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Districts constituted under "The Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1875."

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1875," I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration districts known as the Awitu, Pukekohe, and Rangiriri Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into three registration districts, the names whereof shall be the Awitu, Pukekohe, and Rangiriri Districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be coterminous with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names, as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of "The Marriage Act, 1880."

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and four.

Districts constituted under "The Marriage Act, 1880."

(L.S.) RANFURLY, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Marriage Act, 1880," I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Awitu, Pukekohe, and Rangiriri Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into three marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

AWITU DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north-east generally by the waters of the Manukau Harbour from the entrance of the Manukau Harbour to the south-western boundary-line of the Karaka Parish; thence towards the east generally by the Karaka, Pukekohe, and Puni Parishes to the Waikato River; thence by the production of the western boundary-line of the last-mentioned parish to the left bank of the Waikato River; thence towards the south-east by the left bank of the said Waikato River to the sea; and thence towards the south-west by the sea to the entrance of Manukau Harbour, the place of commencement.

PUKEKOHE DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north generally by the northern boundary-lines of the Parishes of Puni, Pukekohe, Mangatawhiri, and Kohe-roa respectively from the Mauku River to the Mangatangi River; thence towards the south-east generally by the said Mangatangi River to its confluence with the Maramarua River; thence by the said Maramarua River to its confluence with the Whangamarino River; thence by the said Whangamarino River to its confluence with the Waikato River; thence by a line due west across the said Waikato River; thence towards the east generally by the left bank of that river to the mouth of the Opuatia Stream; thence by the said Opuatia Stream to the northern boundary-line of Section No. 8, Parish of Opuatia; thence towards the south generally by the said Section No. 8 to the Opuatia Stream; thence by that stream to its confluence with the Mangatea Stream; thence by the Mangatea Stream to the northern boundary of Whangape Parish; thence by the said northern boundary to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 104, Whangape Parish, in Block XIV., Onewhero Survey District; thence by the eastern and southern boundary-lines of that section and the southern boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 108, 103, and 106, Whangape Parish aforesaid, to the south-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence by a right line running due west to the sea; thence towards the north-west by the sea to the mouth of the Waikato River; thence by the said Waikato River to a point in line with the western boundary-line of the Parish of Puni; thence towards the west generally by a right line to the said western boundary-line; and thence by the western boundary-line of the said Parish of Puni to the place of commencement.

RANGIRIRI DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north by a right line being the production in a westerly direction of the southern boundary-line of Section No. 106, Whangape Parish, in Block XIII., Onewhero Survey District, from the sea to the south-western corner of

the said Section No. 106; thence by Sections Nos. 106, 103, 108, and 104, Whangape Parish aforesaid, to the north-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence by the northern boundary of Whangape Parish to the Mangatea Stream; thence by the said Mangatea Stream to its junction with the Opuatia Stream; thence by the Opuatia Stream to Section No. 8, Parish of Opuatia; thence by the western and northern boundary-lines of the said Section No. 8 to the Opuatia Stream; thence towards the west generally by the said Opuatia Stream to the Waikato River; thence by the left bank of the Waikato River to a point opposite the mouth of the Whangamarino River; thence towards the north-west generally by a right line to the mouth of that river; thence by the said Whangamarino River to its confluence with the Maramarua River; thence by the said Maramarua River to its confluence with the Mangatangi River; thence by the said Mangatangi River to the northern boundary-line of the Koheroa Parish; thence again towards the north by the northern boundary-line of that parish to the Frith of Thames; and thence by the Frith of Thames to the mouth of the Piako River; thence towards the east by the Piako River to its intersection by a right line joining Te Aroha Trig. Station and Putakauere, on the Waikato River; thence towards the south generally by that line to Putakauere aforesaid; thence by a right line to the northern corner of Section No. 22, Parish of Whangape; thence by the southern and eastern shores of Lake Whangape to its southernmost corner; thence by a right line running west-south-west to the sea; and thence towards the west by the sea to the place of commencement.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and four.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and fourteen of "The Public Works Act, 1894" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor may, upon the terms and conditions in the said section mentioned, by Proclamation publicly notified, direct that any bridge already constructed, or which may hereafter be constructed, over or across any river or arm of the sea respectively shall, from and after a date to be fixed in such Proclamation, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of such local authority as shall be mentioned in that behalf in such Proclamation, and may, by any such Proclamation as aforesaid, fix and determine whether all or any, and if so what part, of the cost, whether theretofore incurred or thereafter to be incurred, of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing any such bridge is to be provided and paid by the local authority or local authorities, and, if so, by what local authority or authorities; and may, by any such Proclamation as aforesaid, direct how, when, and to whom any such payment is to be made:

