WHEREAS by section seventy-six of "The Post Office Act, 1900" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that the limitation of interest-bearing amounts of Post-Office Savings-Bank deposits therein mentioned shall not apply in the case of such non-mercantile societies as the Governor in Council specifies from time to time:

And whereas it is desirable to extend the specification of non-mercantile societies in the manner hereinafter set forth for the purposes of such section:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities for that purpose vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, and acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order and declare that volunteer fire brigades, public libraries or mechanics' institutes, agricultural and pastoral associations, church mission societies, domain boards, cemetery boards, religious societies, and every branch thereof, are non-mercantile societies to which the hereinbefore-mentioned limitation of the amount of interest-bearing deposits shall not apply: Provided always that a copy of the rules of any such society the funds of which it is desired to deposit in the Post-Office Savings-Bank, and of every amendment thereof, be rendered to the Postmaster-General, with the names and addresses of the trustees or officers for the time being.

Licensing T. M. Lane and Sons to use and occupy Part of the Foreshore of Whangaroa Harbour as a Site for a Boom.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, Thomas Major Lane, Joseph Solloway Lane, and Major William Lane, of Totara North, trading under the style of "T. M. Lane and Sons" (hereinafter called "the licensees"), have applied to the Governor in Council for a license under "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark in order to erect and maintain thereon a boom on the east side of Whangaroa Harbour, in the Provincial District of Auckland; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," have deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 1029) showing the place in the said harbour where it is intended to construct such boom, and the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied for such purpose: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said Act for the purpose aforesaid should be granted and issued to the licensee on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensees as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark which is particularly shown and delineated on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon a boom; such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say,—

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark on the east side of Whangaroa Harbour, shown on the said plan marked M.D. 1029.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensees shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of two pounds ten shillings, and thereafter an annual sum of one pound, such annual payment to date from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and four, and the first of such annual payments to be made to the Minister on a copy of this Order in Council being supplied to the licensees.

4. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for eleven years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

5. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, and the licensees may be required to remove the boom at their own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees one month's previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand.

6. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which may be sustained by any vessel or boat in passing the boom, or by contact with it, and which may be occasioned by any default or neglect on their part.

7. In case the licensees shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said boom for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause three of these conditions; or
- (4.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law in force for the time being relating to bankruptcy,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensees or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined; and upon such revocation the Minister may cause the said boom to be removed, and may recover the cost incurred by any such removal from the licensees.

8. The construction of the boom shall be deemed to be an acceptance by the licensees of the conditions of this Order in Council.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore on which the jetty and fish-cleaning shed are to be constructed, as shown on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing and maintaining the said jetty and fish-cleaning shed thereon; such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned jetty and fish-cleaning shed in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at his own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorised by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said jetty and fish-cleaning shed and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such jetty or fish-cleaning shed, requiring him within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said jetty shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall

be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said jetty or fish-cleaning shed may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on his part.

13. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said jetty or fish-cleaning shed for a period of thirty days; or
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause three of these conditions—

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. The construction of the jetty and fish-cleaning shed shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the licensee of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Public Works Act, 1894," and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order and declare that the roads described in the Schedule hereto shall, on and after the date of this Order in Council, be county roads.

ALL that road in the Hawke's Bay Land District, commencing at its junction with the Dannevirke-Weber Road, in Block VIII., Tahoraite Survey District, and running in a northerly direction to a point where it crosses the Mangatoro River, and thence in a north-easterly direction to the south-west corner of Section 5, Block I., Mangatoro Survey District, thence in an easterly direction to the southern boundary of Section 13, Block II., Mangatoro Survey District, and terminating at Hamilton's Creek, a length of 7 miles and 10 chains, or thereabouts; as the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked R. 5161H, and coloured pink thereon, deposited in the office of the Chief Engineer of Roads, at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District, and marked A.A. thereon.

