WHEREAS by the twelfth section of "The Public Domains Act, 1881," it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred, save as is therein mentioned, to any person or persons, for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas, pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule hereto, situate in the Auckland

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Public Works Act, 1894," and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order and declare that the roads described in the Schedule hereto shall, on and after the date of this Order in Council, be county roads.

RANFURLY, Governor.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section one hundred and thirty-six of "The Land Act, 1892," and section two of "The Bush and Swamp Crown Lands Settlement Act, 1903," I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby declare and provide as follows, that is to say:—

1. The rural lands enumerated in the Schedules hereto are hereby set apart for disposal by way of sale or selection on and after the sixteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and four, at the respective prices specified in the said Schedules.

2. The said lands may be purchased for cash, or be selected for occupation with right of purchase, or on lease in perpetuity; provided that in the case of land containing or supposed to contain any metal, mineral, or valuable stone, it shall be selected on lease in perpetuity only and shall not be purchased for cash.

3. For the purposes of "The Bush and Swamp Crown Lands Settlement Act, 1903," the lands enumerated in the First Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be "heavy-bush land," the lands in the Second Schedule shall be deemed to be "light-bush land," the lands in the Third Schedule shall be deemed to be "scrub land," and the lands in the Fourth Schedule shall be deemed to be "swamp land."

4. No general rate shall be levied or collected by any local authority from the said lands for the period of four years in the case of heavy-bush land, three years in the case of light-bush land or swamp land, and two years in the case of scrub land, from the date from which in each case respectively such land is disposed of, and no local authority shall have power to levy or collect any such rate from such land during such period.

5. After the first half-year's rent has been paid by the selector the further instalments of rent payable by him for a period of four years in the case of heavy-bush land, three years in the case of light-bush land or swamp land, and two years in the case of scrub land shall not be demanded; provided that if at any time during the first five years of his occupancy the selector disposes of his interest in the land the rent so conceded shall be paid by him in full, and thereupon the Land Board may remit such instalments of rent payable by the incoming tenant, not exceeding in the aggregate the amount of rent previously conceded to the selector, as the Board shall think fit.

After the first half-year's rent has been paid by the selector the further instalments of rent payable by him for a period of four years in the case of heavy-bush land, three years in the case of light-bush land or swamp land, and two years in the case of scrub land, shall not be demanded; provided that if at any time during the first five years of his occupancy the selector disposes of his interest in the land the rent so conceded shall be paid by him in full, and thereupon the Land Board may remit such instalments of rent payable by the incoming tenant, not exceeding in the aggregate the amount of rent previously conceded to the selector, as the Board shall think fit.

Regulations for the Conservation and Use of the Rotorua Sanatorium, Thermal Springs, and Grounds.

RANFURLY, Governor.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the two-hundred-and-forty-second section of "The Land Act, 1892," and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do by this notification revoke the regulations made on the eleventh day of February, one thousand nine hundred and two, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twentieth day of February then instant, and all previous regulations, and in lieu thereof do hereby make the following regulations for the use by the public of the reserve described in the Schedule hereto, and grounds pertaining to such reserve, which contain the thermal springs, situate at Rotorua, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations apply to the Crown lands at Rotorua, in the Auckland Land District, which are within the area described in the Second Schedule hereto, including those planted and enclosed, and in which are situated the Rotorua Sanatorium and the thermal springs which supply the bathing-places known as the Rotorua baths and Whakarewarewa baths, and to the reserves made for recreation or other purposes in connection therewith.

Sanatorium.

2. Application for admission to the Sanatorium shall be made to the Government Balneologist, Rotorua, and each applicant shall be subject to examination by that officer before being admitted to the Sanatorium. The charges for residence at the Sanatorium and medical treatment shall be those as set forth in the First Schedule hereto.

3. No person shall be admitted (unless in accordance with Regulations 5, 6, and 7) except on the recommendation of the Hospital or Charitable Aid Board of the district to which he or she belongs, or on the recommendation of the trustees of the benevolent society or hospital (if separate institutions) of the town in which the applicant resides.

4. The Board or trustees in making such recommendation shall guarantee the cost of such applicant patient, shall send him or her at their own charge to Rotorua, be responsible for his or her return passage, and provide a suitable supply of clothing. They shall also furnish a report on the case by a duly qualified medical practitioner, showing nature of complaint, in order that it may be known whether the case is one that is likely to benefit by treatment at the Sanatorium.