And whereas it is expedient to make provision under the said Act for the purposes and in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers and authority vested in me by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and direct that the said bridge shall, from and after the date of this Proclamation, be under the exclusive care and control and management of the Council of the County of Rangitikei; and, in further pursuance of the aforesaid powers and authorities, I do hereby fix and determine that the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said

bridge shall be borne by the Council of the County of Rangitikei in the proportion of forty-one per centum, the Council of the County of Manawatu in the proportion of forty-one per centum, and the Bull's Town Board in the proportion of eighteen per centum of the said cost respectively:

And I do hereby also further direct that any contribution hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Council of the County of Manawatu and by the Bull's Town Board shall be paid from time to time respectively, in the proportions hereinbefore prescribed, out of the funds of the said County and Town Board respectively, within a period of thirty days after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the Council of the County of Rangitikei; and all such payments shall be made from time to time to the Clerk of the said Council for and on account of such Council.

The said lands may be purchased for cash, or be selected for occupation with right of purchase, or on lease in perpetuity; provided that in the case of land containing or supposed to contain any metal, mineral, or valuable stone, it shall be selected on lease on perpetuity only and shall not be purchased for cash.

3. For the purposes of "The Bush and Swamp Crown Lands Settlement Act, 1903," the lands enumerated in the said Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be "heavy-bush land."

4. No general rate shall be levied or collected by any local authority from the said lands for the period of four years from the date from which such land is disposed of, and no local authority shall have power to levy or collect any such rate from such land during such period.

5. After the first half-year's rent has been paid by the selector the further instalments of rent payable by him for a period of four years shall not be demanded; provided that if at any time during the first five years of his occupancy the selector disposes of his interest in the land the rent so conceded shall be paid by him in full, and thereupon the Land Board may remit such instalments of rent payable by the incoming tenant, not exceeding in the aggregate the amount of rent previously conceded to the selector, as the Board shall think fit.

Rural Lands in Southland Land District open for Sale or Selection.

RANFURLY, Governor.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section one hundred and thirty-six of "The Land Act, 1892," and section two of "The Bush and Swamp Crown Lands Settlement Act, 1903," I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby declare and provide as follows, that is to say:—

1. The rural lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto are hereby set apart for disposal by way of sale or selection on and after the second day of March, one thousand nine hundred and four, at the respective prices specified in the said Schedules.

2. The said lands may be purchased for cash, or be selected for occupation with right of purchase, or on lease in perpetuity; provided that in the case of land containing or supposed to contain any metal, mineral, or valuable stone, it shall be selected on lease in perpetuity only and shall not be purchased for cash.

3. For the purposes of "The Bush and Swamp Crown Lands Settlement Act, 1903," the lands enumerated in the First Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be "heavy-bush land," the lands in the Second Schedule shall be deemed to be "light-bush land," the lands in the Third Schedule shall be deemed to be "scrub land," and the lands in the Fourth Schedule shall be deemed to be "swamp land."

4. No general rate shall be levied or collected by any local authority from the said lands for the period of four years in the case of heavy-bush land, three years in the case of light-bush land or swamp land, and two years in the case of scrub land from the date from which in each case respectively such land is disposed of, and no local authority shall have power to levy or collect any such rate from such land during such period.