TUTUREWA ROAD.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Christchurch Tramway Board, incorporated under "The Christchurch Tramways District Act, 1902," is desirous of making and constructing an embankment across that portion of the tidal lands of the estuary of the Heathcote and Avon Rivers lying between the point where the Sumner Tramway-line passes the northern extremity of Rural Sections 4 and 866, known as "Andrews Quarries," and the point where the said tramway-line passes the northern corner of Rural Section 262, known as "The Cutting," for the purpose of thereby effecting a deviation of the said tramway-line: And whereas the said tidal land is within the limits of the port or harbour of Lyttelton:

And whereas the Lyttelton Harbour Board, upon the application of the Christchurch Tramway Board made in that behalf, did by resolution passed at a meeting of the Lyttelton Harbour Board held on the sixth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and three, assent to the construction of the said works: And whereas the said Christchurch Tramway Board has deposited in the office of the Marine Department plans (three sheets), marked M.D. 2668, of the whole of the proposed work, showing all the details thereof and the mode in which it is proposed the same shall be carried out: And whereas it appears to His Excellency the Governor in Council that the proposed works will not be injurious to or tend to the injury of navigation:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by "The Harbours Act, 1878," and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the said deposited plans and the construction and maintenance of the said works, and doth hereby make and impose the following restrictions, conditions, and regulations for the purposes of the said Act:—

1. The proposed embankments shall be so constructed and thereafter maintained by the Christchurch Tramway Board as to allow the tide to flow freely in and out to and from the tidal lands lying to the south of the said proposed embankment, and between the said embankment and the foreshore of the said tidal lands.

2. One, two, or three permanent openings, of the aggregate width of not less than fifty feet, in the said embankment, at such place or places as shall be approved of by the engineer for the time being of the Lyttelton Harbour Board, shall be provided and thereafter maintained and kept clear so as to allow the tidal water to flow freely in and out at each tide.

3. It shall be the duty of the Christchurch Tramway Board to maintain, repair, and keep up the said embankment and openings and all works connected therewith.

4. The said embankment and tram-line thereon shall be used for conveying passengers and goods, and for the general purposes of the said tramway, and, save as aforesaid, shall not be used or permitted to be used as a road for other traffic, or as a thoroughfare or right-of-way, and all necessary steps shall be taken by the Christchurch Tramway Board to prevent it from being used.

5. The Lyttelton Harbour Board may, by its officers, agents, servants, and workpeople, at all reasonable times enter, pass, and re-pass on and over the said embankment

and the tram-line thereon for all and every purposes and purpose connected with the said tidal waters, land, and foreshore, and for the purpose of ascertaining the state of repair and maintenance by the Christchurch Tramway Board of the said embankment and openings therein.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-fifth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and two, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-eighth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and two, regulations were made and charges fixed, under the authority of "The Electric Lines Act, 1884" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), *inter alia*, for search for telegrams; and it is desirable to alter and amend such regulations and charges in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers in this behalf enabling him, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby revoke the regulations and charges included in the two paragraphs numbered 26 and 27, under the heading "Fee for Search," in the Second Schedule to the above-recited Order in Council, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make and prescribe the regulations and charges set forth in the Schedule hereto, and doth order that such substitute regulations and charges shall have effect on and after the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

FEE FOR SEARCH.

26. The originals of inland telegrams and cable messages are kept for six months and three years respectively.

27. The sender or the addressee of an inland telegram or cable message, or his duly authorised agent, may inspect such telegram or cable message at the office of transmission or of destination without charge, or be supplied with a certified copy of it, unless it be a Press telegram, on payment (in advance) of a fee of 6d. for each inland telegram, and 5d. for every hundred words, or fraction thereof, of a cable message, provided the telegram or message has not already been sent to the General Post Office. If it has been so sent, the sender, or the addressee, or the duly authorised agent of either, may only inspect such telegram or cable message, or obtain a certified copy thereof, on payment in advance of a fee of 1s. if the necessary particulars enabling the telegram or cable message to be found without any delay are supplied, or 2s. 6d. if such particulars are not furnished. Satisfactory proof of identity of the applicant as the sender, addressee, or agent must in all cases be given. If desired, the copy of the telegram or cable message, or an extract, will be telegraphed, upon payment by the applicant of the telegraph fee in addition to the before-mentioned charge. No copy of a Press telegram will be given.