5. Members of any duly registered friendly society may be admitted, on the recommendation of the lodge to which they belong, on the same terms as patients recommended by a Hospital or Charitable Aid Board, and Regulation 4 shall be read as applying to them in all respects: Provided that not more than six of such members shall be resident at the Sanatorium at any one time, and that all the hospital beds are not required by patients admitted under Regulation 3.

6. When all the beds are not occupied by patients admitted under Regulations 3 and 5 the Balneologist may, at his discretion, admit such persons as he may consider fit and proper subjects for treatment in the Sanatorium.

7. When all the beds are not occupied by patients admitted under Regulations 3, 5, and 6, persons may be admitted to the Sanatorium free of charge on the following conditions:—

- (a.) Each application for admission shall be made to the Superintendent of the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts, Wellington, and shall be accompanied by a doctor's certificate showing nature of complaint, and stating that the applicant is a fit patient for and is likely to receive benefit from treatment at the Sanatorium, and is not suffering from tuberculosis or any infectious disease.
- (b.) Each applicant for free accommodation and treatment shall have been a resident of New Zealand for more than twelve months prior to the application, and shall satisfy the Superintendent that he or she has not sufficient means to pay for such accommodation and treatment.
- (c.) Each applicant on arrival at Rotorua shall be subject to examination by the Government Balneologist before being finally accepted for free accommodation and treatment.
- (d.) That the expenses to and from Rotorua are provided by each such person, together with a sufficient supply of clothing.
- (e.) That during the months from October to March, inclusive, not more than four, and from April to September, inclusive, not more than six, such persons shall be resident at the Sanatorium at one time.
- (f.) The residence of each patient shall be limited to three months, but the Superintendent may, at his discretion, further extend the duration of such residence.

8. Patients residing in the Government Sanatorium at Rotorua may, while so residing, and on production of a ticket from the Balneologist, be admitted free to such baths as he may direct.

9. Fees for consultations with the Balneologist or House Surgeon shall be as set forth in the First Schedule hereto.

10. The charge for mineral waters for drinking shall be as provided in the First Schedule hereto.

Baths.

11. Hours of admission to baths shall be as authorised by the Superintendent. Admission shall be obtained by ticket only, and each bather shall present his or her ticket to the bath-attendant, who shall clip and retain it. The charges for tickets for admission to baths and for the use of towels and bathing-dresses shall be those set forth in the First Schedule hereto.

12. Persons suffering from skin-diseases must not bathe in any baths or pools, nor use any towels, except those specially set apart for their use; any such persons must inform the ticket-issuer, before taking the baths, of the fact that he or she is so suffering. Any person failing to furnish such information will be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

13. No garment or clothing of any description shall be worn by any male person whilst using any public bath. No female person shall be permitted to use any public bath except when clothed in a bathing-dress.

14. No person shall wash or place in any bath or swimming-pool subject to these regulations any clothes, soap, substance, article, or thing. Any person committing a

breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

15. No person shall place, deposit, or leave any bottle or glassware (whether broken or whole), paper, straw, litter, dirt, rubbish, or any offensive or noxious matter of any kind, in any bathing-house, bath, or pool subject to these regulations.

16. No dog shall be allowed on the premises of any bath or swimming-pool. The owner of any dog so found will be liable to a penalty not exceeding £1.

17. Every person using any bath or swimming-pool subject to these regulations shall conform to and abide by such regulations; and in case any such person shall while using any such bath or swimming-pool commit any indecency or breach of the peace, or be guilty of any disorderly conduct, or commit a breach of any of these regulations, the Balneologist, or any person duly authorised in writing by the Balneologist, may (without prejudice to any proceedings for a penalty) require any such person to abstain from doing any of the acts aforesaid and forthwith to leave, or in default thereof may eject or cause to be ejected such person from the premises subject to these regulations.

Park and Pleasure-grounds.

18. The grounds shall be open to the public free of charge, subject to the provisions of these regulations: Provided that the Superintendent may, if deemed expedient, declare the grounds closed, and may direct that at specified times a charge be made for admission, such charge not to exceed the sum of one shilling.

19. No person shall pick any flower or break or destroy or injure any plant, shrub, or tree growing on land subject to these regulations; and if any person shall commit a breach of this regulation he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, in addition to paying for the damage done.

20. No person shall place, deposit, or leave any bottle or glassware (whether broken or whole), paper, straw, litter, dirt, rubbish, or any offensive or noxious matter of any kind, within the grounds or any part thereof.

21. No person shall wash or place in any thermal spring subject to these regulations, or in any spring, geyser, or pool, or in any water-race, channel, or reservoir within the grounds, any clothes, soap, substance, article, or thing.