5. After the first half-year's rent has been paid by the selector the further instalments of rent payable by him for a period of four years in the case of heavy-bush land, three years in the case of light-bush land or swamp land, and two years in the case of scrub land, shall not be demanded; provided that if at any time during the first five years of his occupancy the selector disposes of his interest in the land the rent so conceded shall be paid by him in full, and thereupon the Land Board may remit such instalments of rent payable by the incoming tenant, not exceeding in the aggregate the amount of rent previously conceded to the selector, as the Board shall think fit.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section one hundred and thirty-six of "The Land Act, 1892," and section two of "The Bush and Swamp Crown Lands Settlement Act, 1903," I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby declare and provide as follows, that is to say,—

1. The rural lands enumerated in the Schedules hereto are hereby set apart for disposal by way of selection on and after the ninth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and four, at the rentals specified in the said Schedules.

2. The said lands may be selected on lease in perpetuity only, as provided by section one hundred and twenty-one of "The Land Act, 1892," as they contain, or are supposed to contain, metal, mineral, or valuable stone, and shall not be purchased for cash.

3. For the purposes of "The Bush and Swamp Crown Lands Settlement Act, 1903," the lands enumerated in the First Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be "heavy-bush

land," the lands in the Second Schedule shall be deemed to be "light-bush land," and the lands in the Third Schedule shall be deemed to be "scrub land."

4. No general rate shall be levied or collected by any local authority from the said lands for the period of four years in the case of heavy-bush land, three years in the case of light-bush land, and two years in the case of scrub land, from the date from which in each case respectively such land is disposed of, and no local authority shall have power to levy or collect any such rate from such land during such period.

5. After the first half-year's rent has been paid by the selector the further instalments of rent payable by him for a period of four years in the case of heavy-bush land, three years in the case of light-bush land or swamp land, and two years in the case of scrub land, shall not be demanded; provided that if at any time during the first five years of his occupancy the selector disposes of his interest in the land the rent so conceded shall be paid by him in full, and thereupon the Land Board may remit such instalments of rent payable by the incoming tenant, not exceeding in the aggregate the amount of rent previously conceded to the selector, as the Board shall think fit.

Subsidies to Public Libraries.

NOTICE is hereby given that the sum of £3,000 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries.

The distribution will take place on the 8th February, 1904, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the 31st January, 1904.

1. A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year from subscriptions and donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

2. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £75—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.

4. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1903; and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—

Arrivals and Departures in 1903.

Registrar-General's Office, Wellington, 18th January, 1904.

TABLES showing the numbers of arrivals in and departures from New Zealand during the year 1903, with totals for the previous nine years by way of comparison, are published for general information.

The arrivals in the colony last year (30,883) exceeded the number recorded in 1902 (30,293), but the departures during 1903, which numbered 19,608, were less than those in the previous year—viz., 22,301.

The excess of arrivals over departures last year was 11,275, against 7,992 in 1902.

The comparative tables show that the colony has drawn to itself in each of the ten years 1894 to 1903 more population than it has parted with—a sure indication of prosperity.

The figures under the heading "United Kingdom" for 1903 show an excess of 1,756 arrivals over the departures, and from Australia there is an excess of 9,949, but for other countries a loss of 430.

Of the 30,883 persons who came to New Zealand last year, 3,652, or 11.83 per cent. of the total, were children—i.e., under twelve years of age; and of the 19,608 departures the children numbered 1,519, or 7.75 per cent.

3. The licenses shall be dated on the 1st March, 1905, and shall in each case be for the years specified above, from that date.