Rural Lands in Wellington Land District open for Sale or Selection.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section one hundred and thirty-six of "The Land Act, 1892," and section two of "The Bush and Swamp Crown Lands Settlement Act, 1903," I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby declare and provide as follows, that is to say:—

1. The rural lands enumerated in the Schedules hereto are hereby set apart for disposal by way of sale or selection on and after the tenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and four, at the respective prices specified in the said Schedules.
2. The said lands may be purchased for cash, or be selected for occupation with right of purchase, or on lease in perpetuity; provided that in the case of land containing or supposed to contain any metal, mineral, or valuable stone, it shall be selected on lease in perpetuity only and shall not be purchased for cash.
3. For the purposes of "The Bush and Swamp Crown Lands Settlement Act, 1903," the lands enumerated in the First Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be "heavy-bush land," and the lands in the Second Schedule shall be deemed to be "scrub land."
4. No general rate shall be levied or collected by any local authority from the said lands for the period of four years in the case of heavy-bush land, and two years in the case of scrub land, from the date from which in each case respectively such land is disposed of, and no local authority shall have power to levy or collect any such rate from such land during such period.
5. After the first half-year's rent has been paid by the selector the further instalments of rent payable by him for a period of four years in the case of heavy-bush land, and two years in the case of scrub land, shall not be demanded; provided that if at any time during the first five years of his occupancy the selector disposes of his interest in the land the rent so conceded shall be paid by him in full, and thereupon the Land Board may remit such instalments of rent payable by the incoming tenant, not exceeding in the aggregate the amount of rent previously conceded to the selector, as the Board shall think fit.

This block is situated between the Wanganui and the Mangawhero Rivers, and includes Tauakira, the highest point on their common watershed. The access to the western portion is by the Wanganui River to Pitangi Road, opposite Te Rimu, twenty-eight miles from Wanganui; thence by the surveyed but unformed Pitangi Road, which leads into the heart of the block. THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by subsection (1) of section 238 of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," it is provided that, where it appears to His Majesty that due facilities are or will be given by the Government of any foreign country for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in that country, His Majesty may, by Order in Council stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that that section shall apply in the case of such foreign country, subject to any limitations, conditions, and qualifications contained in the Order:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that due facilities are given by the Government of Japan for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in that country:

And whereas Her late Majesty Queen Victoria was pleased, by and with the advice of her Privy Council, on the 19th day of May, 1898, to apply the provision of section 238 of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," in the case of Japan:

And whereas since the date of the above-mentioned Order in Council the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation entered into by Her late Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Majesty the Emperor of Japan, dated the 16th day of July, 1894, has been brought into operation in accordance with the provision of Article XXI. thereof:

And whereas under Article XIV. of such treaty it was provided that the stipulations therein contained for the recovery of deserters from the vessels of their respective countries should not apply to the subjects of the country where the desertion takes place:

And whereas it is desirable to repeal the said Order in Council of the 19th day of May, 1898:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in him by the hereinbefore-recited subsection (1) of section 238 of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and by and with the advice of his Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that from and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette*, seamen not being slaves (and not being British subjects) who, within His Majesty's dominions, desert from ships belonging to subjects of His Majesty the Emperor of Japan shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships.

And His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in him by the provisions of section 738 of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and by and with the advice of his Privy Council, is further pleased to order and declare that upon and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette* the Order in Council made on the 19th day of May, 1898, and published in the *London Gazette* on the 20th day of May, 1898, shall be revoked, and the same is hereby revoked accordingly.

