At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-eighth day of July, 1903.

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE R. J. SEDDON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL. IN exercise of the powers conferred upon him by "The Government Railways Superannuation Fund Act, 1902," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting under the advice and consent of the Executive Coun-

cil of the said colony, doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto for the purpose of prescribing the powers, functions, and procedure of "The Government Railways Superannuation Fund Board" (hereafter called "the Board"), and generally of giving effect to the said Act.

#### SCHEDULE.

1. ALL meetings of the Board shall be held in Wellington.
2. Ordinary meetings shall be held quarterly, on the second Monday in January, April, July, and October.
3. Special meetings may be held at such times as the Board considers necessary.
4. At all meetings the Chairman shall have a deliberative as well as a casting vote.

5. The Board shall keep a correct record of the business transacted at its meeting.
6. Every member of the Board shall receive notice of the business to be transacted at the ordinary meetings at least business to be transacted at the ordinary meetings at least one week prior to the date of any such meeting, and a notice concerning the business to be transacted at any special meeting at least three days prior to the holding of such meeting.

7. The General Manager of Railways shall from time to time furnish the Board with a list of contributors who signify their intention of retiring from the railway service and claiming on the Superanyuotion Fund.

olaiming on the Superannuation Fund.

8. Such list shall be certified under the hand of the General Manager, and shall contain the following information, viz.: Name of contributor; rank; date of birth; date of entry into service; date of retirement; rates of pay received; length of service; total amount contributed to fund; amount of compensation to which he is entitled under section 3 of "The Government Railways Act, 1900"; amount of superannuation to which he is entitled; how retired (cause of retirement). retirement).

9. He shall similarly advise the Board with respect to contributors retired "medically unfit," or who resign or are dismissed, except that the amount of superannuation shall not be shown in the two latter cases, or the amount of com-

not be shown in the two latter cases, or the amount of compensation in the case of dismissal.

10. With respect to contributors who die from any cause before becoming claimants on the fund, the General Manager of Railways shall, in addition to the foregoing particulars, furnish to the Board a statement setting forth full and correct particulars of the family of the contributor, and showing the name of the widow and the name and date of birth of each child. He shall also report to the Board all cases of contributors totally or partially disabled by accident, and who have in consequence become medically unfit for further duty, a d have received an allowance under "The Workers' Compensation for Accidents Act, 1900," and its amendments, stating the amount so paid to such contributor.

11. The General Manager shall likewise report to the Board whenever the pay of a contributor is temporarily stopped on account of ill-health, and again when it is resumed.

resumed.

12. The Board shall at its first meeting after receipt of the necessary particulars from the General Manager consider such cases as have been reported upon, and direct payment in accordance with the terms of the Act, and determine the date from which the first payment shall be made.

13. The Board shall within fourteen days from the date of its decision advise the contributor or beneficiary of the

same.

14. (1.) Every contributor whose pay is temporarily stopped owing to ill-health may—

(a.) Pay his contributions to the fund four-weekly during the period of sickness; or

(b.) Allow his liability to the fund to accumulate until he resumes duty, when the amount in arrears shall be deducted in three equal instalments from his pay for the first three four-weekly periods

shall be deducted in three equal instalments from his pay for the first three four-weekly periods after resuming duty.

(2.) Every contributor whose pay is temporarily stopped from any cause other than ill-health shall during such stoppage liquidate his liability to the fund four-weekly:

Provided that in all cases where the contributor does not return to duty his liability to the fund by way of contribution shall be a first charge against any moneys payable to any person under the Act in respect to such contributor.

15. Should it be reported, or the Board have reason to believe, that any contributor who has been retired medically unfit is fit to resume duty, or should such contributor decline to go up for examination, then and in all such cases the Board shall immediately direct that all payments from the fund to such contributor shall cease until such time as he produces satisfactory medical proof of his unfitness for duty, and the Board shall then determine what forfeiture, if any, shall be made from the retiring allowance. any, shall be made from the retiring allowance.

16. Members of the Board shall not be entitled to or be

paid any remuneration for their services as members, but shall, whilst travelling on the business of the Board, be entitled to travelling-allowance in accordance with the scale prescribed by the regulations for the time being in force re-

lating to officers travelling on the public service. Provided that in the case of elective members the minimum daily allowance (exclusive of cost of transport) shall be 10s.

17. The receipt of any person to whom the Board may direct any sum accruing in respect to benefits derivable under the Act to be paid shall be an absolute discharge to the fund of all further liability in respect of the amount so paid.