4. The license shall be subject to the following conditions, amongst others:—

- (1.) That if the licensee, or any person claiming an interest through or under him, shall make or cause to be made any agreement or contract, or shall give or cause to be given or taken any negotiable security, for the purpose of defeating or evading the provisions of, or shall in any way whatsoever, directly or indirectly, commit or be privy to a fraud upon, "The Land Act, 1892," the license shall be liable to be forfeited and revoked;
- (2.) That the licensee shall prevent the destruction or burning of timber or bush on the land comprised in the license;
- (3.) That the licensee shall prevent the growth or spread of gorse, broom, and sweetbriar on the land comprised in the license, and shall with all reasonable speed remove or cause to be removed all gorse, sweetbriar, broom, or other noxious weeds or plants, as may be directed by the Commissioner;
- (4.) That the licensee shall destroy all rabbits on the land comprised in the license, and shall prevent their increase or spread, to the satisfaction of the Commissioner or an officer appointed by him to inspect the ground; and
- (5.) That during the months of December to June, inclusive, or such other months, not exceeding altogether seven in any one year, as the Commissioner shall from time to time determine, the licensee shall not burn the grass on the land comprised in the license.

5. The licensee shall have the exclusive right of pasturage over the lands specified in his license, but shall have no right to the soil, or timber, or minerals thereon or therein.

6. One half-year's rent and a license fee of £1 1s. shall be paid on the fall of the hammer, and the purchaser shall make a declaration in terms of section 195 of "The Land Act, 1892." The rent shall be paid half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of March and the 1st day of September, in each year during the term of the license, the half-year's rent paid on the fall of the hammer being for the half-year commencing on the 1st March, 1905. Should the half-yearly rental at any period not be paid within thirty days, a penalty of 10 per cent. in addition will be enforced.

7. No liability is accepted by or on behalf of the Crown in respect of any fencing existing upon the Crown lands offered for license. The runs are sold subject to the rights of the present licensees to valuation for improvements in terms of section 207 of "The Land Act, 1892," and to the other provisions of the Land Acts relating to improvements effected by licensees, but no licensee shall be entitled to valuation for improvements effected upon the forest reserves included in this license. Where fences form the boundary between Crown lands offered for license and freehold lands, the purchaser of such license will be liable to the provisions of any law now or hereafter in force relating to boundary-fences. Valuation for improvements must be paid to the Receiver of Land Revenue, Christchurch, before the licensee will be let into possession.

The total population of Auckland and its suburbs was 57,226 persons, and that of Christchurch with its complete suburbs amounted to 57,041 persons, at the Census of March, 1901.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 524, against 506 in November—an increase of 18. The deaths in December were 181, an increase of 7 on the number in November. Of the total deaths, males contributed 98, females 83. Fifty-one of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 28.18 per cent. of the whole number; 45 of these were under one year of age.

There were forty-four deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Seven men, 65, 67, 71, 73, 74, 76, 82, and three women, 65, 67, 70, died at Auckland; five men, 70, 75 (two), 85, 93, and five women, 72, 75, 76, 81 (two), at Wellington; three men, 65, 69, 73, and eight women, 65, 69, 71 (two), 72, 73, 79, 93, at Christchurch; and eight men, 67, 69 (three), 72 (two), 73, 80, and five women, 67, 69, 71, 75, 85, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland and Dunedin, but raises it at Christchurch.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—Of 13 deaths in this class, at the four chief towns with suburbs, which happened in December, 8 were from diarrhoea—2 at Auckland and 6 at Wellington. Influenza was fatal at Christchurch, 1 death; whooping-cough at Wellington, 2 deaths; and enteric fever at Auckland, 2 deaths.

Constitutional Diseases.—Of 41 deaths at the chief centres, 19 were caused by cancer and 12 by phthisis. There were also 6 deaths from other tubercular diseases—2 from diabetes, and 2 others.

Local Diseases.—Deaths in this class for December numbered 91—from diseases of the nervous system, 24; of circulatory, 22; respiratory, 9; digestive, 18; lymphatic, 3; urinary, 4; reproductive, 7; locomotive, 3; and integumentary, 1.

Violent Deaths.—There were 8—7 accidental, 1 suicidal. The former included a death by fall from tram, and another "run over by tram." There was 1 death by drowning, another caused by blow from ship's hawser, another by fracture, which, with 1 from fall, and 1 from asphyxia, not further described, make up the total of accidental mortality. The suicide was by drowning.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