And the Secretary of State for the Home Department, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Secretary of State for India in Council, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Regulations as to the Introduction of Trees, Fruits, and Plants into South Australia.—Notice No. 844.

Department of Agriculture,
Wellington, 29th December, 1903.

THE following regulations of the South Australian Government, dated 11th November, 1903, as to introduction of trees, fruits, and plants into South Australia, are published for general information.

The regulations dated 17th December, 1902, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of 5th February, 1903, are revoked.

1. (a.) The introduction into South Australia of grape-vines and any portions thereof from any country or place is absolutely prohibited.

(b.) Living trees, plants, or portions thereof (not being grape-vines or portions thereof), and fruits (not being grapes), may be introduced into South Australia from any country or place under and subject to these regulations, but not otherwise.

(c.) Living trees, plants, or portions thereof (not being fruit) shall only be introduced into South Australia at Port Adelaide by sea, or at Adelaide by parcels post, or at Adelaide by railway parcel under bond.

(d.) All living trees, plants, or portions thereof intended for introduction into South Australia must, prior to being landed or introduced, be thoroughly cleansed of soil: Provided always that any inspector may admit plants growing in pots if in his opinion there is no danger in importing them.

2. All living trees or plants, or portions thereof, or fruits, introduced into South Australia from any country or place shall, on being landed or introduced, be forthwith delivered into the custody of some officer of Customs, and shall, at the expense of the importer or consignee thereof, be conveyed in original unopened packages to such place as the Commissioner shall direct.

3. An inspector shall examine such trees, plants, or portions thereof, or fruits, and may treat such trees, plants, or portions thereof, or fruits, in such manner as he may think desirable, or may order that such trees or plants, or portions thereof, or fruits, and the boxes or packages in which they were packed, or either of them, shall be destroyed by fire if in his opinion there is any danger in importing them.

4. The expense of conveying such trees, plants, portions thereof, or fruits to the place fixed for their examination, and of the examination and treatment or destruction thereof, shall be borne by the consignee or introducer thereof, and shall be paid before they are delivered to such consignee or introducer.

5. No person shall be entitled to any compensation by reason of any damage to or by the destruction of any tree, plant, portion thereof, or fruits, or of any box or package, under these regulations.

6. No parcel of plants or portions thereof shall be introduced into South Australia from any country where the insect known as *Phylloxera vastatrix* is known to exist, unless accompanied by a declaration made by the grower before a Justice of the Peace or British Consular Agent in the State or country of origin, to the following effect:—

- (a.) That the case contains no grape-vines or portions thereof.
- (b.) That the plants were grown at a greater distance than 50 yards from any grape-vines or roots of vines.
- (c.) That no phylloxera exists or has existed in the nursery or garden in which the plants have been growing.
- (d.) That the whole of the plants are free from the insect known as *Phylloxera vastatrix*.

Subsidies to Public Libraries.

NOTICE is hereby given that the sum of £3,000 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries.

The distribution will take place on the 8th February, 1904, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the 31st January, 1904.

1. A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year from subscriptions and

donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

2. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £75—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.

4. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1903; and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—

DECLARATION.

I, [Name], of [Place of abode], [Occupation], do solemnly and sincerely declare that I am Chairman [or Secretary, or Treasurer] of the [Name of institution]; that during the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1903, the receipts of the aforesaid institution for the maintenance of the library only were as follows: From rates levied by a local governing body under "The Public Libraries Act, 1869," or "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1900," pounds shillings and pence; from the subscriptions of members, pounds shillings and pence; and from voluntary contributions other than members' subscriptions, pounds shillings and pence. And I do solemnly and sincerely declare that the information hereinafter furnished by me in the appendix hereto is correct in every particular; that the abstract of accounts is a true statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year herein specified; that the whole of the subsidy received during the year was expended in the purchase of books for the library; and that by the rules of the library it is open to the public free of charge.