22. No horse, dog, or other animal will be allowed inside the grounds or any part thereof which are or is subject to these regulations; and the owner of any horse, dog, or other animal will be liable to a penalty not exceeding £1 for each time such horse, dog, or other animal trespasses or is allowed to trespass on the grounds.

This regulation does not apply to horses drawing any carriage, nor to saddled horses, nor to dogs which are led by a cord or chain, passing into or through the grounds.

23. No person shall trespass upon any portion of the reserve within any enclosure which may be set apart for planting, or where the soil is loose, or upon grass kept cut for lawns or ornamental purposes. Any person infringing this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £1.

24. The bowling-green, tennis-court, and croquet-lawn shall be open to players from the 1st November to the 30th April.

25. The hours of play on the bowling-green, tennis-court, and croquet-lawn shall be as directed by the Superintendent.

26. Charges shall be made for playing bowls, tennis, and croquet, and shall be as set forth in the First Schedule hereto. No person shall be allowed to play without first purchasing a player's ticket.

Any person who is a season-ticket holder shall be liable to have his ticket cancelled should he cause a breach of any of these regulations.

27. All playing-fees shall be paid in advance, and a ticket obtained.

28. Season tickets shall be obtained at the pavilion ticket-office only, and must be submitted to the attendant for inspection on demand.

29. Single-game tickets shall be obtained from the attendant, and must be given up to him on demand.

30. Material for playing shall be obtained from the attendant, and players shall return it to him before leaving the grounds.

31. Players shall not play more than one game or set when other persons desire to play.

32. Bowl-players shall deliver their bowls with both feet on a mat, and must not drop any bowl on the green.

33. Persons not engaged in the games shall not trespass on the bowling-green, tennis-court, or croquet-lawn.

34. Persons wearing boots or shoes with nails or heels shall not be allowed on the bowling-green, tennis-court, or croquet-lawn.

35. Any person behaving to the annoyance of others shall be required by the head gardener, or any officer having control or charge of the grounds, to leave the playing-grounds, and may be prohibited from again entering them.

36. The Government reserves the right to refuse to issue tickets to any person or persons. The Government Baalneologist shall determine to whom tickets shall not be issued.

37. Every person using or passing through the grounds subject to these regulations, or any part thereof, shall conform to and abide by such regulations; and in case any person shall, while using or passing through any of the grounds, commit any indecency or a breach of the peace, or be guilty of any disorderly conduct, he shall be liable as for a breach of these regulations.

38. For the purpose hereof the Superintendent shall have charge of gardens, grounds, enclosures, paths, and the premises pertaining thereto; and as regards any part of the ground subject to these regulations the gardener or other person in charge thereof at the time shall have authority to carry out these regulations.

39. Except where otherwise specially provided, every person committing a breach of or failing to observe the provisions of these regulations shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £5.

40. The term "Superintendent" where mentioned in these regulations shall mean the person for the time being holding the office of Superintendent of the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts, or such person as shall be duly authorised to act for him.

Children's tickets shall be issued only to children whose individual ages do not exceed twelve years.

Commutation tickets shall have a currency of four months from date of issue.

A "resident"—who shall be deemed to be any person who shall have signed a declaration before the Resident Medical Officer, a Justice of the Peace, or the Postmaster, truly setting forth that he or she has resided for a period of at least six months within a radius of five miles from the Rotorua Post-office—shall be entitled to receive tickets at rates specified for "residents." For the purposes hereof, the head of any household may sign one declaration for the whole of the inmates of such household, providing the name of each person the declaration applies to is appended to the said declaration. Each resident's family commutation ticket shall be available for the use of members of one household only.

Except where otherwise provided, one towel will be supplied free for the use of each bather using a bath, but a charge of 2d. will be made for each additional towel supplied, except in the case of Aix massage douche and double Aix massage douche, when towels and all other material are provided free of charge.

The charges for players' tickets shall be—For bowls, single game, 6d. for each game; for tennis, 3d. for each set; for croquet, 3d. for each game; for bowls, season ticket, 10s. 6d.; for tennis, season ticket, 10s. 6d.; for croquet, season ticket, 10s. 6d.

Subsidies to Public Libraries.

Education Department,
Wellington, 28th November, 1903.

NOTICE is hereby given that the sum of £3,000 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries.

The distribution will take place on the 8th February, 1904, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the 31st January, 1904.

1. A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year from subscriptions and donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

2. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £75—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.

4. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1903; and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—

Locality and Description of Runs.

Locality and Description of Reserves.

Waiau Town Blocks I., II., and III. are situated near the western end of the township, between Leonard and Highfield Streets.

Notice to take Lands for Waterworks, &c.