18. The Board may pay out of the fund all expenses inci dental to the management and administration of the fund.

ELECTION OF SUPERANNUATION FUND BOARD.

19. For the conduct of elections for the Superannuation

Fund Board the following provisions shall apply:—
20. There shall be prepared by the General Manager, and retained at the Head Office in Wellington, three separate alphabetical voting-lists, to wit,—

(a.) One of all members of the First Division resident

in the North Island who are contributors to the

fund;
(b.) One of all members of the First Division resident in the Middle Island who are contributors to the fund: and

(c.) One of all members of the Second Division who are contributors to the fund:

and all such lists may be inspected by contributors at all

reasonable times.

21. If any contributor wishes to take any objection to any list, particulars of such objection must be communicated, through his immediate superior officer, to the General Manager, Wellington, who shall decide the same, and whose decision shall be final.

22. No objection shall be entertained unless it reaches the General Manager not later than the third day before the lists are closed. The lists shall be closed for the purposes of each election on the forty-second day before such election,

and shall continue closed until the election is completed.

23. The first ordinary election shall be held on the first Monday in March, 1905, and subsequent ordinary elections shall be held on the same Monday in every third year there-

24. Special elections shall be held on dates to be fixed by the General Manager, being in no case later than three months after the vacancy occurs, and he shall give to all contributors concerned not less than two months' previous notice of the date so fixed.

25. Nominations shall be made in writing by not less than three contributors in the same list as the candidate, and must reach the Returning Officer at Wellington not later than the twenty-eighth day before the election. Any nomination which fails to duly comply with this clause shall be

26. Contributors shall be entitled to vote as under, that is

to say

(a.) Each contributor entered in the list of the First
Division for the North Island shall be entitled to
vote for one duly nominated candidate of the
First Division for the North Island.

(b.) Each contributor entered in the list of the First Division for the Middle Island shall be entitled to vote for one duly nominated candidate of the First Division for the Middle Island.

(c.) Each contributor entered in the list of the Second Division shall be entitled to vote for three duly nominated candidates of his own Division to represent him on the Board.

27. Should there be only sufficient contributors nominated to fill the vacancies in either Division or Island, the contributors nominated shall be de lared to be duly elected.

28. In the event of there being more nominations than there are vacancies to fill, a ballot shall be taken.

29. The Returning Officer for the election shall be the Chief Clerk to the General Manager, Wellington, or other

person for the time being performing the duties of such Chief Clerk.

30. As soon as possible after the date for receiving nominations is past the Returning Officer shall cau e separate ballot-papers, in the form or to the effect following, to be printed and supplied to every contributor.

34. All ballot-papers shall be transmitted by post or otherwise to the Returning Officer at Wellington, in envelopes which will be provided for the purpose, and must reach him not later than the ordinary course of post computed from the day after the polling-day.

35. No contributor shall in any case be compelled to record

his vote, and no contributor shall canvass for votes or at-tempt in any way to influence voters.

36. Immediately after the last day fixed for the receipt at Wellington of ballot-papers, the Returning Officer shall in the p esence of the scrutineers proceed to ascertain the total number of votes recorded for each candidate; and the Returning Officer shall cause the result to be published in an turning Officer shall cause the result to be published in an official circular, and shall declare the candidates obtaining the majority of votes in the respective Divisions or Islands duly elected. The voting-papers shall, after being counted, be enclosed in a sealed packet, and be retained by the Returning Officer. They shall not be opened unless a scrutiny be demanded, when such scrutiny shall be conducted by the Returning Officer and two scrutineers. The papers will remain in the Returning Officer's custody for two months, and will then be destroyed. If a scrutiny be demanded, application therefor must be made in writing to the Returning Officer by not less than seven voters within

the Returning Officer by not less than seven voters within fourteen days after the publication of the result aforesaid.

37. Whenever there is an equality of votes at the election, and the addition of one vote will entitle any of the candidates to be elected, the Returning Officer shall himself record such

additional vote.

38. In the event of any dispute or question arising as to the meaning of the regulations, or any portion thereof, for the conduct of elections for Superannuation Fund Boards, the same shall be referred to the Minister for determination, and his decision shall be final and conclusive.

#### ELECTION OF SCRUTINEERS.

4. His Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment.

5. The Council shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at its own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister. by the Minister.

6. Any person authorised by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring it within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Garnetic

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or

may hereafter be in force.

8. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the Council and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that numbers for that purpose.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

first obtained.

10. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand.

11. The Council shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on its part.

any default or neglect on its part.

12. In case the Council shall—

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions herein-

before set forth, or any of them;
(2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period

of thirty days—
