WHEREAS "The Counties Act, 1886" (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), is suspended within the County of Oroua, and the Council of the said county, at a special meeting held on the fifth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and three, under the provisions of the said Act, determined, by a resolution passed by a clear majority in number of the whole of such Council, that the whole of the said Act should come into force in the aforesaid county, and a copy of the aforesaid resolution has been presented to me: And whereas it appears expedient to give effect to the terms of such resolution:

Now, therefore, I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby proclaim and declare that the whole of "The Counties Act, 1886," shall come into force and its operation be revived within the County of Oroua on the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and three, and the said Act shall thereafter continue to be in force within the said county.

All forest-clad; well watered; good soil. This allotment is situated between Hale's Track and Wangaehu Valley Road, the access being from Mangamahu, which is about eighteen miles distant viâ the latter road, which is formed for dray traffic to a point opposite Section No. 73. dupois; barley, 12 bags of 4 bushels to 1 ton avoirdupois; oats, 14 bags of 4 bushels to 1 ton avoirdupois; peas, 10 bags of 4 bushels to 1 ton avoirdupois; potatoes, 12 bags of 4 bushels to 1 ton avoirdupois; chaff, 25 bags machine pressed and dressed to 1 ton weight avoirdupois; chaff, 35 bags hand pressed and dressed to 1 ton weight avoirdupois; coal, 12 bags to 1 ton weight avoirdupois; firewood, three-quarters of a cord to 1 ton weight avoirdupois.

2.
