The scale of pensions for men discharged as unfit on account of disease contracted on active service has, however, been improved and assimilated to the scale for men discharged on account of wounds. (Army Order 21 of 1902.)

2. The widows and children of warrant officers whose deaths are due to war service are now eligible for pension and compassionate allowances at the rate of £30 and £6 5s. a year respectively. (Army Order 150 of 1901.)

3. The widows and children of non-commissioned officers and men whose deaths are due to war service are now given

pensions under the terms of Army Order 150 of 1901.

4. Army Order 270 of 1902, paragraph 3, relaxes the former rule that death due to disease must occur within one

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 524, against 482 in August—an increase of 42. The deaths in September were 230, an increase of 42 on the number in August. Of the total deaths, males contributed 129, females 101. Forty-eight of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 20.87 per cent. of the whole number; 39 of these were under one year of age.

There were sixty-seven deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Eight men, 65, 69, 71, 72 (two), 73, 76, 78, and four women, 66, 67, 69, 86, died at Auckland; eight men, 66, 72, 73, 74, 75, 76, 81, 100, and seven women, 65, 67, 72, 78, 81, 87, 95, at Wellington; ten men, 67, 68, 73 (two), 76 (two), 80, 81, 86, 89, and nine women, 70, 71, 75, 76, 78 (two), 79, 83, 87, at Christchurch; and thirteen men, 66, 68, 73, 75 (three), 76 (two), 78 (two), 80 (three), and eight women, 65, 67, 69 (three), 75, 77, 85, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland, Wellington, and Christchurch, but raises it at Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—Scarlet fever was fatal at Christchurch during September, where there was 1 death, and at Dunedin 2 deaths. Two deaths occurred from influenza at Dunedin, and 1 from mumps at Auckland. The mortality from diarrhœal diseases during last month was limited to 1 death at Wellington. The above, with 3 deaths belonging to the septic order, complete the total of 10 deaths in the class.

Constitutional Diseases.—The mortality for September was heavy—52 deaths at the four centres. Eighteen deaths were caused by phthisis, and 15 by cancer. Diabetes contributed 7 deaths, and tubercular diseases other than phthisis 10. There was 1 death from rheumatism, and 1 from rickets.

Local Diseases.—Of 117 deaths, 28 resulted from diseases of the nervous system, 1 from disease of organs of special sense, 24 of diseases of circulatory system, 32 of respiratory system (bronchitis, pneumonia, &c.), 14 of the digestive system, 2 of lymphatic, 11 of urinary, 4 of reproductive, and 1 of integumentary systems.

Violent Deaths.—Eight were accidental and 4 suicidal. One accidental death was from fracture of skull, 1 from rifle-shot, 3 were by drowning, 1 from ptomaine poisoning, 1 from asphxia, and 1 from accident at birth. Of suicides, 1 was by shooting, 1 by cutting throat, 1 by hanging, and 1 by drowning.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.

Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

THREE scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition. One of these scholarships, to be called the senior scholarship, is open to all Maori boys under sixteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination: the other two scholarships are junior scholarships, one of which is open to all Maori boys under fifteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination who have attended a Native school or schools other than Te Aute or St. Stephen's, and whose attendance at school during the previous year is considered by the Inspector of Native Schools to have been satisfactory; the other is open to Maori boys whose attendance at any school other than Te Aute and St. Stephen's during the previous year has been similarly satisfactory. The senior scholarship is open to Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Native Schools Code, 1897. Candidates for the junior scholarships will be examined in the subjects specified for Standard IV. in the Native Schools Code, 1897. The questions will, however, be somewhat more difficult than those set for the standard examinations. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 14th and 15th of December. 1903.