And I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true, and by virtue of an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled "The Justices of the Peace Act, 1882."

Standing Orders, House of Representatives, respecting Local and Private Bills.

THE following amended Standing Orders relative to local Bills and to private Bills are published for general information:—

LOCAL BILLS.

Definition of "local Bill."

390. [Formerly No. 384.] Local Bills are those which, not being private Bills, affect a particular locality only.

Notice stating objects of Bill to be published in locality to which it relates.

391. [Formerly No. 385.] No local Bill shall be read a second time unless notice has been given of the Bill in the locality to which it refers; such notice shall state explicitly the object which the Bill is intended to effect, and shall have been published once at least in each of three successive weeks on the same day in each week before the second reading in a newspaper circulating in such locality.

Copy of Bill to be deposited in Magistrate's Court, and afterwards forwarded to Clerk of House or Council, with certificate, &c.

392. [Formerly No. 386.] At the time of the first publication of such notice a copy of the Bill shall be deposited in the Magistrate's Court of the district, and shall be open to public inspection for a period of three complete weeks; and shall, at the expiration of such period, be forwarded to the Clerk of the House in which the Bill is to be introduced, with a certificate written on the face of the Bill by the Magistrate, or Clerk of the Magistrate's Court, that such Bill was so deposited and remained open for public inspection for the prescribed time. Each page of the Bill so deposited shall also be stamped with the Court seal and initialled by the Magistrate or Clerk of the Court.

Certified plans or surveys of lands to be deposited. Scale.

394. [Formerly No. 388.] When it is intended in such Bill to take power to deal with any lands, the copy deposited as aforesaid shall be accompanied by plans or surveys of such lands drawn on the following scales, viz.: Scale of not less than one inch to five chains if the lands to be dealt with are town or suburban lands; not less than two inches to a mile if the lands to be dealt with are other than town or suburban and do not exceed an area of ten square miles; and not less than one inch to a mile if the lands to be dealt with exceed an area of ten square miles. Such plans and surveys shall be certified by an authorised surveyor, and shall also be certified, stamped, and initialled by the Magistrate or Clerk of the Magistrate's Court in the same manner as the Bill to which they refer.

Power to confer or sit with similar Committee of Legislative Council.

398. [Formerly No. 392.] The Committee on Local Bills shall have power to confer with any Committee appointed for a similar object by the other branch of the Legislature, or to sit with any such Committee as a Joint Committee.

Second reading of local Bills fixed when reported on.

399. [Formerly No. 393.] Local Bills reported on by the Local Bills Committee or Joint Local Bills Committee shall be set down for second reading on the following Thursday, on which day orders relating to private members' local Bills take precedence of all other business till disposed of.

Revival of Bills lapsed in preceding session.

400. [Formerly No. 394.] In the event of a local Bill introduced in any session, and in regard to which the Local Bills Committee or Joint Local Bills Committee shall have reported that the Standing Orders have been complied with, failing to be finally dealt with during such session, then such Bill may be reintroduced during the next succeeding session, and the notices, advertisements, and deposits issued, published, and made in compliance with the Standing Orders relating to local Bills prior to or during the first-mentioned session shall be good and effectual in respect of such Bill, as if they had been issued, published, and made immediately before or during such succeeding session: Provided, however, that if it be intended to reintroduce such Bill during the next succeeding session a notice of such intention shall be advertised in not less than two issues of some newspaper published in the district within which such Bill is to have operation, or, if there be no such newspaper, then in some newspaper circulating therein.

The other Standing Orders relative to local Bills have not been amended.

PRIVATE BILLS

Private Bills defined.

2. Private Bills shall be understood to be Bills promoted for the particular interest or benefit of, or Bills that interfere with the private property of, any person or number of persons, whether incorporated or not.

The other Standing Orders relative to private Bills have not been amended.
