation Act, 1900," and "The Land for Settlements Amendment Act, 1901,"

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Acts, doth hereby amend clauses nine and forty-two of the aforesaid regulations by the addition of the following subclauses to each of the said clauses:—

"(3.) In addition to the limitations prescribed by subclauses (1) and (2) hereof, a married woman shall also be subject to the special limitation that the maximum area which she shall be capable of applying for or holding shall not exceed 320 acres of first-class land or 1,000 acres of second-class land, irrespective, however, of any land that her husband may be entitled to acquire or may hold: Provided that this special limitation shall not apply in the case of a married woman who is separated from her husband under decree of judicial separation, or is the holder of a protection order, nor shall it operate to prevent a married woman from becoming a lessee under a will or by virtue of an intestacy."

The railway-line from Oxford to Sheffield passes through portions of the block. From Oxford Railway-station the nearest portion of the block is distant about five miles, and the furthest about eight miles; from Sheffield the distances are respectively about four and ten miles; and the Bexley Station adjoins part of the block, and is about six miles from the furthest portion. The sections consist generally of open level land of light quality on shingle; most of it is stony, and a considerable portion is covered with manuka scrub. In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christehurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christehurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at each of the four centres.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—Of 22 deaths from these causes at the four cities and suburbs in April, 1903, 7 were from scarlet fever, of which 1 occurred in Wellington, 4 in Christchurch, and 2 in Dunedin. There were also 4 deaths from measles—3 at Christchurch and 1 at Dunedin. Four more deaths resulted from diarrheea—2 at Wellington, 1 at Christchurch, and 1 at Dunedin. Typhoid was fatal at Wellington, but there were only 2 deaths from this cause. Of the remaining 5 deaths 4 were caused by septicæmia.

Constitutional Diseases.—The mortality from these in April was heavy—35 deaths, 20 of which were attributable to phthisis and other tubercular diseases, 11 to cancer, and 2 to diabetes.

Local Diseases.—Of 94 deaths, 17 were caused by diseases of the nervous system, 1 by diseases of organs of special sense, 23 by diseases of circulatory, 20 of respiratory, 26 of digestive, 3 of urinary, 3 of reproductive, and 1 of integumentary systems.

Violent Deaths.—These numbered 12 at the four centres. One death was caused by being crushed by a cart, 1 run over by a tram, 1 fall of chimney, 1 killed on railway, 1 fall from ship's staging, 1 burns, 1 poison, 1 choked by piece of meat. These 8 were accidental. By suicide there were 4 deaths—3 cases of shooting, 1 of cutting throat.

The total population of Auckland and its suburbs was 67,226 persons, and that of Christchurch with its complete suburbs amounted to 57,041 persons, at the Census of March, 1901.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 466, against 489 in March—s decrease of 23. The deaths in April were 199, a decrease of 40 on the number in March. Of the total deaths, males contributed 101, females 98. Sixty-one of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 30.65 per cent. of the whole number; 48 of these were under one year of age.

There were forty-eight deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Twelve men, 65, 67, 68, 70 (two), 73, 76, 81, 82, 83, 84, 87, and four women, 65, 70, 74, 83, died at Auckland; three men, 67, 70 (two), and four women, 68, 70, 72, 80, at Wellington; three men, 73, 78, 84, and seven women, 65 (two), 73, 78, 79, 81, 88, at Christchurch; and six men, 68, 70, 75, 78, 80, 88, and nine women, 65, 71, 72, 73, 75, 78, 81, 83, 84, at Dunedin.

The foregoing accounts have been examined and found correct, subject to the following remarks:

1. The "Customs," "Railways," and "Territorial Revenue" receipts are not now examined by the Audit Office.

2. The Audit Office is unable satisfactorily to verify the receipts of gold revenue, through the failure of the Mines Department to comply with a requisition for a certified statement of the accounts collectible as such revenue.

3. The "Advances in the hands of the officers of the Government" include payments to the amount of £2,211 16s., though the accounts of the same were received at the Treasury before the close of the year.

With reference to the above remarks, it is sufficient to reply that the revenues as named have been removed by law from the Audit Office xamination for many years past; and, as to the gold revenue, the statement referred to is not required by law.

With regard to the payments, amounting to £2,211 16s., made by imprestees but not included in the account, these outstandings are known by the Audit Office to be unavoidable.

(1.) The Customs, Railways, and Territorial Revenue receipts are not now examined by the Audit Office.

(2.) The Audit Office is unable satisfactorily to verify the receipts of gold revenue through the failure of the Mines Department to omply with a requisition for a certified statement of the amounts collectible as such revenue.

(3.) The "Advances in the hands of Officers of the Government" include payments to the amount of £2,211 16s., though the accounts it the same were received at the Treasury before the close of the year.

LOCALITY AND GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF THE OHOTU BLOCK.
